



Share that message yourself with those who the LORD brings your way and opens the door for you to reach. 4. Share a Gospel tract or card that tells of the great salvation they can find in Jesus and ONLY in Jesus. You can put these in with your bills when you mail them, leave them on tables at restaurants, etc. And those are just a few of the things that you can do. Setting Boundaries

Galatians 5:13-15 - For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another. 14 For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. 15 But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another.

I want to discuss with you about setting up some Biblical Boundaries. Establishing some guidelines for healthy living. In order to live holy, separated and acceptable unto God, we must set the boundaries found in the Word of God...by doing so, you protect and guard your Godly decisions, which place you on the path to your Godly destination. The road you travel depends on the boundaries you establish based in the Word. That's why it's so very important to study and read the Word every single day not just on Sundays and Wednesdays. If you do not set boundaries then no boundaries lead to a life that is out of control and destined for hell. Boundaries are like a road map. You can't get to where you want to go without planning. Otherwise, you won't know when you arrive. Boundaries get you where God wants you to be. Setting boundaries in your life is not wrong! Biblical boundaries guide you to the destination of Godly promises. Let's see what the Bible has to say about Biblical Boundaries...Galatians 5:13-15 - For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another. 14 For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. 15 But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another. 1) Healthy Christian Boundaries Shout... Jesus help me create healthy boundaries from your Word. Let's define a boundary as something that indicates a border or a limit. When you draw a physical boundary, it can be seen; it separates one area from another. (i.e. - a fence or a block wall in a neighborhood) It is difficult to see boundaries in the spiritual realm. God has boundaries in His Word and He has given us rules to live by. These rules or boundaries activate the promises of God in your life but we have to obey them. In today's society, boundaries are being eliminated, uprooted and discarded. (Prayer taken out of schools, 10 Commandments being removed, etc....) Where there are no boundaries, there is bondage and we know who is behind that, none other than Satan himself. We need to place boundaries around our good decisions. Boundaries promote true freedom; however, Satan will try to use your emotions to destroy your boundaries. When we allow our liberty to surpass the boundaries we have set, chaos and bondage are inevitable. God has given you freedom; however, you must not use it to sin as we see here in Galatians 5:13 - For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another. Sin begins in the mind. It starts off as an idea or a whisper from Satan. Don't bite the bait of Satan. (Set boundaries with your children, work, spouse, family, church, etc. I set boundaries such as a set prayer times or alone time with God. Family time to discuss issues and just hang out. Church boundaries such as counseling time (man to man, woman to woman). These are healthy boundaries.) 2) While some things may be lawful for you, not all things are beneficial for you. 1st Corinthians 6:12 - All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any. Shout... Jesus help me made wise decisions that are beneficial for me. Shout... Jesus bless my Godly decisions. Make a quality decision regarding how you will live your life. Choose Jesus and His ways today. Don't do things the world's way. It never turns out the way you expect. Romans 14:12 - So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God. The choices you make will bring you happiness or sadness. If we are truly grounded in God's Word then we will have wisdom to discern right and wrong if we listen to His instructions. We have to be very careful in the choices we make... (going to a bar and getting drunk is a bad choice.) It's lawful but not good for you. You may cause another to stumble by your witness. The feeling of condemnation comes when you choose to disobey God. The devil brings forth condemnation, God brings conviction. Romans 8:1 - There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. If you continue in God's Word, you are His disciple. John 8:31 -Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; Knowing the Word brings you benefits. 3) How do we establish boundaries in our life? Shout... Lord Jesus lead me in your Word to establish Godly boundaries. Obey the Word. Obey the Word. Obey the Word. Respect the laws of God; govern your actions around them. Develop a real relationship with God, and the Holy Spirit will tell you when you are not in line with the Word. Mediation in the Word helps establish clear boundaries. Be a doer of the Word, not a hearer only. Blessed are those that do His commandments. Revelation 22:14 - Blessed are they that do His commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city. Ask God to lead you. Check your decisions against what the Bible says. Test the Word of God daily!

Unity

"That they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me." John 17:21-23

Jesus, in His high priestly prayer, prayed for the unity of believers; with the express purpose that the world would believe that the Father had sent Him. Jesus, again in His prayer, stated that He had given us a unifying glory so that we could be perfectly one. Again, the purpose for such unity was for the sake of the world, that they may know and believe. Sadly, there is little unity in the body of Christ today; that translates to little love and even less effectiveness in the world around us. This ought not to be so. Whether we get caught up in denominational differences or a selfish lusting after our own way within our own local church, the reason is a loss of focus on the One who unifies. I know that doctrine divides, the Bible divides, and one can make a case for the fact that Christ Himself divides; but most importantly for the Church, Christ also unifies. He makes us one! Rather than focusing on that which readily divides, why doesn't the Body focus on He who unifies? We are to keep "looking unto Jesus"—that phrase means to look away from ALL else that we might focus on Him, look upon Him, and be united IN HIM. Those things which should cause a hard divide should be that which divides the sheep from the goats—the saved from the unsaved! When the goats see the unity and love of the sheep, when the grace of God is visible in our lives, it herds them to belief; they'll wish they were sheep and seek the great Shepherd. Am I saying that we should just ignore our differences? No, we have rich and beautiful distinctives and ecclesiastical heritages that we should be grateful for and enjoy; but God is to be the object of our worship. He is where our focus must be. Each of us, either through divine creation or through a molding by our experiences, is moved by the Holy Spirit in different ways. God is kind to meet with us where we are and we tend to gather in like-minded circles; yet, each circle should have the mind of Christ. Each circle should, in love and unity, show the same grace to others which God for Christ's sake has shown to us. Each circle must recognize and beware that we do not worship our brand of experience rather than worshiping God in all His unifying holiness. In other words, stoicism can become as much an idol as charisma can. The root of pride can grow from any circle or any heart which forgets that it is only by the grace of God that we are able to worship the One true God at all; He calls the exuberant as well as the passive. In the first half of Ephesians 4, we are instructed that "With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; One Lord, one faith, one baptism, One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." We are reminded to speak the truth in love. When issues arise we are called to reprove, rebuke, and exhort (forbearing in love), not run, murmur or cast stones. Whenever we speak into real or perceived issues, we must do so from the whole counsel of God found in the Bible, not our little books of discipline or the traditions of men. After all, it is the Word of God which is authoritative and living. Let us approach each issue with the mind of Christ, in humility with the glory of God our highest concern. Let us, with Paul say, "whether in pretence, or in truth, Christ is preached; and I therein do rejoice, yea, and will rejoice." We are called to unity in Jesus that the world may believe that the Father has sent Jesus. The church is hindered, the glory of God eclipsed in our life, and Jesus minimized rather than magnified in our life, when we look for points of division and contention rather than the point of unity—"God manifest in the flesh." Can we agree that Jesus was born of a virgin, is the only begotten of the Father, that He died an atoning death upon the cross only to be resurrected by the Father three days later, and now sits on the right hand of God? Do we agree that salvation is in Christ alone by the grace of God and that no one comes to the Father except through Him? Then let us hug our brother and call out together in unity, "LORD," even as we recognize that there are vast differences between ourselves and our flesh and blood siblings, yet we care for them. In 1888, Charles Ross wrote, "Oh! brethren, it is not until the spiritual unity of believers in Christ shall show itself strong enough to destroy the selfishness, carnality, worldliness, and indifference that feed like a canker-worm at the root of our Christianity, in all the visible sections of it—it is not until then that we may expect the world to be won to the Saviour. It is when the Spirit shall be poured out upon us from on high, as the Spirit of truth and love, taking out of the way for ever sinful differences, jealousies, and heart-burnings; producing astonishment, humiliation and shame, at past unfruitfulness and unprofitableness; drawing forth living, longing desires after a holy catholic union; and awakening deep yearnings of soul after a lost and perishing world—and all this manifesting itself in outward forms and palpable proofs—it is then, and only then, that we may expect the effect here announced to be produced; but then, it shall be produced without fail." "Let us earnestly pray that the Lord may bless his church with more unity; that he may take out of the way everything which divides her—every error which splits her up into fragments; that he may bring her to be one in the truth, one in Christ, and one in love to one another..."All this to the glory of God, the name of Christ, and to the good of a dying world—that they may know and believe upon the only name that can save them from an eternal hell--the name of Jesus!





Caramel Nut Cookies

3 chopped snickers bars
2 (16.5oz) refrigerated sugar cookie dough
Powdered sugar (optional)

Preheat oven to 375. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. In a large bowl knead chopped snickers into cookie dough. Roll dough into small balls. Place 1 inch apart on baking sheet. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes or until light brown. Cool on a wire rack. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Squash Fritters

1 lb yellow summer squash
1/2 medium sweet onion
1 cup all-purpose flour
1 egg
1/2 teaspoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
vegetable oil

Wash the squash then grate them on a box grater. You should end up with about 3 cups of grated squash. Grate the onion as well. Place the grated squash and onion in a mesh strainer and press to squeeze out some of the water. Place the squash and onion in a large bowl, then add the flour, egg, sugar, and salt and mix until combined. Allow the mixture to sit for about 5 minutes. Place a large skillet over medium-high heat and add enough oil to barely cover the bottom. Once the oil is hot, carefully place dollops (about 1 heaping tablespoon) of the batter into the skillet. Cook for 3 to 4 minutes or until golden brown. Carefully flip the fritters over and gently press them flat with the back side of a spatula. Cook another 3 to 4 minutes or until golden brown. Cook in batches, adding more oil if necessary, Drain on paper towels.

Pizza Pot Pie

1 (8oz) cream cheese
1 1/2 cups shredded mozzarella

1 tsp. oregano

1/2 lb sauage

1 cup sliced mushrooms

1 diced green bell pepper

1 (14.5oz) diced tomatoes, drained

1/4 cup sliced black olives

2 refrigerated pie crusts

1 beaten egg

1/2 tsp oregano

8 to 10 pepperoni slices

Preheat oven to 425. In a large bowl stir together cream cheese and shredded mozzarella. In a skillet cook sausage over medium heat until almost cooked through. Add mushrooms and green pepper and cook while stirring, about 5 minutes. Drain and stir sausage into cream cheese mixture. Fold in diced tomatoes (drained) and black olives. Press 1 of the pie crusts into the bottom of a 9 inch pie plate and fill with mixture. Top with the other pie crust and press edges to seal. Cut slits in center of top pie crust. Brush with 1 beaten egg. Sprinkle with 1/2 tsp oregano and top with pepperoni. Bake 25 to 30 minutes. Let cool for 15 minutes before slicing.

Pineapple Pretzel Salad

For the topping:

1 C coarsely chopped pretzels 1/3 C sugar

½ C butter, melted

For the salad:

8 oz cream cheese, at room temperature

½ C sugar

8 oz Cool Whip

20 oz can pineapple tidbits, drained

For the topping: Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Mix melted butter and sugar together. Stir in pretzels. Spread in a 9 x 13 pan and bake for 7 minutes. Stir to break it up and cool completely.

For the salad: Cream together the cream cheese and sugar until well mixed. Stir the Cool-Whip and pineapple tidbits into the cream cheese mixture. Chill 2-3 hours. Add pretzel mixture right before serving.

The guys that had invited them were really cool and although they seemed a little arrogant, they were nice. Aaron was concerned. His sister was a people pleaser and while sometimes that worked to his advantage, this was one of those times that it concerned him. He knew of the guys that she was talking about. 




