A Word to the Wise – Communism: A Path to Avoid

“My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not.” Proverbs 1:10

Solomon, with great concern for the young, points to the fear of the Lord as something we cling to, so that we might garner wisdom and knowledge. Now, he warns the young to avoid the enticement and snares of the sinner. Bad company leads to bad results. How fitting that in our nation today, the young seem so taken with Communism. It gives empty promises of fulfillment; when the rain comes, those promises vanish like cotton candy – that’s vanity.

While the verses in Proverbs 1:10-19 are not specifically about Communism, they give a fair description of what Communism is and for what it stands. Communism is like other anti-Christ systems, simply meaning it stands against and attacks Christ and His divine Body, the Church. It’s a system that “lurks privily for the innocent,” inventing a cause. They promise substance but only those in charge get the benefit. They promise “one purse,” but they alone hold the strings. Solomon warns us with wisdom to not join them, to keep our feet out of their path because “their feet run to evil, and make haste to shed blood.” Dear Reader, it is the blood of the ordinary man, particularly the blood of the Christian that they desire to shed. Never forget the vast evil that is in sin. Take the Word of God to heart, apply it to your life, and rest in its eternal safety.

David Adeney, author and missionary to China, warns, “It would be a great mistake to regard Communism merely as a political system. Communism is not only a religion, but it is also a dynamic missionary movement aspiring to the conquest of the whole world... Communism attempts to provide a substitute not only for Christian doctrine and experience but also for many of the methods and activities used in the church. Indeed, Communists have often adapted Christian methods and have proved themselves to be more thorough and efficient in using them than the Christians from whom they were borrowed.”

Communism tried has only led to national devastation and Christian persecution; it has never been successful anywhere. Andrew Gih is the author of the book *The Church Behind the Bamboo Curtain*. Asia Harvest wrote the following in their November 2021 newsletter: With a form of Communism rising in many Western nations today, Christians would do well to take heed of Andrew Gih’s warnings. He wrote the following observations and comparison between Communism and Christianity:

“Since they have to maintain large standing armies, concentration camps are a necessity—politically to silence the opposition by taking people away after midnight, sending them to concentration camps, so their families do not hear from them. They arrest so many that they instill fear into the minds of the people, so there is no opposition or rebellion. “Communist countries are not for commerce or trade. Their aim is always political.... Communism is against human nature. It cannot stay in power except by brute force. So, in Communist countries the people not only have no freedom, but they constantly live in fear.” The following comparison is also given. Church, do not be deceived; take heed; watch and pray!

COMMUNISM vs CHRISTIANITY—A COMPARISON

Communism is materialistic; Christianity is spiritual. Communism is godless; Christianity is God-centered.

Communism is God-hating; Christianity is God-loving. Communism is God-defying and blasphemous; Christianity is God-honoring. Communism divides people into classes. Christianity unites people in Christ. Communism pulls down the higher classes; Christianity lifts up the lower classes. Communism spreads hatred and strife; Christianity spreads love and peace. Communism aims for a classless society; Christianity says, ‘Thy kingdom come.’ Communism sheds blood for revolution; Christ shed His Blood for salvation.

Think of our beginning verse, why would sinners entice thee? Because they have no desire to go to hell alone (Rom. 1:32). May each of us have an even stronger compelling not go to heaven alone. Convert them with the strength of the Law and the grace of the Gospel. Remind them that one day they will stand before the Judge of all the earth, giving an answer for what they’ve done in this life.



Where Are You Rooted?

“Rooted and built up in him, and stablished in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving. Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ.” Col. 2:7-8

The soil a plant is rooted in determines the stability of the roots and the quality of fruit that it produces. Environment certainly plays a role, but the richness of the soil and the tender care of the gardener regarding those roots are major determining factors. The same is true for how we raise our children and, more importantly, where we root ourselves. Where are you rooted; from where are you getting your nutrition and stability?

Paul gives us three possibilities: rooted in Jesus Christ, rooted in the church (“...traditions of men”), or rooted in the world. Paul encourages the church of Colossae, and us, to be rooted and built up – established – in Jesus. He then explains why. Christians should know better than to be rooted in the world; yet many are unconsciously and synergistically trying to root themselves in both, corrupting their roots. The greater warning is to not be rooted in the church, as opposed to being rooted in Christ – the warning is that although they ought to be the same, they are not the same thing. As we’ve watch churches go astray from the Word of God, faster and farther recently, we’ve watched congregations full of good people follow the church as it leaves the safety, shelter, and truth of Scripture. Such are leaving Christ. If you are rooted in Christ, you will go wherever He goes; if you are rooted in the church, you will go wherever it goes. If you are rooted in Jesus but the church, for whatever reason, follows the world or departs from the Gospel, you will stay with Jesus while the church follows a path to destruction. If you are rooted in the church and it departs from Christ, you will also, unwittingly and without discernment, follow the church’s departure from its Sacred Head. You will be spoiled, taken like captured treasure.

Do you think that’s too harsh a statement? An unnecessary warning? Can I remind you that Jesus’ final words to the church were repent, as He warned various churches in Revelation? One had lost their first love; another mixed worldly doctrine with Christ’s holy doctrine, thereby becoming impure; yet another, having no discernment for the things of God, believed they were rich and healthy when Christ warned that they were poor and sick. These name only a few, but the simple fact is that there were those who were rooted in the church while believing they were rooted in Christ. Jesus is saying to them, BEWARE! REPENT! There is a sickness in you; turn away from the wrong and turn back to me! Be rooted and built up IN ME!

I am NOT saying there was nothing good in those, or our, churches; Jesus also pointed out that there was good in them. BUT HE GAVE A WARNING to those churches that their wrong would be their ruin; they MUST repent or be lost. We’ve watched our culture grow to hate the Word of God and those who hold it as their standard. We’ve watched the church chase after the culture, moving away from its rooting in Jesus, in order to be seen as relevant, to be seen as knowledgeable or wise, or to be seen as loving or kind. Whatever the reason, as it leaves its first love of Christ and His Word, we’ve begun to see the unfaithful church attack those who remain faithful to the Word. In such circumstances we must hold fast to our faith; we must be rooted steadfastly in Christ.

Even if every church in our nation were to move with the LGBTQ+ crowd, we must stay rooted in Christ. No matter how many churches and Christians proclaim that abortion or euthanasia are loving solutions, we must stand firm in Christ. When majorities of denominations or individual Christians cling to communistic principles that deny God’s goodness, abilities, truths, and even existence, we must remain steadfast, crying out that we have no king but Jesus; we have no sovereign but God; and there is no truth but the Scriptures given to us by His Spirit. When all the world denies that God is the Creator and that He made man perfect; when they say that artificial intelligence is the wave of the future and that we must combine with it for the next phase of evolution or become subservient nothings, we must cling to Christ, trust His Word, hold on to our humanity, and depend on God’s perfect timing and will. All of this to say, we must be rooted in Christ; He alone is the unshifting sand of time and eternity. He alone is stable and stabilizing. The world will fall away; the church may fall away; but Christ and His Word are sure. He is our anchor, our defense, our salvation from everlasting to everlasting – we MUST be rooted IN HIM!



Reesie's Recipes

Baked Spaghetti

- 1 lb of ground beef
- 1 jar of spaghetti sauce
- 8 oz of cream cheese
- ¼ cup sour cream
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- ½ cup butter (1 stick)
- 1 pkg spaghetti 16 oz
- Shredded cheddar cheese
- Shredded mozzarella cheese

Preheat your oven to 350°. Boil your spaghetti noodles until al dente (firm). Drain and set aside until ready to assemble. Combine the cream cheese, sour cream and cottage cheese until well blended. Brown your hamburger and when done, drain well. Combine the hamburger with your spaghetti sauce. Put a few slices of butter into a 9x13 pan then pour half of your spaghetti noodles on top. Take your cream cheese mixture and pour on top of the noodles. Spread well over noodles. Pour the rest of the noodles on top of the cream cheese mixture. Put a few more slices of butter on top of the noodles. Pour your spaghetti and meat sauce on top of your noodles. Bake in the oven for 30 minutes. After 30 minutes, pour the desired amount of shredded cheese on top and return to the oven for 15 minutes to allow cheese to melt.

No Bake Oreo Cake

- 1 (15 oz.) package Oreos, crushed
- 6 T. butter, melted
- 1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 c. confectioners' sugar
- 1 large (5.1 oz.) box instant chocolate pudding* + milk to prepare, as specified on the pudding package
- 1 large (16 oz.) container Cool Whip

Set aside about 1/4 cup crushed Oreos. Mix remaining crushed Oreos with the melted butter. Press into the bottom of a 9x13" pan. Combine cream cheese and confectioners' sugar; mix well. Fold in 1/2 of the Cool Whip until well combined. Spread the cream cheese mixture over the crushed Oreo layer. Chill for 20 minutes. Prepare chocolate pudding according to package directions. Spread over cream cheese layer. Chill for 20 minutes. Spread remaining Cool Whip over the pudding layer. Sprinkle reserved crushed Oreos on top. Chill for 8 hours or overnight before serving.

Baked Macaroni and Cheese

- 1 (12 ounce) package macaroni
- 2 cups milk
- 1 egg
- 2 ½ cups shredded Cheddar cheese
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- salt and pepper to taste

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 2-quart baking dish. Boil macaroni in a large pot of salted water until barely done, about 5 minutes. Drain and set aside. Whisk together milk and egg in a large bowl. Stir in cheese and butter. Place par-boiled macaroni in the prepared baking dish. Pour milk mixture over macaroni, season with salt and pepper, and stir until combined. Press mixture evenly into the baking dish. Bake, uncovered, in the preheated oven until top is browned, 30 to 40 minutes.

The Precious Blood Of Jesus

Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot: 1 Peter 1:18-19

In First Peter the blood of Christ is called precious. The word precious means "valuable". In the Old Testament the blood of animals was used to atone for the sins of the people. Therefore the blood of a sheep or goat in an offering was of less value than the blood of an ox.

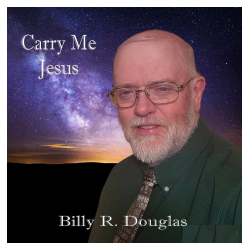

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: Matthew 6:1 Take heed that ye do not your alms before men, to be seen of them: otherwise ye have no reward of your Father which is in heaven.

Additional Passages for Today: Mark 12:43-44; 1 John 3:17-19; John 7:16-18; Matt. 6:5; Matt. 23:5

Thought for Today: Doing the right thing for the wrong reason doesn't make things right. When we do good things to make ourselves look good, God says that is all the reward we will receive.

Story for Today: Cammy picked out her favorite doll and lovingly wrapped her in the prettiest blanket she could find. Today this gift was going to church with her. Ms. Less had reminded the class that they would be packing boxes to send overseas to the missionary families after class today. Roxey had bragged that she would be bringing lots of toys and other things to fill the boxes. When Ms. Less first mentioned the project it seemed like everyone in the class was excited to participate. Suggestions were made of items that would be helpful and items that would not be able to be sent. Several of the kids had brought in little items each week and put them in the box. But this was the last week and everyone that brought their gift today would be part of the parade at church. They would march to the front of the church and deposit the items in the boxes in front of the altar. Everyone would see them. Roxey hadn't brought in the promised items yet and Cammy guessed it was because she was saving them all for today. Bringing in her best doll would show Roxey. She may not have lots of toys and things but her doll was the best doll she had ever known. Cammy couldn't wait to march up the aisle to put her gift in the box. Danielle was so excited; every week she had found a little something that she thought someone her age would like. She had brought in coloring books, crayons, and a couple of books that had great lessons that she had enjoyed reading. Her mom had helped her make some doll clothes and a couple of sun dresses too. Today she had the last of her gifts and while it wasn't much, she hoped someone would appreciate it. Today she was bringing in a couple of matchbox cars. Her dad had said he liked to play with them when he was little. When she got to the classroom Ms. Less was just carrying the empty boxes up the stairs to the sanctuary. Danielle quickly put her donation in the already full box and began helping Ms. Less. When it was time for the kids to line up for the parade, Ms. Less explained that those who hadn't already put their items in the box would be able to do so in front of everyone. Roxey and Cammy rushed to the front of the line. Roxey had a bag with several items and Cammy clutched her precious doll close as she thought about how everyone would see what a great gift she was giving. The congregation was singing a song as the procession made its way to the front of the church. Many of the parents looked on with pride at the youngsters placing items in the box. Some of the kids didn't have a gift, so they just walked by the boxes as the line moved along. After the last person put their gift in the box, the congregation began to clap their hands as they showed appreciation for all the gifts that were collected that day. Questions for Today: When you give, do you make sure someone knows? Do you give to meet the expectations of others or do you give to please God? Do you feel empty after the gift has been given? If so, maybe you need to reevaluate why you are giving.
