Like Father Like Son

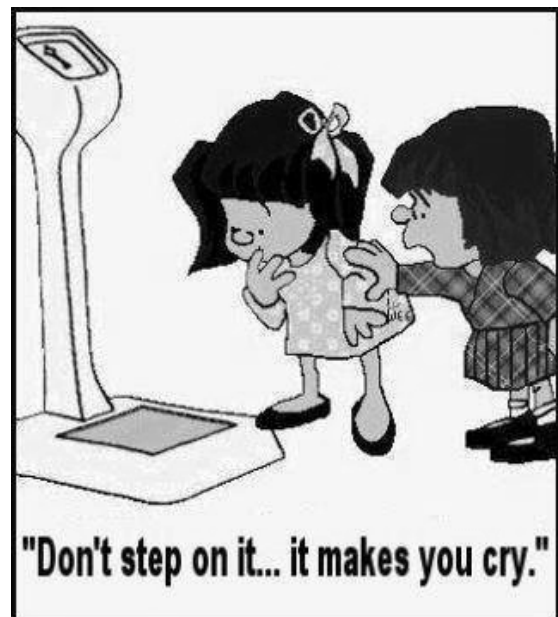

REESIE'S RECIPES

Cake Batter Rice Crispy Treats

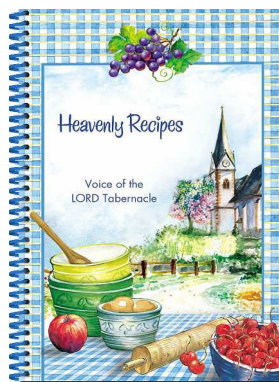
- 4 Tbsp. butter
- 1 (10 oz.) bag of mini-marshmallows
- 1/2 cup yellow cake mix (the dry cake mix, not prepared into a batter!)
- 5 cups crispy rice cereal
- 1 (1.75 oz.) container of sprinkles

Melt butter in a large saucepan over low heat and add marshmallows. Stir until they begin to melt, then remove from heat. Whisk in the (dry) cake mix, then stir in cereal so it is completely coated with marshmallow mixture. Sprinkle in half of the sprinkles and briefly stir. (Don't stir too much or the sprinkles will bleed out their color.) Press the mixture into a baking dish (any size will do) and top with remaining sprinkles. Let sit for about 30 minutes before cutting. Spraying a knife with nonstick spray helps to cut them cleanly.

Iron Skillet Cornbread

- 1 large egg
- 1 1/3 cups milk
- 1/8 cup vegetable oil
- 2 cups self rising cornmeal mix
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 stick butter

Preheat oven to 350. Melt butter in iron skillet while mixing cornbread. Mix the other ingredients in a bowl. Pour into hot skillet. Bake 30 minutes or until golden brown.



Burger Secret Sauce

- 1/2 cup light mayonnaise
 - 2 tsp. ketchup
 - 2 tsp. yellow mustard
 - 2 tsp. dill pickle relish
 - 2 tsp. sugar
 - 1 tsp. finely chopped white onion
- Combine all ingredients except onion and blend well. Stir in onion just before serving.

Baked French Toast

- 1 loaf sourdough bread
- 8 eggs
- 2 cups milk (I used 1%)
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp. vanilla
- Topping:**
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. salt

1 stick cold butter, cut into pieces (1/4 lb.)

Grease a 9x13 pan with butter. Tear bread into bite-size chunks and place evenly in the pan. Mix together the eggs, milk, cream, sugar, and vanilla. Pour evenly over bread. Cover tightly and store in the fridge overnight. In a medium bowl mix together the flour, brown sugar, cinnamon, and salt. Cut in the butter with a pastry blender until it all looks nice and crumbly. Place in a ziploc bag and put in fridge. When ready to bake, take pan and bag out of fridge. Remove wrap and evenly sprinkle the crumb mixture over the top. Bake for 1 hour at 350 degrees (or 45 minutes if you like it more soft and pudding-like).

"The Bible"

"What would you say if someone decided Shakespeare's plays, Charles Dicken's novels, or the music of Beethoven could be rewritten & improved? Writing in the journal "The Alternative", Richard Hanser, author of *The Law & the Prophets* and *Jesus: What Manner of Man Is This?*, has called attention to something that is more than a little mind boggling. It is my understanding that the Bible (both the Old & New Testaments) has been the best selling book in the entire history of printing. Now another attempt has been made to improve it. I say another because there have been several fairly recent efforts to quote "make the Bible more readable & understandable" unquote. But as Mr. Hanser so eloquently says, "For more than 3 1/2 centuries, its language and its images, have penetrated more deeply into the general culture of the English speaking world, and been more dearly treasured, than anything else ever put on paper." He then quotes the irreverent H. L. Mencken, who spoke of it as purely a literary work and said it was, "probably the most beautiful piece of writing in any language." They were, of course, speaking of The Authorized Version, the one that came into being when the England of King James was scoured for translators & scholars. It was a time when the English language had reached it's peak of richness & beauty. Now we are to have The Good News Bible which will be in, "the natural English of everyday adult conversation." I'm sure the scholars and clergymen supervised by the American Bible Society were sincerely imbued with the thought that they were taking religion to the people with their Good News Bible, but I can't help feeling we should instead be taking the people to religion and lifting them with the beauty of language that has outlived the centuries. Mr. Hanser has quoted from both the King James Version & the Good News Bible some well known passages for us to compare. A few thousand years ago Job said "How forcible are right words!" [Job 6:25] The new translators have him saying "Honest words are convincing." That's only for openers. There is the passage [Eccl. 1:18], "For in much wisdom is much grief: and he that increaseth knowledge increaseth sorrow". Is it really an improvement to say instead, "The wiser you are, the more worries you have; the more you know the more it hurts." In the New Testament, in Mathew, we read "The voice of the one crying in the wilderness. Prepare ye the way." [Matthew 3:3] The Good News version translates that, "Someone is shouting in the desert. Get the road ready." It sounds like a straw boss announcing lunch hour is over. The hauntingly beautiful 23rd Psalm is the same in both versions, for a few words, "The Lord is my shepherd" but instead of continuing "I shall not want" we are supposed to say "I have everything I need." The Christmas story has undergone some modernizing but one can hardly call it improved. The wondrous words "Fear not: for; behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy" has become, "Don't be afraid! I am here with good news for you." The sponsors of the Good News version boast that their Bible is as readable as the daily paper -- and so it is. But do readers of the daily news find themselves moved to wonder, "at the gracious words which proceeded out of his mouth"? Mr. Hanser suggests that sadly the "tinkering & general horsing around with the sacred texts will no doubt continue" as pious drudges try to get it right. "It will not dawn on them that it has already been gotten right." This is Ronald Reagan. Thanks for listening." (September 6, 1977)



“Keep Christ In Your Home”

And you went over Jordan, and came unto Jericho: and the men of Jericho fought against you, the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Girgashites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites; and I delivered them into your hand. 12 And I sent the hornet before you, which drave them out from before you, even the two kings of the Amorites; but not with thy sword, nor with thy bow. 13 And I have given you a land for which ye did not labour, and cities which ye built not, and ye dwell in them; of the vineyards and oliveyards which ye planted not do ye eat. 14 Now therefore fear the Lord, and serve him in sincerity and in truth: and put away the gods which your fathers served on the other side of the flood, and in Egypt; and serve ye the Lord. 15 And if it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of The flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord. Joshua 24:11-15

2nd Samuel 6:9-11 - And David was afraid of the Lord that day, and said, How shall the ark of the Lord come to me? 10 So David would not remove the ark of the Lord unto him into the city of David: but David carried it aside into the house of Obbedom the Gittite. 11 And the ark of the Lord continued in the house of Obbedom the Gittite three months: and the Lord blessed Obbedom, and all his household.

Summary: Our homes are called to be sacred. Places where children learn how to love God and serve Him through positive Godly example. How can our home truly be blessed? Many Christians do not see their homes to be as sacred as the church. They have undervalued and underestimated God's perspective and heart for the home. God began human existence with a marriage and a family. The first community that God established was a family and a home. He had relationship with man in the context of the family before the setting of the church. The Israelites did not have a formal place of worship until the Tabernacle of Moses. Previous to this, the place of worship was the home, and all worship was directed and led by the head of the home, the husband and father. Deuteronomy 6:4-9 - Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord: 5 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. 6 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: 7 And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. 8 And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. 9 And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates. We have replaced the home with the church. For many Christians and their families all spirituality is exercised IN church, all prayer is IN church, all teaching is IN church - and not in the home. In too many Christian homes there has been an abdication of responsibility for godly leadership, family worship and spiritual discipleship. How do we experience genuine divine blessing in our home? What can we do to reinstate God's pattern for the home? 1. CHOOSE TO MAKE YOUR HOME HIS HOME Joshua 24:15 - And if it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord. Joshua made a choice for his home. His choice was for his household to serve one God only, to worship one God only. A choice against idolatry and for faithfulness. Regardless of the choices of others Joshua's wife and children knew which way he would lead them. The challenges of Joshua's day are no less than those we live among today. We have to choose to live according to God's design for us IN OUR HOMES and FAMILIES. As I was growing up we had a plaque in the hallway of our home.....Christ is the head of this house, The unseen guest at every meal, The silent listener to every conversation. Jacob also made a clear decision for the spiritual direction of his family. Genesis 35:2-5 - Then Jacob said unto his household, and to all that were with him, Put away the strange gods that are among you, and be clean, and change your garments: 3 And let us arise, and go up to Bethel; and I will make there an altar unto God, who answered me in the day of my distress, and was with me in the way which I went. 4 And they gave unto Jacob all the strange gods which were in their hand, and all their earrings which were in their ears; and Jacob hid them under the oak which was by Shechem. 5 And they journeyed: and the terror of God was upon the cities that were round about them, and they did not pursue after the sons of Jacob. Is my home His home? - It's no good saying ... 'well of course it is because I'm a Christian' - it involves much more than that. There is a secular pressure on Christian homes today to compromise our highest spiritual values. Do we behave at home as we do at church? - We are surrounded daily with opportunities to offer greater worth (worship) to other things and people more than God. I am left with the undying influence of Parents who sought to make Jesus the centre of our home. Who taught us and modeled for us an authentic relationship with God whatever the happy or difficult situations we faced as a family. Living in such a way brings blessing to one's home. Psalm 128:1-6 - Blessed is every one that feareth the Lord; that walketh in his ways. 2 For thou shalt eat the labour of thine hands: happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee. 3 Thy wife shall be as a fruitful vine by the sides of thine house: thy children like olive plants round about thy table. 4 Behold, that thus shall the man be blessed that feareth the Lord. 5 The Lord shall bless thee out of Zion: and thou shalt see the good of Jerusalem all the days of thy life. 6 Yea, thou shalt see thy children's children, and peace upon Israel. (In this way even a lone Christian in an unbelieving home can bring blessing) 2. WELCOME HIS PRESENCE TO YOUR HOME 2nd Samuel 6:11 - And the ark of the Lord continued in the house of Obbedom the Gittite three months: and the Lord blessed Obbedom, and all his household. For 3 months the most awesome symbol of God's presence was seated in Obbed-Edom's home. This box was the most sacred article in all of Israel's history - the most powerful object on the face of the earth. A box measuring 4'x 2.5' x 2.5' was the focal point of his home. I am certain beyond doubt that this box changed the way they lived in that house. Every day for 3 months they were aware that God was living with them, lodging in their lounge. When God's presence is welcomed and encouraged a home is truly blessed. In most of our homes there is a box which is the focal point. The furniture points toward it and too often our attention is too focused upon it. It has the power to shape our home life, form our children, corrupt our values, disturb our relationships and control our diaries. In many Christian homes the TV Times is read more often than the Bible. The box at the centre of Obbed-Edom's house brought blessing. It reminded them DAILY of God's presence and goodness to Israel, His faithfulness, promises, covenant, power and glory. Inside the ark of the covenant were three items ...1. The two stone tablets of the law given to Moses - (God's Word in our homes.) 2. A jar of manna from Israel's wilderness wanderings - (God's provision in our homes.) 3. Aaron's budding staff - (God ordained leadership in our homes.) Each of these I believe should be represented in our homes, and when they are we too, like Obbed-Edom will be blessed. In his house God was acknowledged, valued and treasured. Jacob (who we read of earlier) valued the worship of God in his family - Genesis 35:3 - And let us arise, and go up to Bethel; and I will make there an altar unto God, who answered me in the day of my distress, and was with me in the way which I went. Is there an altar in our home? - Not a construction of gold or stone put a heart to love and worship God. 3. BUILD AN ARK OF SALVATION IN YOUR HOME Hebrews 11:7 - By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith. Noah did all he could to save his family from the impending judgment on the earth. He could not drag them into the ark - but he warned them and built their way of escape in his home. The salvation of our homes is of paramount importance. We cannot save our families only God can. But we can build in our homes what God has given us the design of and that is a home that always points our families to Jesus, the Savior. Our kids will make their own choices - but we must point them in the right way. One day my children will 'leave home' One day they will 'set up home' - But I pray that.... One day they will declare 'As for me and my house we will serve the Lord' So where do we begin? EXALT - God in your home. EXAMPLE - Christ likeness in your home. ENCOURAGE - Faithfulness in your home. EDUCATE - Your children in God's ways in your home. ESTABLISH - Godly values in your home.

"I cried unto God with my voice, even unto God with my voice; and he gave ear unto me." Psalm 77:1 (KJV)

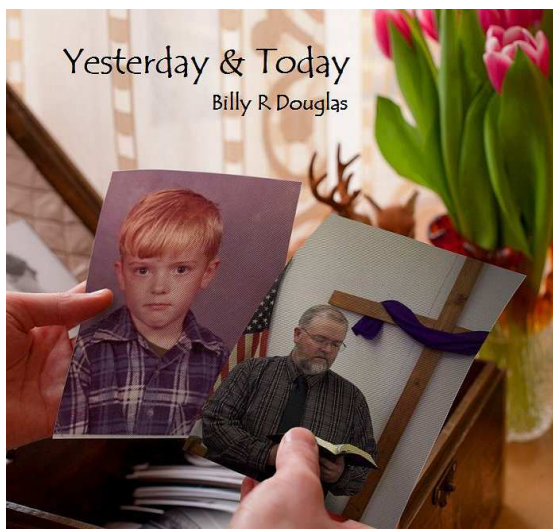
