He is not here, but is risen:...



And a woman having an issue of blood twelve years, which had spent all her living upon physicians, neither could be healed of any, Came behind him, and touched the border of his garment: and immediately her issue of blood stanched. And Jesus said, Who touched me? When all denied, Peter and they that were with him said, Master, the multitude throng thee and press thee, and sayest thou, Who touched

me? And Jesus said, Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me. And when the woman saw that she was not hid, she came trembling, and falling down before him, she declared unto him before all the people for what cause she had touched him, and how she was healed immediately. And he said unto her, Daughter, be of good comfort: thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace. Luke 8:43-48

Here we see the LORD in the midst of a "multitude" which in the Greek means a crowd, a press of people. And while all of this is going on He stops and says "Who touched me?" Isn't it interesting that we see here the crowd thronging and pressing Him yet Jesus only acknowledges the touch from this women with the issue of blood. It was so strange that Peter and the other disciples would act shocked that He would even ask such a question. What did cause Jesus to notice her out of all of the rest of the crowd? Now we know that she touched Him with her faith because He told her that her faith had made her whole BUT what brought her to that place? This women was to the point of desperation. She had tried every way that she knew of to get the answer she needed from the world...every doctor...every treatment that money could buy yet was no better as a matter of fact she was worst! She had done everything that she could to help herself. She was now at the end of her rope, oh but my friend there was HOPE at the end of her rope! She now turns her attention not on man, not on the world, not on SELF...but on the ONLY one who really had the answer to begin with. The world tries to convince man that the answer to our troubles can be found in the world...sadly much of the church today tries to convince us that the answer to our problems can be found WITHIN US by means of positive thinking, the champion within, name it and claim it whatever you want to call it all these things lead back to "self". REESIE'S RECIPES

Salad Dressing Rolls

2 cups self rising flour

2 Tbs. sugar

2 Tbs. salad dressing

1 cup milk

Combine all ingredients in mixing bowl and mix thoroughly. Pour into greased muffin pan. Bake at 425 until golden brown. Slice each roll in the center and slide in a thin slice of butter.

Grandmas Casserole

1 cup onion, chopped

1 green pepper, sliced 2 Tbs. butter

11/2 lbs. ground beef

1 tsp. seasoned salt

1/2 tsp pepper

1 Tbs. sugar

2 cans stewed tomatoes

1 (15oz) can tomato sauce

2 cups water

8oz. Package wide noodles

8oz. Mozzarella cheese, sliced

Preheat oven to 350. Saute onion and pepper in butter for 3 minutes. Add the meat and brown, drain off excess fat. Add salt, pepper, and sugar. Stir in tomatoes, tomato sauce, and water. Heat mixture to boiling, reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes. Layer uncooked noodles and meat mixture in casserole dish. Top with cheese. Make sure noodles are well covered. Cover pan with aluminum foil and bake for 45 minutes.

Jiffy Corn Casserole

1/2 cup butter or margarine melted

1 (8oz) can cream style corn

1 (8oz) sour cream

1 (8oz) can whole kernel corn, drained

2 eggs

1 pkg. jiffy corn muffin mix

Heat oven to 375. Grease 11/2 qt. to 2 qt. casserole dish. Combine butter and both corns. Blend in sour cream. Beat eggs and add to mixture along with muffin mix, mix together good. Bake 35-45 minutes May top with shredded cheese.

Peanut Butter Cream Cheese Pie

1 8oz. Package soft cream cheese

1/2 cup peanut butter

1 cup sifted powdered sugar

2 Tbs. milk

1 (4oz) cool whip, thawed

1 chocolate graham cracker crust

Chopped peanuts, optional

In a large mixing bowl combine cream cheese and peanut butter, beat with mixer until combined. Add powdered sugar and milk, beat until mixed well. Fold in cool whip. Spoon mixture into the pie shell and sprinkle with peanuts, if desired. Cover and chill in the freezer for 15 minutes.

<u>Faith</u>

Jesus is our mighty coming King! When He comes, what will He find? Oh, He will find sin and all manner of unrighteousness; that's for sure. He'll find backbiting, anger, bitterness, and unforgiveness. He'll find people who cherish their sin and people who chastise their sin; some who cling to a form of grace which is not biblical and some who cling to the things of this world. BUT...will Jesus find faith-true faith-when he returns? This is the very question Jesus asked while on earth. Remember Luke 18:8? "I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?" Friends, take great care that you don't have faith in yourself, like the Pharisee in Jesus' teaching right after this statement. Don't put your faith in your good works or your own righteousness. Your good works couldn't be done except God gave you the power and desire to do them. Ephesians 2:8-10 tells us of the importance of faith, your faith is the vehicle through which you receive God's grace; it's not your own righteousness, not your own works; you can't boast because it is the gift of God. Works are important because verse ten goes on to tell you that God has planned out these works for you to do. Unless you put the horse before the cart-put your faith before those works-they won't do you a bit of good. Remember, it's not a salvation OF works but it is a salvation THAT works! Take great care that you are not putting your faith in faith. Our faith must be in Jesus and in Him ALONE! In the parable prior to Jesus' asking if He will find faith when He returns to the earth, he tells of an unjust judge who does the right thing and states that God being a Righteous Judge most assuredly will do the right thing. It's not faith in our prayers, it's not faith in our faith, it's faith in the character of God who cannot lie, faith in His sovereignty, His holiness, His mercy and goodness. We must have faith IN HIM! Faith includes trust. Do you trust in God? I mean, do you REALLY trust God? In the rest of this chapter we find people bringing very young children to Jesus, a rich young ruler who had great riches as well as a great foundation in doctrine. He'd followed the commands of God but it would appear that his faith or trust was in his riches. I'm sure he thought he trusted in God but his actions showed that he held on to the things of this world. You and I may not have great riches but what do we have that we dare not let go of? It's been said that those great riches had him; what has you? Do you have enough faith IN JESUS to let go and let Him have control? To let Him be enough? To let Him see there is faith on this earth? The last two sections of this chapter in Luke give examples of faith. Let's take the last one first. Here we see a blind man who put his pride aside and cried out in faith to Jesus. He had nothing left, and neither must we—we must be poor in spirit—putting all aside and believing in the blessing of salvation from Jesus. People tried to shut this blind man up; he would not be silenced! He didn't care what others thought; all he wanted was Jesus. Jesus made him see. It was the blind man's faith IN Jesus that brought him sight, brought him blessing and salvation from darkness. Our faith must be IN Jesus. We must want Jesus to let us see more than we want to protect ourselves, more than we want our own comfort, more than anything. We must give up all so that we He can be all! Jesus told the blind man that it was his faith that saved him. Faith in himself? No! Faith in his faith-"If I only believe enough..." No! It was faith in Jesus. Just before this account we read of Jesus' teaching his disciples of His own death and resurrection. They didn't get it until much later but He taught them of it anyhow. He told them of who He was, "the Son of man." They had been witness to Jesus' holiness, mercy, greatness, etc. They had even declared that He was the Son of God. Then Jesus told them of what He must do. Jesus had faith that God would accomplish all that God promised; He shared these things with his disciples. As we celebrate Easter, let's celebrate the true Christ, the Christ of the Bible. We can't afford to have faith in ourselves, in faith itself, nor in a Jesus of our own making. We must have faith in the Biblical Jesus, in the Biblical God. We must see Him for who He is, not what we'd like Him to be. Then we must recognize what He has done. It's ONLY then that we will know how we should live. It's only then that our salvation will truly work itself out in our lives. May we walk the hard and narrow path that He has laid out for us that we might be the children of God and that He might receive glory by our lives. Press on IN HIM, friends. Press on faithfully in faith!

"Are You A Full Gospel Christian?" part 01

Summary: The apostle Paul declared the importance of preaching the full gospel. That included the manifestation of miracles, healings, gifts of the Holy Spirit, and similar demonstrations of the Spirit's power. Are you a "full gospel" Christian? Acts 20:27 - For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God. The timeless apostolic encouragement to those of us who handle God's word is to present it in its fullness, in its entirety. It was very important to Paul — and should be to us — to proclaim "all the counsel of God". Christian, ask yourself: do you regularly lay hands on the sick, expecting them to receive God's healing? If not, why not? Our fellow believers in the early Church did so in fulfillment of the timeless Great Commission. Mark 16:15-18 - And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. 16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. 17 And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; 18 They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover. Preachers, is yours a full gospel church? Are you regularly inviting those in your church to receive the mighty baptism with the Holy Spirit? If not, why not? This heaven-sent experience, the apostle Peter told his hearers in Acts 2:38-39 - Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. 39 For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call. In sum, are you preaching, teaching, and proclaiming what the apostle Paul called the full gospel? Let's see what that means. Romans 15:18-19 - For I will not dare to speak of any of those things which Christ hath not wrought by me, to make the Gentiles obedient, by word and deed, 19 Through mighty signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God; so that from Jerusalem, and round about unto Illyricum, I have fully preached the gospel of Christ. Paul was a full gospel preacher. He "proclaimed ... the whole will of God." Accompanied by signs, miracles, and Holy Spirit power, he "fully proclaimed the gospel." Let us also be "full Gospel" Christians. It will be evident by "what [we, like Paul] have said and done." The Scriptural word gospel means "good news". The Bible's mandate is that we preach not just some of God's good news, but all of it! What then are some of the main topics we should be emphasizing if we are to be biblical "full gospel" Christians? Acts 3:19 - Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord. Acts 4:12 - Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved. Preach repentance unto salvation in the name of Jesus Christ there is no other name, no other way. Acts 4:10 - Be it known unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by him doth this man stand here before you whole We can't receive salvation through good works or good intentions. It comes only through repentance and faith in Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Declare the "full gospel" message of the necessity of being born again. John 3:3-7 - Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. 4 Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born? 5 Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. 6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again. God's great salvation is "good news"! Acts 10:47-48 - Can any man forbid water, that these should not be baptized, which have received the Holy Ghost as well as we? 48 And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord. Then prayed they him to tarry certain days. Peter "ordered" them to be water baptized — no option — in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Declare the "full gospel" message of water baptism. Acts 1:8 - But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth...be sure and look for the conclusion to this teaching in next months issue of The Trumpet.

Simple, Powerful Faith!

"The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe." John 20:25 (KJV)

To all of us, there comes a time when faith is not enough. Circumstances may look dark, and to find a place of solace in Christ, seems hopeless, and often leaves our hearts wanting and in desperate straits. Have you often times wondered why, when we make a decision for Christ, there always seems to be so much adversity that comes against us? Could it be that God is testing us? Could it be that God wants to see what we're made of? Perhaps. I am sure that there are those who could argue a well thought-out discourse on the rudiments of Divine Testing. Yet, for our purposes of what I believe that the Lord wants us to focus in on for today - is simple; even basic. It comes down to the very core of our belief in Christ Himself and sometimes, unfortunately, what other people see of the Christ that is in us. Thomas, the disciple, was always the skeptic. In fact, he earned the name perhaps somewhat deservedly of "doubting Thomas". While other disciples had seen the risen Lord - Thomas, for whatever reason was not there when Jesus came to them. As the others tried to tell him that the Lord had risen just as He said... Thomas was having none of it. His reply was classic and is something we talk about in our youth meetings; Ministerial Retreats and of course, back home in our own sanctuary. Why? Because one of the things that is basic to the Christian faith, is the sum total of the power of who we are as Christians. One of the first things we learn is that seeing isn't always believing - yet the opposite is the ROCK (faith in Christ" on which Jesus built the church. Yet we find Thomas much like many of us today. You know what I'm talking about: we have to see results. We have to see God heal in order to believe that He can. They have to see their situation "turnaround" by morning for them to rely on this Christ of the Human Road. Thomas went so far as to say, "Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe." Sounds kind of morbid to say the least - but you would be surprised to hear some of the things I have seen people do - to escape the bounds of the finite to taste the intrinsic excellence of the Spirit. Why? TO BELIEVE! To have something to grab hold of even when life seems anemic and frail - never letting go, knowing now what lies beyond their grasp. When Jesus allowed Thomas the ability to trust his finger into the holes in his hands and feet, and his entire hand into His riven side... Thomas "got it"! He looked deep into the Lord's eyes and gave probably one of the greatest testimonies that ever came forth from his lips in just 5 words when he said, "My Lord and my God." Sometimes the most powerful answer to life's most far-reaching challenges to faith - is to simply believe.
