"Many are the afflictions of the righteous: **but the LORD delivereth him** out of them all." Psalms 34:19

"They gather themselves together against the soul of the righteous, and condemn the innocent blood. **But the LORD is my defence;** and my God is the rock of my refuge." Psalms 94:21-22

This coming year, looking at the direction this country and the world is headed; true Christians – those who are righteous and live boldly by God's Word – are certain to face more afflictions and stronger troubles as unrighteousness is heralded and evil is exalted. We've been watching Proverbs 29:2 play out before our very eyes - "When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice: but when the wicked beareth rule, the people mourn." – as supplies have become less abundant, thereby increasing the cost; as we've been coerced to accept sin and even celebrate it; as our nation surrenders common sense for insanity; as pulpits refuse hot holiness but promote being lukewarm; as Biblical Christianity is denigrated and a form of godliness that denies the power thereof increases; God's people mourn and, like Elijah, fight discouragement.

Dear Reader, Our afflictions come from all sides, and are as thick and as tormenting as swamp mosquitoes in the middle of summer! BUT GOD! If you will be faithful and true, He who is called Faithful and True (Rev. 19:11) will be your Deliverer and your Defender. This doesn't mean that nothing "bad" will happen to you; but it does mean that He will keep you and will work all things together for good (Rom. 8:28). He will hear your cry of faith, see you through, and eventually call you out of them ALL; Hallelujah! Stay strong in the power of His might, depending upon your Deliverer. Remember, it's the righteous that the LORD delivers; He is close to the broken heart and contrite spirit. Dear Reader, be in such a position to worthily call upon Him for deliverance.

If you'll be righteous many will come against you. In Isaiah 59 we read, "he that departeth from evil maketh himself a prey;" and Paul warned Timothy, "all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." Be righteous anyway, because, BUT the LORD is your Deliverer and Defender! Remember that phrase "BUT God" turns everything around; it undoes what comes before. They will condemn you but the LORD will conquer them for you; they will attack you but the LORD will astound them before you. If God is your "rock of refuge," what can man do to you?

In that twenty-third verse of chapter 94 we read that God will use their own wickedness against them. They unjustly will make bonds for you, but they will be bound by them. They lay snares for the righteous but God catches them in their own traps. Oh Friend, "trust in the LORD with all thine heart" (Prov. 3:5); live righteously. "Be not wise in thine own eyes; fear the Lord and depart from evil." (Prov. 3:7) It's then that the LORD will deliver and defend you. It's then, in that sweet moment of obedience – the fulfillment of trust and faith – that you'll best understand the words of songwriter Horatio G. Spafford: It is well with my soul.

Though Satan should buffet, though trials should come, Let this blest assurance control,
That Christ hath regarded my helpless estate, And hath shed His own blood for my soul.

My sin—oh, the bliss of this glorious thought!— My sin, not in part but the whole,
Is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more, Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul!

For me, be it Christ, be it Christ hence to live: If Jordan above me shall roll,
No pang shall be mine, for in death as in life Thou wilt whisper Thy peace to my soul.

And Lord, haste the day when the faith shall be sight, The clouds be rolled back as a scroll;

He Makes All Things New

Amy Carmichael, renowned missionary to India, wrote: "In the mountain forests to the west of Dohnavur (India) our children find the cocoon of the atlas moth. It hangs from a twig, like a small brown bag tied up, left there and forgotten—a mere two inches of papery bag. And however often we see it, we are never prepared for the miracle that emerges. For miracle it is: a large, almost bird-like creature, struggles through the very narrow neck of the bag. It has wings of crimson and pink and blended green of various soft tones, shading off into terra-cotta, brown, old-gold. Each wing has a window made of a clear substance like a delicate flake of talc, and on the edge of each is a pattern of wavy lines or dots, or some other dainty device. From wing-tip to wing-tip, nine, sometimes ten inches of beauty, one of God's lovely wonders—that is what comes out of the brown paper bag. Nothing preserved in a glass case can show it, for the colors fade; but fresh from the hands of the Creator, it is like something seen in a dream."

The struggle that it takes for a butterfly to emerge from its cocoon reminds me of the trials, pains, and struggles that the Christian goes through. The Christian is not meant to be preserved in a glass case; he is meant to live life in the world but not of it. He is to face trial applying the Word of God to his various situations, including trials. Sometimes these things that we are called to endure with Christian charity and faith are physical, other times emotional, financial, governmental persecution, etc. Yet, as we remain faithful, through it all, to Him who has brought us to these trials for our own benefit and to His glory, we emerge stronger and more beautiful as we more reflect the image of Christ. "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing. If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him." (James 1:2-5)

Did you know that if you help a caterpillar get out of its chrysalis (cocoon) it won't have had the opportunity to build up the muscles in its wings and it will never be able to fly? When they are working to out of their chrysalis, a chemical is released that strengthens their wings. Their movements inside the chrysalis pumps fluid into their wings, which help the wings to expand. We, too, have trials that help us to build our spiritual muscles, that strengthens our "wings," all by the grace of God. In similar fashion, as the butterfly makes its way out of its chrysalis, we need to be patient during our trials as our spiritual muscles are built, so we can fly.

During those trying times there are some who feel as though God has left them; but He hasn't. He attends to us and watches over us like a Mom who stands by and watches her little one learning to walk or crawl. She doesn't pick them up because she knows they have to do it in order to learn. Our God is so gracious and kind to give us opportunity to grow, helping us and protecting us.

Miss Carmichael continues, "What if our life within these detaining months or years be like the life within the dull brown bag of the cocoon? One day something will emerge to the glory of His grace. Can we not, then, sustained by the Bread of heaven and the good Wine, continue in this hidden labor and spiritual fight till the sunset colors kindle and the stars appear?" As John reminds us in his first epistle, "Beloved, now we are the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is." (3:2)

The butterfly struggles because God put within it an innate realization that struggle it must; then it will fly. Similarly, God has promised in His Word that "ALL things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose." Puritan Thomas Watson sums it up nicely with these words: "DO not mistake me, I do not say that of their own nature the worst things are good, for they are a fruit of the curse; but though they are naturally evil, yet the wise over-ruling hand of God disposing and sanctifying them, they are morally good. ... Or as in a watch, the wheels seem to move contrary one to another, but all carry on the motions of the watch; so things that seem to move cross to the godly, yet by the wonderful providence of God work for their good." Christian, the struggle is real; but it is not unexpected. It is hard; but we do not fight nor stand firm in our own strength. Praise God, it is temporary; for, one day we will stand in the presence of our Savior and our God as overcomers, if we will but faithfully fight the good fight of faith. Press on!



Reesie's Recipes

Maple Glazed Ham

- 1 cup maple syrup
- 1 cup orange juice
- 1 cup ginger ale
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1 (10 ounce) jar maraschino cherries, halved
- 1 fully-cooked whole boneless ham
- 1 (15.25 ounce) can pineapple slices, drained
- 1 box wooden toothpicks
- Oven cooking bag

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a medium bowl, mix together the first five ingredients. Stir in the juice from the maraschino cherries, and half of the cherries. Place the ham into an oven bag, in a large roasting pan. Place the pineapples onto the top of the ham, and secure with toothpicks. Place cherries into the centers of the pineapples, and secure with toothpicks also. Carefully pour the juice mixture over it, keeping all of the juice in the bag. Tie the end of the bag closed with the ties provided, cut a few small slits in the top of the oven bag. Bake the ham for 3 hours in the preheated oven. Remove from oven and allow ham to sit for 15 minutes. Pour the glaze off the ham and into a bowl. Slice ham drizzling glaze over ham slices.

Party Meatballs

- 2 lbs. ground beef
- 1 pkg. onion soup mix
- 5 oz. evaporated milk
- 4 T. Worcestershire sauce

Sauce

- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 cups ketchup
- 4 T. Worcestershire sauce

Mix meatball ingredients and let stand for 5 minutes. Shape into balls and broil for 10 minutes. Place in crock pot. Mix sauce ingredients together. Pour over meatballs. Cook until hot. Do not stir.

- 1 lb deli sliced white American cheese
- 1/2 lb deli sliced pepper Jack cheese
- 1/2 of small can of diced green chilis

Add a little milk. Stir occasionally and add more milk as needed until it gets to desired consistency. Turn down to low or warm after good and melty

- 1/2 of a 2 lb box of velveeta
- 1 pkg li'l smokies
- 1 jar sweet gherkin pickles
- Toothpicks

Cut lil smokies into halves. Cut sweet pickles into thirds. Cube velveeta into small cubes to match the size of the smokies. Assemble on toothpick by adding lil smokie, cheese and pickle.

At that moment the only thing this American pastor could think about was a Chinese mother and father who were willing to risk their lives so their children could know about Christ. At night they would close all their shutters and pull a stone from the floor and take out an old Chinese Bible and read it to their children. The salvation of those children came from reading the Bible that Robert Morrison gave his life to translate.

Verse for Today: 1 John 3:23-24 "And this is his commandment, That we should believe on the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and love one another, as he gave us commandment. And he that keepeth his commandments dwelleth in him, and he in him. And hereby we know that he abideth in us, by the Spirit which he hath given us."

Additional passages for Today: Acts 16:23-34; John 13:34-35; John 14:23-27

Thought for Today: Your actions show what you truly believe. If you say that you love God, your actions must show you love Him by obeying His commandments. The Holy Spirit will reveal the truth.

Story for Today: Betsy and Jane were captured by the words that Pastor Mark had been sharing. The two girls had been attending this church for several months and had thought they were Christians just like everyone else that attended church regularly. Jane leaned over and whispered to Betsy quietly, "But we said the prayer, doesn't that count?" Betsy held a finger to her mouth and continued to listen. "It says, 'He that believeth. That is, believeth the gospel. Credits it to be true, and acts as if it were true. This is the whole of faith. Man is a sinner, he should act on the belief of this truth, and repent. There is a God. Man should believe it, and fear and love him, and seek his favour. The Lord Jesus died to save him. To have faith in him, is to believe that this is true, and to act accordingly; an example of this is to trust him, to rely on him, to love him, to feel that we have no merit, and to cast our all upon him. There is a heaven and a hell. To believe this, is to credit the account, and act as if it were true; to seek the one, and avoid the other. We are to die. To believe this, is to act as if this were so; to be in readiness for it, and to expect it daily and hourly. In one word, faith is feeling and acting as if there were a God, a Saviour, a heaven, a hell; as if we were sinners, and must die; as if we deserved eternal death, and were in danger of it; and, in view of all, casting our eternal interests on the mercy of God in Christ Jesus. To do this, is to be a Christian; not to do it, is to be an infidel'. These words are true," Pastor Mark continued on as he quoted passages from The Barnes Commentary.

At the close of service, Pastor Mark opened up the altar and invited all who felt a pricking of their spirit to come forward. He invited all who had questions about what they heard to come forward. Betsy and Jane made their way to the front of the church. As they knelt to pray, they began begging God to help them to understand. They had prayed and asked Jesus into their heart before and had even gone to the altar and confessed the things that they had done wrong. But both knew that their lives hadn't changed in the way that Pastor Mark had just been speaking about. They loved the nice people who did good things for them. They didn't love the difficult ones so much. They didn't act out obedience to God's commandment in this area very well at all. They realized that they needed God to change their heart and change their way of thinking. Pastor Mark explained that as they read the Bible, studying it to understand God more, God would renew their mind and the Holy Spirit would lead them to act out what they said they believed. The girls were so excited to learn more about God and his will for their life. Their joy was overflowing as they left the church. Their new resolution was to begin and end each day reading and studying the Bible. Pastor Mark reminded them to always begin by asking God for wisdom and spiritual understanding before they began their time in the Word.
