Where there's someone in need Of a neighborly deed, Or a cause needs a dollar or two; If trouble is brewing, Or something needs doing— Just call on the faithful few!


When the pastor makes pleas That we go to our knees, For souls that are lost through and through, You will find that the staying, The fasting and praying, Are done by the faithful few!

Therefore with joy shall ye draw water out of the wells of salvation. Isaiah 12:3



### A Word to the Wise – New Year's Challenge

"Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety." Prov. 11:14

Most of our readers will be familiar with Solomon's challenge – more of a command really: "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." (Prov. 3:5-6) No part of these verses can be lifted up as more important, but how often to we "Trust in the Lord" by our "own understanding" instead of going to God's Word in EVERY instance for sound counsel and direction? The challenge I'm issuing is to simply "in ALL your ways acknowledge him." That'll take real dedication to ask yourself every time, "What does the Bible say about that?"

Today's verse warns that a multitude of counsellors is necessary for safety. While this is a general principle, it still requires us to receive real counsel – wise, godly, biblical counsel and a willingness to follow that counsel. I knew a young lady who, when trying to decide what to do about various situations, would ask many people for advice: her pastor, biblically knowledgeable and godly mother and grandfather, sisters, friends, and others. Instead of accepting godly counsel, she would continue seeking advice from others until she heard the counsel that matched her own desires. It didn't matter that 25 might counsel against her choice while only 1 or 2 agreed with her. It strongly reminded me of the foolish, high-minded, insolent son of Solomon – Rehoboam (1 Kings 12) In 2 Chron. 12:14 we are told that the evil he did was because he had not prepared his heart to seek the Lord. It's my prayer, dear reader, that you will prepare your heart to seek the Lord this year; if you've already been seeking Him, I pray that you will seek a deeper walk with and understanding of Christ.

Had that rascal Rehoboam sought his counsel from the sources his father and grandfather (King David) found refuge, comfort, wisdom and guidance in, he and Israel would've been the better off for it. Solomon wrote, "Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he." (Prov. 29:18) In the midst of his longest psalm of praise for the Word of God, David points to where his counsel comes from – "Thy testimonies also are my delight and my counsellors." (Ps. 119:24) Another great challenge would be to memorize the whole of Psalm 119; at least read it daily for a month (or year).

As we take "Thy testimonies" for our counsellors, let us recognize two things. 1) "Testimonies" is plural. We never hang our hat on one verse to make a life-long doctrine or decision; there must be agreement with the whole of the Bible. Look at the context and search out the whole counsel of God for it will never contradict itself. Ask yourself, "Does this thing help me to grow in godliness and holiness; does it help or hinder my walk with God?" Read Titus 2:11-15 for a short list of what Jesus teaches and how our transformed walk should look like.

2) "Thy testimonies" are the Word of God. The gospel of John tells us that "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (1:1) And he further proclaims: "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth." (1:14) To this end, we recognize that Jesus is our Counsellor if we will go to Him and seek wisdom and guidance from Him. This should be no surprise; Isaiah told us "his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor..." (Isa. 9:6)

I'm not saying that there is never a need to go to a counsellor, BUT I would never go to a counsellor who is NOT a BIBLICAL counsellor. There are many "Christian" counsellors who are not BIBLICAL counsellors. First and fore-most, what does the Bible say about it – "in all thy ways acknowledge him."

### This IS a millstone moment

"And whosoever shall offend one of these little ones that believe in me, it is better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and he were cast into the sea." (Mark 9:42)

As we step into this New Year, I want to draw your attention to the fact that we are to be lights and ambassadors in this dark world (2 Cor. 5). We are to speak truth into those around us, particularly in regard to Jesus' atoning work on the cross. But friends, it's not just a truth to speak into the spiritual lives of those around us. It's a transforming truth that affects and heals all areas of our life. God has blessed us with a sphere of influence that is specific to each one of us. There are people that we can reach that no one else reaches quite like we do. So, reach out with compassion to those in our sphere who are sin-sick.

Too often we shy away from the topic of sin; it's uncomfortable and very often not well received – particularly nowadays, when it comes to sexuality and gender. Understand, there's a political agenda that is engulfing our schools, doctors, large swathes of "churches," and social media in an attempt to swallow up our children and young adults. This agenda attacks our young people, falsely promising to fix a psychological disorder with a physiological solution, which, directly or indirectly, affects every family in America to some extent or another: youth gender dysphoria ("transgenderism"). At this point some of you will be tempted to stop reading – PLEASE KEEP READING anyway!

Our young people cannot afford our silence; it is so very important that we see the hurt behind the façade, that we show the compassion of Christ by speaking truth lovingly, and that we are informed with the societal and political facts that have brought this nation and our children to where they are. Ask yourself, why is it that all of a sudden children and young adults are thinking that they've been born in the wrong body, as if God, after thousands and thousands of years, got confused and began making mistakes – PERISH THE THOUGHT!

Whatever masking these drugs and surgeries may provide, they will never bring about the change and satisfaction promised. We need to speak reality into the lives of those around us. We need to love them enough to NOT go along with their deceived mind. We need to love them enough to say, "If you are born male, every cell in your body will continue to shout out, 'I'm a man!' no matter how well it may be hid. Regardless of how you may try to convince yourself, reality does not go away." We don't discount their feelings, but we do compassionately speak truth into their lives – regardless of what sin is trying to overtake them.

If we are Christians, then at the very least let us speak truth into these hurting "gender dysphoric" souls, addressing them according to their God-ordained pronouns and birth-given names – not apologetically or angrily, but compassionately. Many of you are likely familiar with Jesus' parable of the "Good Samaritan" in Luke 10:25-37. These youth have been hijacked by "robbers" with an agenda; left beaten by politicized counsellors, doctors, and social media; and stripped of the dignity of who God made them to be. They are "left for dead" by such "robbers" who care nothing for them or who are themselves deceived. Let us bring the balm of truth to heal their wounds and be willing to "pay" for whatever such actions may bring.

Any sin beats, robs, and leaves its victim for dead. This year, let us have compassion enough to bring the balm of truth into the lives of those around us – friend or stranger. F.B. Meyer exhorts us, "Make no distinction of race or creed; but wherever you come across a man who has been stripped, beaten, robbed, and is half-dead, don't wait for other men to succor him, but bind up his wounds; minister to him, and treat him as though you loved him with the natural love of brotherhood."

### No Root, No Fruit

Have you ever wondered why you do what you do? One former Navy pilot tells how he was living a wilder life than he knew he should live. He decided his problem was that he was being led astray by his friends in flight training. So he arranged to finish his work in the program early and be transferred to another field nearby. Yet, it wasn't long, he said, before he was back in the same old bars, with the same girls, just with different friends. One night out-on-the-town he wondered, "Why do I do this?" And he realized, "Because I like to." Before a person becomes a Christian-I mean a real Christian, not just someone who says he is-his "want-to" is broken. He is not interested in God. He is bored by church and by reading his Bible. He cannot "make" himself "want to" do right and he cannot "make" himself "want not" to do wrong. When a person is born again, God repairs his "want-to." Even though he still feels the pull of temptation, he will have a new set of desires.

He will love God and want to talk to God in prayer and see what God has to say to him in His Word, the Bible. He wants to be around other people who love God; church attendance becomes meaningful. There is a new desire to obey God. Why do we do what we do? The answer is simple: we do what we do because of what we are. It's like fruit trees. Apple trees bear apples, pear trees produce pears, peach trees grow peaches. The fruit is the natural result of the nature of the tree. I suppose you could tie apples to a peach tree, but that would not make it an apple tree. In the same way, adding religious activities to one's schedule doesn't make one a Christian. Just as the fruit of the tree naturally flows from the nature of the tree, even so the attitudes, words, and actions of our lives reveal the true nature of our selves. Jesus said, "Even so, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit....Therefore, by their fruits you will know them" (Mat. 7:17, 20).

# THE STORY BEHIND THE SONG

### Living For Jesus

Living for Jesus is one of the greatest hymns of self-consecration; it was written by the author's daughter constantly humming its tune to her father.

Thomas Obadiah Chisholm (1866-1960) was educated in a one-room schoolhouse, but became a teacher, associate editor of his hometown newspaper, editor of the Pentecostal Herald, ordained a Methodist minister in 1903, and wrote over 1200 poems – 800 of which were published in such periodicals as The Sunday School Times, Moody Monthly, and Alliance Weekly (and many of these were eventually set to music). At 27-years-old Chisholm became a Christian under the ministry of Henry Clay Morrison, founder of Asbury College and Seminary.

C. Harold Lowden had written both the tune for what is now known as Living for Jesus and the tune's original words under the title Sunshine Song, but, now, two years later while preparing a collection of hymns for publication, he felt that the song needed a stronger text. He changed the title to Living for Jesus and sent 51-year-old Thomas Obadiah Chisholm the tune and title, requesting new lyrics.

Though Chisholm proclaimed that he knew nothing about writing words to a pre-existing tune, Lowden stated that he "believed God had led me to select him" to provide a text to this music. Thomas could not read music, so he asked his daughter to hum the melody over and over to him. She did so until the words came to him.

Why did Chisholm write songs? "I have sought to be true to the Word, and to avoid flippant and catchy titles and treatment. I have greatly desired that each hymn or people might have some definite message to the hearts for whom it was written." He certainly met that goal in O to Be Like Thee, Great Is Thy Faithfulness, and Living for Jesus.

First verse and refrain: Living for Jesus, a life that is true/Striving to please Him in all that I do/Yielding allegiance, glad-hearted and free/This is the pathway of blessing for me. Refrain: O Jesus, Lord and Savior, I give myself to Thee/For Thou, in Thy atonement, didst give Thyself for me/I own no other Master, my heart shall be Thy throne/My life I give, henceforth to live, O Christ, for Thee alone.


