REESIE'S RECIPES



Mexican Casserole

- 10 - 6 inch fat free flour tortillas, halved
- 3 cups cooked cubed chicken
- 1 cup frozen corn
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 - 141/2oz. Can stewed tomatoes
- 1 - 10oz can diced tomatoes and green chilies
- 1 cup shredded reduced fat cheese

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9x13 inch pan. Line with half the tortillas. Layer chicken, corn, onion, pepper and stewed tomatoes. Cover with remaining tortillas. Pour tomatoes and green chilies over top. Cover with foil and bake until heated through about 30 minutes. Uncover and sprinkle with cheese. Bake uncovered until cheese is melted. Serve with fat free sour cream and salsa.

Twinkie Cake

Cake

- 1 French vanilla cake mix
- 1 small box vanilla instant pudding
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1 cup water

Filling

- 1/2 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup Crisco
- 1/2 cup sugar

Cake - Mix well. Divide batter between 2 well greased 9x13 inch pans. Bake at 350 for 12-15 minutes.

Filling - Make a thick white sauce of 5 tablespoons flour and 1 cup of milk. Let cool. Cream margarine, Crisco and sugar together. Add cooled flour mixture and 1 tsp. vanilla. Beat until fluffy. Spread filling between cakes.

7 Layer Salad

- 1 head chopped lettuce
- 1 cup celery, chopped small
- 4 hard boiled eggs, sliced
- 10oz. Frozen peas
- 1/2 cup green peppers, sliced
- 1 onion, in rings
- 1 pkg. bacon, fried and crumbled
- 2 cups mayonnaise
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 4 to 8oz. Shredded cheddar cheese

Place ingredients in dish in order given. Cover with mayonnaise and sprinkle with sugar. Sprinkle cheese on last. Prepare several hours ahead of serving.

Deep Dish Pizza Casserole

- 1 pound ground round
- 1 - 15oz. Can chunky Italian style tomato sauce
- Cooking spray
- 1 - 10oz. can refrigerated pizza crust
- 6 - 1oz. Slices mozzarella cheese divided

Cook meat in nonstick skillet over medium heat until brown, stirring until in crumbles. Drain and return to skillet. Add tomato sauce and cook until heated. Coat a 9x13 inch cooking dish with cooking spray. Unroll pizza dough, press into bottom and half way up sides of dish. Line bottom of pizza crust with 3 slices of cheese. Top with meat mixture. Bake uncovered at 425 for 12 minutes. Top with remaining 3 slices of cheese and bake for another 5 minutes.

"Finding God...AGAIN"

"Let not mercy and truth forsake thee: bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart: So shalt thou find favour and good understanding in the sight of God and man." Pro 3:3,4 (KJV)

The WORD tells us to "Let not mercy and truth forsake thee:" and I cannot think of anything better to begin this new era (since President Obama's re-election) than to exercise those truths found here in the book of Proverbs. To show "mercy" to fellow creatures - including the little dogs and cats that are slaughtered every month because they became more troublesome than lovable. To show mercy and truth to all mankind whether sinful or in the joyful fellowship of God, by meeting their needs where possible, by connecting not just with their minds but with their souls; by praying for them and by giving them good counsel and advice. To show mercy to fellow Christians, sympathizing with them in their troubles; being compassionate, tenderhearted, and forgiving offences against you. To in a spirit of meekness: restore backsliders, "for God will have mercy, and not sacrifice, for they that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick." (ref., Matt 9:12,13 Attend to "truth"; exercising full faith in the Lord; casting not away your confidence; speaking truth to your neighbor and brother; and holding fast the truth of the Gospel, never departing from it. For, the mercy and truth of God; the "mercy" of God in forgiving sin; in sympathizing under affliction; in helping in time of need; in supplying with all needful grace - and in bringing to eternal life; is from everlasting to everlasting, upon them that fear him, (ref., Psalms 103:7-17). The "truth" of God and His faithfulness in performing promises, never fails! Just because man may choose not to believe, doesn't make it of no effect. Though we believe not, He abides faithful and true to every word of his; not one shall fail, or pass away; all shall be fulfilled! (ref., Psalms 89:33). In fact, "...all His paths are mercy and truth", and He never runs out of them. (ref., Psa 25:10) The WORD goes further to not just establish Mercy and Truth as our foundation - but it tells us to wear them like jewelry (ref., bind them about thy neck; as chains for ornament...) for they are commandments of wisdom, (ref., Pro 3:1); They are the doctrines and ordinances of Christ; (ref Proverbs 1:8) Dropping down to the next verse (Proverbs 1:9) we see that we are to consider it as our greatest honor, glory, and beauty, steadfast in the duty of the work of the Gospel. Think of it my fiend, nothing makes a believer look more beautiful in conversation than a life that regards first the truths of Christ, and constantly walks in His ordinances. Finally, He tells us to write them upon the table of our hearts; keeping them in memory, and always seeking their leading in our life's work with others. To retain a hearty affection for them - and in fact, since it is the Holy Spirit's work to write them in our hearts... once established and written, they must be applied as the work of the saints, under a divine influence, to make it the practice in life, to show by their conduct and behavior that they "are" therein written. (Ref., Jeremiah 31:33). "Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart." 2Corinthians 3:3 (KJV)

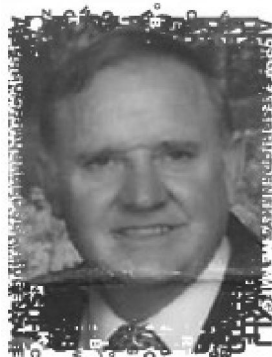
