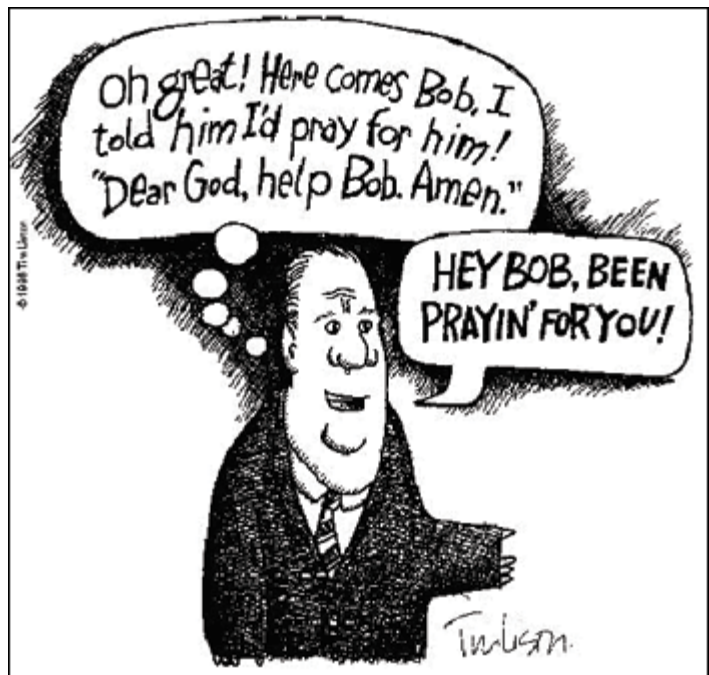

REESIE'S RECIPES



Layered Orange Pineapple Delite

Ingredients

- 1 20 ounce can crushed pineapple in juice
- 1 1/2 cups boiling water
- 2 4 serving size packages JELLO orange flavor sugar free low calorie gelatin
- 2 8 ounce packages cream cheese, softened

Drain pineapple, reserving juice. Add cold water to juice to make 1 1/2 cups. Stir boiling water into gelatin in large bowl at least two minutes until completely dissolved. Stir in measured pineapple juice and water. Reserve one cup gelatin at room temperature. Stir 1/2 of the crushed pineapple into remaining gelatin. Pour into 5 cup mold. Refrigerate about two hours or until set but not firm. Stir reserved 1 cup gelatin gradually into cream cheese in medium bowl with wire whisk until smooth. Stir in remaining crushed pineapple. Pour over gelatin in mold. Refrigerate four hours or until firm. Unmold.

Italian Meatloaf

Ingredients

- 2 lbs Ground beef
- 1/2 teaspoon Pepper
- 1 cup Progresso Spaghetti Sauce
- Breadcrumbs
- 1 Med. Onion, finely chopped
- 1 Egg
- 1 teaspoon Salt
- 3/4 cup Parmesan Cheese

Mix all ingredients together in a large bowl making sure everything is well mixed. Place in greased baking pan. Form into loaf shape. Bake at 350 for 1 hour or until done. Slice and serve on Sub buns with your favorite toppings or top meatloaf with your favorite sauce or cheese and serve with mashed potatoes

Chicken Mac Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 c elbow macaroni, cooked and drained
- 6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 2 c chicken breast without skin, cooked and cubed
- 1/2 c onions, chopped and cooked
- 1/2 c bell peppers, chopped and cooked
- 10 3/4 ozs cream of mushroom soup
- 1 c sour cream
- 1 1/2 c frozen mixed vegetables, thawed
- 1 c cheddar cheese shredded
- 1/2 c cheddar cheese shredded

Preheat oven to 375. Prepare a 8 x 12" pan with cooking spray; set aside. Return hot macaroni to saucepan. Stir in bacon, chicken, onions, and bell peppers. In a mixing bowl, combine cream of mushroom soup, sour cream, mixed vegetables, garlic powder, and 1 cup cheddar cheese. Spoon half the macaroni mixture into prepared pan. Cover with half vegetable mixture. Repeat layers. Bake, covered, for 30 minutes or until heated through. Top with remaining cheddar cheese. Bake, uncovered, 3 minutes more.

Cheddar-Pepper Biscuits

Ingredients

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/3 cup margarine -- softened
- 1 1/2 cups Cheddar cheese -- divided
- 3/4 cup milk

In medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder, salt and pepper. Cut in butter with a pastry blender or 2 knives until mixture is size of coarse crumbs. Stir in 1 cup cheese. Add milk; mix just until dry ingredients are moistened. Turn dough out onto floured surface; knead gently 8 to 10 turns. Roll out or pat dough about 1/2-inch thick; cut with 2-1/2-inch biscuit cutter. Re-roll and cut scraps. Place on greased baking sheet. Sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup cheese. Bake at 450°F 10 to 12 minutes or until biscuits are golden brown.

Easy Peanut Blossoms

Ingredients

- 1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 cups baking mix
- 3/4 cup peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar for decoration
- 24 milk chocolate candy kisses, unwrapped

Directions

Preheat oven to 375. In large bowl, beat condensed milk and peanut butter until smooth. Add baking mix and vanilla; mix well. Shape into 1 inch balls. Roll in granulated sugar. Place 2 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 6 to 7 minutes. Place chocolate on cookie and place back in oven for 1 to 1 1/2 minutes.

Ice Cream in a Bag

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 6 tablespoons rock salt
- 1 pint size zip lock plastic bag
- 1 gallon size zip lock plastic bag

Directions

Fill the large bag half full of ice, and add the rock salt. Seal the bag. Put milk, vanilla extract, and sugar into the small bag, and seal it. Place the small bag inside the large one and seal again carefully. Shake well until mixture becomes ice cream, about 5 minutes. Wipe off top of small bag, cut end with scissors, squeeze out the ice cream and serve.

“WORD SEEKERS”



Most of you know that we have been in Radio Ministry for well over 10 years now and by the grace of God we have been able to reach and hear from people from all around the world. It has always been and continues to be a powerful tool for ministry. The other day a dear friend of mine that is also in the Radio Ministry emailed me and was telling me how the number of listeners at his station seems to drop the moment he starts airing preaching/teaching instead of just music. That is sad but true for most stations. The truth is that so many people want to be entertained not taught...music makes them feel good...preaching/teaching brings conviction! That word “conviction” has become a no no in the church age that we live in. I know people who will not darken the door of a church but will follow Gospel singers everywhere they go. The Bible says *Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition; 2 Thess 2:3 and in 1 Tim 4:1-2 it says Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils; Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their conscience seared with a hot iron;* These scriptures that speak of a “falling way” and “departing from the faith” could not be more real than they are today. People are *falling away* from the truth, and that in turn has caused many to depart from the faith. They would rather be entertained by music or sit in the congregation of an all smiling preaching who basically teaches your ok, I’m ok we’re all ok! And this has lead to so many having their “*conscience seared with a hot iron*”...meaning they are left with no conviction! And “no conviction” means you can live any way that you want to live and still be right with God. So of course when a preacher stands behind the pulpit and brings forth the unadulterated truth the people begin to drop out like flies. Or as my good friend wrote me and said...when you stop the music and go to preaching so many turn you off until the preaching is over. That being said, though many are falling away and departing from the truth there is still a remnant of Gods people who seek after the true Word of God. These are those who know *his voice and a stranger they will not follow*. There are still multitudes out there who are hurting and bound by sin that have tasted what the Music BUSINESS has to offer. They have tried what the preacher in his \$5,000.00 suit that stands in his mega-church each Sunday declaring that you can have your best life with positive thinking has to offer. They have tried religion and man made denominations and through all of this they have still found no peace or real freedom. Yes, there are still people who will seek and find the real Word of God in these last days. *Amos 8:11-12 tells us “Behold, the days come, saith the Lord GOD, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD: And they shall wander from sea to sea, and from the north even to the east, they shall run to and fro to seek the word of the LORD, and shall not find it.* “ There will come a time and you can see the beginning of it now that the word of the LORD will not be able to be found. BUT if you will seek him NOW *while he may be found* you will find true peace and deliverance in his Word! There are still those WORD SEEKERS out there which *do hunger and thirst after righteousness:...* AND Glory to God...*they shall be filled.*
