THE STORY BEHIND THE SONG

Alas, And Did My Saviour Bleed

Isaac Watts wrote over 500 hymns in his life and has been called the father of the English hymn. During America's War for Independence, during the Battle of Springfield (1780), some soldiers ran low on wadding for their muskets, and called out for more wadding. Reverend James Caldwell, a Presbyterian minister who had lost his wife to the British during the Battle of Connecticut Farms, was riding around the fighting area, encouraging the soldiers. When the American soldiers hollered out their need for wadding, Reverend Caldwell rode his horse to the church and grabbed a stack of hymn-books written by the then well-known hymn-writer Isaac Watts. He rode back to the bridge and as he threw the hymn books to the soldiers to use the pages for wadding, he shouted, "Give 'em Watts, boys."

Thanks, in part, to the "hymns of Isaac Watts," the patriots won that battle. But seventy years later, one of Watt's songs played a role in winning an even greater battle. During revival services in the fall of 1850, Fanny Crosby came to a Methodist Church altar in New York City, where she sought the peace with God that her soul longed for but hadn't found on two previous trips to that altar. While kneeling there, the congregation began to sing Watt's hymn Alas and Did My Saviour Bleed. As the Holy Spirit brought light to her spirit, the battle was over! Fanny describes this amazing and blessed victory with these words:

"...it seemed to me that the light must indeed come then or never; and so I arose and went to the altar alone. After a prayer was offered, they began to sing the grand old consecration hymn, 'Alas, and did my Saviour bleed, And did my Sovereign die?' And when they reached the third line of the fifth stanza, 'Here Lord, I give myself away,' my very soul was flooded with a celestial light. I sprang to my feet, shouting 'hallelujah,' and then for the first time I realized that I had been trying to hold the world in one hand and the Lord in the other."

Fanny J. Crosby also became a famous and prolific hymnist who has been credited with writing more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs. Some of which are: Blessed Assurance; He Hideth My Soul; Redeemed, How I Love to Proclaim It; All the Way My Saviour Leads Me; Tell Me the Story of Jesus; and one of my favorites – Rescue the Perishing, Care for the Dying.

A Word to the Wise: The Surprise Party – Prov. 9

"Stolen waters are sweet, and bread eaten in secret is pleasant. But he knoweth not that the dead are there; and that her guests are in the depths of hell." Proverbs 9:17-18

In chapter nine of Proverbs, the wise man tells us the story of two different parties. Invitations are given for each and the houses are across the road from one another. One invitation is to a great feast; the other is for a surprise party. One house is bright and cheery; the other is a house of smoke and mirrors. At one of these parties you eat the prepared beast, while at the other; the beast prepares to eat you. To accept Wisdom's invitation and its inherent blessings, you must give up sin and folly. To join in Folly's fun for a season, you must reject Wisdom's sensibilities and her blessings for here and the hereafter. Taking advantage of your near-sightedness and lack of eternal commitment, Folly's invitation pulls you across the street to her mansion.

As you step on Folly's mansion porch, you hear the cry ring loudly from across the street, coming from Wisdom's mansion: "Forsake the foolish, and live!" You turn your head to look in Wisdom's direction, but the sights, sounds, smells, and the promise of a good time grab hold of your senses and you quickly jump up Folly's steps.

As you enter the doorway of abandoned hope, "Forsake the foolish, and live" tugs at your ear and convicts your heart, albeit a little softer than before.

Having gone through Folly's rooms one by one with the invitation from Heavenly Wisdom to "Forsake the foolish, and live; and go in the way of understanding" growing ever fainter behind each closed door, the tug on your calloused heart lessens, discipline is discarded, and anticipation for whatever is next grows.

The enticement of each room continues to draw you in deeper and deeper, filling your senses, while Wisdom's invitation still pleads, giving warning and offering its open door to you.

You cannot attend both parties; you must choose. The allurement of this house is great and the deeper you travel into its inner chambers the stronger its pull is, the fainter Wisdom's call becomes, and the folly of frittering away your day of grace becomes more apparent to those who look on with concern.

With your hand on the doorknob of Folly's innermost chamber, you begin to turn the latch and hear the faint click. Your senses are overwhelmed and you're ready to rush in with utter abandon, when all of a sudden...

Wisdom's cry shouts its warning, "WAIT, THE DEAD ARE THERE! THE DEAD ARE THERE!! Flee!!! Turn away quickly and take refuge in Me! Forsake the foolish, and live! Go in the way of understanding! Eternity is at stake! YOUR eternal soul is at stake; what will a man give in exchange for his soul?"

Dear Reader, which will you choose? Will you forsake the foolish or have the enticements of sin gotten a strangle-hold on your senses? Will you choose the way of faith and have holy obedience to God where the living are and "They shall not be hurt of the second death"? Or do you choose to open that final door, joining the dead for all of eternity?

You must decide quickly. Again, you cannot attend both; neither can you have a relish for both, for you cannot serve two masters. As Ralph Wardlaw would urge: "Stand not irresolute, midway between the abode of Wisdom and that of Folly." I will add my own imploring: Make up your mind NOW; flee Folly's house and run with abandon to that of Wisdom's. Wisdom will never leave you nor forsake you. Wisdom will comfort you, console you, and have compassion on you. Forsake the foolish, and LIVE!

"If thou be wise, thou shalt be wise for thyself: but if thou scornest, thou alone shalt bear it." Proverbs 9:12



Gun For Hire

"Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it." John 8:44

In May, I wrote about circuit riders who were "familiar figures in early American villages, towns and cities, and on the frontier. The rough-and-tumble times before, during and after the American Revolution required special men, weather-beaten and toughened by days and weeks in the saddle. But the cause of Christ bred just such hardy warriors of the cross." (from the back cover of Heroes of Early Methodism vol. 1 published by Schmul Publishing Co.) As I wrote, "They willingly would reprove, rebuke, and exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine, for this was their call, souls were their concern, and Christ was their passion."

Those frontier and circuit rider days are far behind us; now we've become "civilized" – so they say. There's no doubt that the American landscape has changed and her culture with it. Those circuit riders of bygone days preached the gospel according to the Word of God and built churches; they weren't perfect, for they were men, but their "guns" took aim at sin, worldliness, and the devil. Today, Satan has found such preachers who could be bought; men who now put truth, holiness, righteousness, and God's character in their crosshairs. These "guns for hire" promote and lift up self rather than promoting and lifting up Christ. Instead of pleasing God, they'd rather please men: tickling their ears, sugar-coating hard truths to swallow, and titillating their lusts. Instead of preaching a transformed life IN CHRIST, they do their best to twist biblical truth until it matches the lives of those they "preach" to – soothing their consciences and killing conviction. Believers are meant to identify with their Saviour, but the devil's "guns for hire" deceive men into feeling good about identifying with their sin.

Instead of standing on the firm foundation of God's Word and being stalwart against the tide of communist thought that is pervading our nation (i.e., social justice, ESG, woke-ism, globalism, and these to name just a very few), they go along to get along and cave on nearly every biblical issue that's not well-accepted by America's Left.

These "guns for hire" not only put the Bible, God's character, and holiness in their crosshairs, anyone who steps away from the current stream of unbiblical exhortation makes himself a target for these deceptive "gunslingers." This is no strange, fiery trial; Isaiah warned of this: "Yea, truth faileth; and he that departeth from evil maketh himself a prey." (59:15a)

I urge you to depart from evil anyway. Whether you're a preacher in a pulpit or a layman living in the community, stand regardless the cost and preach the truth clearly for all to hear. We are called to be salt and shining lights, for the existence of our nation is at stake. More importantly, eternity is at stake for those souls we come into contact with. As Aaron M. Renn writes in Life in the Negative World (meaning a post-Christian America): "The first challenge for American evangelicals living in the negative world, then, is to examine ourselves, consider our ways, count the cost, and commit to denying ourselves, taking up our crosses and following Christ in everything. This must happen no matter what the price, confident that Jesus will never fail us or forsake us, that all things will work together for our good, and that whatever suffering we do endure in this world is not worthy to be compared with the glory to be revealed in the age to come."

Preachers would do well to take Bishop Francis Asbury's advice: "When you go into the pulpit, go from your closets. Leave all your vain speculations and metaphysical reasonings behind. Take with you your hearts full of fresh spring water from heaven, and preach Christ crucified and the resurrection, and that will conquer the world." (Heroes of Early Methodism vol. 1)

If you attend a church that has a "pistol packin' preacher" who cherishes and guards the precious treasure of God's Word, taking aim at sin, the world, and the devil, stay there! After all, Psalm 119:89 declares, "For ever, O LORD, thy word is settled in heaven." If your pastor doesn't actively take aim with his Bible at those things, "reprove, rebuke, and exhort (him) with all longsuffering and doctrine." If he will not hear the truth, pray for him, but, for the sake of your soul and the souls of your family, find another church to worship and fellowship in.

A You Don't Understand

"As thou knowest not what is the way of the spirit, nor how the bones do grow in the womb of her that is with child: even so thou knowest not the works of God who maketh all."

- Ecclesiastes 11:5

Continuing our study on the book of Ecclesiastes, we now encounter wisdom that we all need to keep in mind. We don't know which direction the wind blows, we don't understand how a child grows within the womb, and just like we don't know those things we cannot understand the way God works.

Reading this verse brings to mind the story of Job - upon first suffering loss, Job continues to praise God, yet as time goes on and he encounters bad advice from his friends, Job starts to challenge God and question how He could make the decisions that He makes. This is something I know for certain I can relate to, and I'm sure most of you can as well - when things don't go our way, we begin to question and challenge God. It feels right for us to do this, we feel justified in doing so, but are we really? Well, we simply have to continue looking at the book of Job to find out. After 30 or so chapters, God steps back into the story and corrects Job and his friends. God says to Job:

"Who is this that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge? Gird up now thy loins like a man; for I will demand of thee, and answer thou me. Where wast thou when I laid the foundations of the earth? declare, if thou hast understanding."

- Job 38:2-4

Job had been challenged by God, yet God challenges him in return - where were you when everything was created? Do you understand it? This challenge by God was met by repentance by Job. Job didn't have ground to stand on because he didn't understand God's ways. When we feel like we are justified in criticizing God, we have to keep in mind that we only understand a fraction of Him and what He can do. Just like we can't understand the wind, how a child grows in the womb, the changes of the weather, or the creation of the universe, we cannot understand the full nature of God. We have to take comfort in the fact that He knows what's best, even when we don't like it.

When your heart is bowed in sorrow, Tempest roar and fierce the gale, As you view the waves and wreckage, Fear not. Jesus will not fail.


Tho' your way be dark as midnight, And your prayers seem but a wail, Your surroundings seem a prison, Fear not. Jesus will not fail.

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: John 14:15-17 If ye love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. **Additional passage for Today:** John 15:10-14; John 14:23-24; John 14:21; 1 John 3:21-24; Rev. 22:14

Thought for Today: Our actions speak louder than our words. Obedience to God reveals our love for Him. Keeping His commandments shows love more than the best-sung song.

Story for Today: Adrian grabbed his guitar case and headed to his 2001 Honda Accord. The car had many miles on it but was still in good shape for the 17-year-old musician. He and a few of his friends were getting together to practice some newer songs they would be playing for the worship service on Sunday.

Adrian was a great student and was looking forward to going to college. He spent much of his spare time strumming his six-stringed instrument and singing the beautiful lyrics as he enjoyed the evening. Some of his friends weren't quite as concerned with grades and would enjoy partying rather than attending a church service but would like to play with the worship team, just because they like to make music. Adrian didn't see the harm and would encourage them to join him in hopes that they might hear a message that would change their life. On this particular night, there were seven of them gathered in Paul's garage where they liked to practice. As they sang, many of the songs were about their love for God, some in the group realized that not everyone believed what they were singing. Adrian really did love God. At least that is what he always thought. But, this night as the group broke up. He and Melody made their way to the coffee shop and decided to catch up while having a snack. It wasn't long and the talk had progressed from what had been happening in each of their lives to talking about some of the kids from school and the trouble they were in. Adrian realized he was talking behind some of his friends' backs and even shared some of the private things he had learned that he had promised to keep to himself. The conviction that he was gossiping and breaking his promises slowed his speech and made the musician thoughtful for a moment. He remembered singing just a few minutes ago about the love of God and singing songs proclaiming his undying love for God. And then he remembered the new song about obedience reflecting love. Dillon had shared the Bible verse that the song was written about and he recalled how Jesus said that if we loved Him, we should keep his commandments. Adrian knew that gossiping and breaking his promises went against the commands of God. But the bonding he felt with Melody was a great feeling. He struggled with himself for a while as he realized that singing about loving God was much easier than actually proving it by obeying the Words that he read in the Bible. Adrian paused his conversation with Melody and began to apologize. He explained that he had messed up. He shouldn't have been talking about the things they had been and he especially shouldn't have shared the things he had learned in confidence. He asked Melody and God to forgive him. He decided he better go home. He had a few friends whom he needed to apologize to also. Melody understood and while she knew she had said some things that she shouldn't have, she had a deeper respect for Adrian. She didn't know that many Christians, but those that she did know, didn't seem to be much different from others. This experience of someone whose actions matched with what they said was very interesting.

Questions for Today: How about you? Do you sing or say one thing and then do the opposite? What do you do when your walk and your talk don't fall into the same path?

Prayer for Today: Heavenly Father, Thank You for loving us and for giving us Your Holy Spirit to dwell in us. Thank You for making our paths straight. Help us to show You our love by obeying Your commands. Help us to study Your Word so that we know Your commands. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
