Faith of Our Fathers

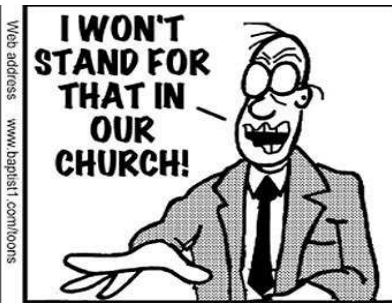
In honor of Father's Day, we will focus on the old, classic hymn Faith of Our Fathers. Although this was written by a Catholic man who originally was referring to the suffering Saints of the Catholic church, several phrases have been reworded over the years that it might be acceptable to a wide range of believers. Each of us have knowledge of groups throughout history like the Covenantors, Huguenots, and others, as well as individuals which are "famous" in our specific denominations. If one wants to become acquainted with contemporary individuals who are standing strong in the faith despite "dungeon, fire, and sword," you need look no further than Voice of the Martyrs or Open Doors. Of course, none of us need to look any further than that list of faithful men and women found in Hebrews 11 and the rest of Scripture.

Be sure to understand correctly. This hymn IS NOT idolizing or lifting up men and women of the faith; it IS pointing to the FAITH of our fathers. It's THE FAITH given to us by God which we are to diligently grow (2 Pet. 1:1-8) that is being heralded and honored. Each verse ends with a refrain repeating this theme: "Faith of our fathers, holy faith! We will be true to thee till death!"

- (1) Faith of our fathers, living still/ In spite of dungeon, fire, and sword/ O how our hearts beat high with joy/ When-e'er we hear that glorious word/ Faith of our fathers, holy faith/ We will be true to thee 'til death.
- (2) Faith of our fathers, God's great power/ Shall win all nations unto thee/ And through the truth that comes from God/ Mankind shall then indeed be free/ Faith of our fathers, holy faith/ We will be true to thee 'til death.
- (3) Faith of our fathers, we will love/ Both friend and foe in all our strife/ And preach thee too as love knows how/ By kindly words and virtuous life/ Faith of our fathers, holy faith/ We will be true to thee 'til death.

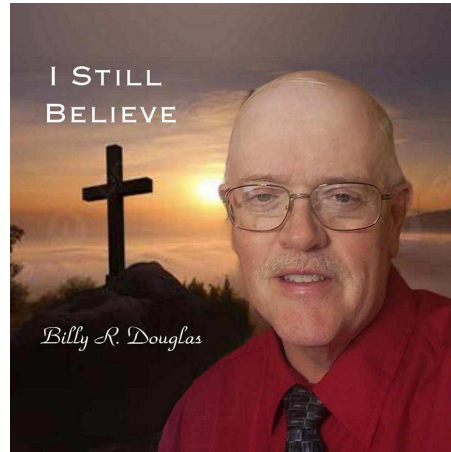
The Three Little Pigs

**Word to the Wise – Pride's Dangers - 01**

"Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall." Prov. 16:18

Pride and humility are not only frequent and expansive topics in Proverbs, but throughout the Bible as well. This month's key verse is a very well-known verse, although it's often misquoted as "Pride goeth before fall." There are many verses in holy writ that give this same warning – for example: Prov. 11:2 "When pride cometh, then cometh shame: but with the lowly is wisdom." And there are many examples of Biblical characters living out the warning of this theme regarding the dangers of pride. Let's take this opportunity to evaluate what pride can bring us to do – both in our heart and in our actions.

1. Pride can make you take credit or glory which belongs to another: I know a man who frequently takes credit for the good things and hard work that his wife does. Of course, this is nothing compared to the pride which takes credit for what God is doing or has done.

Who can forget King Nebuchadnezzar's arrogance in believing that he was responsible for the greatness of Babylon? Do you remember his prideful statement found in Daniel 4:30? "The king spake, and said, Is not this great Babylon, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of my power, and for the honour of my majesty?"

It is the heart of a beast that would steal glory from another, particularly to steal credit and glory from one's Creator God; while the words were still in the king's mouth, God made his outward appearance and inward mind to match his beastly heart. Yes, the king suffered a great fall physically and politically, but it was meant for his spiritual good. For when we come to the end of this fourth chapter, we read that King Nebuchadnezzar learned his place by learning both the rightful place of and Who the true King of Heaven was: "Now I Nebuchadnezzar praise and extol and honour the King of heaven, all whose works are truth, and his ways judgment: and those that walk in pride he is able to abase." I urge you to read the whole of this chapter.

2. Pride can make you assume another's position or steal their responsibilities – makes you too big for your britches: How often have you seen someone in a group insist that things are done their way or a task is given to another only to have someone do everything in their power to attempt that task for their very own. Such was case of King Uzziah found in 2 Chronicles 26. Uzziah was made king at age 16 and reigned for 52 years; the first 15 verses of this chapter detail the many amazing things God helped Uzziah do. Go now and read how he was a man of military might and prowess, he was a builder and fortified Jerusalem, actively knew about farming and animal husbandry, he had massive armies and knew how to provide what they needed, and invented special weapons to protect his kingdom – this was one great man UNTIL his heart was lifted up (he became proud in his own strength). It was then "he transgressed against the LORD his God, and went into the temple of the LORD to burn incense upon the altar of incense."

Now you might think that wasn't a big deal – BUT IT WAS, because it was the priests' job to burn incense before the Lord; it was NOT for the king. If you read the rest of that chapter, you'll find out that his haughty spirit caused him to be angry when the priests stopped him and his anger brought leprosy upon himself. Uzziah was cut off from the house of the Lord and had leprosy until his dying day.

Pride can cause you to do many wrong things, the greatest of which is to forget God and that He is the Giver of every good gift, skill, ability, and position. We may think that we can get away with pride, but as we've discussed over the last two months, "God calls ALL the shots." We are free to choose our actions, but we aren't free of the consequences of those actions. God has already declared that after pride comes destruction and the haughty spirit will fall. Almighty God has also declared that the humble will be lifted up. Pride can hide in the smallest of corners – we may be unaware. Ask the Holy Ghost to help us go on a search and destroy mission, putting pride in the crosshairs.

**Building a nation one family at a time**

“As goes the home, so goes the church, so goes the nation. Family worship is a most decisive factor in how the home goes.” ~ Dr. Joel R. Beeke, Chancellor, Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary

For any home to have its influence in the future history of a nation, there must be children in that home. Whether adopted, natural born, or for one to lovingly come alongside to bring another's children “under your wing,” Scripture likens these children to “arrows...in the hand of a mighty man.” (Ps. 127) These “arrows” are to be shaped into a straight and sturdy shaft, fletched well, and prayerfully shot into the future of our lineage, churches, and nation – by God's grace and for His glory!

But what happens when a society and the churches of that society largely become deceived, no longer seeing children as “an heritage of the Lord,” and put their own perceived needs and desires ahead of child-rearing for the glory of God? God's Word tells us that children are a blessing, but, for many generations now, leftists have succeeded in convincing our culture that they are a burden instead. For years, we've been warned that the West's plummeting birth rates will be devastating, particularly in light of the fact that Islamic families continue to reproduce at healthy, sustaining, and even growing birth rates. Between the left's various anti-child propaganda schemes and Marxist training in public schools, Pew Research found that 47% of Americans without children, aged 18-49, do not plan to ever have children. The top reason given by those choosing not to have children was “they just don't want to.”

Very few have heeded the warning of declining birth rates, until Elon Musk recently posted on X: “Low birth rates will end civilization.” What Musk and others have missed, but we must not is this: It's not just about giving birth to more children; it's about building healthy families. Strong families founded on Biblical principles are what shaped and stabilized Western civilization and that's what it will take, by God's grace, to pull us out of this nosedive.

We don't just need more babies; we need more men and women stepping into real fatherhood and real motherhood. That starts with boys and girls growing up, not just becoming older in age. It means becoming Christ-centered instead of remaining self-centered. May we commit to the costly work of self-sacrifice, from start to finish, in having children AND discipling them, teaching them the fear and love of the Lord.

What is this costly work? It begins with truly committing your own life to Jesus Christ and following Him with all that you are. Then it moves on to three very general things:

1. Recognize Reality – Most people around you don't think strictly Biblically; be prepared to experience opposition. Prayerfully, lovingly, painstakingly, stand your ground. Come alongside others to “reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.” Think generationally and start “fletching those arrows!”
2. Regroup and Rethink – 1) Exit Public Schools – much of the decline in fearing God and in family ideals came from Marxist ideology taught in public schools. What good is it to pull weeds and clear a field for planting if you purposefully allow weed seed to be planted with your good seed? 2) Many churches today have been infected, to some extent or another, by this same Marxist, “squishy,” ideology. Be sure to attend a Bible-believing, God honoring church. Speak with your children about the sermons, Sunday School lessons, and various issues which arise in the church. In all you decide as a family, ask: “What does the Bible say about that?”
3. Reassess and Reorient Family Life Around Christ – It's vital to be in the Word as a family and to pray as a family. Be intentional in your conversations and your choices regarding entertainment, cell phones, friendships. In all that you do ask: Can I do this to the glory of God? (1 Cor. 10:31) Can I do this in the name of the Lord Jesus? (Col. 3:17)

May we commit to the costly work of self-sacrifice, from start to finish, in having children AND discipling them, teaching them the fear and love of the Lord.

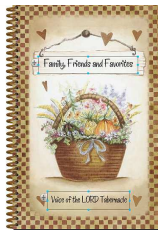
Reesie's Recipes



Pineapple Dream Cake

- 1 box Pineapple cake mix
- 1 3/4 cup milk
- 1 small box instant Vanilla pudding
- 1 (8 Oz) cream cheese, softened
- 1 small can crushed pineapple in syrup, drained
- 1/2 (8 oz) bowl cool whip

Prepare and bake cake as directed on box. Remove from oven and let cool. In a large mixing bowl mix milk and pudding until well blended. Beat in cream cheese. Gently stir in well drained pineapples. Fold in 1/2 of the bowl of cool whip. Spread over cake and refrigerate.

American Potato Salad

- 5 lb. red potatoes
- 6 eggs
- 2 cups mayonnaise
- 1 onion, diced
- 2 green onions, thinly sliced
- 1 small green bell pepper, seeded and diced
- 3 ribs celery, thin sliced
- 2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. pepper

Bring large pot of water to a boil. Add potatoes and cook for 15 to 20 minutes. Drain, cool and cut into cubes. Boil eggs for 10 minutes. Cool, peel and chop. In a large bowl combine potatoes and eggs. Mix together remaining ingredients. Add to potatoes and mix well. Cover and chill for several hours.:

Pasta Salad

- 2 C. Elbow or Rotini Noodles (cooked following directions)
- 1/2 sweet red pepper chopped
- 1/4 green pepper chopped
- 2 tomatoes cut into little pieces
- 1 dill pickle cut into little pieces
- 1/4 C mild banana peppers
- 1/2 C Zesty Italian Dressing (fat free)

Cook and drain noodles and let cool. Cut up all vegetables. Add to cooled noodles. Stir in dressing and vegetables. Refrigerate or eat immediately!

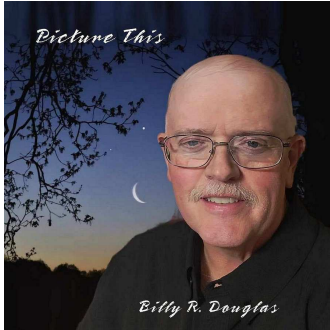

Caution - Satan At Work

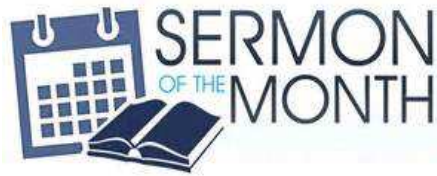

A Word for TODAY!

For these two years hath the famine been in the land: and yet there are five years, in the which there shall neither be earing nor harvest. And God sent me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance. **Additional Passages for today:** Genesis 37:3-4; 13-36; 39:1-41:46; 42:1-45:15

Thought for Today: God sees the big picture. Trusting Him, remaining faithful, and living obediently is the way to fulfill His purpose in your life.

Story for Today: Eric ran his hand down the sheet straightening the cover over the young lady who lay silent in the hospital bed. He hadn't seen Candie in 27 years. He thought back to the life he had lived and was grateful for the opportunity to help her now. Eric had been raised on a sheep farm that had been handed down through 5 generations of Wheaten men. Being the oldest in the family of six boys, Eric had been very involved, learning every aspect of the business. He had learned about the care of the sheep firsthand and from books that he had been encouraged to read as a young boy. He knew when the flock needed to be moved to greener pastures and when they needed to be sheared. His love of God and the Word helped him to see his animals in a special way, as he related so well to the shepherd boy, David. He never had to fight off the bear or a lion as David did, but he did have to defend his defenseless stock from wild animals like the coyote and wolves and even the occasional bobcat that would prowl nearby as other animals went into hibernation and the hunting became scarce. It was one of those days when Eric was protecting the flock that the young man discovered the trouble from a nearby farm. He had handled the situation as best as he knew how and had thought that everything was going to be alright. About a month later he was surprised to be served lawsuit papers and was shocked when he read the allegations. Eric knew that he had not done anything that he was accused of doing. He didn't understand why this would be happening. He quickly knelt in prayer and peace came over him as he gave the situation over to his Heavenly Father. The court date came and by the end of the day the 17-year-old Eric was denounced by his family and friends and was taken away to be held for sentencing. His love for God had only grown as he used his time to witness to many men who would never have heard the message if he had been home. Because of his truthfulness and good behavior, the guards would often use Eric to help them with their jobs. Eric was a favorite with the authorities and most of the guards wondered why such a good guy was in prison. Because of his good attitude, one of the guards who was taking classes to be a doctor took Eric under his wing and the two could be seen studying together. It wasn't long before Eric was enrolled in studies to become a surgeon. After serving time in prison, Eric was released, but not before completing many of his classes where he excelled and was at the head of the class. Realizing that his home was no longer available to him, he decided to continue his education and it wasn't long before he was a top surgeon, which brought him to where he was today. Now, he stood staring down into the face of the young lady, the daughter of the man who had put him in prison. God had blessed him to perform the first operation of this kind. Candie would have died had he not become a surgeon. It was God working through him that allowed him to meet this need. He looked up to see Red, Candie's dad, entering the room. It was interesting to see the different emotions crossing the man's face. First, hope, as he saw his daughter resting peacefully, then guilt and fear turned quickly to confusion as recognition dawned that Eric was the doctor who had saved his daughter's life. Eric reached out his hand and paraphrased some of Genesis 45:5-7 as he forgave Red and let him know that God had ordained this. He had been brought to this place, prepared and able to save Red's daughter. Had he not been in prison, meeting up with the guard studying to be a doctor, he would never have known how much he desired to be a surgeon. Had he not had to work so hard to become the best surgeon, he would never have known how to do this particular surgery that had saved her life.
