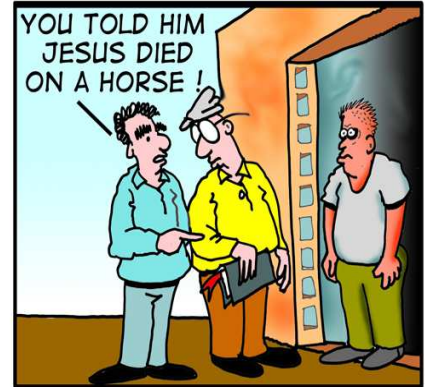

2 Timothy 1:4-5

Coconut Cookies

- 1 1/4 cups flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 egg
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 1/3 cups coconut

Preheat oven to 350. In a bowl, mix together flour, baking soda, salt and set aside. In a separate bowl cream butter and sugars together. Add the egg and mix well. Combine the flour mixture with the sugar mixture. Add coconut and vanilla. Bake for 8-10,

Easy Cheesy Chicken Bake

- 1 pkg. (6oz.) stove top stuffing for chicken
- 1 1/2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken breast, cut into bite size pieces
- 1 pkg. (14oz.) frozen broccoli florets, thawed, drained
- 1 can (10 3/4oz.) cream of chicken soup
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

Heat oven to 400. Prepare stuffing as directed on package. Combine chicken and broccoli in 13x9 baking dish. Stir in soup, milk and cheese. Top with stuffing. Bake 30 minutes or until chicken is done.

Ding Dong Cake

- 1 box chocolate cake mix
- 8 oz. cream cheese softened
- 3 c powdered sugar
- 1 stick butter softened
- 8 oz. cool whip
- 1 tub milk chocolate icing

Prepare and bake cake as directed on box in 2 round cake pans. **Filling:** Mix and cream the butter and cream cheese. Add powdered sugar and fold in cool whip. After cake is completely cooled split layers and spread filling on each layer and stack, do not spread filling all the way to the edge of the cake, the weight of the cake will press it out to the edge once you are finished, this keeps the filling from mixing with the icing. Then ice entire cake with the chocolate icing.

Cheesy Spaghetti Pie

- 4 oz. uncooked spaghetti
- 1/2 lb lean ground beef
- 1 green pepper, chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 jar of pasta sauce
- 1 tsp. chili powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup Ricotta cheese
- Shredded mozzarella cheese

Heat oven to 375 F. Grease a 10-inch glass pie plate with olive oil. Cook and drain spaghetti and set aside. Cook beef, green pepper and onion over medium heat for 10 minutes or until beef is brown. Stir in pasta sauce, chili powder, salt and pepper. Cook an additional 6 minutes, stirring occasionally. Place spaghetti in pie plate. In a small bowl, stir eggs and ricotta cheese until well mixed. Spread evenly over spaghetti. Spoon beef mixture over ricotta cheese mixture. Sprinkle with mozzarella cheese. Bake 35 minutes or until centre is set. Let stand 5 to 10 minutes before cutting.



Alcohol in America

Remember laughing at granny's moonshine on the Beverly Hillbillies, her "rheumatiz" medicine? Who couldn't help but chuckle, as the sound of a bomb dropping from the sky and exploding on impact was the sound over, while the drinker's eyes became wide and they lost their breath (and other faculties)? Remember smiling with John-Boy on the Waltons, as the Baldwin sisters would serve some of their renowned "recipe," while momma would make a fuss over their "family secret"? Even cartoons weren't off limits as some animated character would accidentally become intoxicated and do some silly things, bringing laughter to the very young, grooming them to accept this deadly foe, Mr. Alcohol. After all, laughter is good medicine, right? And according to the snake oil salesman on the Andy Griffith Show, medicine that contains a goodly amount of alcohol is better yet, right? Oh the dangers of laughing at sin, for once you laugh at sin, it will never be seen as serious as it once was. Alcohol wasn't the only thing we've laughed at until it became accepted. There was taking God's name in vain through slang and then full blown blasphemy, homosexuality in the sit-coms, big screen, and then finally society. It seems as though nothing was immune from Satan's evil laugh, twinkling eye, and move to acceptance. We laughed ourselves into dangerous times while lessening the urgency of God's truth. Laughed and entertained ourselves into "perilous times" until all became as "silly women laden with sins, led away with diverse lusts." (2 Tim. 3:1-7) They say, "Eat, drink, and be merry for tomorrow we may die"; but today we talk about alcohol in America and the seriousness which it ought to be dealt with, that tomorrow we may live. All this silliness about alcohol in Hollywood was going on while America's pulpits, by and large, were silent. Oh there would be the occasional meager message; but how impacting was that against Hollywood's making a fool of the "temperance clubs," showing those primetime pastors falling to the evils of alcohol on the "family" show, or making those who spoke the truth—"Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise" (Proverbs 20:1)—out to be angry, uncompassionate church goers. Yes, the drunkard was shown as fun-loving while the truth teller was shown as fun-hating and people hating. Never mind that Isaiah 5 and its woes read like a description of America's college and university campuses. Never mind that there are some who starve their children to help the brewer pad his pockets. Never mind that drink is responsible for the destruction of many homes, affecting even the homes of those who don't imbibe. Never mind that it poisons the mind and senses, bringing one to act in irrational ways, doing things they would never do when sober, endangering themselves, their family, and complete strangers. Never mind that it is often the precursor of death itself. Sin always carries a knife under its cloak; the bottle is always cloaked by fun, inhibition, "bravery," soothing of emotional or physical pain, and a false sense of love. Each of these cloaks holds the cold, hard, steel blade that cuts the throat of the partaker. It stabs at the heart of loved-ones, and can shred a family to bits. It always takes you further than you want to go and holds you longer than you would like to be kept. It can lead to the death of the body, death of relationships, and death of whole families. "Death," you say? According to a recent Washington Post article, "Americans are drinking themselves to death at record rates." The article goes on to say, "Last year, [referring to 2014] more than 30,700 Americans died from alcohol-induced causes, including alcohol poisoning and cirrhosis, which is primarily caused by alcohol use." "This tally of alcohol-induced fatalities excludes deaths from drunk driving, other accidents, and homicides committed under the influence of alcohol. If those numbers were included the annual toll of deaths directly or indirectly caused by alcohol would be closer to 90,000, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention." Even sticking with this lesser statistic, one might be surprised to find that "in 2014, more people died from alcohol-induced causes (30,722) than from overdoses of prescription painkillers and heroin combined (28,647), according to the CDC." I'm not here shouting, "ABSTINANCE!" But I will say, no one ever got drunk who never took his first sip. I will say if it takes 10 drinks to get drunk, with your first drink you are a tenth of the way there; how wise is that? I will encourage you to look at the word of God with your children and talk honestly about what God says regarding alcohol. Point out the dangers of what this substance can and will do when used. I will say that a parent should lead by example; what life do you really want for your child? I will warn that if you are a pastor, don't ignore this issue; you are called to preach the whole counsel of God, with fear, urgency, and sobriety. Press on brothers and sisters; be controlled by the Spirit...not the spirits.

**“I Hear The Sound Of An Abundance Of Rain” PART 01**

Scripture Reference: 1st Kings 18:41-45

And Elijah said unto Ahab, Get thee up, eat and drink; for there is a sound of abundance of rain. 42 So Ahab went up to eat and to drink. And Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; and he cast himself down upon the earth, and put his face between his knees, 43 And said to his servant, Go up now, look toward the sea. And he went up, and looked, and said, There is nothing. And he said, Go again seven times. 44 And it came to pass at the seventh time, that he said, Behold, there ariseth a little cloud out of the sea, like a man's hand. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down that the rain stop thee not. 45 And it came to pass in the mean while, that the heaven was black with clouds and wind, and there was a great rain. And Ahab rode, and went to Jezreel

I hear the sound of the abundance of rain: That means my ear has picked up a signal in the airwaves (Sound = vibrations) my ear has picked up the vibration of something that is coming. I can't see it, I can't touch it, I don't feel it but it's on the way. How do I know it's coming this way? Because it's getting louder all the time, (the closer it gets the louder it gets). When a train is coming your way, you feel the vibrations before it arrives. When large hail is coming your way, hear it blocks away. When 120 men and women had gathered in the upper room waiting for the promised power, the bible says in Acts 2:2 - And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. There was a sound: The sound was an indication (Something is coming). Acts 2:3-4 - And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. I hear the sound of an abundance of rain: Elijah spoke those words in a place and a time where there had not been one drop of water from the sky or due on the ground, in 3 ½ years. What did that mean? (Rain) It meant: life, recovery restoration, the rivers will run again, fish will be caught again, the crops will grow again,, there will be joy where there has been sorrow, there will be laughter where there has been weeping. God said to prophesy to you and tell you it's getting ready to rain, the rain is on it's way, I hear the abundance of rain. That may not mean anything to some of you, but for somebody listening to my voice it means everything. It's on the way, it's on the way, it's on the way (tell your neighbor, it's on the way) Help is on the way, the answer is on the way, the breakthrough is on the way. There's just something powerful about knowing that it's on the way that puts a fire back in your soul and a fight in your spirit, it gives you the strength to hold on. I don't know who I'm talking to but you prayed and you fasted, and you've cried and you've confessed the word and from every natural evidence (nothing has changed, and if the truth be known for many of you it's gotten worse). But I came to tell you: Change is in the atmosphere, the rain is coming, restoration is coming, healing is coming, peace is coming, joy is coming, I hear the sound of the Abundance of rain: I don't see any evidence, I don't see any sign, (but I hear it) Tell your neighbor: The sound is the sign Romans 10:17 - So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. There is a sound: The word sound does not just mean noise of racket. It means PROCLAMATION...It's a decree in the spirit realm. 1st John 5:4 - For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Somebody's faith is going to another level, (somebody who has been struggling through the wilderness of just enough and barely getting by is getting ready to go into overflow. Somebody is going to change addresses in the Spirit: Some of the stuff that used to hinder you, and used to pull down, after this Word they are not going to bother you anymore because you won't be living in that same neighborhood anymore. I hear the sound of the abundance of rain: What is the rain to you? The rain is Gods power visiting your life in whatever area or areas are in drought, or in lack, or broken or empty. The rain is God taking every plan, every plot and every scheme and every weapon that the devil has launched at you and turning it around for your good. The simplest definition of all is just answered prayer. I wish somebody would prophesy (God's gonna turn it around, now prophesy, God's gonna make it rain). Come on say it again: Gods gonna make it rain. The rain was on the way but there was work to be done: Ahab went to play and Elijah went to pray. E.M. Bounds, one of the greatest men of prayer that ever lived said: God does nothing except in answer to prayer. So if things seem to be stagnate around you and nothing seems to be moving (you better check your prayer temperature.) For every miracle, every breakthrough, every prodigal who comes home, every son or daughter who is delivered from drugs and perversion (Somebody has to pray) 42 So Ahab went up to eat and to drink. And Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; and he cast himself down upon the earth, and put his face between his knees, Elijah got himself in the birth position (head between his knees) and began to labor in prayer for what he heard in the Spirit. He sent his servant out to look toward the sea for an answer: (The sea represents the word of God) You have to get your eyes on the word. God's Simple Plan of Salvation

My Friend: we are about to ask you the most important question of your life. Your joy or your sorrow for all eternity depends upon your answer. The question is: Are you saved? Do you know Jesus Christ as your personal LORD and Saviour? It is not a question of how good you are, nor if you are a church member, but have you put your faith in Jesus? Are you sure you will go to Heaven when you die?
