**A Word to the Wise – The Things God Hates Prov. 6:12-24**

If one were to ask, “What does God call an abomination?” most Christians today would quickly cry, “Homosexuality!” though some might think of idolatry too. Are you aware that the Holy Ghost moved Solomon to list seven other things which are an abomination to God? Recognizing that the word “abomination” is defined as “a thing which causes disgust or hatred,” it would behoove us to take stock of ourselves to see where we stack up with God. We humans have a way of seeing any sin which isn’t ours as being a lesser one which we quickly justify, but God sets the standard and will judge by His perfect standard. Let’s do some serious self-examination, asking the Holy Ghost to help us see ourselves as God sees us. The following are those seven things that the Lord hates:

1. A Proud Look – representing a proud heart, something God detests
2. A Lying Tongue – God is Truth, the guardian of truth, and demands Truth.
3. Hands that Shed Innocent Blood – Do we make any excuse for abortion or euthanasia?
4. A Heart that Deviseth Wicked Imaginations – Would we contrive any wickedness?
5. Feet that Be Swift in Running to Mischief – Are we in a hurry to commit or watch evil works?
6. A False Witness that Speaketh Lies – Such falsehood brings evil against the innocent.
7. He that Soweth Discord Among Brethren – Peace, not strife, should be the goal of believers.

Perhaps you’re tempted to say about one of the above, “This is only a little thing, surely a look or ‘little white lie’ or a little teasing of discord can’t be that bad.” To such a one, I would give the warning of puritan Thomas Brooks: “One flaw spoils the diamond, one treason makes a traitor; ...one wound strikes Goliath dead...So, many men, by favoring one sin, lose God, heaven and their souls forever. Sin favored, ever ends in tragedy. A holy heart abhors all sin because it pollutes his soul and strikes against God’s holiness.” Don’t forget, these are things that God hates; they disgust Him.

What will keep us from these seven things which describe the “naughty person, a wicked man,” and one who walks with a self-willed, rebellious spirit (froward mouth), as described in verses 12-15? What will guard our feet from walking in those ways that our Lord hates? Verses 20-24 tells us that it is the blessing of godly upbringing that is cherished and adhered to. If we will protect in our minds those precious words of fatherly advice and motherly counsel; if we will constantly focus on them and duly consider them; they will lead us, protect us, counsel us, comfort us, and show us the way to life, and to life eternal. These godly instructions are given for the express purpose of protecting us from evil companions and smooth-talking people who would draw us into teaching which is incompatible with the Word, command, and counsel of God.

I beg of you, take these things seriously. If we would strike at the holiness of God, we strike at ourselves. Even as David passed such godly wisdom and warning on to his son Solomon, we should feel compelled to pass such counsel and warning on to our children. Our sacred responsibility is to pass the torch of godliness on to our children, they’ll be held accountable for what they do with it. Solomon urges his son to guard that sacred fire; let us do likewise.

Be warned, if we ourselves do not carry the torch of wisdom, we’re unable to pass it on to our children, others, or to be a light in this dark world.

On Christmas Eve of last year, a dear mentor of mine received his eternal reward in glory. Like a vanishing vapor, he exhaled his last breath on earth and inhaled his first breath in heaven. Next to my parents, Mr. Blackburn had the greatest impact on my life as I grew up. He was the song leader in our church and it was not uncommon to see him teary-eyed and broken over the words that conveyed what Jesus did for us on that cross so long ago. Throughout the years he would be my Sunday School or Wednesday night teacher where he'd share his experiences from the military, hunting, fishing, woodworking, or the public school in which he worked. On occasion, he would take us on camping trips, teaching us about the outdoors and Jesus. He was a godly man who loved Jesus, loved to sing about Jesus, loved to teach about Jesus, and loved everyone because of Jesus. He lived to be 90 years-old and in his latter years he had Alzheimer's. Even then, he loved to sing about Jesus and remained a gentle man. I can't think of a more fitting song for this man of God than Eliza E. Hewitt's hymn More About Jesus. It describes his life well and sums up what Mr. Blackburn taught me by his words and actions. I can still see his big smile, teary eyes, and can hear the brokenness in his voice as he would sing of his love for our Saviour. His life was a vapor, so is mine, and so is yours. What will you do with the life God has given you? My desire is to follow in his footsteps – learning more, loving more, and sharing more of Jesus. I pray that the Lord will help you to make these words your prayer.

Reesie's Recipes



Reesie's Broccoli Velveeta Soup

- 1 Cup Carrots, chopped
- 1 16 oz brick of Velveeta Cheese, cubed
- 1 Cup Celery, chopped
- ½ cup butter
- 2 Cups Broccoli, chopped
- ¼ C Flour
- 6-8 Cups Chicken Broth
- pepper to taste

Boil veggies in chicken broth until tender about 10-20 minutes. Add butter and flour. Add Velveeta, mix together until smooth. May add more chicken broth for desired consistency.

Upside Down Pizza

- 2 lb. ground beef
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 (26oz) jar Ragu spaghetti sauce
- 2 cup pkg. Mozzarella cheese, divided
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided
- 1 (8oz) can refrigerated Crescent rolls
- 1 small can sliced mushrooms, optional

Preheat oven to 350. Brown ground beef and onion in a large skillet, drain. Stir in spaghetti sauce. Spread 1/2 of mixture into a 9x13 cooking dish. Top with half of the Parmesan, Mozzarella and mushrooms. Then layer remaining sauce mixture, Parmesan cheese and remaining Mozzarella cheese. . Top with crescent rolls pinching seams together. Bake on 350 for 20 to 30 minutes or until rolls are golden brown.

One Pot Chilimac

- 1 lb ground beef
- 1/4 cup diced onion
- 1/4 cup diced bell pepper
- 1 can petite diced tomatoes
- 1 can chili beans
- 1 (8oz) can tomato sauce
- 1 lb elbow macaroni
- Beef broth
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 packets Velveeta cheese sauce

In a large skillet add one pound ground beef, diced onion and diced bell pepper. Cook until meat is done. Drain. Add chili seasoning, petite tomatoes, chili beans and tomato sauce. Stir together. Add elbow macaroni. Pour enough beef broth into the pan to cover macaroni completely. Bring to a boil, cover with lid and reduce heat to simmer. Once the macaroni is tender add cheddar cheese. Stir together to melt cheese. Add cheese sauce.

Brown Sugar Meatloaf

- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup ketchup
- 1 1/2 pounds lean ground beef
- 3/4 cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon chili powder

3/4 cup finely crushed saltine cracker crumbs

Preheat oven to 350. Lightly grease a 5x9 inch loaf pan. Press the brown sugar into the bottom of the loaf pan and spread the ketchup over the sugar. In a mixing bowl, thoroughly combine all remaining ingredients, shaping them into a loaf. Place in the pan: Lay the shaped meatloaf on top of the ketchup in the loaf pan. Bake in the preheated oven for 1 hour or until the juices run clear.



VANITY Of VANITIES

Better Than He

“If a man beget an hundred children, and live many years, so that the days of his years be many, and his soul be not filled with good, and also that he have no burial; I say, that an untimely birth is better than he. For he cometh in with vanity, and departeth in darkness, and his name shall be covered with darkness. Moreover he hath not seen the sun, nor known any thing: this hath more rest than the other. Yea, though he live a thousand years twice told, yet hath he seen no good: do not all go to one place? All the labour of man is for his mouth, and yet the appetite is not filled.” Ecclesiastes 6:3-7 -

Solomon here is speaking on the vanity of having many blessings, yet never enjoying them. He presents us with an example to really establish the issues surrounding absurd amounts of wealth - There is a man who is exceedingly rich, he has many children, and he lives a long life. The man has all of these things, and yet he is not satisfied by all of his blessings. Solomon declares that an “untimely birth” is better than the unsatisfied man.

The phrase “an untimely birth” is accurately reflecting the meaning of the original Hebrew word, but there are still some questions on what it truly means. Other translations provide us with two primary options - “the miscarried” and “the stillborn”. These two options are closely related, but are not interchangeable. A miscarriage is a loss of pregnancy before the 20th week and a stillborn is a loss of pregnancy after the 20th week. Solomon doesn’t give a strong indicator as to which he is referring to and the reason is this - the emphasis isn’t meant to be on the unborn child, but instead what the comparison means for the man. The point is that it would be better for one to be born dead - the one who never experienced life is in a more fortunate position than the man who never became satisfied by life.

The lost child came into the world “in vanity” - the child never got to experience life outside of the womb, meaning the time in the womb was but a vain effort. He departed in darkness, never getting to witness the light of the sun for himself, and “his name shall be covered with darkness” - while his parents may remember his name, eventually he will be lost to the sands of time with no one remembering him in any way. Despite all of this, Solomon believes that this child is in a far better position than the man who has been extraordinarily blessed, yet is not satisfied. Solomon states that the man could live to be 2,000 years old, but if he never experiences satisfaction and contentment in his blessings, then what benefit is it to him? Everyone dies and goes to the afterlife, so the one who never had to experience the issues of this life is in a far better position than the man who had to deal with the struggles of this life.

Solomon finishes this passage by stating that all of a man’s work is for his own “mouth” - our work is for us to enjoy. If our appetite is not filled, if we are constantly unsatisfied with the things God has blessed us with, then we are no better than those that have already died - Solomon would actually argue that they’re in a better position than us.



Charles Darwin's Last Words

The following little account by Lady Hope of the death of Charles Darwin, the Evolutionist, is startling; it is most wonderful as we read the narrative; it contains the account of a great and terrible tragedy, the tragedy of sixty years.

Darwin is propped up in bed, and he looks out over the lovely landscape, as the sun is setting. He is reading the Bible! Says Lady Hope, I made some allusions to the strong opinions expressed by many persons on the history of the creation, its grandeur and then their treatment of the earlier chapters of the book of Genesis.

He seemed greatly distressed, his fingers twitched nervously, and a look of agony came over his face as he said: "I was a young man of unformed ideas, I threw out queries, suggestions wondering all the time over everything, and to my astonishment the idea took like wildfire. People made a religion of them.

Was there ever a more dramatic scene? The very soul of tragedy is here exposed to us! Darwin enthusiastic for the Bible, speaking with glowing enthusiasm about the grandeur of this Book. Reminded of that modern evolutionary movement in theology, which linked with skeptical criticism, has become a blight in all the churches and has destroyed the Biblical faith of the multitudes. Darwin, with a look of agony, deploring it all and declaring, "I was a young man of unformed ideas," imploring his visitor he said:

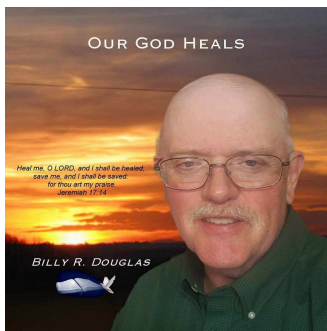
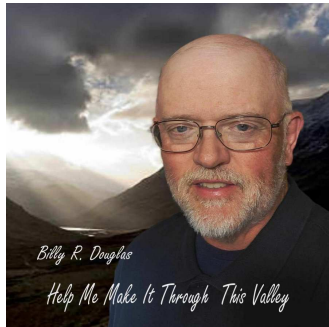
"Do gather servants, tenants, and neighbors together and preach to them Jesus Christ. I know you read the Bible in the villages."

This remarkable picture of Darwin is a challenge to every Modernist. What an overwhelming criticism! The "unformed ideas" of the young man Darwin are the basis of modern evolutionary theology.

The above account should cause each of us to take heed and consider our "every idle word," before we even speak them. God tells us we will be held accountable for them "in the day of judgment" (Matt. 12:36). The words we use give opportunity for others to either draw closer to Christ or to abandon Jesus and question the Bible. What a frightening prospect. Might we guard our soul with the Apostle Paul's words to the Romans: "God forbid: yea, let God be true, but every man a liar; as it is written, That thou mightest be justified in thy sayings, and mightest overcome when thou art judged." (Rom. 3:4)

How sad that many churches, pulpits, and Christian schools sold the truth for acceptance and the desire to be smart by aligning themselves with "science." Better to stand alone on the Word of God and let God vindicate us in the last day than to seek the applause of men. Besides, given enough time, science always catches up with the Bible, time after time after time.

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: Ephesians 6:10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

Additional passages for Today: Ephesians 1:15-21; 3:16-19; Joshua 1:6-9; 2 Corinthians 12:9-10; Colossians 1:9-13

Thought for Today: To be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might, we must first be in the Lord and second rely on the power of His might. Our inner being must be submitted and dependent on the Lord at all times.

Story for Today: Christopher and Jacob paused their discussion as Maria, the class president, stopped in front of them. They had been discussing what to do with some of the knowledge they had received about recent happenings around town. It seemed that a few of the guys had taken their 4-wheelers out to have fun and ended up on the soccer fields. Several donuts had ruined the turf and there were a lot of unhappy adults.
