John 3:16-18

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. 17 For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. 18 He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

How do you explain the meaning of Christmas in just a few words? Well the best way I know is this: John 3:16 - For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. No one could outdo what God has done. No one could give a greater gift than God has already given. I would like for us to consider the meaning of Christmas and what it should mean to each and every one of us. Christmas means a lot of things to a lot of different people. What message should it convey to every one of us? To me, Christmas is...I. A TIME OF REMEMBERING Remembering the great love that God had for each and every one of us. He loved us so much, that He spared not His only Son that we might be saved. Remembering the uniqueness of His life, His teachings, His miracles, His prophesies, His death and His resurrection. Remembering all those humble but great people surrounding the Christmas story...people like Joseph & Mary, Zacharias & Elizabeth, Anna, Simeon, the shepherds, the wise men, etc. Secondly, to me, Christmas is...II. A TIME OF LOVING People make a special effort to be a little kinder, a little more considerate of others, and a little more generous during the Christmas season. They get involved in such things as Christmas caroling, toys for the needy, meals for the misfortunate, etc. It is a time for reaching out to others with love and concern. God so loved the world-let us never forget that!!! In all of our preaching, teaching, evangelizing, etc. let us always remember that the motivation for all this is the love of God for lost sinners. He really cares about us. So should we care as He cares. So should we love, as He loves. III. A TIME OF GIVING For God so loved the world, that He gave...Love cannot look with indifference on the hungry, and the sick, and the lonely, lost souls of this world. Love must give. God gave all He could give. He gave His only begotten Son. This gift was freely given, lovingly given, graciously given to all of us, who were undeserving sinners. Christ shared our human nature that we might receive His divine nature. Day by day, those who receive Him are being transformed into His image, until we all come into the full stature of the perfected children of God, washed in the blood of the Lamb. IV. REESIE'S RECIPES



Tootsie Roll Fudge

1 teaspoon plus 2 tablespoons butter, divided 2 cups Tootsie Roll Midgees 2 tablespoons peanut butter 3-3/4 cups confectioners' sugar 2 tablespoons milk 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 cup chopped Diamond of California® Pecans

1/3 cup green and red M&M's

Line a 9-in. square pan with foil. Grease the foil with 1 teaspoon butter; set aside. In a heavy saucepan, melt the Tootsie Rolls, peanut butter and remaining butter over low heat, stirring constantly. Gradually stir in the confectioners' sugar, milk and vanilla (mixture will be very thick). Fold in pecans. Spread into prepared pan. Using a sharp knife, score the surface into 1-in. squares. Press a M&M's candy into the center of each square. Cool. Using foil, remove fudge from pan; cut into squares. Store in an airtight container.

Ho Ho Ho Cake

1 package Swiss cake rolls 2 3/4 cup cold milk

2 packages (3.9 oz each) instant chocolate fudge pudding

2 cups whipped topping

Cut each cake roll into 8 slices; set aside any chocolate coating that that separates from rolls for garnish. Line a 9" spring form pan with cake slices, completely covering the bottom and sides. In a small bowl whisk milk and pudding mixes for 2 minutes. Let stand for 2 minutes or until soft set. Pour over cake. Spread with whipped topping. Sprinkle with any reserved chocolate coating. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours before serving.

Strawberry Divinity

1 3/4 cup sugar 1/4 cup light syrup 1/2 cup water Dash of salt 1 cup strawberry preserves 2 egg whites stiffly beaten Red food coloring

Boil first 4 ingredients until it threads off spoon and is brittle when dropped into cold water testing dish. Add preserves, bring to a boil. Slowly add to stiffly beaten eggs beating constantly until gloss is gone. Add food coloring. Drop by spoonful onto wax paper.

Orange Pineapple Salad

1 carton cottage cheese 1 package orange-pineapple jello 1 can mandarin oranges 1 small can crushed pineapple 1 small container cool whip Mix ingredients in order and refrigerate.

Holiday Ham

Whole boneless (fully cooked) ham 1 can Pineapple slices in syrup 2 pound bag brown sugar Reynolds wrap toothpicks

Place ham in big pan. Drain syrup from pineapples and set aside. Place pineapple slices on ham and hold in place with tooth picks. Mix together pineapple syrup and brown sugar (mixture will be thick). Pour mixture over ham. Cover ham with aluminum foil. Cook in oven at 250 degree's...one hour per pound...

Remove from oven...Cool ham...slice and drizzle brown sugar syrup mixture over ham.

Snickers Fudge

2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips1 (3 3/4 ounce) Snickers candy bars, chopped1 (12 ounce) can milk chocolate frosting:

Line an 8-inch square pan with foil, extending foil over the edges. Spray lightly with nonstick cooking spray. Set aside. Microwave chips in medium microwave safe bowl on high for 1-2 minutes or until chips are melted, stirring occasionally. Add frosting and candy bars. Blend well. Spread in sprayed foil-lined pan. Refrigerate 1 hour or until firm. Remove fudge from pan by lifting the foil. Remove foil from fudge. Cut into squares.

Cheesy Green Bean Casserole

2 (10.75 ounce) cans condensed cream
of mushroom soup
3/4 cup milk
1 (2.8 ounce) can French fried onions
2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
2 (16 ounce) packages frozen cut green beans
1/2 pound Velveeta, sliced
Ritz crackers
Margarine, melted

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease a 2 quart casserole dish. In a mixing bowl, combine mushroom soup, milk, cheddar cheese, and half of the onions. Mix together. Layer the bottom of a 2 quart casserole dish with 1/2 of the green beans. Pour half of the soup mixture over beans, and add half of the Velveeta. Repeat layering, top with crushed Ritz crackers and sprinkle with meted margarine.

Bake for 30 to 40 minutes.

Ham Cheese Ball

2 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese
2 tsp. finely chopped green onion
1 tsp. lemon juice
1/2 tsp. paprika
1 (2.25 oz.) can ham spread
2 tbsp. diced pimento's
1 cup finely shredded cheddar cheese
2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
1 tsp. mustard
1/2 tsp. salt
Chopped pecans

Soften cream cheese in large bowl. Add rest of ingredients. Chill until firm. Shape into two balls.

Roll in pecans. Serve with snack crackers

Pineapple Dream Cake

1 box Pineapple cake mix
1 3/4 cup milk
1 small box instant Vanilla pudding
1 (8 0z) cream cheese, softened
1 small can crushed pineapple in syrup, drained
1/2 (8 oz) bowl cool whip

Prepare and bake cake as directed on box. Remove from oven and let cool. In a large mixing bowl mix milk and pudding until well blended. Beat in cream cheese. Gently stir in well drained pineapples. Fold in 1/2 of the bowl of cool whip. Spread over cake and refrigerate.

Shine as a Star

Numbers 24:17 I shall see him, but not now: I shall behold him, but not nigh: there shall come a Star out of Jacob, and a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel, and shall smite the corners of Moab, and destroy all the children of Sheth.

Daniel 12:3 And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever.

A National Geographic article published last year describing a real celestial event which took place at the time of the birth of Jesus reminded me of Risto Santala's explanation in his book, "The Messiah in the New Testament in the Light of Rabbinical Writings". He wrote about a conjunction of major planets that took place which could have led the wise men from the east, to Israel. Santala reports that in 1603, Johannes Kepler observed a conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn in the constellation of Pisces; he observed a "new, particularly brilliant and strangely colored star between Jupiter and Saturn, which soon faded." Kepler suggested that the Star of Bethlehem could have been such an event. Later, Alfred Edersheim wrote, "There can be no doubt that the most remarkable conjunction of planets — that of Jupiter and Saturn in the constellation of Pisces, which occurs only once in 800 years — did take place no less than three times in the year 747 A.U.C., or two years before the birth of Christ (in May, October, and December). This conjunction is admitted by all astronomers." Santala writes, "The constellations of the zodiac were generally identified with different nations, Pisces, for example, being considered the patron constellation of Syria and Palestine, and the revealer of the End Times. Saturn was associated with Palestine in Babylonian astrology, whereas Jupiter was the royal planet, foreshadowing a political Golden Age. Thus, when Jupiter conjoined with Saturn in Pisces it was obvious that the Ruler of the End Times had been born in Palestine." Whether or not this was the "star" the wise men saw is debatable, but it strongly suggests that a real and significant celestial event did take place roughly at the time of the birth of Jesus. As millions around the world are celebrating His birth this week, we ought to remember that one purpose for which God created the stars was, "for signs." [Genesis 1:14] But you also, are a sign...a sign of His birth and of His life. Whether you realize it or not, you also are a living, breathing, announcement of Messiah and of His light. And this holiday season, with the spiritual darkness so rapidly increasing, your calling and destiny is to SHINE!...to shine like the stars, in a darkening world, exactly in the same way that His coming to Bethlehem was announced, "a star out of Jacob"...What a destiny! Let us pray that as the season closes and the new year turns, we, His people, will be filled with the oil of his Spirit which will fuel this shining...even right up til the moment He comes, blazing back into this world...Hallelujah!
