“True Worship” part 02

New Testament worship is never merely practice for some later experience in heaven. It is genuine worship in the presence of God Himself. Through the cleansing effect of the shed blood of Christ, we can live free of guilt and sin, and experience new life in Him. This new life changes our conduct. Hebrews 10:23-25 - Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;) 24 And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: 25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. It produces hope, good deeds and the desire to join with others in worship. Has this been your experience? Has worshipping God strengthened your walk with Him? It should! III. True worship abandons whatever offends God. Isaiah 6:1-8 (Main Text) One of the accomplishments of worship is that it purifies us. Whenever we catch a glimpse of God's holiness, which often occurs as we worship, we are confronted with our sin. Why? Because the pathway to the presence of God is holiness. Hebrews 12:14 - Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord: Consider the experience of Isaiah as he encountered the Lord. Isaiah 6:5 - Then said I, Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts. Obviously, it was not the lips of Isaiah that were producing uncleanness, but his heart. Matthew 12:34 - O generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things? for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh. Peter had the same sort of experience in Luke 5. He witnessed firsthand the power of God over nature (which he had earlier doubted) and he was filled with the knowledge of his sin. Luke 5:8 - When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, Depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord. We are holier men and women when we worship. How many times have you come here and been forced to acknowledge and wrestle with your own sin as you praised the Lord? It's not fun, but getting rid of any impure thing makes for a healthier body of believers. IV. True worship avoids the chastening of God. A. God's people were disciplined for the failure to worship. 2nd Kings 17:25-27 - And so it was at the beginning of their dwelling there, that they feared not the Lord: therefore the Lord sent lions among them, which slew some of them. 26 Wherefore they spake to the king of Assyria, saying, The nations which thou hast removed, and placed in the cities of Samaria, know not the manner of the God of the land: therefore he hath sent lions among them, and, behold, they slay them, because they know not the manner of the God of the land. 27 Then the king of Assyria commanded, saying, Carry thither one of the priests whom ye brought from thence; and let them go and dwell there, and let him teach them the manner of the God of the land. It was the duty of the Israelites to worship God. When they failed to do so, God dealt with them appropriately, yet severely...some were devoured by lions. B. God's people were disciplined for misdirected worship. Hosea 13:1-3 - When Ephraim spake trembling, he exalted himself in Israel; but when he offended in Baal, he died. 2 And now they sin more and more, and have made them molten images of their silver, and idols according to their own understanding, all of it the work of the craftsmen: they say of them, Let the men that sacrifice kiss the calves. 3 Therefore they shall be as the morning cloud and as the early dew that passeth away, as the chaff that is driven with the whirlwind out of the floor, and as the smoke out of the chimney. The worship of idols brought God's discipline. V. True worship accesses the help of God. Hebrews 4:16 - Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need. The throne of grace in Hebrews 4:16 is referring to the throne of God where Jesus sits, exalted at the right hand of the Father. It is the antitype of the 'mercy seat' in the earthly sanctuary where the work of atonement was completed by the high priest year in and year out. Jesus, our high priest, has finished the work, accomplishing our salvation once for all. John 19:30 - When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost. Now we have the constant availability of God's help in our time of need. Acts 27:17 - Which when they had taken up, they used helps, undergirding the ship; and, fearing lest they should fall into the quicksands, strake sail, and so were driven. In this verse, we're given a picture of what the word 'help' means in this context. The word refers to a rope or chain used to secure a vessel during rough weather. When life is at its hardest we can know that a visit to the throne of God will provide us with the secure and timely help we need to keep going and growing.

Rack'em Up Ribs

- 1 cup ketchup
- 3 tablespoons molasses
- 1 tablespoon cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tablespoon dark-brown sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon hot pepper sauce (such as Tabasco)
- 1/4 teaspoon liquid smoke
- 4 pounds country-style pork ribs

In a small bowl, stir together ketchup, molasses, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, sugar, mustard, hot sauce and liquid smoke. Place pork ribs in the slow cooker insert and pour 1 cup sauce over top, reserving the rest for later. Cover and cook on HIGH for 6 hours or LOW for 9 hours or until very tender. Remove ribs from slow cooker and brush with reserved sauce.

Butterfinger Ice Cream Pie

- 3 c. graham cracker crumbs
- 1/2 c. butter, melted
- 2 pkg. instant vanilla pudding
- 2 c. cold milk
- 1 pt. softened vanilla ice cream
- 1 (8 oz.) Cool Whip
- 3 Butterfinger candy bars, crushed

Combine cracker crumbs and butter. Press half into a 9 x 13-inch pan and chill. Combine pudding mix, milk and softened ice cream. Beat until smooth. Pour over crumbs. Chill until firm. Top with Cool Whip. Combine remaining crumbs and crushed Butterfinger bars and sprinkle over top. Refrigerate.

Twinkie Delight

- 1 box Twinkies
- 2 small boxes instant vanilla pudding
- 1 large can crushed pineapples, drained
- Sliced bananas to layer
- 16 oz. cool whip
- 2 small jars maraschino cherries

Cut Twinkies lengthwise. Arrange Twinkies cream side up in large dish. Mix pudding as directed. Spread over Twinkies. Spread crushed pineapple then layer bananas. Place one jar of cherries over bananas. Top with cool whip and decorate with second jar of cherries.

Spaghetti Casserole

- No-Stick Cooking Spray
- 1-1/4 cups original baking mix
- 1/2 cup reduced fat (2%) milk
- 2 cans (14.5 oz each) Chef Boyardee Spaghetti & Meatballs
- 3/4 cup shredded mozzarella cheese, divided
- 1/3 cup sliced pepperoni

Preheat oven to 375°F. Spray 13x9-inch glass baking dish with cooking spray. Combine baking mix and milk in medium bowl; stir until soft dough forms. Drop dough by spoonfuls on bottom of baking dish (will not completely cover bottom). Spoon 1 can spaghetti and meatballs over dough and sprinkle with 1/2 cup cheese. Top with remaining can spaghetti and meatballs, remaining 1/4 cup cheese and pepperoni. Bake 20 to 25 minutes or until dough is done in centers and browned.



God in the Flesh

There is a little verse nestled away in John 12:41, that speaks volumes about Who Jesus really was: "These things said Esaias, when he saw his glory, and spake of him." When Isaiah (Yeshayahu means "Salvation of Jehovah"), received his calling to be a prophet in about 740 BC, recorded in Isaiah 6:1-8, he saw God sitting on the throne in all His glory, with the angelic hosts crying, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of hosts." Isaiah prophesied for about 50 years, primarily in the later part of the 8th century BC. But what the apostle John was inspired to write in John 12:41, was that Isaiah spoke about the coming Messiah. Isaiah "saw his glory, and spake of him", the One who was talking in John 12. So to put in plainly, Jesus of Nazareth was the God of the Old Testament in human flesh. It is very important that we see the God of Israel and Jesus as synonymous. The incarnation is a great mystery, and our minds cannot wrap around it all, but the Word became flesh that created everything in Genesis 1. It is an awesome picture to see the God of Noah, the God of Abraham, the God of Moses, the God of David, and the God of the prophets, walking among His people in the gospel accounts. This puts an entirely different dimension on Who Jesus was. The Jehovah Witnesses and the Muslims say that Jesus was not God.

He Still Speaks

"Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Matthew 11:28-30 (KJV)

In the walk of today's Christian - it seems as though "the valley" of the shadow seems to have grown old and in many cases... disappeared altogether. Man today insists on a consummate religious JOY, but a consummate religious fervor is feigned and even shunned as unattainable. Yet, Christ said, and says forever, "My yoke is easy." Yet, that statement is so mis-interpreted, and the integrity of fervor is so evaded... Christians tend to think they can pretty much have their cake and eat it too. One thing I have learned throughout my life is that along with all of the other things Jesus promised - He also promised a Cross. When in the most coarse of my study in the WORD, (digging though the nitty gritty of the WORD) I often find the depth and brashness of life-interpretations by human minds - cloud and even dim the meaning of "Life" in Christ to mean nothing more than "base" religion. There is no calling; no commitment of purpose or commitment of any kind. "If there's nothing in it for me - I want no part of it they say." Yet, Jesus says, "...narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." Matthew 7:14 (KJV) In the Christian life, there seems to be a contradiction: two opposite conceptions of that perce a man's soul and mind. The one says, "If I come to Jesus, my life will be filled with Joy." The other says, "If I follow Christ, I may find many a sorrow, hard labor, and endless tears." I cannot tell you how as a young teen I would be impressed to follow more deeply the leading of my Lord. Yet, I would go only so far because I was afraid that if I went too deeply I would have to give up some of the things I enjoyed - like city softball and the Band I was in with some of my best school chums - the Ranslow boys. Don't forget that I sat pining for my sweetheart of those "wonder years" while I would spend hour at my guitar singing about her - rather than the real song that burned so deeply in my soul - about my one true love, Jesus! It is a great thing to be an earnest Christian - a high calling to be a soldier of the cross - even though it would cost me so much. Isn't it ironic how I was willing to sit down and count the cost when it meant giving up everything to follow Jesus. Even though I laid back and didn't become "as committed" as I should - to the extent o my calling in him as a young man... He never ceased in His call; never hid or veiled from me the urgency of the call. Christ calls for YOU today! He says that, "You are a free man; but you must count the cost". He tells us that, "Life is before us: and that we must choose this day whom we will serve." He tells us that while He puts before us a cross, He has also promised a crown. He tells us that while we may - like Paul, struggle with lack - being literally bound to our ministries with no promise of sustenance... there WILL be victory. While we may writhe in utter loneliness, He says, "lo, I am with you always even unto the end of the Earth". You may be restless, yet he promises to give you rest. Let me ask you today my friend... has there ever been a leader so frank, so open, so brave, as "the Master" who is claiming you tonight? What will your answer be? *Go, then, earthly fame and treasure, Come disaster, scorn and pain In Thy service, pain is pleasure, With Thy favor, loss is gain I have called Thee Abba Father, I have stayed my heart on Thee Storms may howl, and clouds may gather; All must work for good to me.*
