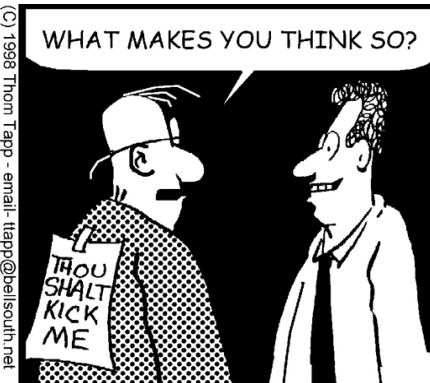
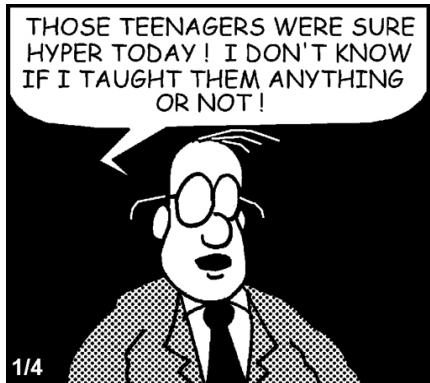
Stop Looking Back - Look Ahead

Kool-Aid Ice Cream

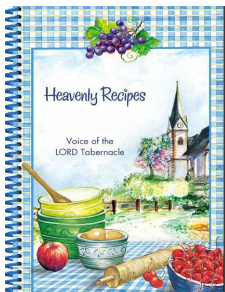
- 1 packet unsweetened kool-aid, any flavor
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2 cups whole or 2% milk
- 1 cup half & half

Mix one packet unsweetened Kool-Aid mix together with granulated sugar. Add the milk, half & half and mix until dissolved. Pour mixture into a shallow freezer container. Freeze for 1 - 2 hours until slightly thickened. Transfer mixture to a bowl and beat until smooth with a wire whisk. Return to the freezer container, cover and freeze 8 hours or over night. Remove 20 minutes before serving to soften slightly.

Zesty Cole Slaw

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 1 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 3/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon celery seed
- 2 packages (14 ounces each) coleslaw mix
- 1 small sweet red pepper, chopped
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced sweet onion

In a large bowl, mix the first six ingredients. Add coleslaw mix, red pepper and onion; toss to coat. Refrigerate at least 1 hour before serving.

Shepherd's Breakfast

- 3/4 pound bacon strips, finely chopped
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 package (30 ounces) frozen shredded hash brown potatoes, thawed
- 8 Eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese

In a large skillet, cook bacon and onion over medium heat until bacon is crisp. Drain, reserving 1/4 cup drippings in pan. Stir in hash browns. Cook, uncovered, over medium heat 10 minutes or until bottom is golden brown; turn potatoes. With the back of a spoon, make eight evenly spaced wells in potato mixture. Break one egg into each well. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cook, covered, on low 10 minutes or until eggs are set and potatoes are tender. Sprinkle with cheese; let stand until cheese is melted.

Grilled Maple Pork Chops

- 6 tablespoons maple syrup
- 6 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 teaspoon coarsely ground pepper
- 4 boneless pork loin chops

In a small bowl, whisk syrup, vinegar, salt and pepper until blended. Pour 1/2 cup marinade into a large re-sealable plastic bag. Add pork chops; seal bag and turn to coat. Refrigerate 1 hour. Reserve remaining marinade for basting. Drain pork chops, discarding marinade in bag. Moisten a paper towel with cooking oil; using long-handled tongs, rub on grill rack to coat lightly. Grill pork chops, covered, over medium heat or broil 4 in. from heat 13-17 minutes or until a thermometer reads 145°, turning occasionally and basting with reserved marinade during the last 5 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

Put The Glass Down

How heavy does something have to be, to be too heavy? Consider the following story: A psychologist walked around a room while teaching stress management to an audience. As she raised a glass of water, everyone expected they'd be asked the "half empty or half full" question. Instead, with a smile on her face, she inquired: "How heavy is this glass of water?" Answers called out ranged from 8 oz. to 20 oz. She replied, "The absolute weight doesn't matter. It depends on how long I hold it. If I hold it for a minute, it's not a problem. If I hold it for an hour, I'll have an ache in my arm. If I hold it for a day, my arm will feel numb and paralyzed. In each case, the weight of the glass doesn't change, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it becomes." She continued: "The stresses and worries in life are like that glass of water. Think about them for a while and nothing happens. Think about them a bit longer and they begin to hurt. And if you think about them all day long, you will feel paralyzed – incapable of doing anything." It's important to remember to let go of your stresses. As early as you can, put all your burdens down. Don't continue to carry them through life. **Remember to put the glass down!** There's an old hymnal that we sing that says "Take your burdens to the LORD and leave them there." Remember that He has said in His Word...in Matthew 11:28-29 Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. HE is waiting for you to put the glass down!



“All Things Work Together for Good”

Scripture Reference: Romans 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

I. Let me remark on this verse...All things Of course we all know that the good things that happen come from God. And we've all heard it said that the bad things are from the devil. But this verse says that all things work together for Good. All things...Even trials, tribulations, loss of loved ones, jail, separation, calamity, sufferings Work together for good? How can that be what good could come from our hurt, our pain, our suffering? We've all heard it said that we suffer the consequences of our actions, and sometimes these are painful realizations that hurt all around us. II. Work together for good This means the final outcome of our situation Suffering teaches us the truth about our mortality, and the frailty of our lives it lets us know that sometimes we have no control over our own. It usually forces us to look towards God for help and support. It gives us a hope of an eternal home in heaven without any suffering. III. The bible tells us best why we suffer Psalm 119:67 - Before I was afflicted I went astray: but now have I kept thy word. Psalm 119:71 - It is good for me that I have been afflicted; that I might learn thy statutes. Hebrews 12:11 - Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby. I read a testimony of an individual that proves that all things work for good...When he was seven years old, his family was forced out of their home on a legal technicality, and he had to work to help support them. At age nine, his mother died. At twenty-two, he lost his job as store clerk. He wanted to go to law school, but his education wasn't good enough. At twenty-three, he went into debt to become a partner in a small store. At six-six, his business partner died, leaving him a huge debt that took years to repay. At twenty-eight, after courting a girl for 4 yrs, he asked her to marry him. She said no. At thirty-seven, on his third try, he was elected to Congress, but two years later he failed to be reelected. At forty- one his four yr old son died. At forty-five, he ran for the Senate and lost. At forty-seven, he failed as the vice-presidential candidate. At forty-nine, He ran for the Senate again and lost. At fifty-one he was elected president of the United States . His name was Abraham Lincoln, a man many consider the greatest leader the county ever had. None of these events prior to his presidency were pleasant trials to suffer but they all Worked Together for Good in the end. I would venture to say if Abraham Lincoln had not suffered, the emancipation proclamation would never have been written. 1st Thessalonians 5:16-18 – Rejoice evermore. 17 Pray without ceasing. 18 In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you. IV. To them that love the Lord Have ever noticed that there always seems to be a catch to everything. You know the fine print that you better know before signing the contract. If there were any catch to this verse this would be it. Romans 8:28 - And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose. What does that mean? If you love the Lord no bad will befall you? NOT If you love the Lord all things will be good? NOT You see this one verse should be our hope in all situations. Romans 8:28 - And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose. You see to them that love God, afflictions are a blessing. Suffering we know is God's way of pruning us, shaping us. Acts 5:40-42 - And to him they agreed: and when they had called the apostles, and beaten them, they commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. 41 And they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his name. 42 And daily in the temple, and in every house, they ceased not to teach and preach Jesus Christ. You see when we trust in God, when we love Him, we can rejoice in our sufferings knowing, having faith that God will work it to good according to his purpose not ours. To those who don't love the Lord sufferings are viewed as chastisements and produce complaining instead of peace, rebellion instead of submission, anger instead of patience, hatred instead of calmness and love. V. Who have been called according to his purpose This is talking about a true Christian. One that is living the life not just talking about it. One who is seeking after God's own heart? One the Holy Spirit has drawn and the individual has accepted the Lord as his Savior. I challenge you to face the trials of life as God pruning us, changing us, molding us and developing us. Seek the Lord daily in a personal way, have an intimate relationship, love the Lord with all you are and you will know that all things will work together for good. Rejoice in your times of suffering and be assured that your hope lies in God and keep you eyes fixed on your eternal reward in heaven.

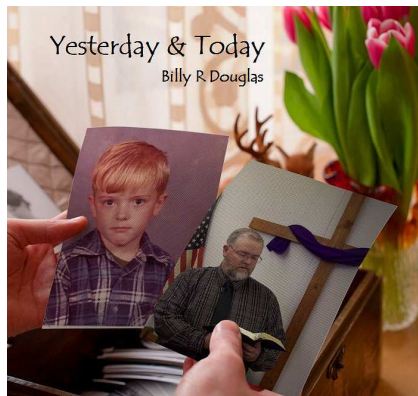

Out of the Depths

"I wait for the LORD, my soul doth wait, and in his word do I hope." Psalm 130:5

In the course of our lives, we sometimes find ourselves in "the depths" Psalm 120:1 says "Out of the depths have I cried unto thee, O LORD." I am sure that there have been times when you have been so despaired that you have felt like saying, I just want to give up. Despair is a kind of dieing within ones self; despair is the death of hope. Job reflected that we are "born to trouble". To be human is to be in trouble. The question is whether you will remain troubled or choose hope. The cause of despair is sin. Everyone gets into the depths, but not everyone chooses to reach out to God. Someone wrote with a marker on a "Dead End" sign the words: "What isn't?" To some people, every road is a Dead End. When we reach rock bottom, it is there that we realize we need mercy. That's when we want God to reach down and rescue us from our troubles. My friend that is when we need to look to God for a way out of the depths. Despair comes from our weight of guilt our sin before God. If God were any different than He is, not one of us would have a leg to stand on. Paul says in I Cor 13:5 that "Love doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil" in other words love doesn't keep a record of wrongs." If God chose to build a case against us, there would be no hope for us; we would appear judged and condemned. There is no way we can bargain with God. We can forgive ourselves, and others can forgive us, but that's not enough. God has to forgive us. Our salvation depends completely on God's mercy. He is our only source of help for now and eternity. Sometimes we're afraid to approach God because we're afraid that He will reject us since we've already failed Him so many times. We KNOW our sins aren't accidents they are willful acts of rebellion against God; and so we feel like hypocrites approaching God one more time to ask for forgiveness. We fear that God will appear with His arms crossed and sternly say, "So—it's you again! Well, let's get your ledger out, that's quite a disturbing list of sins you've piled up! What do you expect Me to do about it?" But verse 4 say, "But there is forgiveness with thee, that thou mayest be feared." Yes we can count on the mercy of a forgiving Father. God's forgiveness is unconditional, and undeserved. Forgiveness is for all who want it. To be forgiven all we must do is ask God to forgive us and He will. The payment of sin is death, but Christ cancels out our debt with His blood. He wipes the record clean. Jesus took them all to the cross with Him. When we truly understand God's forgiveness and the cost of it, in sending His son, Christ to the cross we should be broken and humbled, and we should bow in awe before God our Father. In other words we can counter despair with two words verse 5 says : "I wait for the LORD, my soul doth wait, and in his word do I hope." Look at those words, wait, and hope. If you wait on the Lord and keep the hope God will lift you up out of your despair. Now, despair is spiritual decay which causes people to die within. Do not give up keep the hope. Hope does not deny our problems, it defies them. Hope means learning to live without fear, to be at peace with life. Faith puts our hope into action. It means confidence in God's care. Do you have confidence in God? A Grandmaster chess champion examined a painting in an art gallery. The artist had painted a match between the devil and an outwitted young man. The painting showed the two engaged in a chess game being played for the man's soul. The man is in panic as the devil appears ready to make his final move. The painting was titled Checkmate. The chess champion stood observing the painting for several minutes, then smiled slightly. He turned to the curator and said, "I have good news for the man in the picture—he still has a move." The father of lies even today has convinced too many people that he has placed them in checkmate, but the GRACE of God has provided us the hope that we still have a move.
