Reginald Heber was a very accomplished poet, but most of his poems weren't published until after his death. This long-time favorite hymn written by him has its unique beginnings in both Testaments of the Bible. When Isaiah was given a peak into Heaven (6:1-5), he saw the Lord sitting on a throne high and lifted up and he heard the seraphim singing praise: "Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory." John, the Beloved apostle, while exiled on Patmos, witnessed the four beasts give glory and honor and thanks to God upon the throne saying, "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come." Can you hear these distant, thunderous melodies being sung before God all day and night? Don't just stand in awe, but join in song. "Oh that men would praise the LORD for his goodness, and for his wonderful works to the children of men!" (Psalms 107:8) Yes, He is worthy of praise!

As we've seen, this hymn transcends Heaven with praise— begun by the seraphim – coming down to earth as men have been echoing these words with a voice of praise. Dr. A.W. Tozer once wrote: "I can safely say on the authority of all that is revealed in the Word of God that any man or woman on this earth who is bored and turned off by worship is not ready for heaven."

With a puzzled look on his face he replied, "What's God gonna' do with a dead cat?"

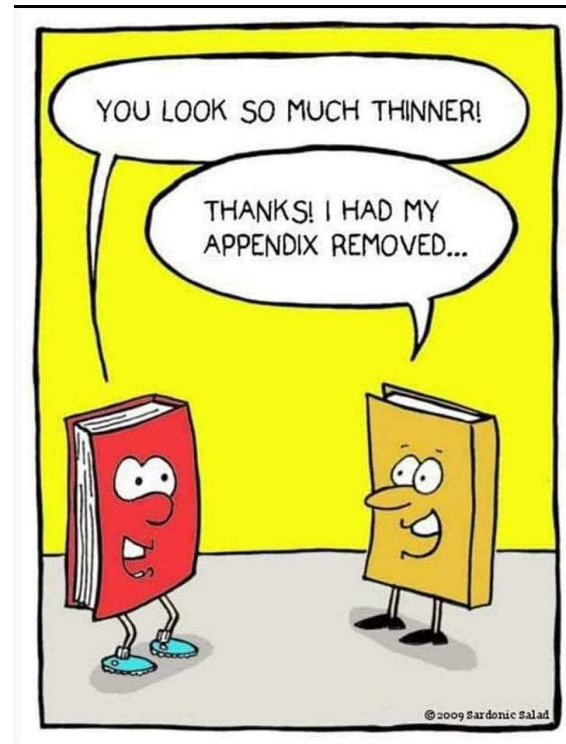
Free Vacation

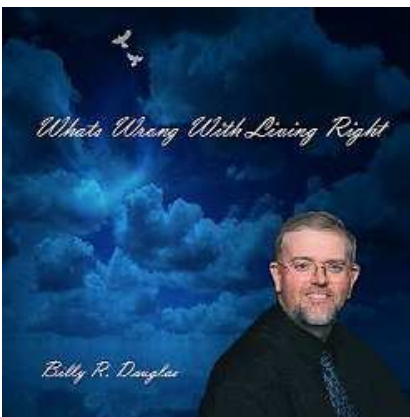

A Word to the Wise – Prov. 8 – Wisdom’s Wail pt. 1

“Doth not wisdom cry? and understanding put forth her voice?” Proverbs 8:1

We will spend at least two sessions on this chapter. First, we want to admit that there are several sources which surround us, crashing in on our senses, presenting themselves as wisdom. Some call out to our carnal senses as did the harlot of chapter seven, others appeal to “common sense” and how to get ahead in this world (ch. 2), still others promise that their way will meet some other temporal or spiritual need. Second, **DO NOT BE DEECEIVED!** ALL fleshly “wisdom,” which runs contrary to Divine wisdom, leads to death; it brings no more fulfillment than the devil’s promise to our first parents, Adam and Eve, did. Hear Wisdom’s wail, follow her instruction, and find real life!

Sadly, even within the church, today, there is much that feigns “wisdom from above,” but is little more than pride and passion putting on a mask of “religious” zeal in order to place oneself at the forefront position of receiving glory, laud, and honor or as an attempt to cover or promote one’s own sin as acceptable. It is an affront to and an attack on true holiness which, if found in a different time and place, would crucify Christ upon the cross or make martyrs of men who are wholly dedicated to our Lord. (I urge you to read James 3:13-16) So, how does one differentiate between that true wisdom from above and that which is merely deception? James succinctly teaches us how to identify “wisdom that is from above” in James 3:17. “But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.”

Let’s apply our mind to these qualities of Heavenly wisdom (Prov. 8) and commit our hearts to that Divine instruction which must be followed and leads to life.

First, divine wisdom is pure. Above anything else, it is pure, not melded with man’s desire, comfort, or his wisdom. Ralph Wardlaw admonishes, “And in the character and conduct of him who has this ‘wisdom from above,’ there will ever be a strict adherence—in self-vigilance and prayer—in his thoughts, desires, words, and actions, to the purity of the standard; a careful shunning of every admixture of the impurities of error in his faith, and the impurities of unhallowed passion and unholy practice in his life.”

Then, wisdom is peaceable. Purity ALWAYS takes precedence; purity must never be sacrificed for the sake of peace. Too often, truth is sacrificed at the banqueting table of unity (peace). Again, Wardlaw gives godly counsel: “If we cannot get others to be at peace with us, otherwise than by yielding up our convictions of truth and duty, -- still, amidst our firm and steadfast adherence to both, we ourselves must maintain the spirit of peace and love. If they lose their temper, we must seek to keep ours; for this wisdom is, in the next place--”

Gentle: one who possesses truth is calm and forbearing, even in the midst of being mistreated by those who rebuff divine wisdom. Such gentleness of spirit naturally leads to the next characteristic possessed by the holder of wisdom. He is – Easily entreated: When wisdom from above is truly ours, we desire, more than anything, to be readily accessible to others that they may know and be possessed by this divine trait. Thus we ready to meet an offender half-way, “willingly softened by the tone of penitence, and delighting to be again at one with him.” “Full of mercy and good fruits”: Wisdom that is from above “dwells in you richly” through the word of God, opening the floodgates of mercy within, producing an abundance of good fruits without. We will “not love in word only, but in deed and in truth.” Such wisdom within moves the Word of God from merely principle to action – helping, loving, teaching, sharing, feeding, visiting, etc. Without partiality: Wisdom’s call is universal and those who have been blessed by this divine trait show gentleness, accessibility, mercy, and good fruits universally, without respect to persons, for the sake of Christ. Without hypocrisy: There can be no wisdom from above where there is hypocrisy, self-promotion, and Pharisee-like pride. As Wardlaw warns, “The inside must correspond with the out, and the outside with the in. What wisdom can there be, in putting on an appearance, which the Searcher of hearts sees and knows to be appearance only?”

Do you have real wisdom (from above) or a cheap substitute that soothes you momentarily but leaves you empty? I urge you to honest, objective, self-examination.



Who's Fooling Who?

“The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.” Psalms 14:1

Seems as though many people enjoy April Fools' Day; they like to trick people into believing something that just isn't so. My wife enjoys telling of the time she heated up her grandmother's tea cup on April 1, by pouring boiling hot water into it. She then dumped it out, refilled it with cold water, and handed it to grandma. Feeling the hot cup, grandma had no idea that she was NOT receiving the hot water she'd requested. She'd been “fooled.”

Putting good-natured pranks aside, we need to consider seriously the number of “good” people, found across this land and sitting in churches, who are fooling themselves and others, but they can never fool God. These of whom I am speaking would never utter the words, “There is no God.” But David, by the Holy Ghost's direction, proclaims IT IS THE HEART that whispers these words while their bodies shout their denial. With their lips they may proclaim a belief in a Living God, pray to Him, or even witness about His great love; but their actions betray the true belief of their heart: there is no God. Sometimes they only try to fool others, but O the danger when we fool ourselves.

There are several groups of people with atheistic hearts, but they can be summed up and lumped together by simply looking at what kind of works they are doing. Some have been taught that they only must say a prayer and agree that Jesus is God's Son, and then they can go merrily on their way – no change. Others have a stronger desire to relate to their sin and cling to it than to be cleansed, transformed, and forsake their sin, relating to and clinging to their Saviour. There are some who are fools at heart who believe that repentance, obedience, and doing “good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them” is simply a salvation of works. Salvation is by faith – NOT BY WORKS – but a saving faith transforms/changes you and brings you to good works which bear much fruit. We are called to repent, obey, love God with all that we are and our neighbor as our self, to be conformed to the image of God's Son, to be holy as God is holy, to walk worthy of the Lord, to redeem the time, and the list goes on. We are called to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Jesus, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, no one comes to the Father but by Him! Take a good look at yourself: Are you corrupt or holy? Are your works abominable or godly?

Of course there are those who do, with their mouth, deny that there is a God. When you run across them, here's an idea:

An infidel was lecturing one day on the unreasonableness of salvation just by believing on Jesus. He then invited anyone with a question to come to the platform. Immediately a man, who before his conversion had been a notorious drunkard in the town, stepped up. Without asking a question he coolly and quietly peeled an orange and slowly began to eat it. The exasperated infidel lecturer thundered out, “Man, stop acting foolish and tell me your question!” The man finished his orange and looking him straight in the eye, “Then stop criticizing the Gospel until you too have tasted it. I have tasted it and know that it is the power of God which is able to transform a Hell-bound drunkard into a saint.” And pointing to his townsfolk he concluded, “And those can testify what it has done for me. Don't find fault with something you never tasted. Meeting adjourned!”

Dear Reader, each of us must taste and see that the Lord is good. If we have tasted the sweet fruit of the Gospel, that sweetness (which is Christ) transforms us. Our sins are forgiven and obedience isn't a chore because we love Him who first loved us. Don't be fooled in April or any other time!

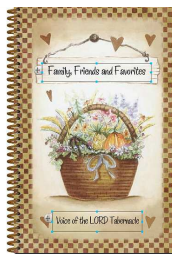
Reesie's Recipes



Sprite Biscuits

- 1/2 stick butter
- 2 cups Bisquick
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup Sprite

Put butter in 8x8 glass baking dish. Put in oven and preheat oven to 400. Butter will melt while oven preheats. In a large bowl combined Bisquick, sour cream, and Sprite. Mix ingredients together well but do not over mix. On a floured surface form biscuits. Remove dish from oven. Add biscuits to the dish. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden brown. Brush tops with butter after removing from oven.



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Pineapple Bundt Cake

- 1 cup crushed pineapple
- 1 stick butter melted
- 3 eggs
- 3/4 cup pineapple juice
- 1 box yellow cake mix

Preheat oven to 350. Mix all cake ingredients. Pour into bundt pan and cook on 350 for 40 minutes

Glaze

- 1/2 stick melted butter
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 3/4 cup pineapple juice

Let cake cool. Poke holes in cake and pour most of the glaze over the cake. Let cake set for 10 minutes. Turn out onto plate and drizzle remaining glaze over cake.

Crockpot Beef Tips & Gravy

- 1 packet Au Jus Gravy
- 1 packet Lipton Onion Soup mix
- 1 packet ranch mix
- 1 jar sliced mushrooms or fresh sliced
- Stew meat
- 1 stick butter

Place stew meat and mushrooms in crock pot. Pour Au Jus, Lipton onion soup mix and ranch packet over the meat. Place stick of butter on top and cover. Cook in crockpot on low, 4-6 hours.

Power Over The Spirit

“There is no man that hath power over the spirit to retain the spirit; neither hath he power in the day of death: and there is no discharge in that war; neither shall wickedness deliver those that are given to it.”

- Ecclesiastes 8:8

This month we continue looking at the Preacher’s teaching on death and our inability to escape it. Solomon states that no one has power “to retain the spirit”, meaning that no one has the ability to keep themselves from dying. He’s discovered during his search that no matter how much wealth and influence he amasses, he doesn’t have that power during the course of his life and he now acknowledges that he will continue to be powerless on the day that he dies. This phrase “there is no discharge in that war” is here to paint a picture - that none of us have hope of escaping from the war between life and death, and there is no way for us to escape our physical deaths. There is only one way for us to escape death and that is through accepting Jesus Christ as our Savior - this is not something that Solomon would have been aware of, given that Jesus wouldn’t be born for another 1,000 years, but it is something that is available to all of us now. We still have to suffer from physical death, we are still powerless to retain our breath when it comes time for us to die, but when we place our faith in Jesus we are able to live eternally in heaven.

Solomon concludes this verse by stating that those that are wicked will suffer the same fate - their wickedness will not protect them from this universal experience. All will die, and all will go to the grave. The difference between the wicked and those that are in Christ is that the wicked are not going to experience eternal life, instead they will have to suffer eternal torment.

How Rich Are You?

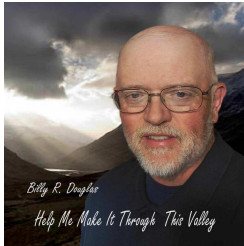

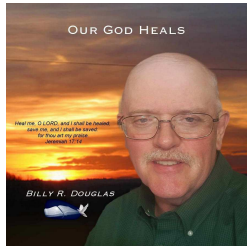
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REMEMBER THE WORKS OF THE LORD
