A Word to the Wise – An Introduction

“The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel;” Proverbs 1:1

The wisdom of Solomon was of world-renown. When the Queen of Sheba witnessed first-hand the wonder of his wisdom and wealth she was amazed to the uttermost. Here were her conclusions (I Kings 10:7-9): 1. She believed the reports regarding Solomon were greatly exaggerated; but her experience confirmed, “...behold, the half was not told me: thy wisdom and prosperity exceedeth the fame which I heard.” 2. Solomon’s people, due to his wisdom, were happy and blessed. 3. Because of Solomon’s great wisdom, it was understood that God is worthy of worship and the people of Israel were blessed.

When kings and queens longed to sit at the feet of Solomon, learning from and being amazed by him, why do so many Christians overlook the richness of these divinely inspired proverbs, treating them as little more than a collection of interesting sayings? Why do believers know Franklin’s “A stitch in time saves nine” better than many truths found in this book of wisdom? In the end, we often find the Wise man’s warning to be true: “They would none of my counsel: they despised all my reproof. Therefore shall they eat of the fruit of their own way, and be filled with their own devices.” (Pr. 1:30-31) You may ask, “What counsel have I ignored? What reproof?” I invite you to start reading through this amazing book each day; join us here in following months for answers.

Do you, like the Queen of Sheba, think I exaggerate the importance of this book? I remind you that Proverbs belongs to Holy Writ, that it is God-breathed, divinely inspired. Proverbs belongs to the category of “All scripture” which Paul said “is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.” (2 Tim 3:16-17)

Holy history tells us that Solomon’s wisdom originated in Heaven, given by the Hand of God because this young man humbled himself before the Almighty, asking for understanding and discernment. (I Kings 3:5-15) We should long for such understanding and discernment – prayerfully read and study this book.

This wisest of men is the son of the best of men, King David, a man after God’s own heart. David trusted God (example Ps. 71), the wisdom of such trusting was exemplified before Solomon, and it took hold both by divine decree and parental training. Having both learned from above and by parental example, Solomon passes this lesson on trust to us through Proverbs 3:5-7.

Our children would benefit better at the feet of Solomon, through the study of Proverbs, than to learn from a government school system that denies Biblical truth, wisdom, and in some cases, the existence of God. A school that teaches rebellion to God through evolution, LGBTQ+ indoctrination, heralds communism, and other anti-Biblical truths, can bring neither wisdom nor real knowledge to our children, for Solomon rightly states: “The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding.” (Pr. 9:10)

We, and future generations, are in desperate need of discernment, understanding and wisdom. The book of Proverbs, like any Scripture, is not to be judged by us; instead, it is to be the standard which judges us. We are simply called to believe and obey. Might these truths bind us, becoming a jewel to adorn us and a crown to identify us as princes of the Most High. Let us read from this book of Proverbs daily, memorize it with our children, and systematically study and teach them as though it is cherished wisdom from on high – for it is!

Sit at Solomon’s feet; learn from One who is wiser than Solomon. Gain understanding and wisdom regarding spiritual, physical, and political dangers. Gain knowledge, warning, and discernment, regarding love, family relationships, financial training, parenting, and much, much more.



The Importance of Standing on Truth (Pt. 2)

“Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.” Ephesians 6:13

Christ tells us to take up our cross daily and follow Him; His way is a holy way of bold truth. Paul calls the believer to stand having done all to stand in this evil day. Last month we asked the question, “What happens when a Christian neglects this sacred and sober duty of standing boldly on truth, diametrically opposing falsehood?” We said that the answer is found in Judges 17:11-13; it’s devastating to the believer (v. 11), gives the unbeliever a false sense of authority (v. 12), and gives the unbeliever a false sense of security, misrepresenting God and His Kingdom (v.13).

We also covered the fact that it’s devastating to the believer (v. 11) last month. Whenever a believer doesn’t stand in obedience and lives in compromise it affects their faith, their witness, and stunts their further growth in Christ. Our words and actions should leave no doubt to a watching world of where we stand. Stand boldly, having done all to stand. Second, verse 12 warns that our contentment with sin and silence in rebuking it gives the unbeliever a false sense of authority; for we read, “And Micah consecrated the Levite.” Micah’s consecration really meant nothing at all. Why? He had no authority from God to declare a renegade, mercenary Levite as set apart (consecrated) by God to the service of this idolatrous false religion. The Levite, by birth, belonged to God, set apart for His service. Through the Levite’s contented compliance Micah believed that he had the authority to do as he wished.

How often is our silence and lack of “having done all to stand in this evil day” seen as a contented compliance that emboldens the enemies of God, giving them, in their own eyes, authority to continually reject the authority of God, the Word of God, and even the existence of God? As a fire goes out both light and heat dissipate. Darkness has no power or authority over light and coldness is simply the lack of heat; yet as light and heat withdraw, darkness and cold take over. The same is true spiritually. When the light and warmth of holiness are ablaze within us there is no room for dark and cold. In Matthew chapter five Jesus said that we, as believers, are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Reader, we are meant to make a difference; when we go along to get along we are trying to hide our light under a bushel and our cleansing, preserving influence is lost.

Let me close this section with Psalm 119:105; “Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path.” Sometimes the world reacts violently to the light because we are shining it in their eyes instead of lighting their path. It’s also true that men love darkness because their deeds are evil; but we do not show people the way out of darkness by shining truth in their eyes so much as on their path, the destruction it leads to, and a better way.

Third, verse 13 shows that our silence, our lack of standing on truth and for truth, gives the unbeliever a false sense of security, misrepresenting God and His Kingdom. After the Levite was content to be unequally yoked (for a price) and after Micah usurped authority, consecrating the Levite, we read, “Then said Micah, ‘Now know I that the LORD will do me good, seeing I have a Levite to my priest.’” With the phrase “Now know I,” it would appear that he had known that his idol making and worshiping was sinful; prior to his hiring of the Levite he had fear of judgment. Apparently he knew that Levites had been set apart to the priesthood and ministry of the sanctuary; so now having acquired one he feels a sense of security, albeit a false one. The Levite neither stood on nor for the truth of the second commandment; “Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image.” His silence led to his active participation which led Micah to believe that the Lord would bless his false worship. In refusing to declare and define the difference between the holy and the profane, in refusing to stand in love for God and in compassion for wayward men, we lend a false sense of security that their sin against a holy God is okay. As part of the royal priesthood we need to recognize that our silence and lack of action not only gives a false sense of security but misrepresents our thrice holy God. We cannot afford to sit in silence. Paul asks, “How shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard?” and explains the importance of speaking the truth to meet man’s only true need, “So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.” Let us not be ashamed of the gospel but speak it clearly and winsomely, “for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth.”

Live holy. Stand boldly. Speak with love.

Reesie's Recipes



Strawberry Lasagna

- 2 lbs strawberries
- 2 sleeves graham crackers
- 1 (8oz) cream cheese, room temperature
- 1 (14oz) can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 (3.4oz) box instant cheesecake pudding
- 3 cups milk
- 1 (12oz) cool whip, divided

Wash, cut tops off of strawberries and slice them 1/4 inch thick and set aside. Line bottom of 13x9 baking dish with graham crackers and set aside. Combine cream cheese and sweetened condensed milk in a large bowl and beat well with a mixer until smooth and creamy. Add pudding mixes and milk then continue mixing on low for 4 to 5 minutes or until mixture starts to thicken. Fold in 2 cups of cool whip until smooth. Pour half of the cream cheese mixture over graham crackers. Arrange a single layer of strawberry slices over cream cheese mixture. Top strawberries with another layer of graham crackers then cover with remaining cream cheese mixture. Top cream cheese mixture with another layer of strawberry slices. Cover and refrigerate for 6 to 8 hours. When serving top with remaining cool whip. Crush remaining graham crackers and sprinkle crumbs over the top.

Sweet Hawaiian Crock-pot Chicken

- 2 lb chicken tenderloin chunks
- 1 cup pineapple juice
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/3 cup soy sauce

Combine all ingredients, cook on low in crock-pot for 6 to 8 hours.

Pineapple Lemonade

- 1 cup country time lemonade mix
- 3 cups water
- 1 (46oz) can pineapple juice, chilled
- 2 (12oz) cans Sprite

Combine all ingredients and chill. Garnish with fresh lemon slices when serving, if desired.

Baked Tortellini Casserole

- 1 (20oz) container of refrigerated or frozen cheese tortellini
- 1 lb ground beef
- 1 (24oz) jar of pasta sauce
- 8 (ounces) cream cheese (cubed)
- 1-2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1/2 cup grated or shredded

Cook the pasta a la dente according to the package directions; drain and set aside. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees and grease a 9x13 baking dish. In a large skillet, brown the ground beef with the seasoning of your choice (I use salt, garlic powder, pepper & Italian seasoning). Remove the excess grease from the browned beef and then stir in your tomato sauce and cream cheese. Simmer for a few minutes until the sauce is well incorporated. Gently toss your cooked tortellini in with the sauce mixture and then pour it into your casserole dish; Sprinkle with shredded mozzarella and parmesan. Bake uncovered in the center rack of your oven for about 20 minutes. Switch the oven to broil and continue baking for an additional 2-3 minutes or until the cheese starts to brown.

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Scars: The Unspoken Language



Our faithfulness in persecution will speak volumes for Christ to those who witness God's grace and love working through us and reaching out to our persecutors. Our words may fall on deaf ears but God's love shown through our actions and our scars of steadfastness will melt hearts as we point to our Saviour.

Henry Bosch relays this precious story of Adoniram Judson, the renowned missionary to Burma. This man of God endured untold hardships trying to reach the lost for Christ. For seven heartbreaking years he suffered hunger and privation. During this time, he was thrown in to Ava Prison and for seventeen months Adoniram was subjected to terrible mistreatment; yet he remained faithful to his Lord. As a result of this persecution, for the rest of his life he carried the ugly marks made by the chains and iron shackles that had so harshly bound him.

Undeterred, when Mr. Judson was released, he asked for permission to enter another province where he might continue preaching the gospel message of Jesus Christ. The godless ruler indignantly denied his request, saying, "My people are not fools enough to listen to anything a missionary might SAY, but I fear they might be impressed by your SCARS and turn to your religion.

When it's our turn to stand faithful for Christ, may we do so by His grace, no matter the cost. May we now begin to more frequently draw near to God, that He might fulfill His promise to draw near to us. Such drawing near must be a lifetime practice, not just a hard time shout for help. Afterall, love is the heart of the gospel.

John 14:6

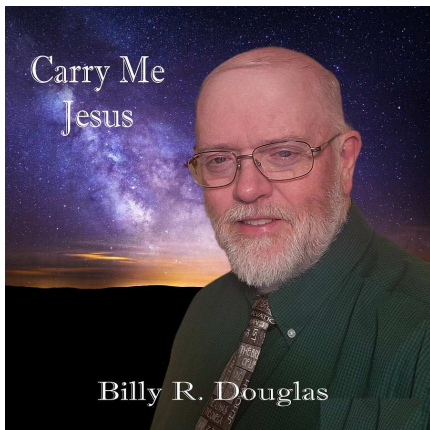

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A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: 1 Corinthians 1:10 Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.

Additional passages for Today: 1 Cor. 11:18; 12:25; Galatians 6:1 - 2; John 13:34; 15:17; 17:21-23

Thought for Today: If we focus on the gospel message of sharing God's love it is easier to be like-minded and avoid creating divisions among believers.

Story for Today: Mia, Emma, and Sophia sat quietly on the couch as they pondered the words that their Dad was sharing with them. It was typical in the Dagmeyer home to find both Mom and Dad sitting in the living room having a time of discussion with their three daughters in the evening. Mr. Dagmeyer felt it was very important to know what his girls had learned throughout the day, whether it was through intentional training or just what they had picked up on from what they saw and heard. Tonight the girls had been to Bible class at church and each had shared about the lesson their teacher had taught. This was an opportunity for the couple to clarify and make sure the girls understood the truths of the Bible. Sophia had told them about her lesson and had added that some of the girls in her class had also been talking about a show they had seen on TV. It was a secular show but it seemed like everyone was watching it. Mr. Dagmeyer was cautious as he chose his words carefully. He explained that the lure of the world was strong. Many things that please the senses, while they may not be sinful, can lead a person away from the presence of God. He reminded the girls of the Bible verses they had just read in 1 Corinthians 12:25-26 which said, "That there should be no schism in the body; but that the members should have the same care one for another. And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it; or one member be honoured, all the members rejoice with it." He explained that watching ungodly things allow seeds of the world to be planted in our hearts. He reminded the girls that it is the responsibility of all believers to be ready at all times to speak of Christ, building up other believers and offering opportunities for salvation to the lost. He encouraged the whole family to spend their time focusing on knowing Christ and sharing His love with others, rather than spending time discussing things that would draw themselves and others away from God. He explained that if every believer were to continuously share the love of God, the gospel message, and the hope that can be found in Christ, there would not be time to focus on ungodly things. He made sure that everyone understood that it wasn't kind to belittle others even if they didn't agree with what they were doing. The family took some time as each of the girls followed their parents' example and prayed for more diligence in keeping their minds focused on Christ. They prayed for the girls in Sophia's class that God would convict and lead them to a closer walk with Him. Sophia made a plan to call each of the girls over the next few days to encourage them with Scripture and let them know she was praying for them. She also planned to take every opportunity to let her friends hear about the love of God.

Questions for Today: When you hear or experience things that go against your Christian beliefs, are you quick to criticize? Do you encourage your brothers and sisters in Christ to be better Christians or do you knock them down as you let them know they are "less of a follower of Christ" because of what they have done or said? All believers must focus on Christ and share the gospel message of His love. Do you take every opportunity? Will you seek to begin to take opportunities today?

Prayer for Today: Heavenly Father, we thank You for Your love and for allowing us to spread Your love story to the lost in this world. Thank You for giving us Your Word, the Holy Bible, to let us know You better. Please help us to encourage one another and be unified in You. Help us to let the world see You by our love for each other. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
