2 Samuel 12:22-23

But God is the strength of my heart

"Truly God is good to Israel, even to such as are of a clean heart. But as for me, my feet were almost gone; my steps had well nigh slipped. For I was envious at the foolish, when I saw the prosperity of the wicked...Behold, these are the ungodly, who prosper in the world; they increase in riches. Verily I have cleansed my heart in vain, and washed my hands in innocency...Until I went into the sanctuary of God; then understood I their end. Surely thou didst set them in slippery places: thou castedst them down into destruction...Thus my heart was grieved, and I was pricked in my reins. So foolish was I, and ignorant: I was as a beast before thee...Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory. Whom have I in heaven but thee? and there is none upon earth that I desire beside thee. My flesh and my heart faileth: but God is the strength of my heart, and my portion for ever...For, lo, they that are far from thee shall perish: thou hast destroyed all them that go a whoring from thee. But it is good for me to draw near to God: I have put my trust in the Lord GOD, that I may declare all thy works."

Psalms 73:1-3, 12-13, 17-18, 21-22, 24-28

As humans, we too often get caught up in what we can see instead of either looking for what God is doing behind the scenes, trusting in His eternal purposes of "working all things together for good for those who love Him," or remembering that oft times rewards and judgments are eternal. In other words, things are not always as they seem and sometimes it just takes time. As Paul reminded the Corinthians, "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal." (2 Corinthians 4:17-18)

That's where the psalmist was—temporarily. Maybe you're feeling that way right now; if so, I hope only temporarily because there's a "BUT GOD" moment awaiting you. It's easy to feel confused or that things aren't fair when we see things going quite well for wicked people. For many of us, recent election results didn't go as we feel they should and the issue of life was defeated in many places around the country. Maybe you're tired of being the "punching bag" in your family or workplace because you alone point to the eternal truths, stand for righteousness, and won't go along with the crowd. We might also feel as Paul did that "all men forsook me;" but don't forget the next verse starts with "Notwithstanding the Lord stood with me, and strengthened me."

When did things change for the psalmist? When he "went into the sanctuary of God." When we start looking at the things which are not seen; when we recognize that our rewards are not here and that God is our portion. That's when we saw the true end of both the wicked and the righteous. When we get a vision of their end and ours, instead of feeling sorry for ourselves, we will feel sorry for them. When we come to that "BUT GOD" moment presented here in Psalm 73, it will make all the difference in how we view of things.

We are told how to walk and where that path leads in verse 24 – by God's counsel, by the Word. We've seen, by the psalmist's example, how weak our flesh is and how our hearts will fail us. We're reminded by Paul that "the things which are seen are temporal." BUT GOD! Jehovah will be our unfailing strength while the arm of flesh will fail us. God is our portion because He is enough. Our hearts may melt in the day of trouble BUT GOD is our strength and portion and bulwark and EVERYTHING we need.

When the psalmist came into God's presence, recognizing God's holiness, and realizing that all who are unholy will receive their just rewards, he saw himself as a beast. His flesh and his heart would fail; he felt weak beyond measure, BUT GOD! The psalmist had no strength BUT GOD strengthens and renews. He had given up everything and thought it was all for naught; but God, became the psalmist's reward, worth, and Savior. BUT God took this victim and made Him a victor; God took him out of his pity party and put him in a praise party. God took his brokenness and turned it to blessedness.

May we shout loudly with the psalmist for all to hear – "But it is good for me to draw near to God: I have put my trust in the Lord GOD, that I may declare all thy works." (Psalms 73:28)

Don't Open 'Til December 25th!

"But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law,"
Galatians 4:4

Who hasn't seen a gift with that "Don't open until Christmas!" tag attached? You've likely often wondered, "What could it be?" as your eyes see it occupying both a special place under the tree and in your mind. Even if it's not your gift, our minds are mesmerized with wonder at the mystery of these special contents. It's a promise to be opened in the fullness of time – that time being December 25. Though not born on "Christmas Day," Jesus is the present from our eternal Father that was the promised Messiah, the long awaited Saviour, and the fulfillment of not only time but many prophecies as well. Jesus, the only begotten Son, had that special "Do not open 'til Christmas" tag. O glorious day when time was fulfilled and the whole world would hear the joyous message, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6)

Can you imagine the excitement and anticipation that Jewish people would feel when their eyes would fall upon one of the many promises in Scripture that Messiah would one day come? How their minds must have wondered who the Messiah would be, what He would look like, what kind of grand entrance would He make, and the anticipation of Messiah putting their enemies in place. I imagine they would teach their children of the promise and present of God, pointing the many Scriptures out with gladness and gratitude, with the excitement that one day the fullness of time would come – one day the "present" would be unwrapped and would be theirs. Hallelujah!

"December 25" came, the gift was unwrapped for "the Jew first, and also to the Greek." There were so few who recognized the promised present - some shepherds on a hillside, Simeon and Anna, a few kings from the East, and maybe a handful of others. For the most part, it was opened unnoticed and unappreciated. Many were looking for someone to save them from Roman rule but He had come, this time, to save them from their sin. They were looking for a man, but He came as a baby; a lion, but He had come as a Lamb. They expected someone who would fit their idea of religion; but Jesus had come as the only way to the Father, that love rather than legalistic rote could become the norm. Actually, to this day many are still waiting for the "fullness of time," so they can unwrap their promised present. Many others have lost the excitement, anticipation, and maybe faith that "December 25" will actually come. It's like receiving a "Don't open 'til Christmas" present in March; at first, you're excited, eventually it gets in the way, so it gets relegated to the hallway closet till Christmas time. Once in the closet, little by little it gets more and more forgotten instead of cherished.

Friends, we've been given another "Christmas/Advent promise," which is simply awaiting "the fullness of time." I've been told that for every promise of Jesus' first coming, there are two prophetic verses of His second coming. Do we await with anticipation and excitement that Jesus IS coming back? Or are we content to live our lives in this world with little thought of the next? Do our thoughts parallel Peter's warning? "...Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation." (2 Peter 3:4)

Luke 21 is full of promise, warning, and admonition regarding the time of this next "Christmas present." Don't be fooled; don't let Jesus' warning go unheeded. Take a few moments to prayerfully read Luke 21 and prepare your heart and mind, keep the faith and keep faithful, do all you can to help others be ready for His sure return. And what of our Jewish friends still awaiting Messiah? There will come a day when they will finally understand that Jesus was the promised Messiah and He is their salvation. In that day, God will "pour upon the house of David...the spirit of grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for him, as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn." (Zech. 12:10)

May this Christmas be as much of a reminder that Jesus IS coming back as it is a remembrance that He has come. find ourselves standing against the Defender of Truth, He who IS TRUTH, Jesus Christ. Be faithful and fruitful!





HOHO Cake

1 chocolate cake mix prepared according to box directions and pour into prepared two 9 inch cake pans and bake for time specified on box.

1 can milk chocolate frosting

Filling

1 8 oz cream cheese softened1 stick butter softened3 cups confection sugar1 8 oz tub cool whip

Blend cream cheese and butter until smooth, add confection sugar mix well, fold in cool whip then refrigerate. Once cake is cooled put the filling in the center of the cake then press the top on and then smooth out the sides. Frost with milk chocolate frosting.

Fiesta Corn Casserole

3 large eggs
1/2 cup margarine, melted
1 (17oz) cream style corn
1 (15oz) fiesta corn, undrained
1 (8oz) carton onion dip
1/8 tsp pepper
1 (8oz) box muffin mix

Beat eggs until foamy. Add both cans of corn, margarine, onion dip and pepper. Blend together. Stir in muffin mix. Pour into greased shallow 21/2 quart casserole dish. Bake at 325 for 25-30 minutes.

Hash Brown Casserole

1 (2lb) pkg. of hash browns
1 can cream of chicken soup
1/2 stick margarine
16 oz. sour cream
1/3 cup chopped green onions
1 c. shredded cheddar cheese
Mix and bake in greased casserole dish
45 minutes at 350.

Patti's Cherry Delight

1 small can crushed pineapple, drained
1 can cherry pie filling
1 large container cool whip
1 cup chopped pecans
1 can eagle brand milk
Mix together in large bowl and chill
until ready to serve.

Veggia Pizza

1 (8oz) cream cheese
1 cup mayonnaise
1 envelope hidden valley ranch dressing
1 pkg refrigerated crescent rolls
Chopped vegetables, broccoli, cauliflower etc
Shredded cheese

Mix cream cheese, mayonnaise and ranch dressing. On a lightly greased cookie sheet unroll the crescent rolls and tightly pinch the pieces together. Bake until light brown. Cool, spread cream cheese mixture on top. Cover with chopped vegetables. Add shredded cheese to top.


Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God. 1 Corinthians 10:31

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: 1 Thessalonians 4:9 But as touching brotherly love ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another. **Additional passages for Today:** John 13:34, 35; John 15:12 & 17; Hebrews 10:24; 1 John 4:7 & 8

Thought for Today: God is love. God teaches love. The more we know God the more we can love.
