"Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God." Hebrews 12:2

It is ever the Holy Spirit's work to turn our eyes away from self to Jesus; but Satan's work is just the opposite of this, for he is constantly trying to make us regard ourselves instead of Christ. He insinuates, "Your sins are too great for pardon; you have no faith; you do not repent enough; you will never be able to continue to the end; you have not the joy of His children; you have such a wavering hold of Jesus." All these are thoughts about self, and we shall never find comfort or assurance by looking within. But the Holy Spirit turns our eyes entirely away from self: He tells us that we are nothing [in ourselves], but that "Christ is all in all." Remember, therefore, it is not [just] thy hold of Christ that saves thee-it is Christ; it is not thy joy in Christ that saves thee-it is Christ; look not so much to thy hand with which thou art grasping Christ, as to Christ; look not to thy hope, but to Jesus, the source of thy hope; look not to thy faith, but to Jesus, the author and finisher of thy faith. We shall never find happiness by looking at our prayers, our doings, or our feelings; it is what Jesus is, not what we are, that gives rest to the soul. If we would at once overcome Satan and have peace with God. it must be by "looking unto Jesus." Keep thine eye simply on Him; let His death, His sufferings, His merits, His glories, His intercession, be fresh upon thy mind; when thou wakest in the morning look to Him; when thou liest down at night look to Him. Oh! let not thy hopes or fears come between thee and Jesus; follow hard after Him, and He will never fail thee.

How different Your people! How failing we are in thought, word and deed. How wandering our hearts!


Oh Lord, make us faithful; faithful to You; faithful to one another; faithful to truth.



The song "There is a Fountain Filled With Blood was written by William Cowper in 1772 after an attack of mental sickness in which he tried to commit suicide more than four times...each time his attempts would fail. After recovering, Cowper came to realize how God can erase the stain of any sin.

The only hope for the world today...the only hope for this nation today is found in the shed blood of the Lamb of God...the finished work that Jesus did on the cross of Calvary! Today on the political scene we hear much about how we are going to "Make America Great Again"...the Word of God is very clear that this is an impossibility UNLESS a nation turns to God. 4-1/2 cups Rice Krispies3-1/4 cups quick-cooking oats1/2 cup cornflakes1/2 cup flaked coconut1/2 cup butter, cubed

1 package (16 ounces) miniature marshmallows

1/4 cup honey

1/2 cup M&M's minis

1/4 cup raisins

The Holy Walk of Fatherhood

"Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty! Early in the morning our song shall rise to Thee; Holy, holy, holy, merciful and mighty! God in three persons, blessed Trinity! Holy, holy, holy! All the saints adore Thee...All Thy works shall praise Thy name in earth and sky and sea..."

Most are familiar with this precious hymn of the faith; my heart wells up within me whenever I hear it. With Father's Day just around the corner, our minds should be drawn to the fact that, as fathers, we are to point our children, wife, and those in our sphere of influence to our Holy Father God. We have the responsibility to train our children to walk in holiness and to praise God in all things. It's my sincere desire that God would be able to say of me as He did of Abraham: "For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him." (Genesis 18:19) Anyone that knows me will tell you I'm no Abraham; but my goal is to raise my children in the fear and admonition of the LORD. I want them to walk in the way of holiness no matter how much the world opposes them. I want to see them love the Lord their God with EVERYTHING that they are because HE IS GOD. If their outward life of holiness doesn't flow from an inward heart of purity, it will mean nothing. My thoughts align with the apostle John, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth." (3 John 1:4) But... That doesn't happen in a vacuum. Taking them to church is important; but it's not enough. I NEED to be with my children; they NEED me to instruct them with my voice and my life. As Deuteronomy 6 instructs me, I must instruct them to know and obey the commands of God. I am to teach them everywhere we are and in every way, that the Lord is One God and that His ways are for our benefit. We do what is right because it is right and HE IS GOD! Fellow dads, the world desires to steal our child's heart, soul, and mind. Our God-given responsibility is to show our children that there's a real difference between the fool's gold that our society tempts them with and the true gold of holiness, the treasure that is not only found in Jesus, but is Jesus Himself. As men whom God has blessed with children, we must consciously give them back to Him. We must like heavenly watchdogs, guarding diligently the things they watch, listen to, and read. Pay close attention to who their friends are and the influences that surround them. It's God's grace that saves; but we too have a responsibility to raise them in the fear and love of our Lord! Why bring children into the world only to populate hell? Pray for them, pray with them, do your heavenly duty by nurturing them in the blessings of God's word, and a lifestyle of, thanksgiving, love, and respect. We are duty bound to teach them to honor their father and mother, to train them to be submissive to authority, particularly the authority of God and His Word. This is not just your boy or your girl; this is a soul that is headed for an eternal destination. They will forever be in the presence of God or they will be in a Christ-less eternity of darkness and torment, a place of eternal gnashing of their teeth. Oh how we must look at them and train them with eternity in view! With all the allurements that desire to steal our children's virtue, we have no choice but to be earthly sentries over their eternal souls. It's not only a blessing to guard the things our children hear, see, say, and do, but it's an even greater privilege to teach them the whole counsel of God, to bring them to the Lord, and to instruct them in the ways of wisdom and holiness. Family altar times are perhaps the most important times of the day for our families. If possible, let us open and close our days with them in prayer and a word from the Scriptures. Encourage them to ask for wisdom, live out holiness, being faithful in pure in word, thought, and deed. Let us take every opportunity to share with them how our circumstances should be viewed in light of God's Word and that our responses should also fall in line with His instruction. Show them how the Bible speaks to the current events of our day. This being the case, it's ever so important that we ourselves walk in holiness; we must never be in the frame of mind that says, "Do as I say, not as I do." Our personal prayer time and study in the Word is vital if we are to lead our family and instruct them in the way of righteousness. Oh how we must guard our own heart and mind, always keeping our focus single, and that single focus being on Jesus. We can't give away what we don't have and our actions speak louder than our words. So keep in mind, like Elijah, we are always standing before the God of Israel who lives. (I Kings 17:1) We must keep our minds stayed on Him, our feet resolutely in His way, and our mouths continually caring for and instructing our family in holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord. Men, ours is a solemn calling and a sacred duty. Let us not shirk these earthly responsibilities which hold such awesome, eternal consequences. There will be days that we feel too tired, too worn, too sick...point those in your charge heavenward anyway. Press on in the power and strength of the Lord.

Scripture Reference: Psalms 20:1-9

The LORD hear thee in the day of trouble; the name of the God of Jacob defend thee; 2 Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Zion 3 Remember all thy offerings, and accept thy burnt sacrifice; Selah 4 Grant thee according to thine own heart, and fulfil all thy counsel. 5 We will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the LORD fulfil all thy petitions. 6 Now know I that the LORD saveth his anointed; he will hear him from his holy heaven with the saving strength of his right hand. 7 Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God. 8 They are brought down and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright. 9 Save, LORD: let the king hear us when we call.

Some families are in want of stability and cohesiveness. We can never use the language of the Laodicean church and say, 'We have need of nothing.' Our needs are great but the Lord's resources are inexhaustible. The New Testament points out some types of man's needs: Material — Matthew 6:31-32 - Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? Wherewithal shall we be clothed? 32(For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. Physical — Luke 9:11 - And the people, when they knew it, followed him: and he received them, and spake unto them of the kingdom of God, and healed them that had need of healing. Personal — Luke 10:42 - But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. Moral — John 13:10 - Jesus saith to him, He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all. Social — 1st Corinthians 12:21 - And the eye cannot say unto the hand, I have no need of thee: nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you. Spiritual— Hebrews 10:36 - For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise. Mental— James 1:5 - If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. Philippians 4:19 - But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus. III. There is help for those without strength to go on. Proverbs 24:10 - If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small. There are times in life when life can seem overwhelming. You may even feel like your life is a journey on a restless and troubled sea. You need help to make it through another day but feel like you're all helpless and all alone. I have good news for you there is help for everything you're going through. Even though you feel like you can't take another step, you may still have to walk the valley but you don't have to walk it alone on your own strength. (Read 2nd Chronicles 14) - When Asa was king of Judah, an Ethiopian named Zerah attacked Judah with an army of 1,000,000 warriors and 300 charioteers. Outnumbered and without the military strength needed to defend themselves rather than frantically looking to others for deliverance, Asa leaned on the Lord. 2nd Chronicles 14:11 – And Asa cried unto the LORD his God, and said, LORD, it is nothing with thee to help, whether with many, or with them that have no power: help us, O LORD our God; for we rest on thee, and in thy name we go against this multitude. O LORD, thou art our God; let no man prevail against thee. Psalms 28:7 - The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped: therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise him. God delights in giving strength to those who are weak who will run to Him. Isaiah 40:29 - He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength. All of God's Giants have been weak men. Hudson Taylor, founder of the China Inland Mission, knew the secret of strength through weakness. Complimented once by a friend on the impact of the mission, Hudson answered, "It seemed to me that God looked over the whole world to find a man who was weak enough to do His work, and when He at last found me, He said, 'He is weak enough—he'll do.' All God's giants have been weak men who did great things for God because they counted on His being with them." Isaiah 40:31 -But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint. Man's greatest weakness is spiritual. We read in Romans 5:6 - For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. As sinners the Bible declare that we are "without strength." This carries the idea of being "powerless". It speaks of people who are "utterly helpless with no means of escape." The idea is that the lost sinner stands before God with absolutely no ability to change what he is. We are powerless to escape sin, to escape death, to resist the devil, to please God in any way. The whole essence of this statement is that man is unable to change his sinful nature by his own effort. He is totally without strength and weakened by his sins. John 1:12 - But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:

Rachel had no idea but, these were worth a quarter of his grade and now there was no way to recoup, let alone finish this project. How would he ever come up with a new idea, do all the research and still have time to do a model, or small craft let alone write the papers. He just turned in the rough draft for this one to his teacher yesterday. There were only two weeks left before the final copy was due and he would have to start from scratch. With his collection destroyed there wouldn't be enough time or resources to get more butterflies. He had been grateful to get them on their migration through this past spring and he had only been finding one here and there lately. Definitely not enough to re-do the whole project! And to add fuel to the fire. Rachel had done it on purpose. She was mad because he had eaten the last of the ice cream and to pay him back, she had dumped his volcano lava he'd been saving, all over the 4' x 4' board his collection was mounted to. My Friend: we are about to ask you the most important question of your life. Your joy or your sorrow for all eternity depends upon your answer. The question is: Are you saved?
