

## Story Behind The Song - I Am Resolved

This month we will be looking at a rousing hymn of unwavering commitment to Jesus, rejecting worldly allurements, and choosing to follow Him through the words of Scripture and the promptings of the Holy Ghost. Of course, I am speaking of that grand Christian hymn of resolution entitled I Am Resolved. Within this issue of the Trumpet is an incredibly well-written article by Sis. Nancy Willis that is complementary to this hymn and also gives a strong call to determined resolution of hearing and obeying God. Please be sure to look for it, read it, and give it serious thought. When Christ calls, may we be resolved to walk in faithful, unhindered obedience.

Palmer Hartsough was born on May 7, 1844 in Redford, Michigan and crafted the lyrics to this grand hymn (I Am Resolved) as well as texts for over a thousand other hymns. Musically gifted, Palmer taught music throughout various states, finally landing in Illinois where he opened a music studio. In 1839, he joined the Fillmore Brothers Company in Cincinnati, Ohio writing lyrics for their musical compositions.

Six years later, Palmer Hartsough was called upon to write I Am Resolved when James Fillmore, Sr. wanted a hymn for the Ohio delegation to take with them to the World Endeavor Convention in San Francisco. Fillmore put his hand to writing the hymn initially, but felt that his attempt needed refinement in order to reach a broader audience. So, he turned it over to Hartsough.

Luke 9:23-26 shares with us Christ's admonition and warnings. The call to take up one's cross is certainly a call to being resolved. "And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: but whosoever will lose his life for my sake, the same shall save it. For what is a man advantaged, if he gain the whole world, and lose himself, or be cast away? For whosoever shall be ashamed of me and of my words, of him shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he shall come in his own glory, and in his Father's, and of the holy angels."

Take note that Jesus is addressing all people; it's to be the norm for Christianity. It's not a call to some sect of "super-Christians." Such was Palmer Hartsough's call for all who would claim the name of Christ, to boldly sing while resting in the power of the Holy Ghost: "I am resolved!"

Vs. 1: I am resolved no longer to linger, Charmed by the world's delight,  
Things that are higher, things that are nobler, These have allured my sight.

Vs. 2: I am resolved to go to the Savior, Leaving my sin and strife;  
He is the true One, He is the just One, He hath the words of life.

Vs. 3: I am resolved to follow the Savior, Faithful and true each day;  
Heed what He sayeth, do what He willeth, He is the living way.

Vs. 4: I am resolved to enter the kingdom, Leaving the paths of sin;  
Friends may oppose me, foes may beset me, Still will I enter in.

Vs. 5: I am resolved, and who will go with me? Come, friends, without delay,  
Taught by the Bible, led by the Spirit, We'll walk the heav'nly way.

Have you resolved these things? If not, follow the call of the chorus:

Chorus: I will hasten to Him, hasten so glad and free; Jesus, greatest, highest, I will come to Thee.

**Word to the Wise – Pride’s Dangers - 03**

““Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:” Phil. 2:5

One is not immune from temptation to the sin of pride just because one is saved; that truth is just as real for the sanctified individual, too. For Christians, the temptation to pride is many-faceted, even as it is for those who haven’t humbled themselves unto Jesus and His way, yet. I hesitate to begin listing ways in which Christians fall into pride, for fear that one might consider it an all-inclusive list – thereby feeling a false sense of security if they don’t see themselves within this list.

Perhaps we feel a slight twinge of pride in the amount of Scripture we know or have memorized or is easily accessed by our mind for the win during the big Bible trivia game. Maybe you “notch” your Bible to signify how many people you’ve witnessed to or won to Jesus – much like the gun slingers in the old west who “notched” their guns. There are those who take pride in their modest dress or the bun they wear on the top of their head. Are you a Sunday School teacher that secretly wells up in pride as your students thank you for being such a great teacher? The same could be asked of talented preachers or those pastors with larger congregations. Maybe one area we don’t think much about, but should, is having pride in our own denomination or group of denominations which are similar to our own.

John Wesley had strong thoughts regarding the last of these on our “Christian pride list.” Quoting from Calvinism Calmly Considered: “Is it not the duty of every Arminian Preacher, First, never, in public or in private, to use the word Calvinist as a term of reproach; seeing it is neither better nor worse than calling names? – a practice no more consistent with good sense or good manners, than it is with Christianity? Secondly, to do all that in him lies to prevent his hearers from doing it, by showing them the sin and folly of it?” Of course, John Wesley gave the same exhortation to Calvinist preachers and followers as well.

Jesus’ words in John 17:21 tell us that all believers are to be one so that “the world may believe that thou hast sent me.” Of course, there will be disagreements, but that is why the Apostle Paul calls us to rebuke, improve, and exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. (2 Tim. 4:2)

Let me close with some words on pride from John Wesley’s Christian Perfection:

“The first advice I would give those who have been saved from sin by grace is to watch and pray continually against pride. For it is pride not only to ascribe what we have to ourselves, but also to think we have what we do not. One man, for instance, ascribed his knowledge to God and therefore was humble. But then he thought that he had more knowledge than everyone else which is dangerous pride. We often think we have no need of anyone’s advice or reproof. Always remember, much grace does not imply much enlightenment. We may be wise but have little love, or we may have love with little wisdom. God has wisely joined us all together as parts of the body so that we cannot say to one another, ‘I have no need of you.’

“Even to imagine that those who are unsaved cannot teach you is a very great and serious mistake. Dominion is not found in grace. Not observing this has led some into many mistakes and certainly into pride. Beware of even the appearance of pride. Let there be in you that lowly mind which was in Christ Jesus. Be clothed with humility. Let modesty appear in all your words and actions.

“One way to do this is to own any fault we have. If you have at any time thought, spoken, or acted wrong, do not refrain from acknowledging it. Never dream that this will hurt the cause of God—in fact, it will further it. Be open and honest when you are rebuked and do not seek to evade it or disguise it. Rather, let it appear just as it is and you will thereby not hinder but adorn the gospel.”



“Not So, Lord!”

“And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?” Luke 6:46

In the key verse above, Jesus makes an excellent point, for if He is indeed our Lord, whatever He says we must resolve to do. We aren't to “seek the Lord's will” so we can simply consider it. If we merely weigh the Lord's will/command against our own, or any other thing, instead of being resolved to unconditional obedience, then we have made ourselves the master.

You may feel that I have stated the above too strongly, but have I? The role of the master is to rule and there can only be one master.

In the few verses following Christ's question, Jesus tells of the safety and stability of those who respond to His words with unconditional obedience: “He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock.” (v. 48)

Jesus also warned of the condition and end of the life of one who simply hears His will but doesn't do it: “But he that heareth, and doeth not, is like a man that without a foundation built an house upon the earth; against which the stream did beat vehemently, and immediately it fell; and the ruin of that house was great.” (v. 49)

Either we will be the master of our own life or we will put our lives into the hands of Jesus, allowing Him to be master/Lord. We cannot have it both ways; if He is Lord, we must be resolved to do what He says.

I read the following account in the May-June 2025 issue of *Beside the Still Waters* (June 19). It well illustrates the necessity of giving lordship to Jesus:

Many years ago, a young woman was deeply stirred by a sermon that called the listeners to make Jesus their Lord and Master. Afterward, she came to the minister and said, “That message is inescapable. It corners me. I can do nothing but make Him Lord. But there is a problem, and it is that I don't want to be a missionary overseas. If I allow Jesus Christ to be Lord of my life, do you think I'll have to be a missionary and sail across the ocean?”

The minister opened his Bible to Acts 10 and read the verse that says, “Rise, Peter; kill, and eat,” along with Peter's response, “Not so, Lord.” Turning to the woman, the minister said, “A slave cannot dictate to his master. He is either 'Lord' or 'not so.' To say, 'Not so, Lord' is a contradiction.” Handing the young woman a pencil he said, “Go into that room and decide. Don't leave until you can cross out the words 'Not so' and leave the word 'Lord.’”

The young woman fought a hard battle, but finally it was won. The minister looked at her Bible and saw the tear-stained page in Acts with the words “Not so” crossed out. One word remained: “Lord.” With a glad look in her eyes, the young woman said, “Anywhere, anytime, any cost.” As she left, the minister heard her whisper, “Lord, Lord, Lord.”

Sometimes it's fear that keeps us from unconditional obedience; sometimes it's our own selfish desires. Better to “trust in the Lord with all thine heart” than to lean upon our own understanding. Jesus makes a better Lord and Master over our life than we ever could. If you haven't already, I urge you to cross out the “Not so,” truly trusting Jesus as “Lord,” with utter abandon. Even as that June 19 devotional ended: “Unconditional obedience to our Lord is the only way to find true fulfillment, blessed assurance, and abiding peace.”



# Reesie's Recipes



## Easy Macaroni Salad

- 8 ounces elbow macaroni
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup onions, chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup celery, sliced thin
- 1 cup green bell peppers, can use red if you like, chopped
- 1 cup salad dressing
- 1 tablespoon mustard
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- 3 tablespoons skim milk

Cook and drain pasta according to package directions; rinse with cold water to cool. In large bowl combine mayonnaise, milk, vinegar, mustard, sugar, salt and pepper. Add macaroni, celery, green pepper and onion; toss to coat. Cover; chill to blend flavors.

## Strawberry Banana Poke Cake

- 1 strawberry cake mix
- 1 large box instant banana pudding
- Vanilla wafers
- 1 (16oz) cool whip, softened
- Bananas, sliced
- Strawberries, sliced

Bake cake according to directions on box in a 9x13 pan. Let cool. Poke holes in cake. Prepare pudding according to directions on box. Pour pudding over cake. Spread cool whip on top. Crumble desired amount of wafers on top of cool whip. Top with bananas and strawberries. Chill before serving.

## Dirt Delight

- 16 ounces Oreo cookies
- 12 ounces Cool Whip
- 8 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 2 cups Fresca soda
- 2/3 cup powdered milk
- 1 (3 1/3 ounce) box vanilla instant pudding
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Crush the Oreos and place half the crumbs in the bottom of an 11x17 inch pan. Use a mixer to blend the Cool Whip, cream cheese, powdered sugar, and butter. In a bowl, combine the pudding mix, powdered milk, Fresca, and vanilla. Beat this mixture until it is the consistency of pudding. Combine both mixtures and pour over the layer of crushed Oreos. Sprinkle the remaining Oreos on top. Refrigerate for 1 to 2 hours before serving.

### Are you a stream or a pool?





## A Word For Today

**Verse for Today:** Psalms 25:7 Remember not the sins of my youth, nor my transgressions: according to thy mercy remember thou me for thy goodness' sake, O LORD. Additional Passages for today: Job 20:11; Psalm 51:1; Psalm 25:11; Exodus 34:6-7; Isaiah 43:25;

**Thought for Today:** Forgiveness isn't earned nor deserved. It is a gift that honors the Lord. It is for the sake of the Lord's mercy and goodness, not the wicked, that God forgives.

**Story for Today:** Rita threw her car keys down on the coffee table. She wasn't the 17-year-old girl that Claudette remembered. They were both almost 60 years old and lived what felt like a lifetime. Rita had once been a wild child, known for her fearless, troublemaking ways. How she survived was a wonder. Drinking, smoking, rebelling, and living recklessly were an everyday occurrence, beginning before she reached 13 years old. Claudette was often involved in her schemes and resented that Rita seemed to have her life together. Claudette wanted to hold on to Rita's past. She remembered the girl who never conformed to the rules and constantly challenged authority. When life brought the two ladies together after forty years of no contact, Claudette was not willing to give Rita the benefit of the doubt. She just knew that Rita was still the same troublemaker who was always creating chaos wherever she went. Rita sank onto the sofa and placed her head in her hands. She knew she was blessed to have been forgiven. She regretted having wasted her youth, living in sin. But God had found her. She may have been a wreck, nearly destroying herself with the wicked lifestyle, but one day, when she was at her lowest, God put Mandi in her path. Mandi shared with her that God loved her. She told her that God loved her so much that He sent His son Jesus to pay for her sins so that she could be restored to Him. She explained that Jesus came as a baby. He lived a perfect life, but was accused of doing wrong things. She said that jealousy and pride ruled in the hearts of the leaders who falsely accused Him and that the punishment was death on the cross. The rulers meant to destroy Jesus Christ, but God planned it as a way of salvation so that Jesus took our sins on Himself and allowed us to be His righteousness. Rita had never known a love like that. How could someone die to save her? She was a mess. She didn't feel like she had anything worth saving. But as she knelt in prayer that day, she received forgiveness and with it a freedom like nothing she had ever known. From that day forward, her life was changed. She was still Rita, but that was all of her old life that stayed with her. She quit smoking and never took another drink. She was so grateful for what Jesus did for her that she wanted to please Him by living a godly life. Mandi helped her find a job and get a nice place to stay. She met with her regularly, where they talked about concerns that Rita had and discussed what she had been reading in her Bible. They also memorized Bible passages together. Mandi would pick Rita up for church, and they became like sisters; Sisters in Christ.

As Rita bowed her head, she began to pray. First, she thanked the Heavenly Father for forgiving her sins and for changing her life. She thanked Him for the mercy that caused Him to no longer remember her sins and transgressions. Then, she began to pray for Claudette. Rita knew that she didn't deserve forgiveness. She recognized that it was God's mercy that made it possible for her to receive forgiveness and that it was all to God's glory and for His goodness' sake. She prayed that God would allow her to show Claudette the loving Father that Mandi had shown her. Rita was grateful that she was able to work for God. She thanked Him for this opportunity, even though it brought back many of the days in her past that she would rather not remember. She knew that God had forgiven her, and that was all that mattered. If her discomfort was able to be used to bring another soul into the kingdom, she would willingly suffer, for Christ's sake.

**Questions for Today:** Have you been forgiven? All have sinned and fall short of the Glory of God. All have sins and transgressions of their youth that they need to confess, repent, and be forgiven for. Will you start fresh today with Jesus as your Saviour? Or do you still see the sins of others past, not letting them be free? Remember that God is the judge and that we are to leave that work in His hands. Can you forgive and forget the sins of your friends?

**Prayer for Today:** Dear Heavenly Father, Thank You for Your mercy and grace. Thank You that You are all we need and that You continue to offer forgiveness. Please allow us to be used by You to point the lost to salvation through the blood of Your Son, Jesus Christ.
