THE STORY BEHIND THE SONG

The Doxology – Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow

Though there are many doxologies, the one most well-known and most often sung is Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. I was surprised to learn that this hymn actually has thirteen verses which proceed the ever-popular final four-lined stanza:

Praise God from whom all blessings flow,

Praise Him all creatures here below;

Praise Him above, ye angelic host (now sung: heavenly host),

Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

Thomas Ken, the chaplain at Winchester College, wrote a book in 1667 for his boys entitled, Manual of Prayers. In it he exhorted the boys to "Be sure and sing early in the morning and in the night season." By 1674, the boys were not following Chaplain Ken's admonition. So he wrote and inserted three hymns into his manual to give the boys something to sing: The "Morning Hymn," the "Evening Hymn," and, for those who awoke during the night, the "Midnight Hymn." Each of these hymns directed the student's mind to their Heavenly Father and each closed with the "Praise God from whom all blessings flow" stanza.

King Charles II made Mr. Ken his chaplain in 1679 and later promoted him to bishop. But Charles' successor, James II, sent Bishop Ken to the Tower (a prison). He was acquitted and Queen Anne offered Ken his old job, but Ken chose to move to the seclusion of the country, where he lived out his last days in poverty.

At his death in 1711, at age seventy-four, he owned nothing more than an old horse and an old lute. He had requested that at his burial the six poorest men in the parish carry his body to the grave. That was done and as the sun rose, his friends lowered the casket and sang:

Praise God from whom all blessings flow,

Praise Him all creatures here below;


Praise Him above, ye angelic host,

Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.



It's later than you think my friend there's no time for us to doubt.


Oh it's later than you think my child the night is drawing nigh.

A Word to the Wise: America Needs Wise Leaders - Prov. 8:12-36

"By me kings reign, and princes decree justice. By me princes rule, and nobles, even all the judges of the earth."

Proverbs 8:15-16

Wisdom and Prudence are housemates; they are inseparable companions (v 12). Prudence is Wisdom applied to practice. While Wisdom is exercised in executing that which is good, Prudence "is exercised more in foreseeing and avoiding evil...It is sometimes mere caution or circumspection" (Webster Dictionary 1828). What an amazing combination, reminiscent of Jesus' call to be "wise as serpents and harmless as doves" (Matt. 10:16). It's no wonder Matthew Henry declared, "Divine wisdom gives men good heads," when writing on this verse.

Regarding verse 13's description of what "the fear of the Lord" is, he said that Divine wisdom "gives men good hearts." Wisdom desires to work out a heart of holiness within the believer, making us holy in all our actions, as our God is holy (I Pet. 1: 15). In becoming more like Jesus, we will hate that which He hates and love that which He loves. We will hate all evil, particularly the sin of pride which gives birth to many – if not all – sins.

The next several verses speak to the importance of all those in authority operating by the character of Divine wisdom. It gives sound counsel by which leaders may rule wisely and justly. If I could follow Mr. Henry's lead, I would say that Divine wisdom gives men good discernment. Such discernment is needed for both those who have been given rule (authority) and for those who must sit peaceably under that rule. Government was instituted by God and it is good; we've been blessed with self-governance, church governance, civil and federal governance. Matthew Henry once again hits the nail on the head: "Religion is very much the strength and support of the civil government; it teaches subjects their duty, and so by it kings reign over them the more easily; it teaches kings their duty, and so by it kings reign as they ought; they decree justice, while they rule in the fear of God. Those rule well whom religion rules."

Those who rule outside the bounds of godliness will often wrongly blame the righteous for the woes of both that ruler and their nation. Yet, truthfully, one could answer like Elijah to Ahab: "I have not troubled Israel; but thou, and thy father's house, in that ye have forsaken the commandments of the LORD, and thou hast followed Baalim." There are many in authority today who sit in our three branches of federal government and occupy positions of authority in state and local governments today who have troubled the United States in that they have forsaken the commandments of the LORD, both personally and in their "ruling." May we pray for God to save them, sanctify them, and bring them into His service – or remove them.

Divine wisdom was with God at creation; it's evident that she was there at America's founding as well. As we followed God's Word and God's Way nationally, the truth of verses 20-21 were apparent: "I lead in the way of right-eousness, in the midst of the paths of judgment: That I may cause those that love me to inherit substance; and I will fill their treasures." As we nationally have turned our back on God's Word and our leaders reject His way, we've traded substance for vanity, treasures for poverty, Truth for deception, and sanity for "confusion of face" (Dan. 9).

Let us seek and love Wisdom, for we surely need her again today – recreating our land and reviving us by the Wisdom of God's Word. Let God's people be full of repentance and faith, consecrating our lives to His service fully. O Lord, we NEED You! (Please read 2 Chronicles 7:14 and 1 Peter 5:6-8)

Love, seek, and live with Wisdom. Regardless the path of our nation, pray that the Holy Ghost will teach you Wisdom's warning and blessing: "Blessed is the man that heareth me, watching daily at my gates, waiting at the posts of my doors. For whoso findeth me findeth life, and shall obtain favour of the LORD. But he that sinneth against me wrongeth his own soul: all they that hate me love death." Proverbs 8:34-36

O Lord, make us wise unto You, discerning against evil, and full of charity to our fellowman. Teach us to love You with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. Create in us a holiness of heart and life that can only come from You, for in these things Wisdom is worked out in our lives. In Jesus' name, Amen.



Do you have a burden to pray?

Old Testament prophets had a burden from the Lord. We carry a burden until we get it to its destination – for the prophets, that meant delivering God's message to the people. There's only one place to deliver a burden of prayer; we must take that heaviness of heart to the throne of grace for help in time of trouble, depositing it at God's feet and touching the heart of God for His answer. A burden of prayer is given to us from God, we carry it back to God, and, by His grace, He deals mercifully and bountifully with us. Do you have a burden to pray?

Prayer is a duty. Jesus expects us to pray. In Matthew 6:5-7, we read the phrase "When thou prayest" three times. He doesn't say, "If you pray," but WHEN you pray. The early church had much power – they were intensely prayerful, passionate, and persecuted. When persecuted, it drove them to prayer. It's their prayers of faith which produced their passion. Our nation and the church are in desperate need of prayer – let us be a fervently praying people daily.

Prayer should be our first response, not an afterthought. Nehemiah well-demonstrates that for us (Neh. 1:1-4; 2:1-4). Unable to fix the problem ourselves, we throw up our hands in resignation saying, "All I can do is pray!" Reader, prayer is not merely all you can do; it needs to be your first go to! Instead of a last response, it should be our first thought! Instead of worrying or complaining about things first, our natural response should be to automatically pray first. I've come a long way in this regard, but I still have a long, long way to go.

Prayer is the best form of activism; it sets the foundation for any other activism we may feel led to do. However, that does not negate our responsibility to do more than pray. In the words of Jeremy Taylor, "Whatever we beg of God, let us also work for it." God is sovereign but man has a responsibility to act as well. The Bible is replete with examples of this truth.

Pray diligently for those in authority. Paul exhorts us in 1 Tim. 2:1-6 to pray for all those in authority. We often think of those who are elected, but generally only those at the highest levels of authority like the president, Congress, Supreme Court, and maybe state governors. But I urge you to not forget local authorities: mayor, city council, library board, school board, etc. Other authorities we sometimes forget are those who are self-appointed authorities – those who have power due to their riches or being appointed to positions of authority, including: George Soros, Bill Gates, Claus Schwab, etc. Can you imagine what might happen if these men became Christians? How might our world be changed if groups of saints gathered together to regularly, fervently pray for such men of wealth, power, and influence?

Power for our prayers: Of course, we must have faith and believe that God is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him (Heb. 11:6). We also must have humble hearts of repentance, turning away from anything the Holy Spirit reveals to us. It could be a form of unrealized pride, interfamily dynamics – particularly husbands (1 Peter 3:7), or some besetting sin we hold dear – Psalms 66:18 "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me:" Is it any wonder that David, a man who petitioned God regularly, cries out to God that the Lord would teach him God's law, statutes, and testimonies so that David might live them out and that he might teach them to others? He desired God to hear his personal prayers as well as the nation's corporate prayers.

If we feel no burden to pray, perhaps that should be our first prayer — "Lord, give me a burden to storm the gates of Heaven; give me a burden to come boldly before your throne of grace, for we certainly are a people who are in a time of trouble." If not a burden, do we at least feel a desire to pray and commune with our Heavenly Father? The Apostle Paul calls us to pray without ceasing. Others have likened prayer for the Christian's spiritual well-being as to our bodies' need to breathe. I may not feel a burden to breath because it's a natural automatic function, but if something keeps me from breathing, it won't be long before I feel a burden to breathe again. Anything alive must breathe; what's the condition of a soul which feels no compulsion to pray? Prayer is ALL we can do. It needs to be our first action.

Finally, share your specific burden of prayer with others. If the Lord is leading you to pray specifically, be obedient and put some feelers out for others who may share that same burden. Regardless of what our burden for prayer is – revival, the church, national repentance, those in authority, or whatever it is – pray, carry your burden to the throne of grace, and, by faith, expect results all to the glory of God!

Strawberry Pie

1 frozen pie crust

1 1/4 cup sugar

3 tbsp cornstarch

1 1/4 cups water

3 tbsp strawberry jelly

2 cups strawberries, sliced

Bake frozen pie crust according to the directions on the package. Remove from oven and allow to cool for 30 minutes. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan over medium heat, whisk together sugar, cornstarch and water. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 5 or so minutes, until thickened. Whisk in strawberry jelly. Remove from heat and set aside to cool. Add strawberries to the cooled pie crust, then pour over strawberry jelly mixture. Refrigerate for a few hours until set.

Butterfinger Dessert

6 (2 1/8 ounce) butterfinger candy bars, crushed
1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese
1 (12 ounce) carton Cool Whip
1 graham cracker crust

Mix first three ingredients together.

Put it in pie crust. Chill

Red Cactus Meatloaf

2 eggs

2 lbs ground beef
1 cup of your favorite Red Cactus salsa
1 to 2 sleeves crushed buttery round crackers
1 tsp salt (or to taste)
1 tsp ground black pepper (or to taste)

1 cup ketchup1 Tbsp. brown sugar

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Mix together ketchup and brown sugar for topping and set aside. Beat the eggs in a mixing bowl, add salt and pepper, then add the ground beef and salsa. Gently add crushed crackers until meat mixture is thick and forms well. Form loaf in a pan sprayed with cooking spray. Bake in preheated oven 45 minutes. Remove from oven and top with ketchup and brown sugar mixture. Return to oven and cook 15 minutes longer or until no longer pink in the center Or until thermometer inserted into the center reads at least 160 degrees F.



A Protected Heart

"A wise man's heart is at his right hand; but a fool's heart at his left. Yea also, when he that is a fool walketh by the way, his wisdom faileth him, and he saith to every one that he is a fool."

- Ecclesiastes 10:2-3 -

When Solomon writes that the "wise man's heart is at his right hand" the purpose is to convey to us that the wisdom and desires of the wise man are placed under protection - that they are in a place of safe-keeping that will help them make the correct decisions. This is because the ancient Israelites associated the right hand with protection - if you're right hand dominant (which 90% of our current population is) then you're going to hold your weapon (your source of protection) in your right hand. Solomon tells us that the wise man's heart is held within protection, but the fool's heart is kept unprotected. It isn't treated with care.

Not only is the foolish man careless with his heart, everyone bears witness to the fact that he is a fool. It's not hidden well - even if the fool thinks he's hiding it, his decisions betray him because his heart is left exposed. Everyone is able to tell that the fool lacks wisdom because of his actions which are put on full display for all to see.

As we live this life and walk with Christ, let us be a group of people that protects our heart within our "right hand" rather than acting carelessly, showing everyone that while we attempt to talk-the-talk, maybe we can't really walk-the-walk.

Undoing Gossip's Harm

There was a peasant with a troubled conscience who went to an old preacher for advice. He said that he had circulated a vile story about a friend, only to find out the story was not true. "If you want to make peace with your conscience," said the preacher, "you must fill a bag with chicken feathers, go to every yard in the village, and drop at each of them one fluffy feather." A Livingstone Faith

Too often we tend to look at "giants" of the faith, forgetting that they are mere men who have been transformed by God's grace, the blood of Christ, and the empowering of the Holy Ghost. That truthful description does remove them from the "mere men" category, yet we all – including them – have moments of doubt. loneliness, or a time when the flesh

momentarily presses in hard on our spirit.

Dear Reader, be encouraged that even the "great" missionary David Livingstone had moments when fear ALMOST conquered his faith. By God's grace he stood and by that same grace so can you! Here is an excerpt from his diary dated January 14, 1856:

"Felt much turmoil of spirit in prospect of having all my plans for the welfare of this great region and this teeming population knocked on the head by savages tomorrow. But I read that Jesus said, 'All power is given unto Me in Heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.' It is the word of a gentleman of the most strict and sacred honor, so there's an end to it! I will not cross furtively tonight as I intended. Should such a man as I flee? Nay, verily, I shall take observations for latitude and longitude tonight, though they may be the last. I feel quite calm now, thank God!"

Even the Apostle Paul, a great man of faith, requested prayer for himself, that he might speak boldly and as he ought. "Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints; And for me, that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel, For which I am an ambassador in bonds: that therein I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak." Ephesians 6:18-20

Share your fears, ask for prayer, and walk forward in faith, trusting God to see you through the fire or into His presence.

Verse for Today: Luke 10:42 But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. Additional Passages for today: Luke 10:38-42; 1 Timothy 4:8; Matthew 6:33; Psalm 119:30

Thought for Today: Submission to Christ in every area, all of the time, is something that cannot be taken away, no matter how much life tries to demand otherwise. If you can succeed in this, you have secured the "one thing" that is needful. As Mary listened carefully so that she could follow Jesus' instructions, so can we as we read our Bibles and listen to instructions from the Word.

Story for Today: Shandra sat transfixed as her teacher spoke with great passion. She had never heard anyone teach this way before. Mr. Adams was the favorite teacher in her school and she now understood why. The topic was much more interesting when she listened to Mr. Adams. He had a way of bringing things to life. When he finished lecturing, she, along with most of the others in the class, was always desirous to go out and put the lesson to the test. Mr. Adams finished giving them their assignment to go to the mall and people-watch just as the final bell for the day rang. He listed the several things they were to be looking for and encouraged them to take what he had taught and put it into practice. Shandra gathered up her books and headed to her locker. While she was changing out her books and packing them into her backpack, her friends Miranda and Jesse stopped and invited her to join them on a short trip to the beach. A few of their friends were planning to get together for a quick game of beach volleyball and they were hoping she could make it.
