And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted. And he saith unto them, Be not affrighted: Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified: he is risen; he is not here... Mark 16:5-6

HEB. 12:12-13 "

This morning as I was getting ready to go to Bible Study I thought, "Lord, I just seem to be limping along lately. It seems a struggle just to hold the ground I've already gained. Just keeping on seems tiring." Now I realize that this kind of statement is not a good confession to have and this is not a good thought to hold long in your mind, but it was an honest statement. The Lord brought the above scripture to mind. Sometimes there are major issues that tend to "cripple" our lives. The death of a loved one, a debilitating disease, job loss, divorce. And sometimes it's just a build up of the smaller irritations, the rocks in the shoes, the thorns along the side of the road. Right away the Lord is giving us a strong key to helping ourselves by redirecting our focus to the problems of others. The Word teaches us that whatever we do for others will eventually find its way back into our own lives. Look around you. Do you know someone who is struggling in life? Perhaps there is something you can do to help. Maybe you could mow the lawn for the neighbor that's recovering from an operation. Could you watch the children of that young mother down the street for an hour while she gets a little rest? Maybe you could visit that elderly widow that has such a problem with loneliness. Is there a jar on the grocery counter with someone's name and need written on it? Don't pass it up. Leave a little something extra in it. There is always something you can do to help "lift up the hands that hang down and strengthen the feeble knees." No matter what you can or even can't do, remember to always pray! Determine to set yourself in agreement with someone who desperately needs a job, physical healing, or help with any problem. Just five minutes a day in earnest prayer for someone else will work miracles, not only in their lives, but also in yours. You can not bless someone else without also receiving blessing. Don't become so focused on your own problems that you can't 'see' the problems of your fellow traveler. As you meditate on this scripture and begin to practice what it says, you will find some wondrous things beginning to happen. You will one day discover that your own "limp" in life has been healed, that your problems are being solved, and that you are running your race with joy and strength. God's special healing has come to you. Look around you. What can you do today? My prayer is that no one be left to die on the roadside, but rather be healed. As we become part of the healing of others, God makes sure that healing comes for us. We need never 'limp' in life again. The Lord has given us the answer. Let's use it.

Incredible Strawberry Pie

Ingredients

- 2 c. water
- 1 pkg. Sugar Free COOK-N-SERVE vanilla pudding
- 1 pkg. Sugar Free strawberry jell-o
- 4 c. Strawberries
- fat Free cool whip

Bring water and pudding mix to boil, take off stove, add pkg. jell-o and stir up. Let cool. Clean and slice the fresh strawberries. Line a pie plate with strawberries. Pour cooled pudding on top. Allow to set in refrigerator for at least one hour or until firm. Top with fat free cool whip.

Biscuit Taco Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 (16 oz.) jar taco sauce
- 1 (12 oz.) can Golden Layers Refrigerated Buttermilk or Flaky Biscuits
- 4 oz. (1 cup) shredded sharp Cheddar cheese
- 4 oz. (1 cup) shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 (2 1/4 oz.) can sliced ripe olives, drained
- 1/2 lb. lean ground beef
- 1/4 cup chopped red bell pepper, if desired
- 1/4 cup chopped green bell pepper, if desired
- 1 (4 oz.) can Mushroom Pieces and Stems, drained

Heat oven to 400 degree. Lightly spray 13 x 9 glass baking dish with nonstick cooking spray. Spread taco sauce evenly in bottom of sprayed baking dish. Separate dough into 10 biscuits. Cut each into quarters. Place biscuit pieces in taco sauce; turn to coat. Sprinkle 1/2 cup of the Cheddar cheese, 1/2 cup of the mozzarella cheese and the olives over top; stir gently to mix. Bake 15 to 18 minutes or until bubbly. Meanwhile, in medium skillet, combine ground beef, bell peppers and mushrooms; cook over medium-high heat until beef is thoroughly cooked, stirring frequently. Drain. Remove baking dish from oven. Sprinkle remaining 1/2 cup Cheddar cheese and 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese over mixture. Top evenly with ground beef mixture. Return to oven; bake an additional 5 to 7 minutes or until mixture bubbles vigorously around edges.

Top with lettuce, tomato & sour cream

Hot Fudge-Style Cake

Ingredients

- 1 3/4 cups brown sugar, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/4 cup plus 3 tablespoons cocoa, divided
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 3/4 cups boiling water

Combine 1 cup of the brown sugar, flour, 3 tablespoons of the cocoa, baking powder and salt in a mixing bowl. Stir in the milk, butter, and vanilla extract. Spread the mixture in the bottom of slow cooker. Combine the remaining brown sugar and cocoa in a separate bowl: sprinkle evenly over the mixture in slow cooker, Do Not Stir. Pour in boiling water, Do Not Stir. Cover, cook on high for 2 to 3 hours or until a wooden pick inserted comes out clean. Serve warm with ice cream or whipped topping

Broccoli Cheese Bake

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup (1/2 of 8-oz. tub) PHILADELPHIA Chive & Onion Cream Cheese Spread
- 1 can (10-3/4 oz.) cream of mushroom soup
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 pkg. (16 oz. each) frozen broccoli florets, thawed, drained
- 1 cup KRAFT Shredded Cheddar Cheese
- 1 thawed frozen puff pastry sheet (1/2 of 17.3-oz. pkg.)
- 1 egg, lightly beaten

PREHEAT oven to 400°F. Mix cream cheese spread, soup and water until well blended. Stir in broccoli and Cheddar cheese. Spoon into 2-1/2- to 3-qt. shallow rectangular or oval baking dish. ROLL pastry sheet on lightly floured surface to fit baking dish. Cover dish completely with pastry. Press pastry edges against rim of dish to seal. Brush entire surface lightly with egg; pierce with knife five to six times to vent. BAKE 30 min. or until heated through and pastry is puffed and golden brown.

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup butter
- 1 egg
- 1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 Tbsp honey
- 2 1/3 cup flour
- 1 tsp cocoa
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 cup chocolate chips

Directions

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Combine the sugars, with the egg, vanilla, honey, and butter; mix till well combined. Combine the flour, cocoa, baking soda, baking powder in a separate bowl, mix. Add the flour mixture gradually to the sugar mixture. Once all is combined add the chocolate chips. Place parchment paper on baking sheet or lightly grease. Drop cookies by rounded tablespoon onto cookie sheet. Bake for 8-10 min.

Ingredients

- 3 eggs
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- Dash ground cinnamon
- 10 slices bread
- 2-1/2 cups Fruity PEBBLES Cereal




A Study In The Word

Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them. And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre. And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus. And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments: And as they were afraid, and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen: remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Galilee, Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again. And they remembered his words, And returned from the sepulchre, and told all these things unto the eleven, and to all the rest. It was Mary Magdalene, and Joanna, and Mary the mother of James, and other women that were with them, which told these things unto the apostles. And their words seemed to them as idle tales, and they believed them not. Then arose Peter, and ran unto the sepulchre; and stooping down, he beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves, and departed, wondering in himself at that which was come to pass. Luke 24:1-12

See the affection and respect the women showed to Christ, after he was dead and buried. Observe their surprise when they found the stone rolled away, and the grave empty. Christians often perplex themselves about that with which they should comfort and encourage themselves. They look rather to find their Master in his grave-clothes, than angels in their shining garments. The angels assure them that he is risen from the dead; is risen by his own power. These angels from heaven bring not any new gospel, but remind the women of Christ's words, and teach them how to apply them. We may wonder that these disciples, who believed Jesus to be the Son of God and the true Messiah, who had been so often told that he must die, and rise again, and then enter into his glory, who had seen him more than once raise the dead, yet should be so backward to believe his raising himself. But all our mistakes in religion spring from ignorance or forgetfulness of the words Christ has spoken. Peter now ran to the sepulchre, who so lately ran from his Master. He was amazed. There are many things puzzling and perplexing to us, which would be plain and profitable, if we rightly understood the words of Christ.

“Wounded Soldiers”

"Our greatest Glory comes not in never falling...But in getting up each time we fall"

The above quote is not from a passage of scripture but never the less the wisdom of the quote no doubt comes from God. The Bible says "A just man falleth seven times, and riseth up again,..." *Proverbs 24:16*. Great men of the Bible were not known for never falling but for getting up after they had fell. There is no greater example then the one of King David when he sinned with Bathsheba.. After this great and terrible fall of this man that was "after Gods own heart" he repented and cried to the LORD these words "create in me a clean heart and renew a right spirit within me". He acknowledged that his greatest sin was not against his wife, or Bathsheba or even against her husband which he killed. But that his greatest sin was against the one he loved the most GOD. Through this tragedy we see what true repentance is and how that even though we reap what we sow that God shows his great mercy toward us and forgives us. But instead of lifting these wounded soldiers up before the LORD in prayer for the most part all you hear is ridicule and hypocrisy. We are in a battle and nothing pleases the enemy more than when we turn on each other. If we really want to be *Christ like* we MUST learn to **love, forgive, and encourage** our brothers and sisters when they fall. So when you see someone fall **help them up**...for one day the time may come when you need someone to help you up.

Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.
