As some of you may know, a bomb exploded in a bus within blocks of our Jerusalem apartment when we first moved to Israel. That morning, my wife and I, along with our newborn baby, were heading to the city center to run a few errands when suddenly we heard the explosion. Within minutes, the sirens were screaming from every part of the city as officials quickly made their way to the scene. Later that month, the bus I was supposed to be on drove away as I watched it carry away the 50 or so people who would be critically injured and the 8 who would be dead seconds later, when that bus exploded before my very eyes. So, to put it mildly, we have seen firsthand how terrorism works and how it affects people. People ask us all the time -- "Aren't you afraid to be living in Israel these days?" I want to share part of a story that I recently read that blessed my heart and I pray it will be a blessing to you as well.

"It was just another hurried Wednesday afternoon trip to the grocery store. My husband was at work. My daughters were going about their daily activities knowing I would return to them at the appointed time, bearing, among other things, their favorite fruit snacks, frozen pizza, and all the little extras that never had to be written down on a grocery list. My grocery list, by the way, was in my 16-month-old daughter's mouth, and I was trying to retrieve it when I nearly ran over an old man. This man clearly had no appreciation for the fact that I had 45 minutes left to finish the grocery shopping, pick up my 4-year old from tumbling class, and get to school, where my 12-year-old and her car-pool mates would be waiting. He stood in front of the soap selection staring blankly, as if he'd never had to choose a bar of soap in his life. I was ready to bark at him when I realized there was a tear on his face..."Can I help you find something?" I asked. He hesitated, and then told me he was looking for soap. "Any one in particular?" I continued. "Well, I'm trying to find my wife's brand of soap." I started to loan him my cell phone to call her when he said, "She died a year ago, and I just want to smell her again." Chills ran down my spine. I don't think a bomb could have had the same impact. As tears welled up in my eyes, my half-eaten grocery list didn't seem so important. Neither did fruit snacks or frozen pizza. I spent the remainder of my time in the store that day listening to a man tell the story of how important his wife was to him -- how she took care of their children while he served our country...my life was forever changed that day."

I know that for each one of us it is easy to go along this walk of life busy doing what needs to be done, going from here to there. And how so very easy it is for us to get disturbed or frustrated when someone gets in our way and slows us down. How many times have we been in Wal-mart or some other store and someone gets in our way as we hurry down the aisle and we have thoughts like this young woman did? How many times while driving down the highway have we found ourselves behind someone who just is not going fast enough for us? As I read the above story I came away with the thought that when these things happen we need to take a moment to realize that we do not know what is going on in the lives of those who "get in our way"! We have no idea what kind of struggle or trial they may be dealing with. Oh what a difference a kind word or a smile in place of a grunt and a snort might do! Who's to say that the LORD did not put them in our way for a reason? Who's to say as we stomp passed with the attitude of "get out of my way" that we not only passed that person but may have passed up an opportunity to share the love of the LORD with someone who desperately needed some love that day! So the next time someone gets in our way and we begin to get aggravated and agitated may the LORD help us to slow down and ask ourselves am I about to pass up an opportunity to share Your love and Your light with them?? 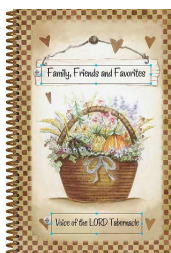


WHITHER SHALL I GO? conclusion

Psalm 139:7 The word "Thou" is very strong, meaning God, you and no other, created and formed all my inward parts Notice the statement, "Thou hast covered me in my mother's womb" The word "covered" speaks of something being fenced in or that which is protected The Psalmist was saying that even when he was in his mother's womb, the Lord was watching over him, protecting him As he thinks of this Attention God gave him, even before he was born, He exclaims in v. 14 – "I will praise Thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are Thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well" He exclaims – I am a work of God! He has made me. He formed me and fashioned me. I am a marvelous creation of God! He continues in v.15 – "My substance was not hid from Thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth" The word "substance" speaks of his body The Psalmist was saying - Before I was ever seen by human eyes, when I was in secret, God was not only giving attention to the formation and creation of my inward parts, but my body as well Whither Shall I Go? – Psalm 139:7 The words "curiously wrought" are one word that describes a weaver making a tapestry or working on fine needlework Like a weaver working on a tapestry, the Lord was forming my body, what my features would be, what I would look like He says in v.16 – "Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect; and in Thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there were none of them" The word "substance" as used in v.16 means "embryo" The word "see" means to watch over The Psalmist declared that when he was in embryonic form, he was being watched over by God From the time we are conceived, we are the subjects of God's attention God even goes as far as to keep a record of every little detail of our life He kept it all in His ("Thy") "book", with our names What is the Psalmist saying? Each of us is Special and Significant to God We are the result of His creation and formation Even before we were born we were the objects of God's special care and attention - Whither Shall I Go? – Psalm 139:7 Do you ever feel that you are unimportant? Then just read Psalm 139:13-16 - For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. 14 I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well. 15 My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth. 16 Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect; and in thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them. I want you to understand that God carefully chose each one of us He carefully formed and fashioned us to be just what He wanted Even before we were born, we were the objects of God's attention God's 'Pre-natal' Attention to our Life Secondly and lastly we see ...B. God's 'Perpetual' Attention to His Life Again in v.17 we read – "How precious also are thy thoughts unto me, O God!" The Psalmist says – Lord, you gave me special attention even before I was born, but even more, you have never ceased to think about me The Psalmist is reminding us that we are always on the mind of God God is always thinking about us! Psalm 40:17 – "But I am poor and needy; yet the Lord thinketh upon me: Thou art my help and my deliverer; make no tarrying, O my God" He is always watching over and out for us Whither Shall I Go? – Psalm 139:7 There is never a moment when we are not the objects of God's Attention and Affection In fact, the Psalmist says – If I were to try to count the thoughts you have for me, it would be like counting the grains of sand in the sea He sums up this great truth by saying in v.18 – "when I am awake, I am still with Thee" Can we flee from God's Presence? Absolutely not! God's Presence is always with us and we are always in God's Presence We are the objects of His Personal /Perpetual Attention CONCLUSION: In closing let me say; if the thought of God's Perpetual Knowledge Of your life -- Perpetual Presence In your life -- Perpetual Attention To your life is a bit alarming, then do and pray what the Psalmist did in vs. 23-24 - Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: 24 And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

I'm frequently encouraging you to READ the Bible, STUDY the Bible, MEDITATE upon the Bible, and OBEY the Bible. So this month we're giving you a help to do just that. This is a Bible Study I ran with our church many years ago. We found it beneficial and some still talk about it. Bacon Ranch Potato Salad

- 3 lbs small red potatoes
- salt
- 1/2 cup mayo
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1 (1-ounce) packet ranch salad dressing mix
- 4 green onions sliced thin
- 4 strips bacon cooked and crumbled

Wash and cut potatoes into about 1-inch chunks. Place the potatoes in a large pot with just enough water to cover them. Add enough salt to make the water taste like ocean water. Place over medium high heat. Bring to a boil and reduce the heat to a simmer. Cook about 15 minutes, or until the potatoes are tender when pierced with a knife, but not mushy. Meanwhile, make the dressing by combining the mayo, sour cream, and ranch dressing mix. Once the potatoes are cooked through, drain them well. If you like your potato salad cold, spread the potatoes on a baking sheet and chill them in the refrigerator. Combine the potatoes, dressing, green onions, and bacon in a large bowl and toss to coat. Refrigerate until served.

Barbecue-Bacon Cheeseburger Meatloaf

- 1 lb. lean ground beef
 - 1 egg, beaten
 - 1/4 cup dry bread crumbs
 - 1/4 cup OSCAR MAYER Real Bacon Bits
 - 1-1/2 cups KRAFT Shredded Triple Cheddar Cheese
 - 1/2 cup BULL'S-EYE Original BBQ Sauce, divided
- Heat oven to 375°F. Mix meat, egg, bread crumbs, bacon bits, 1-1/4 cups cheese and 6 Tbsp. barbecue sauce just until blended. Shape into oval loaf in 13x9-inch pan. Bake 45 min. or until meatloaf is done. Spread top of meatloaf with remaining barbecue sauce; sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake 5 min. or until cheese is melted.

Mac & Cheese

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter, plus more for baking dish
- Coarse salt and freshly ground pepper
- 3 cups elbow macaroni
- 2 (12-ounce) cans evaporated milk
- 1/3 cup skim milk
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 (8-ounce) packages sharp cheddar cheese, grated
- 1 (8-ounce) package Monterey Jack cheese, grated
- Paprika, for sprinkling

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Generously butter a 13-by-9-inch glass baking dish; set aside. Bring a large pot of water to a boil; add salt and macaroni. Cook until al dente according to package directions. Drain, and return to pot. Add butter, and toss until pasta is coated and butter has melted; set aside. In a medium bowl, whisk together evaporated milk, skim milk, and eggs. Add seasoned salt, garlic powder, 1 teaspoon salt, and 1/2 teaspoon pepper; set aside. In another medium bowl, combine cheeses; set aside. Place 1/3 macaroni in an even layer in the bottom of prepared baking dish; cover evenly with 1/3 cheese. Repeat with remaining macaroni and cheese mixture. Pour milk mixture evenly over contents of baking dish. Sprinkle with paprika. Bake until top layer is lightly browned, 35 to 45 minutes. Let stand 10 to 15 minutes before serving.

Creamy Crock Pot Corn

- 2 pkgs. frozen corn 12 oz
 - 8 oz pkg of cream cheese
 - 1/4 c butter cubed
 - 2 T sugar
 - 1 t salt
 - 1/2 t pepper
- Place corn in crock pot Cut butter and cream cheese into cubes and place in crock pot Add sugar, salt and pepper Stir well Cover and cook on low for 4 hours or high for 2 hours Stir at least once half way through cooking time



The Delight of Despair

When I saw Him, I fell at His feet as dead.

REVELATION 1:17

It may be that, like the apostle John, you know Jesus Christ intimately. Yet when He suddenly appears to you with totally unfamiliar characteristics, the only thing you can do is fall "at His feet as dead." There are times when God cannot reveal Himself in any other way than in His majesty, and it is the awesomeness of the vision which brings you to the delight of despair. You experience this joy in hopelessness, realizing that if you are ever to be raised up it must be by the hand of God "He laid His right hand on me..." (Revelation 1:17). In the midst of the awesomeness, a touch comes, and you know it is the right hand of Jesus Christ. You know it is not the hand of restraint, correction, nor chastisement, but the right hand of the Everlasting Father. Whenever His hand is laid upon you, it gives inexpressible peace and comfort, and the sense that "underneath are the everlasting arms" (Deuteronomy 33:27), full of support, provision, comfort, and strength. And once His touch comes, nothing at all can throw you into fear again. In the midst of all His ascended glory, the Lord Jesus comes to speak to an insignificant disciple, saying, "Do not be afraid" (Revelation 1:17). His tenderness is inexpressibly sweet. Do I know Him like that? Take a look at some of the things that cause despair. There is despair which has no delight, no limits whatsoever, and no hope of anything brighter. But the delight of despair comes when "I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells..." (Romans 7:18). I delight in knowing that there is something in me which must fall prostrate before God when He reveals Himself to me, and also in knowing that if I am ever to be raised up it must be by the hand of God. God can do nothing for me until I recognize the limits of what is humanly possible, allowing Him to do the impossible.

Broken Cisterns

For My people have committed two evils; they have forsaken Me the fountain of living waters, and hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water (Jer. 2:13).

The people of Jerusalem, God's Own Chosen People, had sunk to a level that was morally lower than the heathen. They committed two evils. First, they forsook Jehovah; second, they embraced idolatry. They exchanged a living fountain for a broken cistern. The heathen were only guilty of one evil, that is, of idolatry. For God had not revealed Himself and His Law to them. Is it possible that the modern Church is in worse condition spiritually than even the heathen? For all practical purposes, with some few exceptions, the modern Church has forsaken the Cross. To forsake the Cross is to forsake Christ. The modern Church no longer believes the answer is found in the Cross of Christ, and only in the Cross of Christ. In place of the Cross, it has substituted humanistic psychology. Never mind that such wisdom is "earthly, sensual, and devilish" (James 3:15). They have opted for that in place of the "wisdom that is from above," which is "first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy" (James 3:17). So, as Israel of old, the modern Church also has committed two evils. First of all, it has abandoned the light of the Gospel; second, it has adopted the ways of the world. As an excellent example, the false direction of the book, "The Purpose Driven Life," has been adopted by the Church, by the Mormons, by the Catholics, by secular interests of the world, and even by some Muslims; however, the Church is so spiritually blind that it cannot see that the whole thing is a "broken cistern," which will "hold no water." Something accepted by all cannot be spiritually valid, as should be obvious! To forsake the Cross is to forsake Christ. They cannot be separated. And, to be sure, the modern Church has forsaken the Cross. When this is done, and it has been done in a wholesale way, then the Church becomes a ready recipient of false doctrine. Without the Cross, there are no spiritual bearings.

Story for Today: Selflessly giving not only finances, but time and much energy, we pause to thank and express our gratitude for the efforts of one of our own, Mr. Dundkey and his daughter, Raccia. After the applause died down, Mr. Dundkey began to speak into the microphone, his words cut through the humid air of the downtown mission community center. Mr. Dundkey and Raccia often found themselves at the center on most evenings. Both found much fulfillment in meeting the needs and spreading the words of Christ to those that sought help in many a desperate situation. "Thank you for this special honor," he began. "And thank you for working along side us. We could not minister as we have without the help of all of you who have volunteered your time and efforts too." "Betty, thank you for faithfully speaking the truth even when some make it known they do not want to hear! And George, that day that you were attacked, but you kept coming back, thank you! Sam, I want you to know that we noticed all the efforts you made to get the funding for the Bible School program for the school aged children. So many of you; you are what makes this work and the difference in this community. I could go on and on listing off all the good things that we see, but, instead I will close with this prayer of thanks and the hope that all that we do will bring honor and glory to the Father." And with that Mr. Dundkey began to pray. Many that heard this little speech were surprised by the things they heard in the fellowship time after the nice dinner. Everyone loved the workers at the center. But, most people had come to expect the encouragement rather than paying attention to the great offer of generosity that it truly was. As Raccia left that evening with her Dad, she began to wonder how her Dad knew about all the workers. She had been there and had missed so much. Was it possible that she needed to do more than just show up if she wanted to truly be a fellow laborer? Her Dad wouldn't know to do that if he didn't work hard for God seeking His will and His opportunities! She was so grateful for the great example, and a little convicted knowing she had much room for improvement.

Questions for Today: Do you know those that minister together with you? Do you encourage them to live peaceably and blameless, while enduring trials for the Lord?

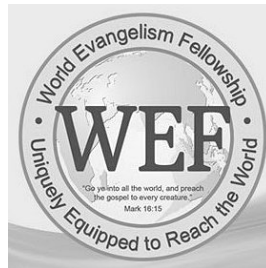
