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


And David said, What have I now done? Is there not a cause? 1 Samuel 17:29

III. V. 4 THERE IS A SONG THEY CANNOT EXPRESS

Psalm 137:4 - How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?

The reason why the song that they once could sing was stuck in their throat is because they were in a foreign land. Only those who are free can sing. Only those who have been delivered from bondage can sing. David said in Psalm 32:7 - Thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble; thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. Selah. The songs of God are songs of deliverance. Do you know where the first song in the Bible is found? It is found in the fifteenth chapter of Exodus. It is called the Song of Moses. The occasion was the crossing of the Red Sea. These people had been in bondage in Egypt for over 400 years. Egypt is a picture of sin. But when these people had been freed from Egypt, when they had been redeemed from their sin, they sang. Now there's only one thing that can rob a saint of his song. You would think that sorrow could do it. But sorrow cannot rob you of your song. Even when night is at its darkest God puts a song in your heart. The Bible says in Isaiah 30:29 - Ye shall have a song, as in the night when a holy solemnity is kept; and gladness of heart, as when one goeth with a pipe to come into the mountain of the Lord, to the mighty One of Israel. Someone else may say suffering can rob you. But no, suffering cannot rob a saint of his song. Paul and Silas were in jail, having been beaten. They were tired, they were hungry, facing death. And yet the Bible says they sang such a song that it brought the house down. No, the only thing that can rob a saint of his song is S-I-N. And there's only one kind of sin that can rob you of your song and that is your sin. Now when you're a backslidden believer in Babylon, there's only one thing to do. That is to take down your harp and to tune up your heart. You see, singing is not a matter of physical freedom, it is a matter of spiritual force. Did you know one of the marks of being filled with the Holy Spirit is that there will be a song in your heart? Paul said in Ephesians 5:18, "Be filled with the Spirit". But he went on to say "speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord." (verse 19). There is nothing that will put a song in your heart, a smile on your face or a bounce to your step like knowing you're clean before the Lord. That every sin is confessed and every sin is forgiven. (III. A.J. Gordon was a great preacher who lived many years ago. He was out taking a walk one afternoon and he saw a dirty faced, barefoot little boy carrying a rusty bird cage. In that bird cage was some sparrows. Gordon, who was a nature lover, stopped that little boy and said, "Where did you get those birds?" He said, "I trapped them." He said, "What are going to do with them?" He said, "I don't know, I'm going to play with them." Gordon said, "Well then what are you going to do with them?" He said, "I guess I'm going to kill them." Gordon said, "Well would you like to sell them?" Little ol' boy said, "Mister, you don't want these birds. They ain't no good to you or anybody. They're just little field sparrows." Mr. Gordon said, "I know what they are. I just asked you if you wanted to sell them." Little boy said, "Well, what would you give me for them?" Gordon said, "I will give you \$2." Little boy said, "Mister, are you crazy or something?" He said, "No, I mean it. I will give you \$2." He said, "Mister, for \$2 you can not only have the birds, you can have the cage." Mr. Gordon said, "Thank you, son, thank you." And that great pastor, A.J. Gordon, took that bird cage full of frightened birds, waited until that little fellow left. He then walked into an alley where no one could see him and he opened the door on that rusty cage where those frightened birds were, he knocked on the bottom of that cage, and Gordon said that one by one those little birds came to the perch of that rusty cage that was opened, spread those little wings and flew away. Gordon said he watched those birds circling higher and higher in the sky. That all of a sudden one by one they began to chirp and they began to sing. And A.J. Gordon said it was almost as if he could hear them sing just one song "Redeemed, Redeemed, Redeemed".) That's what every child of God should be able to sing at any moment. I am redeemed, I'm right, I am clean before the Lord. There is nothing in the Word of God that says a backslidden Christian has to remain that way. You may be backslidden, but you don't have to live that way and you certainly don't have to die that way. Jesus gave his blood, not just to save you from the penalty of sin. Not even one day to save you from the presence of sin. But even now to save you from the power of sin. Take down your harp, tune up your heart and let Jesus put a song back in your soul. Maybe you are saying within yourself, "Things just aren't like they used to be! I don't get anything out of church any longer. It seems as though the things of God are not as exciting as they used to be. I just don't have any joy." If that is you, there is hope at the feet of the Savior. Come to Him today if you have never been saved. Come home if you have wandered away from Him. Either way, He will receive and restore you!

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Be All That You Can Be

BE ALL THAT YOU CAN BE! Turns out that the United States Army and transhumanists have the same slogan. Whether melding man and technology or genes are manipulated to create "super-soldiers," knock out cancer, or enhance other desirable traits within a person, we had better be a thinking, praying, and discerning people. Technocracy covers an extremely wide area of topics and subtopics; each of which demands deep ethical consideration and, for the Christian, thinking within Biblical parameters to the glory of God and to the meeting of man's deepest need - salvation. Transhumanism, the blending of man and machine, and its incompatibility with Christianity's theological precepts is my focus here.

Technology, including that specifically related to transhumanism, is promoted as a matter of convenience and often accompanied by false promises of freedom. While there's no denying that technological advances have often brought convenience and ease to our lives, it's also true that with these conveniences we've given up an element of control which translates into a loss of freedom. We need to think Biblically and critically, realizing that if these new technologies are put into the wrong hands a technological fence is put around us to control us; thereby stifling the ability to be all that we can, and all that God intends us to, be.

I am not against technology; but I do take issue with it when it runs contrary to God's plan or is designed to draw men away from their need for God, salvation, sanctification, or keeps us from following the command to "set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth." When we better understand the tenets and goals of transhumanism (and those of Christianity), we'll realize that while one can be a Christian and secondarily a technophile, one cannot be a Christian transhumanist anymore than we can be a Christian Muslim, Christian Buddhist, or a Christian witch. This will sound like science fiction; yet much of it is already here on some level and readily desired and accepted by the masses thanks to the propaganda put out by Hollywood. When one considers that man was created in the image of God – that we are image-bearers of our Creator - one is flabbergasted at the hubris of the transhumanists. Being evolutionists, they have a sense of duty to use science and technology to transcend the so called limitations of the human existence, speeding up the process and recreating mankind into the image that they think it needs to be. **Indeed, one can become as God, increase one's knowledge, and find "eternal life" here on earth.** Sounds a lot like the serpent's false promises to Eve in the garden, doesn't it?

Lest you think I'm making this up, gubernatorial and presidential candidate, Zoltan Istvan, is a transhumanist who wrote in the Huffington Post (2016): "We must force our evolution in the present day via our reasoning, inventiveness, and especially our scientific technology. In short, we must embrace transhumanism—the radical field of science that aims to turn humans into, for lack of a better word, gods." He continues, "Obviously, the human body is a mediocre vessel for our actual possibilities in this material universe. Our biology severely limits us. As a species we are far from finished and therefore unacceptable. The transhumanist believes we should immediately work to improve ourselves via enhancing the human body and eliminating its weak points. This means ridding ourselves of flesh and bones, and upgrading to new cybernetic tissues, alloys, and other synthetic materials, including ones that make us cyborg-like and robotic. It also means further merging the human brain with the microchip and the impending digital frontier. Biology is for beasts, not future transhumanists."

Whether inserting chips, injecting nanobots, or using CRISPR technology to edit/manipulate DNA sequences, transhumanism attempts to remove God from the equation, focusing on the materialistic. In trying to circumnavigate God, man attempts, by his own strength, to reverse the effects of sin, ignore the value of redemptive suffering, refuse the need for divine forgiveness, and attain eternal life without humbling himself to the atoning work of Christ upon the cross. Christians must recognize the futility of such actions. Whether we live 50, 100, or 1,000+ years we will still stand before God and give an account of our lives. Even if one could "live forever" on this earth through "digital immortality" (uploading one's mind into computer programs) or cryogenics, this earth will one day pass away and each must still give an account of what they have done with their soul.

Christians are not meant to be carried away on wings of ease or so focused on their own physical longevity/health to the ignorance of those still bound by the chains of sin. The goal of transhumanism is to make us more than human and modify our behavior; yet Christ died for those who are human. I close with Wesley J. Smith's words in <u>First Things Magazine</u>; "First principles matter, and those of transhumanism and Christianity could not be more contradictory. Transhumanism is materialistic. Christianity is theistic. Transhumanism is utopian. Christianity sees the fallen world realistically. Transhumanism perceives immortality as something that can be achieved by men. Christianity identifies eternal salvation as the mercy of a loving God. Its eschatology focuses on God's promises, not upon advanced scientific applications."

And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God. 1 Corinthians 2:4-5

Most people have never heard of "Auntie Cooke", but I guarantee you that you'll get to know her in glory! She arrived in Chicago in 1868 as a perfect stranger, but she immediately became involved in D.L. Moody's church when he was just thirty-one years old. She described him years later, as a 'diamond in the rough', and some-one who needed the divine unction and power. During a camp meeting in 1871, she felt an intense burden to pray for Moody. So, along with her friend, Miss Hawxhurst, Auntie Cooke began praying for him that he'd be filled with the anointing power of the Holy Spirit. While Moody was unsure of this need, nevertheless, he asked the two ladies to meet with him every Friday afternoon and they began to earnestly pray. Moody's hunger increased for the power of the Spirit and the Friday before the Great Chicago Fire, Ms. Cooke testified, "Mr. Moody's agony was so great that he rolled on the floor and in the midst of many tears and groans cried to God to be baptized with the Holy Ghost and fire."

It was shortly thereafter that Moody went to New York to raise funds for the rebuilding of the church that was destroyed in the fire. While walking down Wall Street in New York, Moody was hit with power! In fact, Moody recalled how he cried, "Hold, Lord, it is enough!" Throughout his life, he reluctantly talked about that experience, but Moody testified how this was the turning point in his ministry. Moody stated, "I went to preaching again, the sermons were not different; I did not present any new truths, and yet hundreds were converted. I would not now be placed back where I was before that blessed experience if you should give me all the world."

The lasting legacy of D.L. Moody's ministry was connected to two ladies that you'll never read stories about (except maybe, here) -- but whose own, lasting legacy is counted in glory! 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I Know Whom I Have Believed



One of the favorite hymns, "I Know Whom I Have Believed" was written by Daniel Whittle who had enlisted in the 72nd Illinois infantry during the Civil War and headed into the bloodiest conflict in America's history. He was badly wounded in the Battle of Vicksburg and then taken prisoner.

He tells of his conversion experience: "We had many engagements, and I saw many sad sights, and in one of the battles I was knocked out, and that night my

arm was amputated above the elbow. As I grew better, having a desire for something to read, I felt in my haversack, which I had been allowed to keep, and found the little Testament my mother had placed there. "I read right through the book—Matthew, Mark, Luke, to Revelation. Every part was interesting to me; and I found to my surprise that I could understand it in a way that I never had before. When I had finished Revelation, I began at Matthew, and read it through again. And so for days I continued reading, and with continued interest; and still with no thought of becoming a Christian, I saw clearly from what I read the way of salvation through Christ.

"While in this state of mind, yet still with no purpose or plan to repent and accept the Saviour, I was awakened one midnight by the nurse, who said: 'There is a boy in the other end of the ward, one of your men, who is dying. He has been begging me for the past hour to pray for him, or to get someone to pray for him, and I can't stand it. I am a wicked man, and can't pray, and I have come to get you.'

"Why,' said I, 'I can't pray. I never prayed in my life. I am just as wicked as you are.' 'Can't pray!' said the nurse; 'why, I thought sure from seeing you read the Testament that you were a praying man. And you are the only man in the ward that I have not heard curse. What shall I do? There is no one else for me to go to. I can't go back there alone. Won't you get up and come and see him at any rate?' "Moved by his appeal, I arose from my cot, and went with him to the far corner of the room. A fair-haired boy of seventeen or eighteen lay there dying. There was a look of intense agony upon his face, as he fastened his eyes upon me and said:

"Oh, pray for me! Pray for me! I am dying. I was a good boy at home in Maine. My mother and father are members of the Church, and I went to Sunday School and tried to be a good boy. But since I became a soldier I have learned to be wicked. I drank, and swore, and gambled, and went with bad men. And now I am dying, and I am not fit to die! Oh, ask God to forgive me! Pray for me. Ask Christ to save me!' "As I stood there and heard these pleadings, God said to my soul by His Spirit, just as plainly as if He had spoken in audible tones, 'You know the way of salvation. Get right down on your knees and accept Christ, and pray for this boy.'

"I dropped upon my knees and held the boy's hand in mine, as in a few broken words I confessed my sins, and asked God for Christ's sake to forgive me. I believed right there that He did forgive me, and that I was Christ's child; I then prayed earnestly for the boy. He became quiet, and pressed my hand as I pleaded the promises. When I arose from my knees he was dead. A look of peace was upon his face, and I can but believe that God, who used him to bring me to my Saviour, used me to get his attention fixed upon Christ and to lead him to trust in His precious blood. I hope to meet him in Heaven." Years later Whittle penned the words to "I Know Whom I have Believed" as an expression of his testimony of faith in Jesus Christ.
