
DRIVING MISS CRAZY



"Finding Contentment At The Fountain"

Scripture Reference: Jeremiah 2:11-13

Hath a nation changed their gods, which are yet no gods? but my people have changed their glory for that which doth not profit. 12 Be astonished, O ye heavens, at this, and be horribly afraid, be ye very desolate, saith the Lord. 13 For my people have committed two evils; they have forsaken me the fountain of living waters, and hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water.

Leaders who didn't really know the Lord were setting idolatrous pattern for others. Hosea 4:6 - My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children. Two evils, first, Israel abandoned the Lord, their only source of spiritual sustenance. Secondly, Israel turned to idolatrous objects of trust. Jeremiah compared these with underground water storage devices for rainwater, which were broken and let water seep out, thus proving them useless. Does anybody know what an artesian well is? It's a source of water that literally shoots up out of the ground without any need for pumps or any artificial assistance. It's literally "living water." (A promise to every believer.) Paul spoke of this in, Philippians 4:11-13 - Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content. 12 I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: every where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. 13 I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me. Paul is saying, "Christians can live content regardless of their circumstances." Listen to Paul in Philippians 4:1-5 - Therefore, my brethren dearly beloved and longed for, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved. 2 I beseech Euodias, and beseech Syntyche, that they be of the same mind in the Lord. 3 And I intreat thee also, true yokefellow, help those women which laboured with me in the gospel, with Clement also, and with other my fellowlabourers, whose names are in the book of life. 4 Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice. 5 Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand. These two women were prominent church members, who were some of the first people meeting for prayer when Paul came to Philippi. Paul's saying was this: 1. Stay steed-fast. 2. Be in the same mind in the Lord. 3. Help others. 4. Always rejoice in the Lord. 5. Be Content. Going back to the text, Jeremiah gives God's people three things that constantly feed discontentment. *First thing that will constantly feed our discontentment, Greed. "When you dwell on what you don't obtain, you'll not enjoy what God has already given you." Be Satisfied! Proverbs 29:18 -Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he. Vision is important; however, enjoy the journey; Rejoice in the Lord on the way! *Second thing that will constantly feed our discontentment is, Fear. "Fear wants you to run from something that's not chasing you." It's the enemy's way of:1). Robbing you of peace and stability. 2). Tormenting you with the what if's". 3. Keeping you from trusting God. Psalm 56:4 - In God I will praise his word, in God I have put my trust; I will not fear what flesh can do unto me. *The third thing that will constantly feed our discontentment, Seeking satisfaction in the wrong places. Haggai 1:5-7 - Now therefore thus saith the Lord of hosts; Consider your ways. 6 Ye have sown much, and bring in little; ye eat, but ye have not enough; ye drink, but ye are not filled with drink; ye clothe you, but there is none warm; and he that earneth wages earneth wages to put it into a bag with holes. 7 Thus saith the Lord of hosts; Consider your ways. God is saying, "My people have forsaking the living water, and dug water holes that cannot hold water." Come to the fountain. John 7:37-38 - In the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. 38 He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water. Don't hurry. (Jesus never was in a hurry and He redeemed mankind in 3 1/2 years.) Retire to worry. "Faith, 'sometimes' shouldn't say a word." Come to peace, it is well. (And the peace that surpasses.) Listen to the Holy Spirit. (He's not upset.) He'll speak. Go back to His word. (His word will stand!) Remember your foundation. (You're His beloved.) Please, Don't compromise...Don't accept substitutes! Colossians 2:10 - And ye are complete in him, which is the head of all principality and power:

REESIE'S RECIPES



Kool-Aid Pie

1 (0.13 ounce) package unsweetened Kool-Aid (any flavor)

1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk1 (8 ounce) container Cool Whip, thawed1 (9 inch) graham cracker crust

Whisk fruit-flavored drink mix with sweetened condensed milk in a bowl until thoroughly combined and thick. Gently fold whipped topping into mixture until light and fluffy. Spread filling into pie crust and refrigerate until set.

Jalapeño Popper Dip

1 4oz can diced jalapenos, well drained

1 8oz package cream cheese, softened
1 cup sour cream
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
3/4 cup + 1/4 cup shredded parmesan cheese
1 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs

4 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted

1 tablespoon dried parsley

In a mixer or by hand, combine cream cheese and sour cream. Add cheddar cheese, 3/4 cup parmesan cheese, and diced jalapenos, mix well. Spoon into 8x8 baking dish, spreading evenly. Blend bread crumbs, melted butter, 1/4 cup shredded parmesan cheese, and dried parsley, using a fork or your fingers, until crumbly. Sprinkle the buttery crumb topping evenly over the cream cheese mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes, or until hot and breadcrumbs are golden brown. Do not overcook. Serve with bread or crackers.

Bottoms Up Casserole

1 lb. ground beef

1/2 cup chopped celery

1/2 cup chopped onion

1/2 cup chopped green pepper

1 can tomato soup

1/2 tsp garlic salt

1/2 tsp onion salt

3/4 tsp Worcestershire sauce

1/8 tsp salt

Dash of pepper

1 9" pastry shell

3 to 4 slices American cheese, cut into strips

Brown ground beef, celery, onion and green pepper, drain well. Stir in the next 6 ingredients. Spread evenly in bottom of pie pan. Place crust over meat mixture. Place pie on baking sheet and bake for 15 minutes on 400. Place large plate or platter over pie pan and turn out upside down. Top meat with cheese strips. Serve hot.

Squash Casserole

2 cups chopped squash

1 medium onion, chopped

1 small box ritz crackers

1/4 cup margarine, melted

1 cup grated cheese

2 eggs

1/2 cup milk

Salt and pepper to taste

Cook squash and onion until tender. Drain off liquid and mash. Beat eggs and milk, add to squash. Mix cheese, margarine and cracker crumbs (save some cracker crumbs). Pour into buttered casserole dish. Sprinkle remaining crumbs on top. Bake 20-30 minutes on 400.

God Is SO Good

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning. James 1:17

In verses 12-18, the writer returns to his discussion of temptation. He emphasizes here the fact that God never tempts anyone, (although we are tested, and tried) I think it's important that we understand that "Evil does not come from God". But every "good and perfect gift" does. God always has, and always will be the source of all good. So, what's your take on God today? One of the Names that the Bible uses to describe God is "ABBA" meaning "Daddy". There is no second guessing how God sees us in that word picture is there? In fact, God's WORD tells us over and over that he loves us, but he also says... "For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son in whom he delighteth." Proverbs 3:12; Hebrews 12:6; Revelation 3:19 Most in the WORLD sees Him as a God Of "Judgment, and a God of Wrath; and there are times when He must punish the wicked for their sin. But He would so much rather love them. In fact, He tells us that he chastens those that He does love. You and I get up every morning, as it is our routine... get ready for our jobs, and take off so as not to be late - forgetting all the time that it is He that wakes us in the mornings. It is He who has numbered our days, & counted the very number of hairs on our heads. It is He who listens to our heartbeat, and knows every thought and intent therein. It is He who hears our prayers, and has told us that He wants to give us the very desires of our hearts. (Psalm 37:4) What's more is - that our text for today doesn't just paint Him as a Gift Giver - but it proclaims the nature of His Parentage. He was the Father of Lights. This was the Same Father That hung the Galaxies in their place and then flung the stars across the heavens so that man would never be in total darkness. This was the same Father who took Abraham out beneath those stars and promised that his seed would be even greater that he could count. Then the writer goes on to say that "in Him", "...there is no variableness, nor shadow of turning". That's a hard thing to find in a Father today. In fact, that's a pretty tough thing to find in the character of most anyone that we meet on a Daily basis. How may times have you made promises to your children - and had to break them? What about your best friend? Your own Mother? Saving one thing and doing another, tends to leave a bad taste in the mouth. Our scripture reminds us today - that Our God is not like that. Our text tells us that this same "Father of Lights" is unchanging, and that there is "no shadow of turning" in Him. I can guarantee you that my Kids will never say that about their dad. But YOU AND I can be sure of it! What do you have need of today? Call on Him... He'll be excited to hear from you.

For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory. Colossians 3:1-4

Throughout Scripture God's people are called to choose. (Deut. 30:19; Josh. 24:15; I Kings 18:21 - just to name a few) And man has had opportunity to choose from the beginning of time and onward. (Gen. 3; Prov. 1:29; 3:31; Isa. 7:15 - just to name a few more) Verse three states that since you are IN Christ in heavenly places, to seek earthly things would be inconsistent with your new resurrected state. It goes against the nature you now occupy WITH Christ IN God. Meditate on that for a minute. To seek earthly enjoyment instead of heavenly fulfillment would be akin to being set free from a jail cell only to longingly desire to go back there and desire to experience it all over again. The Apostle is telling you, "Don't go back to Egypt!" Israel looked longingly upon its cruel taskmasters with such inconsistent affection. John Eadie said it like this: "Attachment to things on the earth is unworthy of one who has risen with Christ, for they are beneath him, and the love of them is not at all in harmony with his position and prospects." There is great danger in looking to the temporal things instead of putting your focus and energies into heavenly, eternal things. This danger manifests itself in great loss. The chorus sings: "Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in His wonderful face; and the things of earth will grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace." Allow me to warn you that the opposite of this is true as well. If you turn your eyes upon this world; if you refuse to turn your eyes upon Jesus, then the things of heaven; the things of Christ will grow strangely dim. As the things of heaven grow dim to you it will be hard to see that they are growing dim because the alluring lights of this world, although they be false lights, are bright and you think you are fulfilled but you are not. The more joy you have the less entertainment you need. The less joy you have of Jesus, the more entertainment you need. You WILL fill the gap. You will either fill the gap, the void, with the reality of Jesus Christ or you will fill the gap with the fluff and shadow that continually needs more filling because it dissipates. You need more and more because it IS less. Oh dear ones, set your affection on things above. What you allow to replace what is rightfully Christ's will destroy you. Jesus is coming back for a pure bride; a bride that is spotless and without wrinkle. The things of this earth put wrinkles upon your face and upon your soul. Too many are willing to do without a fullness of Him because they have put so much else within, that it deadens the pain of His absence. Until He becomes your air, your food, your water, you may not recognize your great need for His fullness. Think on these things.
