

Spiritual Burnout (part 01)

And he sat down, and taught the people out of the ship. 4 Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. 5 And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net. 6 And when they had this done, they inclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. 7 And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink. 8 When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, Depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord. 9 For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of the fishes which they had taken: 10 And so was also James, and John, the sons of Zebedee, which were partners with Simon. And Jesus said unto Simon, Fear not; from henceforth thou shalt catch men. 11 And when they had brought their ships to land, they forsook all, and followed him.

Stress and burnout can often happen to Christians in their service to the Lord way to often. Paul encouraged the believers in the churches of Galatia to 'be not weary in well-doing'. There is a reason that our service to the Lord is called 'work'! Jesus reminded us of the priority of doing the 'work' of God in John 9:4 - I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work. So I want to talk to you about how to avoid spiritual burnout and how to work for the Lord without growing weary of the Lord's work. Believe me it can and does happen to each and every one of us at times but we can prevent it. Here's a few things I want to share with you today...I. Indicators of Spiritual Burnout A. Lack of Enthusiasm Anytime we become very familiar with something, there is a danger of losing interest. (Consider various ministries we have seen come and go over the years.) We see that even new things are exciting...new clothes...new cars...and even new ministries but we can all grow complacent about them...when we grow complacent about reaching people with the Gospel message...then there are eternal consequences! B. Lack of Activity I am talking about the temptation of quitting... Ask yourself this, "Am I doing less for the Lord than I used to do?" If so, why is that? For some it might be physical limitation but for others...it may be that you are just growing weary...Perhaps you need to refocus and take a look at what needs to be done for The Lord. (Remember the priority of God's work!) Lack of enthusiasm results in a lack of activity...then it is but a short time before there is the...C. Presence of Stagnation What am I talking about? A beautiful mountain stream or the stagnate sludge pit; both are water, h2-0, but there is a vast difference! This can happen to a believer...so excited about their new life in Christ...but that enthusiasm begins to wane then they quit witnessing...quit reading their Bible...quit praying...quit coming to church! Did they lose their salvation? NO...they simply allowed themselves to burnout spiritually and are on the backslidden road! This is very dangerous for any child of God that's why it's so important to rely on other brothers and sisters in Christ, Let's look at another help....II. Partnership to Avoid Burnout Luke 5:1-11 - And it came to pass, that, as the people pressed upon him to hear the word of God, he stood by the lake of Gennesaret, 2 And saw two ships standing by the lake: but the fishermen were gone out of them, and were washing their nets. 3 And he entered into one of the ships, which was Simon's, and prayed him that he would thrust out a little from the land. And he sat down, and taught the people out of the ship. 4 Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. 5 And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net. 6 And when they had this done, they inclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. 7 And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink. 8 When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, Depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord. 9 For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of the fishes which they had taken: 10 And so was also James, and John, the sons of Zebedee, which were partners with Simon. And Jesus said unto Simon, Fear not; from henceforth thou shalt catch men. 11 And when they had brought their ships to land, they forsook all, and followed him. The word 'partners' is found twice in this passage. This word speaks of fellowship. It also speaks of being fellow laborers. Being a partner means being associated one with the other, a partaker, and companion one with the other. These men were partners in fishing, and now God is going to cause them to be partners in ministry as well.

Pastor Steve's 2021 Challenge

Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created. Revelation 4:11

At the beginning of each New Year I challenge my congregation in a specific area of study or Bible reading. At this point it's a given that we hope to read through the Bible. Why? Because it's a lamp unto our feet, a light unto our path, and we hide it in our hearts so that we do not sin against God. The Bible "is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works." The statistics regarding people who call themselves Christians, how much time they spend in the Word of God, and if they believe it to be infallible, objective truth to be followed is appalling. Andrew Snelling puts it this way: "A choice has to be made between Scripture, which is authored by God, and modern science, which is authored by men." The simple fact that much of the world and the church have relegated Genesis 1-11 to the category of fable is reprehensible; and, if rejected as real history, then the trustworthiness of salvation, sanctification, and other parts of the Bible are called into question as well. My challenge to you is three-fold this year. 1) Jesus saw Genesis 1-11 as real history; as you read through the Gospels, write down those portions of Scripture where Jesus quotes from those chapters or alludes to them as being real. 2) The apostles also saw Genesis 1-11 as real history. As you read through the rest of the New Testament write down those portions of Scripture that they quote from or allude to. 3) Share what you learn from these exercises with others that you meet. Encourage those you attend church with, use this as an opportunity to talk about the Bible with those you work, play, or go to school with. This year's challenge may stretch you Biblically, spiritually, and evangelistically. After all, do YOU really believe the Scriptures? If so, then you will want to see others make it to heaven, avoiding the eternal punishment of hell. If you only half-heartedly believe the Scriptures then you need to examine your beliefs and assurance of salvation. Remember, "A choice has to be made between Scripture, which is authored by God, and modern science, which is authored by men." Let me whet your appetite with a few Scriptures to start you off with. (You may want to grab a pencil and a notebook NOW!) John starts his gospel talking about Jesus (he sat under his Master's teaching for years) and says in 1:3, "All things were made by him, and without him was not any thing made that was made" Peter declared that Jesus was "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16), and Jesus did not rebuke him for blasphemy, but instead praised him for his confession and acknowledged that God ("my Father which is in Heaven") had revealed this truth to him. Furthermore, Jesus claimed, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). If Jesus was telling lies when He made these claims and approved of others for making incorrect claims about Him, then He is not "the truth." With that in mind, it is important that we recognize that Jesus confirmed that Moses was the author of the book of Genesis by using the Jewish subdivisions of the Old Testament Scriptures: "These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me"(Luke 24:44) Did you know that in the Gospels Jesus referred directly to details in each of the first seven chapters of Genesis a total of fifteen times? Beyond that, He made an allusion to a detail recorded in Genesis 9. These are things to include in your study notebook—make sure to share them with others. Quoting from Andrew Snelling's book Earth's Catastrophic Past (p. 7): "For example, Jesus referred to Genesis 1:26-27 when He said in Mark 10:6, 'But from the beginning of the creation God made them male and female.' In the very next verse, Jesus quoted directly from Genesis 2:24 when He said, 'For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and cleave to his wife; and they twain shall be one flesh; so then they are no more twain, but one flesh.' The same comments by Jesus are also recorded in Matthew 19:4-6. It should be noted that Jesus confirmed the details of Genesis 1 when He said that man was created male and female 'from the beginning of creation,' not after millions of years of evolution. Five times Jesus referred to Noah and/or the destructive global Flood of Genesis 6-7 in Matthew 24:37-39 and Luke 17:26-27. One is forced to conclude that Jesus regarded Genesis as real history, and if He, as the Creator, was actually a witness to the events of Genesis 1-11, then we have absolutely no alternative but to likewise regard these opening chapters of the Bible as reliable literal history." This year's challenge is to get you into the Word specifically recognizing why we believe that Genesis 1-11 is fact, not fable; and therefore, the principles that are taught within those chapters are true and right regardless of what man's "science" comes up with. In the next few years, should the Lord tarry, our beliefs will be assaulted unlike ever before. Let us firmly stand alone on the Word of God, believing the Word Incarnate, Jesus Christ. I would love to hear from any who are going to take the challenge so that I can remember you in prayer. Feel free to share your thoughts as the Spirit guides you into all truth.





Cherry Salad

2 (3 oz.) pkgs. cherry gelatin

2 c. boiling water

1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple

1 (21 oz.) can cherry pie filling

1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese

1/2 c. sugar

1/2 c. sour cream

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1/2 c. chopped nuts

In a large bowl combine the gelatin and hot water. Add the pineapple and cherry pie filling. Pour into an 8x10-inch glass dish. Chill until set. Soften the cream cheese and mix well with the sugar. Blend in the sour cream and vanilla. Spread over the gelatin mixture.

Sprinkle with nuts.

Coca-Cola Pork Chops

8 pork chops
salt and pepper to taste
1 cup ketchup
1 cup coca-cola
brown sugar

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place pork chops into a baking pan, sprinkle with salt and pepper. Mix together the ketchup, cola and and pour cola mixture over the chops, coating well. Sprinkle with brown sugar. Bake uncovered for one hour or until the pork chops are tender.

Drop Biscuits

2 cups self rising flour

1 cup milk

4 Tbsp mayonaise

Preheat oven to 450. In a bowl combine all ingredients. Drop onto a greased baking sheet.

Bake until browned.

Cowboy Soup

1 lb ground beef

1/2 cup chopped onion

1 (16oz) can mixed vegetables

1 (10oz) can rotel tomatoes

1 (13oz) can Spanish rice

1 (14.5oz) can stewed tomatoes

1 (17oz) can cream style corn

In a large stock pot brown the ground beef and the onion. Add the remaining ingredients. Cover and simmer for about 1 hour.

Thick & Hearty Chili

1 lb ground beef

1 sweet onion, chopped

3 medium ribs or celery, chopped

1/2 green pepper, chopped

1 (15oz) can tomatoes

1/2 cup water

1 (15oz) can chili beans

1/2 tsp. black pepper

1 tsp. salt

4 tablespoons chili powder

2 tablespoon brown sugar

1/2 cup ketchup

Add ground beef, onion, celery and green pepper to a large skillet. Cook over medium heat until done. Drain meat and place in a pot. Add remaining ingredients

Cover and simmer for 30 minutes.

When she was asked how she managed this, she said: "Because to the authority of a father I did not oppose the authority of a mother, but that of God. From their earliest years my children have

always seen the Bible on my table. This holy book has constituted the whole of their religious instruction. I was silent, that I might allow it to speak. Did they propose a question, did they commit any fault, did they perform any good action—I opened the Bible, and the Bible answered, reproved or encouraged them. The constant reading of the Scriptures alone has wrought the prodigy which surprises you."

Why did the angel tell Mary and Joseph to name the baby "Jesus"? Is there some holy significance to this particular sequence of letters or sounds? No, these letters and sounds are different in every language into which the name of Jesus is translated. The name "Jesus" is not phonologically unique; it was a fairly common Jewish name and is still used today, though not in English. For example, Jes'us is a fairly common name in many Hispanic countries. Jesus is an English rendering of the Greek name lesous, which is a translation of the ancient Hebrew Yehoshua. This name is formed from Hebrew signifying " Jehovah is salvation" and is translated in our English Old Testament as "Joshua." The Greek version of this name also refers to Joshua in the New Testament [Heb.4:8] The name of Jesus is significant because of who it represents. It represents God our Savior. Jesus Christ is Immanuel, "God with us" [Matt. 1:22-23]. He came to earth as a man in order to die in our place and to become our savior. This is why the angel said, "you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." In the words of the old hymn "What a Savior" He left the Father with all his riches, With calmness sweet and serene came down from heaven and gave His life's blood, to make the vilest sinner clean. O what a Savior!!!

Thought for Today: Putting your trust in God sometimes means that you believe what doesn't make sense.

Story for Today: Run, Run, as fast as you can, you can't catch me I'm the ... Lisa closed her eyes as she thought about the gingerbread man that allowed himself to get eaten by the fox. Why was life so difficult? The older she got the harder and more consequence she saw in the decisions she made. Beginning her freshman year in high school she recognized the anxiety of many of her peers; a new school building and lots of upperclassmen. She had tried to just blend in but her natural intelligence made that difficult as friends from her younger years often singled her out for information in front of everyone. Why hadn't that gingerbread man just been content? Why did he run away? And why, oh, why did he trust the fox? Lisa recalled the people in her life that often said she was too trusting. "Sometimes," she admitted, "they were right." Desperately trying to not draw attention to herself, Lisa had done things she wasn't proud of. He prayed she would do the right thing. Mr. Martin also attended the same church as Jordan and had been mentoring him for the past year. They had been studying the Bible and praying together for ways that they could reach others in their neighborhood. Jordan had studied the scriptures that talk about trusting God and how to take the counsel of God by reading the Bible.
