Story Behind The Song

I Have Decided To Follow Jesus

'I Have Decided to Follow Jesus' is a Christian hymn originating from India. The lyrics are based on the last words of a martyred man in Garo, Assam: Nokseng stood faithful as his family and then he himself died. Indian missionary, Sadhu Sundar Singh, is credited for putting these words, spoken by faith, into the hymn as we know it.

Due to a great revival in Wales, about 150 years ago, many missionaries came to north-east India to spread the Gospel in a region known as Assam, where there were hundreds of tribes who were primitive and aggressive head-hunters. One of these headhunters, Nokseng, his wife and two children were converted by some missionaries from the American Baptist Missions. Nokseng's faith was very contagious and many villagers began to accept Christianity.

Greatly angered, the village chief summoned all the villagers and called upon Nokseng and his family to renounce their faith in public or face execution. Moved by the Holy Spirit, he said, "I have decided to follow Jesus."

Enraged, the chief ordered his archers to arrow down the two children. As both boys lay twitching on the floor, the chief asked, "Will you deny your faith? You have lost both your children. You will lose your wife too."

Nokseng replied, "Though no one joins me, still I will follow." The chief was now furious and ordered his wife to also be arrowed down. In a moment she joined her two children in death. The village chief asked for the last time, "I will give you one more opportunity to deny your faith and live." In the face of death, the former headhunter gave these final memorable lines: "The cross before me, the world behind me. No turning back."

Nokseng, like the rest of his family, was shot dead, but, in the midst of death, a miracle began to take place. The chief who had ordered the killings was moved by the faith of this man. He wondered, "Why should this man, his wife and two children die for a Man who lived in a far-away land on another continent some 2,000 years ago? There must be some remarkable power behind the family's faith, and I too want to taste that faith."

Suddenly, in a confession of faith, the chief declared, "I too belong to Jesus Christ!" When the crowd heard the chief's personal declaration of Christianity, the whole village accepted Christ as their Lord and Saviour.




And so goes the call of Jesus to all of mankind, come unto me! This blind man who had laid by the wayside begging day after day, in his old, tattered, beggars garments.

<u>A Word to the Wise – God Calls ALL the Shots – Proverbs 16:1-6 part 01</u>

"All the ways of a man are clean in his own eyes; but the LORD weigheth the spirits." Pro 16:2

In a very general sense, these verses clearly teach our total dependence upon God for everything. Even in writing those words, I am very aware that many of you who just read them may be giving whole-hearted mental ascent to them with a "Duh, of course that's true, Steve."

Yet, a word to the wise would press us to give serious thought, beyond the generalities, as to what exactly "total dependence upon God for EVERYTHING" might entail. As I've thought on these verses for the past month, I've been amazed at how man's free will is given the space to move within the boundaries of God's sovereignty, thereby given room to roam but always held accountable to a holy God who calls ALL the shots. God is the holy standard and declares what is righteous and what is unrighteous.

In other words, God declares the pure ways of holiness and draws men to Christ, but He neither forces men into the way of holiness nor into the way of sin. In giving men the desire of their hearts, God will move them along the route they have chosen, while still drawing and calling them to the way of the cross – the way of Christ – giving them opportunity to repent and follow "holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." Yet, should they refuse, remaining willful and impenitent sinners, they, not God, have made themselves wicked and will find themselves facing a sinner's hell for all eternity. And yet, God, in His great mercy, provides an atonement from sin through Jesus, His only begotten Son. Through fearing God – having a filial reverence for Him, thereby desiring to neither anger nor displease Him – men will depart from that which is evil. (John Wesley says, "They are kept from abusing pardoning mercy, and from returning to folly or wickedness.")

Verse 2 encapsulates the whole of a man – his preparations, his words, his thoughts, his deeds, his interactions, relationships, choices, ALL his ways. Whatever we do, we feel right/clean in our doing them. We justify a great number of things, excusing them as right, based on the actions of others.

Sometimes we justify our actions by the fact that everyone else is doing it or that it's been made legal by the courts of man. Who hasn't heard their mother say something like: "If everyone else were jumping off a cliff, would you too?" or "That's up to their parents, you're my child and we're not doing that in our house." Regardless of what man's courts may decide, we have been created by God, the courts of heaven have already ruled what's righteous and what's not. God calls the shots and we must deal with His rules. Whether we honor Him as the Heavenly Fa-ther He is or not, we will be judged by what He has declared.

Other times we justify our actions by response to what someone has done to us; we assume that their wrongful actions give us permission to "do as they've done unto us" or pay them back, regardless of how ungodly that is. In reality, it only hurts our relationships, destroys our witness, and changes us (often more than we realize) into bitter people. It shows a lack of trust in God and reveals the true condition of our heart. Most importantly, it hinders our growth in Christ and hurts our relationship with Him. Micah 6:8 tells us what God expects from us: Do justly. LOVE MERCY. Walk HUMBLY with our God. To respond in an ungodly manner, to not turn the other cheek, to not allow God to bring His own vengeance to the situation is to be pride-filled, not humble.

How does God call the shots here? How will He weigh the spirits? Jesus tells us: First, to love God with ALL that you are and, secondly, to love others as you love yourself. The Judge of all the earth also told us to "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven..."

You can buck God's system, but He calls the shots. His way is the only winning way; all others "shall not be unpunished."

The Master Planter

"Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through sanctification of the Spirit, unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace unto you, and peace, be multiplied." (1 Pet. 1:1-2)

It's April, a time when people start planting their gardens or at least start planning what they'll plant and where they'll plant it. Some will pour over seed catalogs while others will go to their local store and choose seed off the rack. Still others will plant seeds in little containers, looking forward to transplanting them into the ground.

Did you know that God is like a Master Gardener and He pours over His catalog of people, obedient believers, to see where He can best use them? Friends, certain seeds and plants do better in particular soils, shades of sunlight, and water; God's people with their own temperaments, abilities, degrees of longsuffering and charity will do best when they, in cheerful obedience, "bloom where they are planted." Can we simply trust that God knows best and will work all things "together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose"?

Let's take a quick look at Peter's first verse, "to the strangers scattered." Friends, every true believer is a stranger here on earth. This isn't our home, we don't truly belong here, except as being able to point others to Jesus and to show God's love to others, while praising Him in all situations. We will either grow a root of bitterness that comes from feelings of anger and self-pity as we cry, "It's not fair;" or we will bloom like flowers in a garden that blend their hues in worship to the Lord. Regardless our circumstance, God has shown His goodness in giving us life and a place to serve Him, and breath to offer Him praise.

Do you see that word "scattered"? The Greek word for scattered literally means "to sow through." It's like when a farmer sows seed in a field by hand; he flings it everywhere. When Jesus told the parable of the four soils, He began: "Behold, a sower went forth to sow; And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the way side... Some fell upon stony places...some fell among thorns... other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit..." (Matt. 13:3-8).

Depending on where we have landed, we might feel that God has indiscriminately sown us to the wind, much like the feeling we get in Jesus' parable. We may wonder if God even knows where we are and what we are going through. Sometimes during affliction or persecution we may feel that we are forgotten. Other times, we may feel that the task of faithfulness is too hard for us because of where we are and what we are going through – BUT WAIT!

Pay close attention to the first word of that second verse – ELECT – yup, that's the one. In the original, it's in the first verse; it means "chosen." God hadn't forgotten His seeds nor where He planted them in Peter's day and He hasn't forgotten where He's planted you! God, the Master Planter, poured over His "seed catalog" and specifically chose you to be "planted where you are" because He uniquely created you for His good purpose, to bring Him glory where you can do Him the most good. You are a temporary resident ("stranger"), representing God where you've been selectively "scattered," to call others to salvation and sanctification to this end: That God will be rightly worshiped and greatly glorified.

The remainder of verse two should encourage and energize us; it shows how the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost has called, enlivened, and strengthened us for the task of faithful obedience. It's by His grace and strength that we can flourish where we are planted – not simply survive – FLOURISH! As always, we have a choice; will we bloom with praise and fruitfulness where we are planted, depending on our great God, or will we, due to tribulation or persecution or because of the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches, become unfruitful and offended?

Cowboy Baked Beans

1 lb ground beef 1 medium yellow onion, diced 1 medium green bell pepper, diced 1 cup ketchup 1 tsp mustard 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed 2 tsp Worcestershire sauce 2 (15 oz) cans pork and beans (do not drain) salt & black pepper, to taste 1 TBS butter

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9 x 13 baking dish with butter. In deep skillet brown up ground beef until no longer pink. Add in onion and bell pepper and cook until softened. Drain excess grease. Add in ketchup and stir to combine. Add in mustard, Worcestershire, and brown sugar. Stir to combine. Taste for seasoning and season with salt & black pepper to taste. Add in pork and beans with the juice. Stir carefully to combine. Pour baked beans & ground beef mixture into prepared baking dish and smooth evenly. Cover and seal dish with foil. Bake in preheated oven for 45 minutes.

Beef Tips & Mushroom Gravy

2 lbs Beef tips or stew meat
1 envelope Lipton beefy onion soup mix
2 cans sliced mushrooms
2 cans cream of mushroom soup

1 can beefy mushroom soup

1 small jar Heinz beef gravy

1 pkg Au jus gravy mix

Preheat oven to 250. Place beef tips In baking pan. Sprinkle beefy onion soup mix over the top of beef. Add mushrooms to pan. In large bowl mix other ingredients together. Pour over meat and mushrooms. Cover with aluminum foil. Bake on 250 for 5 to 6 hours. Serve with noodles or mashed potatoes.

Easy Melt In Your Mouth Biscuits...

2 cups White Lily self rising flour1 cup heavy whipping cream1/2 stick salted butter

Preheat oven to 500 degrees. Mix, pat out biscuits on floured surface. Add butter in an iron skillet or glass baking dish. Place in oven to melt butter. When butter is melted add biscuits. Bake 10 to 12 minutes. Brush with melted butter.

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. James 5:16





Thought for Today: The godly will follow the law of the Lord. They will keep it and seek it with their whole heart. Those who do not keep it and seek it with their whole heart will do iniquity and will not be godly.

Story for Today: Albert finished the paper with a quick glance to make sure he had finished the last sentence and gathered up his books, stuffing them back into the backpack as he rushed to leave the library. It wasn't that the library was closing or anything, he just wanted to be done and get to the gym to hopefully catch a few of the guys, so he could get in a game of 3 on 3. School was not the only area of his life that Albert struggled to give his all. However easy basketball was to give 100% of himself, studying and applying himself with other disciplines was twice as hard. Coach Mitchel often reminded the guys that basketball wouldn't be forever, but the character they learned on the court could carry them further than they might imagine. After a couple of hours of play, the guys all decided to call it a night. Troy walked out the door with Albert and asked him if he needed a ride to youth group tonight. To know, he needed to read and listen. He would be blessed and be able to be a blessing.

What is most important in your life? Would others know to go to you in times of trouble, recognizing that you seek after God with your whole heart?
