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A Word to the Wise – Love Wisely

“Better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a stalled ox and hatred therewith. A wrathful man stirreth up strife: but he that is slow to anger appeaseth strife.” Prov. 15:17-18

There's a whole lot in the Bible that tells us about love and its consequences. This month we're focusing on love from Proverbs 15, which, interestingly, starts by telling us to choose our words wisely. What husband or wife (or any of us in any relationship – even regarding that of strangers) wouldn't be better off thinking of this first verse before opening our mouths: “A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger.” This fifteenth chapter continues pointing us to our words and attitudes – let us read chapter 15 and take heed!

Our key verse points us to the fact that saltine crackers and water eaten in an atmosphere of love is more enjoyable and more easily digested than a porterhouse steak with all the trimmings and your favorite beverage eaten in an atmosphere of bitterness or hatred. It's not just about food either, love can turn just about any activity, regardless of how distasteful it is, into a pleasurable experience. The opposite is just as true; if you're involved in a favorite pastime, but there's bitterness or strife – even if unspoken but felt – it's just not much fun. I've been around people who can make anything pleasant and I've been around others who can suck the joy out of an ice cream cone, favorite game, or walk in the woods.

Our second key verse pretty much describes how that works. Whether it's from pride, selfishness, or anger (as our key verse describes), there are men (or women) who just do not possess a spirit of joy; because of that, they don't think anyone else should be enjoying themselves either. They lack self-control and, in so doing, desire to control everything or everyone around them. Most “wrathful men” don't think of it as “wanting to be in control,” yet, they “stirreth up strife,” and sometimes are ignorant that they are the cause. This shouldn't happen with Christians, but I've known pastors, board members, and laymen who claim to be saved and sanctified, to cause more discomfort and strife by their actions, words, and attitudes, than those who aren't even saved or darken the doors of a church.

On the other hand, there are those who allow the oil of the Spirit to soften their words and attitudes regardless of whether they get their way or if everything seems to go wrong. They take the words of James 1:19-20 to heart: “Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God.” If we will be slow to anger we can hear the whole story; we can measure our words, actions, and attitudes; we can keep our relationships from going sour; and, most importantly, we can glorify God.

With the above, we can see the importance of guarding love, reveling in love, and we can also see how such love benefits those around us. Truly it is loving “our neighbor” as ourself.

I would be remiss if I didn't address the other side of a loving relationship: whether we are talking about a parent's love for their children, husbands and wives who are still deeply in love, or best friends who cannot imagine life without the other. We must take great care in not idolizing such relationships; we must still love the Lord our God above everyone else.

John Wesley addressed this well regarding such relationships: “But they are neither commanded nor permitted to love one another idolatrously. Yet how common is this! How frequently is a husband, a wife, a child, put in the place of God! How many that are accounted good Christians, fix their affections on each other. Now, if this is not flat idolatry, I cannot tell what is.

“Universal experience both our own, and that of all our friends and acquaintance, clearly proves, that as God made our hearts for himself, so they cannot rest till they rest in him. Till we acquaint ourselves with him, we cannot be at peace.”



Love's Standard

“This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you.” John 15:12

The Bible tells us that God is love (1 Jn. 4:8, 16) and that Jesus was the expression of God's love for us (Jn. 3:16). In John 15:2 Jesus gives us both a command – “Love one another” – and sets the standard of love by which that command is to be fulfilled – “AS I have loved you.”

Can you imagine what went through the disciples' minds as they were given the standard of love that they were to carry out? Rough men full of humanity, quibbling over who will get seats of honor, struggling with pride and ambition, yet, with all their foibles, loving Jesus and His teaching, desiring to please Him, and striving to carry out His every command. “How can we love AS Jesus has loved us and as we've seen Him love others?”

If we are serious about fulfilling this command from our Lord, at first it will seem very daunting. Full of humanity and knowing our own selfishness and weaknesses, we also ask, “How can I love others AS Jesus loved? Those are ‘big shoes’ to fill.” Our minds may race through the gospels searching for ways in which we can say, “THIS is an example of Jesus' love. Wow, what would that action look like in my life? How can I show love to others – just AS Jesus loved.”

Then the disciples (and we) hear Jesus share how that standard is to be lived out – it's a sacrificial love for others. “Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends” (John 15:13).

Can we recognize that Jesus IS love, that love is not just something He did, but it IS His character, His essence, and all that He did stemmed from and was because He IS love?

With that in mind, our minds again race through the gospels and the examples we found at first have now increased and we see love everywhere: Jesus loved enough to rebuke Peter, warn the Pharisees and Sadducees with strong language, and exhort those He came into contact with, regardless of what their responses might be. Jesus loved enough to teach others about the Kingdom of God and speak truth when it was unpopular. Jesus not only had compassion but He loved enough to meet the needs of those He had compassion on, even though He Himself may have been tired and weary. Jesus loved enough to pray early, often, and long. Jesus loved enough to cleanse the temple, often be misunderstood, or put Himself at odds with religious leaders. In all this, Jesus was laying down His life for His friends until, finally and literally, He gave up His temporal life so that others might live eternally. Jesus was willing to be forsaken by God so that you and I would never need to be forsaken. “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God” (John 3:16-18).

This is sacrificial love; it was portrayed physically and spiritually. This is the love that followers of Christ are called to.

There's hardly a father or mother who wouldn't take a bullet for their child or drown in an attempt to save him/her, but do we love that child enough to have intentional and hard conversations with them over spiritual things? Do we love enough to deny ourselves rest or cut back on times of entertainment to sincerely pray often for that child and lead our family in prayer and devotions? Do we love enough to warn others of a hell to shun and a heaven to gain, regardless of how we may be perceived or rejected? Do we love enough to question a church that has “gone off the rails” of holy living or has watered down the gospel? Do we love enough that we don't care if we are misunderstood? Are we willing to lay down our lives – fulfilling the sacrificial standard of love set before us by Jesus – obeying our Lord's command to love one another AS He has loved us?



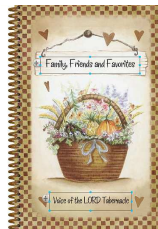
Reesie's Recipes



Ice Cream Cake

- 1 box (12 count) ice cream sandwiches
- 1 (12oz) jar Smuckers caramel topping or (14oz) jar Hershey's caramel topping
- 1 (8oz) bowl Cool Whip, softened
- 1 (7oz) chocolate Magic Shell

Set cool whip out or in bottom of fridge to allow to soften. Set jar of caramel topping and Magic Shell in a bowl of hot water so they will pour easily. In a 9x13 dish or pan (with lid) lay ice cream sandwiches single layer to cover pan. You may have to cut one or two of them in order to get them all to fit. Pour caramel topping evenly over ice cream sandwiches. Gently spread Cool Whip evenly over caramel. Cover with Magic Shell, spreading gently with a spoon to cover Cool whip. Put the lid on the pan and put in freezer to freeze.



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Sunshine Cake

- 1 (15.25-ounce) package yellow cake mix
- 1 (3-ounce) package instant lemon pudding mix
- 1 cup orange juice
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup crushed pineapple in syrup, drained
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans

Glaze

- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 stick butter
- 1/2 cup orange juice

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F. Grease a 10-inch Bundt pan. In a large bowl, combine the cake mix and the pudding mix and stir to combine. In a separate bowl combine eggs, orange juice and oil. Mix together well and add to cake mix.. Mix ingredients well with a hand mixer. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake, about 35 to 45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Remove cake from oven and place on cooling rack while still in the cake pan

Glaze - In a saucepan over medium heat, combine the orange juice, the sugar, and the butter and bring to a boil. Boil for 4 minutes. Remove from heat. Poke holes in cake and drizzle the glaze over the cake. Let cake stand for 10 minutes and then turn cake out onto plate.

THE STORY BEHIND THE SONG

Sydney E. Cox (1887-1975) was born in England but moved to Canada. From 1909 to 1944 he worked in the Salvation Army, eventually becoming a Major. From there he devoted the remainder of his life to evangelical revival work. Of the 400 songs he either authored or composed, Deep and Wide is his most well-known. According to his grandson, Sidney was saddened that the verses to this song "had basically been lost to obscurity."

I would like to take the rest of this article NOT to discuss the fountain which flows deep and wide, but, rather, to bring those three verses out from obscurity and to the hearts and minds of our dear readers.

1. There's a wondrous fountain, Filled with living water, Flowing from the Saviour's wounded side.

Today I Stood!

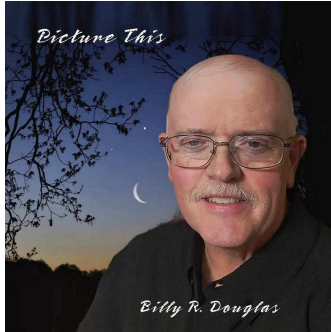
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Today I stood at my window and complained about the pouring rain,
