Love Letter's From The Father

I knew you even before you were conceived.

Then the word of the LORD came unto me, saying, Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations Jeremiah 1:4-5

When Jeremiah was called to be a prophet to Israel, God declared that even before he was conceived, he was known by God and set apart for His divine purposes. The road that Jeremiah would walk in his ministry life would not be an easy one, for he suffered much abuse at the hands of his fellow Israelites. I wonder if he ever reflected on these words when he was going through his darkest times? 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“Has Your Walk Changed?”

And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others. But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus: That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in his kindness toward us through Christ Jesus. Ephesians 2:1-7

In Colossians 2:6 - As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him: we are instructed, One's walk is the daily conduct of one's life; the habitual way or direction of one's life. When a person receives Christ as Savior and the Lord of their life that person is to live a changed life, walking in a new direction. Has your walked changed? Too many believers have substituted words for works. They call Christ Lord but fail to back it up with their lives. They talk the talk, but don't walk the walk. I. The walk of a believer ought to different than his or her old walk. Ephesians 2:1-2 - And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; 2 Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: A walk that is "according to the course of this world" - the system of practices and standards associated with secular society. Fleshly walk - indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind. John Piper writes that flesh is the old ego that is self-reliant and does not delight to yield to any authority or depend on any mercy. Flesh craves the sensation of self-generated power and loves the praise of men....in its conservative form it produces legalism -- keeping rules by its own power for its own glory.... (in its more liberal form) produces grossly immoral attitudes and acts. Verse 3 - Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others. Self-oriented – Here where the Bible speaks of the world it refers to the self-centered, godless value system and mores of fallen mankind. The goal of this present world is SELF - self-glory, self-fulfillment, self-indulgence, self-satisfaction. Disobedient - unwilling and refusing to comply with the demands of God. Ecclesiastes 8:11 - Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily, therefore the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil. A walk that is "according to the prince of the power of the air" Satanically influenced and dominated. 1 John 5:19 - And we know that we are of God, and the whole world lieth in wickedness. Nearly two out of three adults—62%—agreed that Satan "is not a living being but is a symbol of evil." This response has remained relatively consistent throughout the Nineties. Among the more surprising findings, however, are that a majority of born again Christians deny Satan's existence (52%); nearly three-quarters of Catholics say the devil is non-existent (72%); and women are more likely than men to reject Satan's existence (64% vs. 59%). Ephesians 6:12 - For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. II. The walk of a believer ought to be a worthy walk. Ephesians 4:1-3 - I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, 2 With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; 3 Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Walk in a manner worthy of and consistent with one's position as a member of the Body of Christ. Luke 1:5-6 - There was in the days of Herod, the king of Judaea, a certain priest named Zacharias, of the course of Abia: and his wife was of the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elisabeth. 6 And they were both righteous before God, walking in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless. Colossians 1:10 - That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God; Worthy = Axios = Weigh. Axios strictly speaking means bringing up the other beam of the scales. means weighing as much as, of like or equal value, worth as much. It means having the weight of another thing and so being of like value or worth as much. Walk so that your life is balanced with your profession. Bearing fruit – both the fruit of the Spirit and producing fruit of a like kind. The believer who walks in a manner worthy of the calling with which he has been called is one whose daily living corresponds to his high position as a child of God and fellow heir with Jesus Christ. His practical living matches his privileged position. DL Moody said, "Every Bible should be wrapped in shoe leather." III. The walk of a believer ought to be a loving walk. Ephesians 5:1-2 - Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children; 2 And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour An agape walk – a self-sacrificial love Not a love based on sentiment or emotion but a matter of will and action. Love ought to be the motivating power and deciding factor in the life of every believer. The old walk was a selfish walk; the new a giving walk. Love ever gives, forgives, outlives; And ever stands with open hands; And while it lives, it gives, For this is love's prerogative To give, and give, and give. What most people need to learn in life is how to love people and use things instead of using people and loving things. Romans 13:8 - Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. 1 John 4:7 - Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. IV. An Enlightened Walk Ephesians 5:8 - For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light: Every man but a believer walks in darkness; in fact, he is darkness. Darkness describes the whole nature of unregenerate man. 2 Corinthians 5:17 - Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. A New identity calls for a new lifestyle. You who are now believers were darkness. That was then. This is now. Now don't behave like those who are in the darkness!" 2 Corinthians 6:14 - Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness? 1 Peter 2:9 - But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light; We are to be light reflectors! I want to be a little light, That glistens clean and true, I want to show forth Jesus In everything I do. I don't like smoky lamps, Lord, Or candles dim and slow; I don't like flickering, hazy lights That do not shine and glow. Thou hast told me in Thy Word, To let my light so shine, That those who look into my face Will know that I am Thine. 1 John 1:7 - But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. V. A Careful Walk Ephesians 5:15 - See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Circumspectly – watchful and alert - refers to ethical behavior with a focus on careful attention especially regarding the dangers and deceptions that continually assault us. Be careful how you walk - carries the idea of looking around carefully so as not to stumble. Hebrews 12:1-2 - Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, 2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.



REESIE'S RECIPES



Pineapple Angel

1 Box Angel food cake mix
20 oz. can crushed pineapples in juice

Combine dry Angel Food Cake mix with a 20 ounce can of crushed pineapple in its own juice. (No need to use a mixer, just stir it by hand). The mixture starts to froth and will turn airy and fluffy. Once it's all mixed up, simply pour it into a 9 x 13 pan and bake it at 350

Stuffed Mushrooms

24 ounces, White Button Mushrooms
1/3 pound Hot Pork Sausage
1/2 whole Medium Onion, Finely Diced
4 cloves Garlic, Finely Minced
8 ounces, Cream Cheese
1 whole Egg Yolk
3/4 cups Parmesan Cheese, Grated
Salt And Pepper (to Taste)

Brown and crumble sausage. Set aside on a plate to cool. Add onions and garlic to the same skillet; cook for 2 minutes over medium low heat. Add in chopped mushroom stems, stir to cook for 2 minutes. Add salt and pepper to taste. Set mixture aside on a plate to cool. In a bowl, combine cream cheese and egg yolk. Stir together with Parmesan cheese. Add cooled sausage and cooled mushroom stems. Stir mixture together and refrigerate for a short time to firm up. Smear mixture into the cavity of each mushroom, creating a sizable mound over the top. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes, or until golden brown. Allow to cool at least ten minutes before serving.

Cheesecake Sugar Cookie bars

1 (17.5 oz) pkg sugar cookie mix in a pouch,
by betty crocker

1 sm box (4 serving size) french vanilla instant pudding

2 Tbsp brown sugar (packed)

1 stick melted butter= 1/2 cup

3 tsp vanilla extract

2 eggs + plus 3 yolks

2 pkg (8oz) cream cheese @ room temp.

1/2 c sour cream

1/2 c white granulated sugar

2/3 c optional: toffee bits,
(pulverized in a blender or food processor)

Preheat Oven @ 350 Spray 9 X 13 baking pan with cooking spray In Med. bowl mix, cookie mix Pudding Mix Brown Sugar, & Melted Butter, together. Add; 1 Tsp vanilla, and 1 egg, blend with a spoon. When dough begins to come together, Use your hands to Knead the dough then form into a ball. Press dough into your Baking dish, and slightly up the sides In another Large Bowl, using your Mixer, Beat @ Room temp. Cream cheese, Sugar, Sour Cream, and the remaining egg and 3 Yolks, add 2 tsp vanilla, Beat Until Smooth and creamy. Spread this cream cheese Mixture over top of the Cookie Dough in your pan. BAKE 25-30 min. til center is set. While bars are Baking; Pulverize the toffee Bits in Blender, Sprinkle Immediately over Dish as removed from the Oven and still Hot. Let Cool 30-45 min Cover then place in refrigerator at least 3 hrs or Over Night. Cut into 2-3 inch bars to serve. Keep refrigerated.

Chuck Roast

Hidden Valley Ranch dry dressing mix

McCormick dry Au Jus Mix

Stick of Margarine

5 pepperoncini peppers

Place chuck roast in crock pot, Sprinkle with dry Hidden Valley ranch dressing mix, add packet of dry McCormick Au Jus mix. Place the stick of margarine on top of roast.. Lay the 5 pepperoncini peppers along the sides of the margarine. DO NOT ADD WATER.

Cook on low for 7-8 hrs.



Be A Standard Bearer

When the enemy shall come in like a flood, the Spirit of the LORD shall lift up a standard against him. Isaiah 59:19

The Hebrew expression in this verse from Isaiah is rich with meaning. The root "nus" (from the expression "raise up a standard") is related to or sounds like numerous words which mean "sign", "miracle", "to drive away", "to flee", "cause to disappear", "a waving flag". This abundance of meanings in Isaiah's poetic style reveals the multiple dimensions of God's revelation; in this case, the way he deals with evil. The assertion in this word is that the Spirit of the LORD will be powerfully activated when evil comes. Whether the enemy comes in like a flood, and then the LORD raises a standard against him...or, the enemy comes in, and like a flood, the LORD works miraculously and drives him away, the clear meaning and promise is that the presence of evil will not go unnoticed. God will respond powerfully, in His own way, and in His own time. We've often spoken of the increase of wickedness in these last days; virtually every day some new scandal appears. Evil is on the rise; its power being consolidated in many areas of social, political, and personal life. Our identification with the one true God who raises His standard in response to this wickedness, calls us to be His "standard bearers" in the midst of the flood of evil around us. This is not easy, but is a high calling for faith-filled and disciplined saints. Our challenge now, more than ever before, is, do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. We cannot bear the standard of Jesus if we yield to become like the world around us. Only by abiding, praying, staying close to Him, can we represent our Lord. Let's continue to encourage one another...daily.

Psalms 119:63 "I am a companion of all them that fear thee, and of them that keep thy precepts."

It is the living, powerful word of God that is able to divide the soul and spirit as well as discern the thoughts and intents of the heart. (Hebrews 4:12) It is the two-edged sword that comes forth from the warrior Christ in Revelation. And it is what you are to live on, being even more important than bread. These are the things which ought to unify those who love the Lord. The spiritual realm should hold precedence over the physical realm. I may disagree with you about the "good" taste of liver but that should never come between us as companions that fear the Lord and keep his precepts. Make the liveliest of God's people your greatest intimates, and see that their love and likeness to Christ be the great motive of your love to them, more than their love or likeness to you." "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is Spirit" John 3:6 (KJV)

For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do." Ro. 7:15 - 19 (KJV) Sound familiar? One thing I have learned through life is that relationships are either vertical or horizontal. The vertical relationship of course refers to Spiritual matters, while horizontal relationships have to do with others (or flesh). So, where do you think your dislike for your co-worker comes from? Does God dislike your co-worker? Listen, when you're vertical relationship is right, your horizontal relationship will be right. It's so true...the biggest battles we fight every day are the battles within. We know right from wrong, and good from bad, still we find it easier to give in to our inbred sin nature than to practice walking in the spirit. Any one can gossip, and put down another person, but it takes a man or woman of God to let patience have it's perfect work in us. I can't even pretend to know what your battles are every day, but I do know from experience that..."Those who live according to the sinful nature have their minds set on what that nature desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. The mind of sinful man is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace." Romans 8:5,6 Before you leave your house today, ask God to release His Spirit within you. Where there are situations that seem impossible to handle, remember that Man's extremities, are merely God's opportunities to work, and to help you be VICTORIOUS.
