### “Veterans Of The Faith”

Scripture Reference: 2nd Timothy 2:3-4

*Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. 4 No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.*

Quotes: “The most persistent sound which reverberates through men's history is the beating of war drums.” -Otto Von Bismark --And so it is within mankind (the war between the Spirit and the flesh... a constant struggle). “Never has there been a good war or a bad peace.” -Benjamin Franklin “Courage is almost a contradiction in terms. It means a strong desire to live taking the form of readiness to die.” -G. K. Chesterton “Some people live an entire lifetime and wonder if they have ever made a difference in the world, but the Soldiers of the US don't have that problem.” –Adapted from Ronald Reagan “I do not fear an army of lions, if they are led by a lamb. I do fear an army of sheep, if they are led by a lion.” -Alexander the Great --Jesus is the Lion of the tribe of Judea and we are the sheep of His pasture. To be a “good soldier” in Christ / to be a veteran of the Faith you “must”: Obey the Commander and Chief (Jesus the Christ). Engage the enemy (at all times on all fronts). Fight to the end (never giving up). Ephesians 1:18-23 - The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints, 19 And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power, 20 Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly places, 21 Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come: 22 And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, 23 Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all. Jesus Christ is the Commander-&Chief of the Church. And as Christians we are to obey the orders of our commander. And the Old Testament tells us that in 1st Samuel 15:22 - And Samuel said, Hath the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams. Jesus even said Himself in John 14:15 - If ye love me, keep my commandments. Luke 6:46 – And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say? Secondly, we must fight our enemy on every hand...1st Peter 5:8 – Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: The New Testament reminds us that our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against spiritual forces. Sometimes you feel like you are completely surrounded by the enemy of your soul... That just means you can attack on every front; 1st John 4:4 - Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world. And Lastly, Fight unto the very end; for Matthew 24:13 tells us, But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved. And we know most assuredly that our Lord will go with us until the very end without fail. Never ever give up. Fight, and fight some more. A veteran of the Faith never gives up. “Gentleman Jim” Corbett, a great heavyweight boxer said: “Fight one more round. When your feet are so tired that you have to shuffle back to the center of the ring, fight one more round. When your arms are so tired that you can hardly lift your hands to guard yourself, fight one more round. When your nose is bleeding and your eyes are black and you are so tired that you wish your opponent would crack you on the jaw and put you to sleep, fight one more round—remembering that the man who fights one more round is never whipped.” So then Veteran of the Faith-Fight one more round and when you hear the bell call that round over, FIGHT yet another. Keep on fighting; fight unto very end; for if we will never give up on the Lord, you will have victory in the end. If you live right, you will die right. Jesus never gave/nor gives up on you. So Fight the Good Fight of Faith. As Paul so valiantly said in 2nd Timothy 4:7-8 - I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith:8 Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing. Churchill rallied Britain with to fight with these words: “We shall fight on the beaches, we shall fight on the landing grounds, we shall fight in the fields and in the streets, and we shall fight in the hills. We shall never surrender.” So then today I tell you, we shall fight in our homes, we shall fight on the work places, we shall fight in the fields and in the streets of our fair city, we shall fight in the hills. And we shall never surrender. Romans 8:31 - What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us? “War is an ugly thing, but The person who has nothing for which he is willing to fight is a miserable creature...” - John Stuart Mill Young David came to the battle field and saw firsthand the sad situation and heard the vile cries of the ungodly Philistine and cried out, “Is there not a cause?” Is there not a cause today in your life worth going to altar one more time to battle against? ## REESIE'S RECIPES

### Chocolate Over-load Cake

- 1 (18.25 ounce) package chocolate cake mix
- 1 (5.9 ounce) package instant chocolate pudding mix
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup warm water
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 tub chocolate cake frosting

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, mix together the cake, pudding mix, sour cream, oil, beaten eggs and water. Stir in the chocolate chips and pour batter into a well greased 12 cup bundt pan. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes, or until top is springy to the touch and a wooden toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool cake thoroughly in pan at least an hour and a half before inverting onto a plate. Warm frosting and drizzle over cake.

### Award Winning Chili

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 2 (10.75 ounce) cans condensed tomato soup
- 2 (14.5 ounce) cans chicken broth
- 1 (14.5 ounce) can crushed tomatoes
- 5 tablespoons chili powder
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 (15.5 ounce) cans pinto beans, drained
- cayenne pepper to taste (optional)

In a large skillet combine ground beef, onion, red pepper flakes, and half of the cumin; cook until beef is brown, drain off fat. Combine beef mixture, tomato soup, chicken broth, and crushed tomatoes in large pot. Season with chili powder, salt and pepper. Simmer for 30 minutes. Pour in the beans, and season with remaining cumin and cayenne pepper; simmer for another 30 minutes.

### Corn Dodger Muffins


- 2 (8.5 ounce) packages cornbread mix
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 cup grated Cheddar cheese
- Chopped Jalapeño's (optional)

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Lightly grease muffin tins. Stir together the cornbread mix and the brown sugar in a large bowl. Whisk the eggs and milk in a small bowl until smooth. Fold the eggs and cheese into the dry mixture until moistened. Add jalapenos if desired. Spoon mixture into muffin tins until 2/3 full. Bake in a preheated oven 14 to 18 minutes, or until golden brown. Great with chili or soup.

### Vegetable Beef Soup

- 1 pound ground beef
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 4 cups water
- 2 (1 ounce) packages dry onion soup mix
- 1 (15 ounce) can tomato sauce
- 2 stalks celery, chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 (16 ounce) package frozen mixed vegetables
- 3/4 cup elbow macaroni

In a saute pan, brown ground beef, over medium heat. In a large stock pot, combine broth, water, onion soup mix, tomato sauce, celery, onion, frozen vegetables and macaroni. Bring to a boil and then simmer until macaroni is done and vegetables are tender. Add browned ground beef, mix and serve.

A single sentinel takes his post guarding carefully, walking exactly 21 steps then pausing for 21 seconds before turning around and continuing his duty. When the changing of the guard takes place, the orders are passed from one soldier to the next – "Orders Remain Unchanged." As we enter into a New Year, the world is rapidly changing before our eyes!
