Have you ever wondered why you do what you do? One former Navy pilot tells how he was living a wilder life than he knew he should live. He decided his problem was that he was being led astray by his friends in flight training. So he arranged to finish his work in the program early and be transferred to another field nearby. And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment, And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment. Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner. And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on. There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty. And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most? Simon answered and said, I suppose that he, to whom he forgave most. And he said unto him, Thou hast rightly judged. And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head. Thou gavest me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss my feet. My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment. Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little. And he said unto her, Thy sins are forgiven. And they that sat at meat with him began to say within themselves, Who is this that forgiveth sins also? And he said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace. Luke 7:36-50

Luke 7:44 - And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head. How often do we take the presence of Jesus for granted? Our psuedo-Christian culture is profane. I speak not of the profanity of foul language, but the profanity of treating divine things with a casual, apathetic, flippant attitude. We profane holy things by making them common, ordinary, usual, mundane, and routine. Interestingly enough, only those who know the Holy are in danger of becoming too familiar with it. Unbelievers, those who are not yet acquainted with the Holy, cannot profane what they do not understand. The danger of familiarity is in knowing and taking for granted. This is illustrated for us here in Luke 7. A Pharisee invites Jesus to dinner. This is not an irreligious man who invites the Lord, but a member of the strictest religious order. Jesus accepts his invitation and they sit down to have a meal. While they are sitting at the table, a woman enters the room with an alabaster box of ointment. We know she is a sinner, because Luke says, "A woman in the city, which was a sinner..." (Luke 7:37ff). This sinner does a strange and wonderful thing. She washes the feet of Jesus with her tears, wipes them with her hair, kisses His feet, and pours the fragrant ointment out on Him. The Pharisee, of course, is highly offended that this sinner has come uninvited to his home. He is also a bit embarrassed about this display of affection. And he thinks to himself, "If Jesus were a real prophet, He would know that this woman is a sinner!" But in the mind of Jesus, the real issue is, "Who really loves Me, and who takes Me for granted?" No one traveled for pleasure in those days, the way we do now. Travel at that time was universally despised as a hot, dirty ordeal to be avoided if at all possible. Most people, Jesus included, traveled on foot. So the ritual of taking care of guests followed a predictable pattern and centered around the feet. Upon entering someone's home, the host would greet his guests with a kiss on each cheek and offer water for their tired, dirty feet. If available, some perfumed ointment would also be offered to soothe and freshen them up a bit. But the Pharisee failed to provide Jesus with even the most basic, usual, and customary courtesies given to guests: Luke 7:44-46 - And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head. Thou gavest me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss my feet. My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment....(to be continued next month)

#### Not Enough Salt

I recently read an account about a man, who as a boy, lived during the Great Depression. In those days there wasn't refrigeration and if meat was to be kept it had to be heavily salted or it would rot. His mother would cut up a gutted pig and he was responsible for making sure it was well salted. There came a day when special company was coming over for supper so he and his mother went out to the smokehouse and he took down the largest ham hanging from the rafters. When his mother's butcher knife penetrated the beautiful, large ham he had two thoughts that went through his mind at the same time. First was the frown on his mother's face and the other was the worst odor he had ever encountered. The ham had rotted and was full of maggots. His mother simply said, "Son, not enough salt." As we recognize the decay and stench that pervades much of our society today, we need to remember that there are still many good people from all walks of life who are still kind and willing to lend a helping hand. We need only to see groups and individuals responding to disasters like the recent devastation left in the wake of tornadoes in Kentucky or the offer of roadside assistance to one whose car isn't working as it should to recognize this truth. So then, the question begs to be asked, "Why the disconnect? Why is our society and culture crumbling and rotting?" Perhaps the answer is, "Son, not enough salt." Jesus, speaking to His disciples in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), said, "Ye are the salt of the earth; but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted? it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men. (5:13)" Christian, we are to be salt and light (v.14) in this corruption-filled, maggot-infested, darkening world. That takes more than kindness and niceties; it's giving grace to those who show no grace and sharing the gospel truth with them. It's the Holy Spirit within you that makes you salty; it's the gospel of Jesus Christ that has transformed you from corruption to life, from maggot-ridden to a new and living creature, and from darkness to light. The world needs to see that you are different and they need to know why. I'm asking you, as one of our recent speakers asked his audience, "When's the last time you shared your faith? We should be doing so daily!" Even if one supports a salt and light ministry, he/she should still be spreading salt where they themselves travel. Darkness cannot reign where Light shines and maggots cannot survive where the salt of holiness rules. Spirit-filled individuals are meant to make a difference. I went to the funeral of a friend last week; he was one who made a difference. He was a grand example of supporting salt/light ministries and sharing the gospel personally. It was told how wherever he went he handed out a green tract which presented the gospel and he would speak into people's lives. His salt had NOT lost its savour and his light was NOT hidden under a bushel. I and many others are greatly saddened by his passing, and feel the loss; but, he is basking in the Light of his Savior and worshiping the God who had saved him from his sin. He finished well. I couldn't be happier for him. Another thing to keep in mind is that Jesus' exhortations to being salt and light were given in the context of persecution. Sharing salt in the brokenness that surrounds us will either bring healing or persecution. As Christian ministries and individuals come under attack for Christ's sake, for righteousness' sake, we are called to rejoice and to continue being salt and light to a dark and dying world (Matt. 5:10-12). Blessedness, not bitterness, must define us. May the love of Christ constrain us to announce like the angels of old, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men;" and move us to "Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." Be extra salty this season! Believers need no excuse to share the gospel; but, if you're one who isn't used to sharing their faith, Christmas offers us an opportunity to do so. For the believer, nothing should be more natural than talking about Jesus at Christmas time and His coming to save His people from their sins. Instead of "Son, not enough salt," I want to hear, "Well done." There is great expense as Voice of the Lord ministries (VOTL) and Word of the Lord (WOTL) spread salt and light into communities all around the globe, not only through sharing the newsletter that you're reading but also through gospel music and strong gospel preaching. The expenses will most certainly increase while other pressures are likely to press in on us. Won't you help us in this salt and light mission by prayerfully considering a love gift of any amount? #### **Pineapple Nut Cake**

#### CAKE:

1 20 oz. can crushed pineapple - do not drain 1 1/2 cups sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 eggs 2 cups flour 2 teaspoons soda 1 cup nuts -- chopped small

#### ICING:

8 ounces cream cheese -- softened 1/2 cup margarine 1 1/3 cups powdered sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla finely chopped nuts

CAKE: With a mixer, blend pineapple & juice, sugar, eggs and vanilla. Mix in soda and flour. Fold in nuts. Pour in a greased 9x13" pan. Bake at 350°F. oven for 30 minutes. ICING: Cream cheese and margarine. Beat in powdered sugar and vanilla. Place frosting on cake and top with chopped nuts.

#### **Croissant Breakfast Casserole**

1 (10 1/8 ounce) can croissants

6 eggs

1 lb hot sausage

1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded

salt and pepper to taste

Lightly butter large casserole dish. Unroll croissants and lay flat in single layer in dish. Brown sausage in pan and layer on top of croissants. In seperate bowl, scramble eggs with, salt and pepper. Layer on top of sausage. Cover with cheese and bake at 350 degrees for 30-45 minutes.

#### **Italian Meatloaf**

2 lbs Ground beef 1/2 teaspoon Pepper 1 cup Progresso Spaghetti Sauce Breadcrumbs

1 Med. Onion, finely chopped

1 Egg

1 teaspoon Salt

3/4 cup Parmesan Cheese

Mix all ingredients together in a large bowl making sure everything is well mixed. Place in greased baking pan. Form into loaf shape. Bake at 350 for 1 hour or until done. Slice and serve on Sub buns with your favorite toppings or top meatloaf with your favorite sauce or cheese.

#### Cheesy Broccoli Bake

1/2 cup (1/2 of 8-oz. tub) PHILADELPHIA Cream Cheese Spread
1 can (10-3/4 oz.) cream of mushroom soup 1/2 cup water
2 pkg. (16 oz. each) frozen broccoli florets, thawed, drained
1 cup KRAFT Shredded Cheddar Cheese 1 thawed frozen puff pastry sheet 1 egg, lightly beaten

PREHEAT oven to 400°F. Mix cream cheese spread, soup and water until well blended. Stir in broccoli and Cheddar cheese. Spoon into 2-1/2- to 3-qt. shallow rectangular or oval baking dish. ROLL pastry sheet on lightly floured surface to fit baking dish. Cover dish completely with pastry. Press pastry edges against rim of dish to seal. Brush entire surface lightly with egg; pierce with knife five to six times to vent. BAKE 30 min. or until heated through and pastry is puffed and golden brown.

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#### God Cares...FOR EVERYONE

And the word of the LORD came unto Jonah the second time, saying, Arise, go unto Nineveh, that great city, and preach unto it the preaching that I bid thee. Jonah 3:1-2

Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. 1 Corinthians 13:1-2

When the Lord gave Jonah a second chance, He didn't change His mind about the prophet's destination. He didn't lighten the load or change the burden Jonah was destined to carry. There was no negotiation with Jonah where the Lord expressed understanding about his reluctance to go to Nineveh. God didn't concede to send him to Tarshish just because he'd been heading in that direction anyway. Jonah's disobedience and repentance produced a clear and simple result: a second chance to do what he should have done the first time. But it was not just for Nineveh's sake. God cared for Jonah, just as He cared for Nineveh. If His concern was only about Nineveh, the Lord could have sent someone else for the task. But He definitely wanted Jonah to go, because He wanted to change and to soften the prophet's heart; to make him more like Himself.. Jonah's identity and calling as a prophet by no means meant that God was finished shaping him. You may have a significant calling on your life; a "prophetic" or "pastoral" role, known as a leader, a man or woman of God. You may know His will, and His word. You may even have some level of intimacy with Him....but all this could also be a basis for presumption, self-righteousness, pride, distance from those less holy than you, and maybe even an unsuspected level of disobedience bordering on rebellion. Something profoundly important can be missing from your character.. Jonah's experience is an excellent example of the Lord's desire to transform His faithful saints. The apostle Paul speaks in 1 Corinthians 13 of a "more excellent way". The preceding chapter, 1 Corinthians 12, is all about spiritual gifts; and Jonah was certainly gifted as a prophet. But what he lacked was of such great concern to God that He was willing to put Jonah into the most dire circumstances imaginable; because what Jonah lacked was a most essential characteristic of God's nature, the love we call "agape"..... the "love" which God Himself is.

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In 1991 a young Chinese woman wrote a letter to an American Bible College in the mid-West explaining that she had become a Christian and believed that God was calling her to be an evangelist. In her letter she requested to come to this Bible College to get training. She was admitted to the college; so, she went to the American embassy but they refused her visa because she already had a bachelor's degree. At this point the college accepted her to their theological seminary for graduate work but the embassy put all sorts of obstacles in her

path. It seemed as though the devil was working overtime to keep this young lady from fulfilling the mission God had called her to. For two years they blocked her from coming to the United States for training. Discouragement would only be natural at this point. Then, in June of 1993, this young woman from China wrote to the seminary stating that if she could be readmitted and guaranteed financial help, she would be issued a visa. After completing the process again, the seminary received a communication stating that the young lady would be arriving in Texas in September, asking if someone could come pick her up. When the young woman arrived she, like Paul Harvey, told the rest of the story. The embassy official who had given her such grief for more than two years finally looked at her and said, "Okay, one final question." Joy understood that her answer to this question would determine her future. He said, "Would you please explain to me the theological significance of the Song of Songs in the Old Testament.?" Horror gripped her as she wondered how, with her broken English; she would ever be able to explain this to him. Then, as if Jesus were whispering the answer in her ear, it came to her: "Oh, that you would kiss me with the kisses of your mouth. For your love is better than wine.' Sir, that is the second verse of the first chapter of the Song of Songs, and it speaks of my love or the Lord Jesus and his love for me." The American embassy official stared at Joy, shrugged his shoulders, and said, "Let her go. She's for real." Joy, successfully and with much effort, went through three years of school in a second language, and as the end of her program drew near, she began preparing to return to China. Fearful of what might happen to her on her return to China: imprisonment, persecution, rejection; she emerged victoriously from this battle of the spirit and mind, saying, "God will take care of me. I will go with him." A week before she was to fly to China, a knock came at the door of one who works for this theological seminary. It was a total stranger, stating, "You don't know who I am, but I am the principal of the International School in China, and I am in Wilmore looking for staff." The college official looked at this man in total disbelief, all of a sudden Joy popped around the doorpost into full view and said, "My miracle!" This man had started a school for internationals in order to have a Christian presence in China. The school was successful, and he had three positions open. Joy could take her pick. This seminary official shares that he has had enough communication with Joy to know that she is back in China, in her home church, bearing witness to Jesus in her city, her school, and her home. Instead of getting frustrated with delays or complications that seemingly lie in our way, trust that God works all things together for the good of those who love him, who are the called according to his purpose. The reality of every situation is that God is! God is eternal! God is almighty! God is sovereign! And God knows ALL things! With these truths in mind, trust him completely and walk with utter abandon in obedience to God and his will. His timing is perfect; so bear his obstacles with patience and grace.

#### **Missionary Translation Woes**

One of the struggles of being a missionary is the language. You're unable to communicate or understand the most basic aspects of life, from "Where's the bathroom?" to "How much do you want for that mango?" In no time at all, you feel like the stupidest person on the face of the earth, such as when I told the yard boy, "Remember, I am garbage" instead of "Remember to take out my garbage." Although I didn't do any preaching in Haiti, I did try to share the gospel with a number of people. The first conversation I had along those lines went like this "If you accept Jesus Christ, he will take away your dogs." "My dogs? I don't have any dogs." "Everyone has dogs, ma'am. But when Jesus forgives them, it's though you never had a dog your entire life." Bill Smith, an Assemblies of God missionary I worked with in Haiti, told me he once had instructed an entire church that if anyone wanted to become followers of Christ, they should signify it by raising their legs into the air and coming forward on their hands. Lots of puzzled looks, very little response to the altar call. But the all time most embarrassing gaffe has to go to Dale Preiser, another AoG missionary I met who turned red when I mentioned this to him at a church dinner. The word Dale had wanted to use on this occasion was "mambo." a voodoo priestess. Instead he said "mamba," and gave several impassioned sermons up and down Highway One about the dangers of Christians returning to voodoo and shipwrecking their faith and the faith of others by using peanut butter. (I'm told people were very open to this teaching, and sales of peanut butter plummeted wherever Dale went.

And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. Acts 16:25

George Morrison (1866-1928) was a Presbyterian pastor and preacher who was born in Scotland. The pastor of Wellington Church, Glasgow, for twenty-six years, his ministry primarily consisted of personal visits, postcards and letters for all those in his care who were sick or in sorrow or in trouble. He chose not to serve on committees, preferring to spend his time in what he considered the most important responsibilities to his church - mornings in study and afternoons in visiting his congregation. Many of his sermons and devotional thoughts have been put in print. In his volume entitled, "Wind on the Heath", he has a sermon entitled, "Unconscious Ministries," wherein he states that all of us exercise unconscious ministries. He references Paul and Silas, who sang at midnight while under adverse circumstances, not particularly paying attention that the prisoners were listening to them. When I read that, it put a whole new light on the meaning of Acts 16:25. I often speak with pastors and missionaries who feel that their ministry is ineffective and their presence unfelt. They see so little fruit and become discouraged. I have felt that way myself many, many times. But we never know when someone might be listening, or watching, or critiquing how we respond to the trials and troubles of life. As Morrison goes on to state, "Be quite sure that the very humblest life is full of unconscious ministries. There is not a note of song we ever rise but the ear of some other prisoner will catch it." The power of the midnight song! As Paul and Silas sang - the prisoners listened! Oh, how that should drive us to our knees in repentance when we respond to the difficulties of life and ministry without a song in our hearts. Paul and Silas sang in prison. The only time in Scripture Jesus is ever recorded as singing is when He left the upper room at night and headed towards Calvary (Matthew 26:30). David often sang when his heart was troubled. If I recall, Christian, in John Bunyan's "Pilgrim's Progress," sang while going through the Valley of the Shadow heading to the Celestial City. We never know when others might be listening to our conversations, our prayers, our sermons, or even our actions. Have not most of us in ministry, somewhere along the line, had expressed to us how we had been a blessing to someone without even knowing it? All of us, no doubt on a daily basis, exercise unconscious ministries. That is why it is so important to keep a song in our hearts, a smile on our face and a twinkle in our eye. This can happen, even during the "midnight" hours of life, when we saturate our souls with the Scriptures and scale heaven with our prayers of praise. Paul and Silas sang, and the prisoners listened! Today, as we go about business for God, people are listening. Something with God is always happening even though we may not think so. Our labors are not in vain. There are prisoners of some sort all around us. And they are listening.
