REESIE'S RECIPES





Angel Lush Cake

Ingredients

1 pkg. vanilla flavor fat free-sugar free instant pudding mix
 1 can (20 oz.) crushed pineapple in juice, undrained
 1 cup thawed Fat Free Cool Whip
 1 prepared angel food cake

Mix pudding mix and pineapple in medium bowl.

Gently stir in Cool Whip...Cut cake horizontally into thirds...Place bottom cake layer, cut side up, on serving plate. Spread 1-1/3 cups of the pudding mixture onto cake layer; cover with middle cake layer, Spread 1 cup pudding mixture onto middle cake layer; top with remaining cake layer. Spread with remaining pudding mixture...Refrigerate at least 1 hour or until ready to serve.

Refrigerate leftover cake.

Mexican Chicken Casserole

Ingredients

4 chicken breasts
6 flour tortillas
2 cans chopped green chilies
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 can cream of chicken soup
1 lb. cheddar cheese
Garlic, cumin and chili powder
Salt and pepper to taste

Boil 4 chicken breasts and reserve broth. Debone and chunk chicken. Lay flour tortillas in bottom of dish and spread chunked chicken over tortillas. Spread 2 small cans of chopped green chilies over chicken. Mix a little broth with 1 can cream of chicken and 1 can cream of mushroom soups. Generously season the mixture with garlic powder, cumin and chili powder. Salt and pepper to taste. Cover with one pound of cheddar cheese. Bake at 350° F. until cheese has melted and serve.

Graham Cracker Eclair "Cake"

Ingredients

15 HONEY MAID Honey Grahams, broken in half
(30 squares), divided
1-1/2 cups milk

1 pkg. (4-serving size) JELL-O Vanilla Flavor Instant
Pudding & Pie Filling

1 tub (8 oz.) COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed
1 cup chocolate ready-to-spread frosting

ARRANGE 10 of the graham squares, overlapping slightly, in bottom of 8-inch square baking pan; set aside. Pour milk into large bowl. Add dry pudding mix. Beat with wire whisk 2 min. or until well blended. Let stand 5 min. until thickened. Gently stir in whipped topping with wire whisk until well blended. SPREAD half of the pudding mixture over graham squares in pan. Top with 10 of the graham squares and remaining pudding mixture. Cover with remaining 10 graham squares. REFRIGERATE at least 3 hours. Spread with chocolate frosting just before serving.

Angel Salad

Ingredients

1 (13-oz.) can pineapples, crushed, drained
1 pkg. lemon jell-o, fat free
1 (13 oz.) pkg. Cream cheese, fat free (softened)
½ c. chopped pecans
1 c. cream, whipped, fat free
Water

Drain juice from pineapple. Add enough water to make 1 cup. in a sauce pan, heat to boiling. Dissolve jell-o in liquid. Beat in cream cheese. Chill until partially set. Fold in pineapple, whipped cream and nuts. Pour into a mold. Refrigerate for 2-3 hours. Serve.

Soft & Chewy Chocolate Drops

Ingredients

4 squares BAKER'S Unsweetened
Baking Chocolate
3/4 cup (1-1/2 sticks) butter
2 cups sugar
3 eggs
1 tsp. vanilla
2 cups flour
1 tub (8 oz) frozen cool whip
6 squares BAKER'S Unsweetened
Baking Chocolate

Directions

PREHEAT oven to 350°F. Microwave chocolate and butter in large microwaveable bowl on HIGH 2 min. or until butter is melted. Stir until chocolate is completely melted. Stir in sugar. Blend in eggs and vanilla. Add flour; mix well. Refrigerate 15 min. or until dough is easy to handle. SHAPE dough into 1-inch balls; place, 2 inches apart, on greased baking sheets. BAKE 8 min. or just until set. (Do not overbake.) Let stand on baking sheet 1 min.; transfer to wire racks. Cool completely.

GLAZE TOPPING: Place Cool Whip and semi sweet chocolate in microwave bowl. Microwave on high for 1 min. Stir, microwave 30 seconds or until chocolate is melted and mixture is shiny and smooth. Let stand 15 min. to thicken. Spread over cookies.

Let stand until glaze is set.

Autopsy Of A Dead Service

So many times we in the Pentecostal movement are guided by our feelings or what we feel. We leave church and say that we had a good service IF we felt the goose bumps, did the Holy Ghost boogie or jumped a pew. And if none of that happens we usually go out thinking...WOW, that was dead! Too often saints drag in like dead lice find their spot on the pew and look at the preacher or song leader as if to say....do something...get me excited make me feel the Spirit and then I will worship and praise. I know this because I have, as the world puts it..."Been there Done that"! For some reason down through the years we have came up with the mindset that church is for us to be blessed BUT in reality we have it backwards. We come together not so we can feel the goose bumps or be overwhelmed by the Spirit BUT we come together to pray, to worship and to exalt the name of the LORD together. Psalms 100:4 says "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name." No place does it say...AFTER you feel the Spirit or get excited THEN offer up thanksgiving and praise. In Luke 19:46 Jesus said, "It is written, My house is the house of prayer:...". Once again he said NOTHING about praying when we FEEL like it or when the Spirit falls. Now, that being said don't get me wrong, I LOVE to feel it and run the aisles and jump the pews BUT the LORD is teaching me that IT AINT IN THE FEELING! We should never come into church with the attitude that we will worship and praise Him when the Spirit falls. So many times we are setting there waiting for God to move and HE is waiting for us to do what we are suppose to do....WORSHIP and PRAISE Him. Psalms 22:3 says "But thou art holy, O thou that inhabitest the praises of Israel." WHAT A PROMISE! He "dwells" in the midst of our praises! So you see the only way we can have a bad service is if we don't do what we are suppose to do....because it has NOTHING to with what we feel and everything to do with WHAT WE DO. Did we pray? Did we Praise? Did we worship? My Pastor used to say "You get out of it what you put into it". So more than likely the next time you walk out of church thinking "Wow that service was dead"...it probably wasn't the service....IT WAS PROBABLY YOU.

"Room in the Inn"

The store owner's police are to greet every customer with a smile but instead of Merry Christmas you have to say happy holidays. We could offend a customer. Maybe even loose one. What about you? Do you have room for Jesus? Some would say, sure I believe in God, but this Jesus story, I'm just not sure.1 John 14:1 says: Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. I ask you again, "Do you have room for Jesus?" He has room for you. 1 John 14:2 says: In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. The bible instructs us to allow the word of God to renew our views on life. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God (Romans 12:2). We must take a stand for Jesus as Paul did in Romans 1:16 For I am not ashamed for the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; Is there room for Jesus in your life? 
