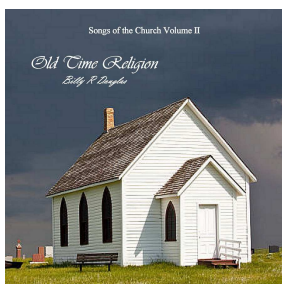

**"How Shall We Sing The Lord's Song In A Strange Land?"part 01**

Psalm 137:1-9 - By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion. We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. For there they that carried us away captive required of us a song; and they that wasted us required of us mirth, saying, Sing us one of the songs of Zion. How shall we sing the Lord's song in a strange land? If I forget thee, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget her cunning. If I do not remember thee, let my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth; if I prefer not Jerusalem above my chief joy. Remember, O Lord, the children of Edom in the day of Jerusalem; who said, Rase it, rase it, even to the foundation thereof. O daughter of Babylon, who art to be destroyed; happy shall he be, that rewardeth thee as thou hast served us. Happy shall he be, that taketh and dasheth thy little ones against the stones.

As you know, Psalms are songs. They were originally put to music. This particular song was one of the saddest songs ever composed and ever sung in the house of God. This Psalm was written by a P.O.W.. But this was not just a prisoner of war, this was a prisoner of want, W-A-N-T. The songwriter here is singing of a time when believers where in Babylon. These believers in Babylon were also believers in bondage. Where once they had been overjoyed with the fresh fragrance of freedom, now the sour stench of slavery filled their nostrils. Now, instead of enjoying blessings, they were enduring burdens. Fruitfulness had turned to bareness; happiness had turned to bitterness; joyfulness had turned to brokenness. Now to understand the background of the story, remember that the Children of Israel had been carried away into captivity by the Babylonians. Now the reason they had been carried away was not because of their weakness but because of their wickedness. They had fallen away from the living God. God had allowed their defenses to be broken down and used a pagan nation to bring them to their knees to break them and to bring them to repentance. Now that should not surprise you. Because Babylon always leads to bareness. Babylon always leads to bitterness and Babylon always leads to brokenness. That is, if you are a child of God. The only people who are happy in Babylon are Babylonians. Now there's a sermon in that sentence. Babylon in the Bible is a picture of the world in all of its iniquity. It is a picture of the world in all of its idolatry. It is a picture of the world in all of its immorality. The name Babylon means confusion. Now, these people were in Babylon but their hearts were in Zion. They were weeping because they "remembered Zion" (verse 1). They could not get Zion out of their minds. Zion is another name for Jerusalem. The name Jerusalem means "City of Peace". There was a time when these people lived in God's capitol city. Because they were right with God they were holy. Because God was right with them they were happy. And because they were right with each other they were healthy. There are two major cities in the Bible and they are totally opposite and yet, in a strange way, magnetically attracted. There is Babylon, the hellish city; there is Jerusalem the holy city. There is Babylon, the seat of wickedness; and there is Jerusalem, the source of holiness. The people of God had been transported from Zion to Babylon. There were two people in this city, there were the captives and the captors. Now the captives represent the saints, the people of God. While the captors represent sinners, children of this world. And so this is a picture of believers in Babylon. Christians who are in captivity. And it shares, both historically and theologically, The Backslider's Burden.

I. V. 1-2 THERE IS A SADNESS THEY CANNOT ESCAPE Psalm 137:1 - By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion. 2 We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. A dark cloud of depression hung over the heads of these people which totally eclipsed the sunshine of joy which once had brightened their lives. Now there are two reasons they were sad. A. The Misery In Their Hearts - "By the rivers of Babylon there we sat down, yea, we wept...." (verse 1). From the very first day they moved into their new homes they were absolutely miserable. You see, there is a tremendous difference between being lost and being saved. Now both a lost person and a saved person can sin. In fact, I'll go farther, both a lost person and a saved person will sin. But the difference is this, only one of them can enjoy it. Transgression always brings tears to the eyes of a true child of God. You see, God loves you so much that He will let you go to Babylon, but He loves you too much to let you enjoy the stay. These people were broken hearted not just because of where they were but more because of why they were there to begin with.

By Whom ALL Things Consist

We are often reminded that the human body is fearfully and wonderfully made. The human eye is an amazing feat of creative engineering, our nervous system and circulatory systems are vast and amazing. All these and much more show the ludicrousness of the theory of evolution. Even today there are many secular scientists that admit evolution is not feasible, yet they still do not bend their mind, will, and knee to the Creator. Fewer talk about the specifics of this world and God's placement and design of it. God, through the prophet Isaiah reminds us that God made the earth to be inhabited. "For thus saith the LORD that created the heavens; God himself that formed the earth and made it; he hath established it, he created it not in vain, he formed it to be inhabited: I am the LORD; and there is none else." (45:18)

We were placed in the perfect position in relation to the sun. If we were closer we would burn up; further away and we would freeze. Our atmosphere is protectively perfect, harmlessly burning up the great number of meteors that hurtle through space at us. If it were thinner we'd be in trouble. If the moon were not the size and distance that it is, the ocean tides would flood the land twice a day. Even the continental shelf is made just right to sustain us; if it were smaller, the oceans would be deeper near the shore and would lower the oxygen level in the atmosphere making life much more difficult. There is much more to consider, whether the delicate balance of the various cycles and ecological processes of nature or the thousands of other variables that keep our universe running in place, all point to the awesome power and care of our Creator for mankind for those who are willing to see it. Take some time to read Colossians 1:15-20, stopping to think on Jesus about whom it is written in verse 17, "And he is before all things, and by him all things consist."

This is much more than a science lesson or simply pointing to the glory of God and His worthiness of worship and glory (although it is that too). This is meant as an encouragement during troublesome times and a call to love and to draw deeper in trust and faith in our Creator and Sustainer God. As Christians see the uncertainty that surrounds them—whether from a political, economic, or medical viewpoint—some respond with worry, others with wonder, and still others with worship. "What about COVID and vaccinations?" "What about the political turmoil coming down upon us both nationally and globally?" "What about my ..." and you can fill in the blank with any number of afflictions that have come and are coming upon us daily. All these are important and all need to be viewed in truth; but, we must always recognize and stand boldly on the truth that GOD IS TRUTH! The Scriptures never fail us and we must know them in order to declare and defend them; in doing so, we declare and defend truth, we declare and defend our God! In truth, God needs no defending; but our burning love for Him will move us to do so.

I don't imply that the afflictions, tyrannies, and movements within this nation are of no concern or we fold our hands and twiddle our thumbs resting in the Lord and His mighty power. No, we are called to stand, having done all to stand in the Lord's mighty power. We follow His leading, decked out in all His armor, with the belt of Truth holding it all in place. I began this article with truths that stem from the Word of God yet are questioned by many in the church today. There are many other ills of society that stand against Scripture and are accepted by the church today under the guise of "feeling" or "science" or "history" and "being on the right side of history." Let us recognize the Bible as the standard of truth, live our lives by its authority, and declare what God has made known. Let us walk in the truth that our spiritual need, which is eternal, outweighs that which is temporal; so, let that be our greater concern, even as those temporal concerns press hard in upon us. Truly, we must trust God and know Him more intimately through times of devotion and leave our closets ready to move within society, willing to wield the Sword of Truth. Walking where the Spirit leads and doing as He bids us to do. We must find our peace and hope in our God, not in our surroundings, political situations, or creature comforts. We must find our actions motivated by and willing to be endured from our love for God and man.

Let me close with a quote from Puritan writer Richard Sibbes (1577-1635), who sums the above well with these pointed words: "...if that which a man loves is touched, he is immediately all on fire. Here the best Christians have cause to be based. If God is their love, how can they bear to hear him disgraced and his name abused without being greatly moved and set on fire? Where there is no zeal, there is no love." He also reminds us, "It is a great shame for a Christian to delight and comfort in the earthly more than in God. Jonah, a good man, was distraught when his gourd was taken away. Many who should joy in God above all things, act as if there were no God in heaven when their outward comforts are taken from them. They act as if there were no providence to rule the world and as if they had no Father in covenant with them. We must rely and depend upon him above all things! Whatever we trust in most, that is our god!"

2 cans whole kernel corn, drained
 1 cup chopped green pepper
 1/2 cup red onion, chopped
 2 cups shredded cheese
 1 cup miracle whip
 11-oz bag chili cheese Fritos

 Heat shortening to 350. Combine cheese, 2 cups of crumbs, mushrooms, onions, savory and pepper. Fold in eggs. Let stand 10 minutes. Shape into balls using rounded teaspoon for each. Roll in remaining crumbs. Deep fry for about 1.5 minutes or until golden brown.

3 lb green beans
 3 Tbsp sugar
 1 onion, chopped
 Small pieces of bacon or ham
 Salt and pepper to taste
 Wash and break green beans. Add all ingredients to 2 quarts of water. Simmer for 2 hours on medium heat.

2 lb carrots, scraped and thinly sliced
 1/2 cup water
 3 Tbsp honey
 3 Tbsp brown sugar
 2 Tbsp margarine
 Combine carrots and water, bring to a boil. Cover and reduce heat, simmer for 6 minutes. Drain and return to pan. Add honey and remaining ingredients. Cook over low heat stirring gently until butter and sugar melt.

Death But Not In Vain



Allen Gardiner paced up and down the street, ashamed to go into the bookshop and ask for a Bible. He had thrown aside his religious upbringing at the young age of fourteen for the rowdy life of a sailor, but now he needed answers. The letter that arrived, telling of his godly mother's prayer for him before her death, struck his heart with a desire to read the Book that he knew held life's answers. Secreted with the newly purchased volume in the quiet of a Chinese temple,

Allen Gardiner came to faith in Jesus Christ.

With an earnest drive for missionary work, Gardiner went to South Africa in 1834 to win the Zulus to Christ. Although they were notorious for savagery, he brought about peace between the warring tribespeople and opened the door for missions among them. When war broke out between the Dutch settlers and the Zulus, it became impossible to continue the work, and he set his face toward South America.

As he traveled through the continent of South America, seeking to work with the native tribes, he was repeatedly thwarted by governmental regulations, Jesuits, or lack of funding. He also sought to go to New Guinea but was told, "You might as well try to instruct the monkey as the natives of Papua...they'll never be any different." Gardiner retorted, "They are men, not animals, and they are included in our Saviour's command to preach the Gospel to every human being." Though access was denied him, he did not give up.

He turned to Tierra del Fuego, knowing there was no government or religious system to deny his entry. Two previous attempts to land there had taught him that the Fuegians were violent and thieving. His team, totaling seven men, arrived in December of 1850. The mission began to fail the moment it started. Part of their supplies were left on the ship that landed them, and most of the rest was stolen by the Fuegians who also drove them from the coastline. The men took refuge in a nearby area but were unable to find enough food to survive. One by one, they starved to death. The scheduled supply ship returned twenty days after the last entry in Allen Gardiner's journal.

Their death created worldwide headlines. Most condemned their "folly and failure" in the venture, but it stirred the heart of the church. A new mission team was sent and, after much turmoil, succeeded in winning many of the Fuegians to Christ.

Twenty years earlier, Charles Darwin had stated that it was "completely useless to send missionaries to savages such as the Fuegians, probably the lowest example of human race." Darwin later saw for himself the difference the Gospel had made. He was astonished at a people so changed physically, mentally, and spiritually that he not only stated his belief in the regeneration of the people but contributed to the South American Missionary Society during the rest of his life.

Shall the axe boast itself against him that heweth therewith? or shall the saw magnify itself against him that shaketh it? as if the rod should shake itself against them that lift it up, or as if the staff should lift up itself, as if it were no wood. Isaiah 10:15

One constant pitfall we must watch for is taking credit for something that God does in or through us, or using the gifts and callings of God for self-exaltation. In that light it may be easier to handle poverty, weakness, or insignificance, than wealth, ability, power or authority, since poverty and frailty are not normally things we boast about, and they cause us to recognize our need for God. Prosperity, gifting, and anointing, on the other hand can be powerful temptations, leading to pride, covetousness, and self-sufficiency. Saul, who came from a humble background, was anointed king of Israel, yet his heart was revealed when the Lord exalted him, but he exulted in his own position, eventually coveting it so severely he became a fierce enemy of God. The Lord then removed His spirit from Saul and the true condition of the man became apparent to everyone. Even the great Solomon whose gifting, anointing, and prosperity were unsurpassed in some ways, seems to have taken for granted his abilities and wealth, and, somehow, rationalizing his blatant disobedience to God's law, he fell into idolatry and brought disaster to the Kingdom of Israel. This seems amazing, given the fact that Solomon's most precious gift was his wisdom. (Those with this gift should take note). Be careful how you handle the gifts and successes that God gives you! Enjoy His blessings as you serve in your family, business, or ministry – but never forget where it all comes from, and to whom the glory belongs, cause if you do, He will be sure to remind you. www.worthydevotions.com
