That heavenly sound of the children and the old saints singing would ring across the hills. I'm so glad to say that old church bell where I grew up is still ringing so faithfully after all these years, but now so few are walking up the mountain to church. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things. Satan in this final hour, is running to and fro throughout the earth trying to get the believer to constantly focus on things that are completely opposite of our above text. I heard a preacher say one time that the mind is the devil's playground. See if we allow the enemy to keep reminding us of the bad memories from our past, we cannot have victory like we should. I see more people today, especially Blood-Bought Believers, who have the answer to life's problems which is Jesus Christ and His finished work at the Cross, still always dwelling on the negative and not dwelling on the good things of God. You can't be a blessing to someone if you are always dwelling on those bad things that have happened to you. Remember the devil is the accuser of the brethren...he always wants to keep reminding us of our past mistakes. Thanks be unto God through Jesus Christ and his shed blood, our sins can be forgiven. Have you truly laid your burdens at the foot of the Cross? Please do so today and accept God's forgiveness from your past mistakes and memories. In God's eyes, once you repent and confess your sins and it's under the blood...they are gone. The very memory of your failure. Glory be to God! When the devil reminds you of your past, just remind him of his future! See the child of God has no past when it's put under the blood of Jesus and the devil has no future! LOVE'S COVERING, PART 2

"First Love"

Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love. Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candle-stick out of his place, except thou repent. Revelation 2:4-5

We spoke last month about "God's love for us"....this month I want to try and talk about "our love for God". There really is no comparison....God loves us with a love that is "unconditional"...no matter who we are...or what we have done his unexplainable love remains the same! Mans love for him however is a different story...so many have turned their back on the LORD and literally shook their fist in his face, spewing words of hate simply because things in life did not go the way they wanted them to. Many that have been offended by others take it out on God...many who have lost loved ones to death turn away from God...it seems at the times when man should depend on God the most they withdraw from him. And of course we all at one time or another have been guilty of the sin mentioned in the above passage of scripture...this church and really all of the churches after this one that would be rebuked were guilty of "leaving their first love". In other words God was no longer at the top of their list of priorities...he no longer was "first" in their life. So many times people allow money, fame, family, the pleasures of the flesh and other worldly things to come between them and the LORD. Most of us would recognize that and realize this to be truth...but did you know we as Christians can allow "good things" to do the same thing? I heard someone say once that "church was their life"...as important as church is...and it is very important. IT MUST NOT BE "YOUR LIFE". Jesus and Jesus alone should be our LIFE! I can speak for preachers...since I am one...many times if we are not careful we can get so caught up in the work that we forget the one that we are working for! There is a great example of this in the Word...the Bible says in Luke 10:38-42 Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word. But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me. And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things: But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. Here we find Martha in the kitchen...was she doing something bad? No, she was preparing a meal for Jesus...she gets to looking around for Mary and cant find her and comes to Jesus and what do you know there she is at the feet of the Master! And in seeing this she said Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? In other words here I am doing all "the work"...working for you LORD and here Mary is at your feet...my my my what a picture of truth we find here! It is so easy to excuse our lack of a prayer life or fellowship with God by just blaming it on how busy we are doing the work for him or just busy doing what we consider "good things". Then Jesus answers her with this... Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things: But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. Jesus was not saying that what Martha was doing was a bad thing but he was trying to tell her that "THIS is what is most important"! What a picture of putting FIRST THINGS FIRST! What a shame to do so much work for the Master without ever really getting to know the Master! So you see whether they be bad things or good things...if it comes before Jesus in our life...we are missing the mark! Take these words that Jesus spoke to the church of Ephesus to heart today dear soul...if you have found that Jesus is no longer your first priority in life...Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent. Put God first in your life remember what he has done for you and the great love that he has for you and you will find it is not to much to ask for us to put him first and everyone and everything else after that! until next time may the LORD bless and keep you is my prayer. REESIE'S RECIPES





Strawberry Frost

Ingredients

TOPPING:

1 c. sifted all purpose flour1/4 c. brown sugar1/2 c. walnuts (or pecans)1/2 c. butter, melted

DESSERT:

2 egg whites 1 c. sugar 2 c. sliced fresh strawberries 2 tbsp. lemon juice 1 c. cool whip

TOPPING. Mix first four ingredients, spread in baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Stir several times, baking until brown. Let cool completely and sprinkle 2/3 of crumbs on bottom of dish you'll put dessert in.

DESSERT: Combine egg whites, sugar, berries and lemon juice. Beat on high speed until forms stiff peaks. Fold Cool Whip into dessert. Do NOT re-whip, just fold in. Put in dish. Sprinkle rest of crumbs on top.

Cheddar Bay Biscuits

2 ½ cups Bisquick baking mix

3/4 cup cold whole milk

4 tablespoons cold butter (1/2 stick)

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

1 heaping cup grated cheddar cheese

Preheat your oven to 400 degrees. Combine Bisquick with cold butter in a medium bowl using a pastry cutter or a large fork. You don't want to mix too thoroughly. There should be small chunks of butter in there that are about the size of peas. Add cheddar cheese, milk, and ¼ teaspoon garlic. Mix by hand until combined, but don't over mix. Drop approximately ¼-cup portions of the dough onto an ungreased cookie sheet using an ice cream scoop. Bake for 15 to 17 minutes or until the tops of the biscuits begin to turn light brown. When you take the biscuits out of the oven, melt 2 tablespoons butter in a small bowl in your microwave. Stir in ½ teaspoon garlic powder and 1/4 tsp dried parsley flakes. Use a brush to spread this garlic butter over the tops of all the biscuits..

Banana Pancakes

Ingredients

1 cup all-purpose flour
1 tablespoon sugar
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 egg, beaten
1 cup milk
2 tablespoons vegetable oil
2 ripe bananas, mashed

Combine flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. In a separate bowl, mix together egg, milk, vegetable oil and bananas. Stir flour mixture into banana mixture; batter will be slightly lumpy. Heat a lightly oiled griddle or frying pan over medium high heat. Pour or scoop the batter onto the griddle, using approximately 1/4 cup for each pancake. Cook until pancakes are golden brown on both sides.

Cornbread Fried Chicken by Galena Stornes

Ingredients

2 CUPS CRUMBLED CORNBREAD
1 TABLESPOON SEASONED SALT
1 TEASPOON BLACK PEPPER
1/2 TEASPOON GARLIC POWDER
1 CUP BUTTERMILK
1 TEASPOON BAKING POWDER
3 POUNDS CHICKEN PARTS
VEG OIL

COMBINE FIRST 4 INGREDIENTS IN ZIP LOCK BAG. SHAKE UNTIL WELL MIXED AND SET ASIDE. IN A LARGE BOWL, MIX BUTTERMILK AND BAKING POWDER. DIP PIECES OF CHICKEN INTO BUTTERMILK AND THEN CORNBREAD AND SET ASIDE IN A LONG PAN. COVER AND REFRIGERATE AT LEAST 1 HOUR. HEAT ABOUT 1 INCH OF OIL IN A LARGE SKILLET TO 3250 ADD CHICKEN AND FRY FOR 35 MINUTES OR UNTIL GOLDENBROWN, TURNING ONCE. DRAIN OIL ON PAPER TOWELS.

Thy Rod And Thy Staff

When you feel down and distressed, where do you turn to? Do you turn to your spouse; a friend; to your pastor? Maybe you turn to a funny movie or go out to eat or even buy yourself something new, thinking that "it" will make you feel better. Where do you turn? Psalms 23:4 says "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me." It is said that on each shepherd's staff (during Biblical times), you would find carvings of his daily diary, and what he believed to be God's Words to him. Often he would look back over that staff, and as he read of the experiences he had gone through and how God was faithful, he would find strength to guide him through the dark lonely nights on the hillsides with his sheep. After fighting away the wolves and wild dogs to protect his sheep he would be tired and weary he would find himself leaning on his staff to give him strength to "hold him up". His staff and his rod, were used to guide the sheep and to protect his flock. Now, that second verse of Psalm 23 says, "He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters...." yet the strange thing about sheep is that they are a very nervous animal. It is almost next to impossible for them to be made to lie down unless four requirements are met. These four things are, freedom from fear, tension, aggravation and hunger. The sheep know their shepherd and only the shepherd can help relieve these anxieties. God is our shepherd and He is there to guide and direct us. Sometimes when we want to go the wrong way and do the wrong things, He is there with His staff, (God's word), to help bring us back into the fold. We, like the sheep, need to know our Shepherd. We need to rely on Him completely. When we are down and distressed we need to turn to our Shepherd. Let's do that together today shall we?


