And many a man with life out of tune, And battered and scarred with sin,


Is auctioned cheap to the thoughtless crowd Much like the old violin.

The Weight of Unforgiveness



Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven. Matthew 18:21-22

One day the Sunday School teacher had each one in the class bring a clear plastic bag and a sack of potatoes. For every person that they refused to forgive in their life, they were told to choose a potato, write the person's name and date on it, and put it in the plastic bag. Some of the bags, as you can imagine, were quite heavy. They were told to carry this bag with them EVERYWHERE for the next month, putting it beside their bed at night, on the car seat when in the car, next to them on the pew at church, etc. The hassle of lugging the potatoes around clearly showed what a heavy spiritual weight each one was carrying. It was a continual reminder of how much attention they had to pay to the weight at all times especially when they would leave it in embarrassing places. Naturally, the condition of the potatoes deteriorated quickly to a nasty slimy stench that was almost unbearable...not to mention embarrassing when around others and the longer they carried it the worst it stunk. Until finally they decided that holding their grudge against those people wasn't really worth the trouble it was causing them any longer. After telling their teacher this they threw away the bag and walked away with a new perspective on the importance of forgiveness and just how it effected them.

This is a great example of the price that is paid for holding on to pain and unforgiveness in our lives! Too often we think we are hurting others by not forgiving them but in reality we only hurt ourselves and this even effects those around us. For example the people who had hurt them had no idea that their name was on one of the potatoes...only they knew that. Forgiveness is something that can certainly heal and mend relationships and give the other party relief BUT more times than not the only person it is hurting is the one carrying it around!! Think about it today...isn't the load you carry heavy enough? Isn't the battle you face each day enough of a struggle without YOU adding more weight and more stumbling blocks along the way? How many times have we offended Jesus? Yet how many times has He so freely forgiven us?? So, the next time you decide you can't forgive someone, ask yourself, "Isn't my bag heavy enough already?" Make it a matter of prayer today to ask for the help of the LORD to forgive those that have wronged you...to forgive those who have harmed and despitefully used you. Ask the LORD to help you lay aside the weight and the STENCH of the bag of unforgiveness that you have been carrying around!

REESIE'S RECIPES

Banana Pudding Cheesecake

submitted by Sister Angela Smith

For the crust:

4 oz vanilla wafers

2 oz butter, melted

Using a food processor, pulse the cookies until they turn into a fine crumb. Add the butter and pulse until a dough is formed. Spread the cookies in the bottom of a 8 inch springform pan. Refrigerate the crust while making the batter.

For the batter:

2 ripe bananas

17.5 oz cream cheese

1/2 cup sugar

4 eggs

1 tsp vanilla extract

2.5 oz vanilla wafers

Preheat the oven to 320°F. In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the whisk attachment, combine the cream cheese and the mashed bananas. Beat for 3 minutes. Add in the sugar, beating for another 3 minutes. Add the eggs one at a time, beating for one min-

ute after each addition. Add in the vanilla extract. Crumble the cookies with your hands and fold them into the batter. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake for 45 to 50 minutes, until the cake appears set, with the center jiggling only a little. Let the cake cool in the turned-off oven.

For the topping:

1 banana

2.5 oz vanilla wafers

1 cup whipping cream

2 tbsp sugar

vanilla wafers for garnish

Slice the banana and lay it one layer on top of the cooled cake. Place the cookies on top of the bananas. Mix the cream and sugar until it forms stiff peaks. Spread it on top of the cake. Top with additional crumbled cookies. Refrigerate overnight (or at least 6 hours) before cutting.

Western Meatloaf

2 lbs. ground beef

1 onion, chopped

1 can tomato soup

1 tsp. chili powder

3 Tbsp. bbg sauce

1 c. cracker crumbs

1 egg

Salt & pepper to taste

3/4 c. ketchup

1 Tbsp. brown sugar

Mix all ingredients together except ketchup and brown sugar. Put in greased glass loaf pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Remove from oven. Stir together ketchup and brown sugar. Spread over loaf and return to oven for 15 more minutes.

Mexican Casserole

1 16 oz container sour cream

1 8 oz pkg cream cheese

2 eggs

2 cans cream of chicken soup

1 large onion, chopped

1 small can chopped green chiles

1 small jar diced pimentos

1 lb. ground beef, browned and drained

2 cups Cheddar cheese, shredded

Mix together sour cream, cream cheese, eggs, cream of chicken soup, chopped onion, green chillies, and beef Spread mixture evenly in a 9x13 pan glass casserole dish. Top with shredded cheese. Cover and bake 1 hour at 350 degrees.

A Call To Pray

Daniel 2:20-21 "Daniel answered and said, Blessed be the name of God for ever and ever: for wisdom and might are his: And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings: he giveth wisdom unto the wise, and knowledge to them that know understanding"

I look at the political fervor of our nation today and I'm concerned. I look at people who call themselves Christians who will accept anything from anyone-politician and preacher alike-and I 'm concerned. I see people who claim Christ one minute and with anger cast a vote for one who defies God, stands against the principles of God, and will lead our country to further ruin. Today, is a call to prayer. Today, our nation needs men, women, and children of prayer more than ever before. Will you be such men and women? God calls HIS people to prayer. The question is, are you a real believer? Puritan, David Clarkson, reminds us that we cannot cling to Christ and our sin at the same time. "Many will not part with that which keeps them at a distance from Christ. They will not part with sin to come to Christ, and there is no coming to him without turning from that; these two are the opposite terms of this motion. Now this is the condition of most that hear the gospel, they have one sin, if not more, which they cannot endure to part with. If Christ and my sin may be joined together, says the sinner, then with all my heart I will accept of Christ's invitation, I will come to him; but if there be no coming to Christ without parting form my sin, oh this is a hard task, a hard saying, I know not how to live without my sin; and thus he leaves Christ." Let go of all sin and cling to Christ! Our country is in serious need of full salvation and true gospel preachers. "If Jesus had preached like most pastors in America, he'd have never been crucified."-Leonard Ravenhill If you listen to fluff, if you listen to just feel good, make me happy preaching, I implore you to turn it off! Read the Bible and let the Holy Ghost teach you and add to that strong holiness preaching, preaching that doesn't contradict the word of God. Your mind hears and follows, changing you. We're a nation that doesn't read its Bible and listens to soft on sin preaching, hates holiness, and doesn't seek the face of God. That's a lot of what is wrong in America today. That's part of why we have such confusion in America and in our political process. We desire to be carnal instead of faithful and carnality breeds confusion. Sin leads to selfishness and confusion. Unless God shows mercy upon us, we may end up with whom we deserve rather than who is best for our well-being. Perhaps God is allowing the god of this world to blind eyes, or perhaps God is blinding eyes. Christians today, now more than ever, should really be enacting 2Chronicles 7:14. We need to really be praying for the repentance of America, of self, of the church, and humbling ourselves. Not praying for a particular candidate...but for God's will and our acceptance of it. The grace to live through it and the wisdom to speak into this world and this age. No matter who wins this election. Jesus is still Lord and the only question is...will you submit to His lordship? How should we pray? I believe Daniel had a very good prayer for his nation in Daniel 1:1-19. Daniel knew the signs of the times and the seriousness of it. Do you see the serious need of God in America? Look around you and you can't help but see the signs of the times...the last times. Not only did he know the times but look at his prayer and see how seriously he took God and how seriously he took prayer. It's time to stop playing with prayer and really let our knees grow roots instead of letting them just kiss the floor. In his prayer Daniel looks at the honor of God and the holiness of God. He looks at our sin and he sees that it is against our Creator. As his prayer continues Daniel speaks to the natural conclusion of sin in his nation-our nation toocarnality breeds confusion. As we leave holiness, as we walk away from the precepts of God-the black and white of how we ought to live and the things we ought to do and not do-we move into gray areas, areas of confusion. Righteousness belongs to God; confusion belongs to us...because we reject the Righteousness of God. Carnality and sin breed confusion but holiness breeds love and mercy. If we are truly holy, our lives will be lives of love and mercy. Not an outward piety that is harsh but an inward love and mercy for others, the holiness of God, that is what will draw others to Christ. Daniel recognized the sin of his nation, his own sin, and confessed it to God. Confession is saying that what God says is right, it's true. He was willing to accept the punishment with grace but his prayer was a pleading for mercy. It's time to plead before a righteous God. It's time to recognize the little sins in our own lives and not only confess them but repent of them. It's time for America to pray.

2 Chronicles 7:14 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

"I Hear The Sound Of An Abundance Of Rain" conclusion

Scripture Reference: 1st Kings 18:41-45

But Elijah just keeps on praying he sends his servant back to the sea and while the servant is running Elijah is praying. You just have to keep on praying: When you have a word from God in your spirit you just have to keep on praying. Daniel prayed for 20 days with no evidence whatsoever that God had heard him, but on the 21rst day the breakthrough came, Michael the warring angel broke into the battle and Gabriel got the message through. God will do whatever it takes to get it to you, if you don't quit! Keep on praying, keep on praising, keep on confessing, keep on tithing, and sowing, and singing and dancing. Don't let the devil see you sweat. Delay is not denial: Abraham was delayed 25 years but not denied Joseph was delayed 15 years but not denied. Lazarus was delayed for 4 days but not denied. Habakkuk 2:3 - For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry. Numbers 23:19 - God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good? Every time you pray you are putting pressure on the spirit realm and you are filling with expectancy the clouds that are bringing your blessings. We don't pray because we feel like it, we don't pray just because it's the Christian thing to do, or because it sounds like a good idea. We pray because we have an objective that can only be reached and can only be won and conquered through prayer. Elijah is still praying: (head between his knees) prayer is serious business and hard work. Somebody said one time: Many Christians pray with such Luke warmness and indifference and uncertainty that they wouldn't even recognize the answer to their prayer when it came. Elijah's servant has brought back another negative report: but Elijah keeps praying. 43 And said to his servant, Go up now, look toward the sea. And he went up, and looked, and said, There is nothing. And he said, Go again seven times. Go back to the sea look again (spend some more time in the word) then come tell me what you see. 44 And it came to pass at the seventh time, that he said, Behold, there ariseth a little cloud out of the sea, like a man's hand. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down that the rain stop thee not. On the 7th time the servant comes back with the report: Behold there ariseth a little cloud out of the sea. In other word: There was a little word that came up to me. (A word from the Word) A Rhema word: A specific word, for a specific purpose, for a specific time. Tell your neighbor: All you need is a word. If you've got a word you can make it through the storm. If you've got a word you can dance in the fiery furnace. If you've got a word you can sleep like a baby in a den of lions. If you've got a word you can beat the famine with a little meal and a little oil. If you've got a word you can walk on water. It was so small: Like a mans hand (It didn't look like much but Elijah's faith grabbed hold of it. There's something about faith that lets you see the greatness in little things: Faith can see: A weapon of mass destruction in the jawbone of an ass. Faith can see: A meal for a multitude in a sack lunch. Faith can see: An oil business in a room full of empty jars. Faith can see: A king in a simple smelly shepherd boy. The servant saw a little cloud but Elijah saw (A river filling, ground soaking, drought busting rainstorm) I don't care how big the problem may seem to you, or how long is has existed: The promises of God come in concentrated form and one little word from God will set you free, and will destroy that thing forever. 44 And it came to pass at the seventh time, that he said, Behold, there ariseth a little cloud out of the sea, like a man's hand. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down that the rain stop thee not. Matthew 17:20 - And Jesus said unto them, Because of your unbelief: for verily I say unto you, If ye have faith as a grain of musttard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you. I feel some mountains starting to shake in here right now. I feel some mountains losing their hold. I feel some real mountain moving faith rising up in here right now. I feel a Drought Busting faith in the house. (I HEAR THE SOUND OF THE ABUNDANCE OF RAIN) I feel something shifting in the atmosphere right now. I prophesy to you right now the drought is breaking and the rain is on the way: Somebody listening to me right now (That drought in your finances is breaking, that long dry spell is over in Jesus name). Somebody else: Your spirit has been dry for so long, and you've felt so distant from the presence of God (That drought is breaking now, the wind is blowing and the rain of Gods supernatural presence is flooding your soul right now, Just open up and let it fall on you. Somebody else: You've been fighting a long battle with your health, (It's raining, there's healing in the rain, receive your healing, receive your breakthrough) Somebody: You've been going through a long dry place with your family, it seems like it just gets worse and worse, (you try to love them, you try to embrace them, but they just push you away and run harder) It's time for that drought to break, it's time for it to rain on your family) Your husband, your wife, your children and even your grandchildren are going to get wet. Come on and just lift your hands and tell God: Send the rain, tell him you want the rain. Zechariah 10:1 - Ask ye of the Lord rain in the time of the latter rain; so the Lord shall make bright clouds, and give them showers of rain, to every one grass in the field. It's the time of Rain: The anointing is here, the rain is falling, yokes are being destroyed, burdens are being lifted. Joy is being restored, peace is being restored. And he said, Go up, say unto Ahab, Prepare thy chariot, and get thee down that the rain stop thee not. 45 And it came to pass in the mean while, that the heaven was black with clouds and wind, and there was a great rain. And Ahab rode, and went to Jezreel Elijah got off his knees and told Ahab: It's here, The rain is here, If you don't get that chariot rolling you aren't getting off this mountain. And while Elijah was prophesying the wind blew and the clouds turned black and the rain came. Elijah heard it with his spirit. He prophesied it with his mouth. He saw it with his eyes. Somebody needs to lift your hands right now and begin to Praise him for that rain. Praise him like a man in the desert who was dying for water and stumbled into an Oasis. Praise him because the drought is over.
