<u>"I'm Uncomfortable"</u>

Matthew 14:22-33

22And straightway Jesus constrained his disciples to get into a ship, and to go before him unto the other side, while he sent the multitudes away. 23And when he had sent the multitudes away, he went up into a mountain apart to pray: and when the evening was come, he was there alone. 24But the ship was now in the midst of the sea, tossed with waves: for the wind was contrary. 25And in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went unto them, walking on the sea. 26And when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, It is a spirit; and they cried out for fear. 27But straightway Jesus spake unto them, saying, Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid. 28And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water. 29And he said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus. 30But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me. 31And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt? 32And when they were come into the ship, the wind ceased. 33Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God.

How many of us have ever stepped out of our "comfort zones?" How many of us would have stepped out of that boat on to the water like Peter did? How many of us would have just stayed right there on the boat? Most of us are like that. We don't want to leave our comfort zones; after all, it's an area where we feel safe and secure. If there is a slight change in our lives, we allow fear to fill in where faith in Jesus should be. The Bible declares in 2nd Timothy 1:7 - For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. Taking the first step is what people fear the most. You see God will give you your breakthrough...but you have to take that first step. It was when Peter took the first step that the storm became stronger. You will have storms in this life. Jesus never said that you would go through this life storm free but you just have to trust in the fact that no matter what storm comes, when Jesus speaks, the storm has to listen. Amen To God! Proverbs 3:5-6 says: Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths. It's one thing to HEAR these words of encouragement and another thing to BELIEVE them with our whole heart. A lot of times moving out of out comfort zones is hard to do because we are not 100% certain that it's the Lord. 2nd Corinthians 5:7 - "For we walk by faith, not by sight." Peter wanted to make sure it was Jesus that was on the water. Look in verse 28 - And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water. Now verse 29 stated that Jesus said "Come." Sometimes we know exactly what the Lord wants us to do and we just won't move. Our comfort zone gets in the way. "Yes, I know He said to "Come," but what if something happens. At times you just have to take a big gulp in your faith and step out. Otherwise you'll never leave the boat and do what He's called you to do. Once Peter stepped out of the boat, he was walking on the water. The whole time from the boat to the water he kept his eves focused on Jesus. When the storm happened it distracted him and he took his eves off of Jesus. Don't let the worries and cares of this life keep you from looking towards Jesus. We have problems at times with money, family members, sickness in our bodies and so forth. We have to stay focused on Jesus. If we can learn to do that, then we will be able to overcome those things that are uncomforting to us and keep us from our victory. Look at the promise He gave us in Isaiah 45:22 - Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else. All Jesus wants us to do is to look towards him and He'll take care of us.

Then Cometh the devil....AND taketh away the WORD



The above quote is taken from Luke 8:12... from the parable of the sower. In that verse it is speaking of the devil taking the Word out of the hearts of those where the seed or the Word had been sown. We can certainly understand how this would be the case...once someone has heard the truth the enemy will do all that he can to take that truth away. I want to talk about an even greater conspiracy than that. You see that is not the only way

he has of "taking" the Word...remember the parable is talking about the Word and the LORD calls it "seed". Suppose the enemy could find a way to...corrupt the seed...change the very Words of God! Think about that for a minute. Corrupt seed will not produce the same results ... will not bring forth the same fruit. We see the devil doing this from the beginning...in the garden of Eden when he said in Genesis 3:1 ... Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden? Here we find his first attempt at "changing" what God had said. He has continued his efforts down through the years...using men and women who I have no doubt that (not all) BUT most of them had good intentions. But the intent of the one behind the movement was not good...but evil. This is one of the greatest conspiracies in the history of mankind and it has been very successful. Most if not all of the big "mega church" pastors preach from a corrupt modern day translation...they will tell you that the King James version is out of date, that it's to hard to understand...that the generation of today need something more modern. Many today say..."One Bible is as good as another" or "A Bible is Bible". Is it? Let's take a look and see what the difference is. To first understand the difference we must look at where the versions originated. Most ALL modern translations are based on the Revised Version (1881-5) which was influenced throughout by the Alexandrian manuscripts Sinaiticus and Vaticanus. I know those are big words but to give you some idea of their credibility...the Greek text they used was the result of a twenty year piece of work by two men who didn't even believe the Bible was the Word of God. In effect there really are only Two English language Bibles to choose from. The King James Version: which is based on the Masoretic Hebrew Text and the Majority Greek Text....that was considered the "closest" to the original text (words) passed down from the original authors and The Revised Version: which is based on the corrupted Minority Text that contradicted itself 3,000 times in the four Gospels alone. This version has spawned a whole generation of *inaccurate translations*: which, like their unholy mother the RV, all rely heavily on the corrupt Minority Text. Here are a few of the 100+ corrupt modern Bibles which followed in the trail of the Revised Version of 1881-5:..you may recognize some of them. The American Standard Version, The Revised Standard Version, The Amplified Bible, The Jerusalem Bible, The New International Version, The New English Bible, The New American Bible, The New American Standard Version, Good News Bible, New Jerusalem Bible , The New King James Version and The Message Bible. Keep in mind that these are only a FEW of the different versions that have been released and they are ALL based on the same corrupt text. How about the men who translated the Bible...Is it important to know WHO did the translating? You better believe it! How about the Modern Version Translators? The two most influential men on the Revised Version translating committee were Brooke Foss Westcott and Fenton John Anthony Hort...these men not only doubted the inspiration of scripture...they doubted creation AND the virgin birth of Jesus, we have included some of their ungodly beliefs on the last page of this newsletter. They did not believe that what they were translating was indeed the "inspired" word of God. They approached it with no more reverence than they would have Dr. Seuss! What about the King James Version Translators: There is no question of the spiritual qualifications of these great men. They were Christians who believed that the text they were handling was the very Word of God! They had absolutely no doubt in their minds that the Genesis account of creation was true. They never for a moment doubted the miracles of Jesus or that he was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, was crucified for the sins of mankind and that he rose from the dead and ascended to heaven. They were scholars of the highest order. Few - if any - of today's scholars come anywhere near them in their understanding of the original languages; let alone their faith and commitment to truth above tradition. AND last but not least to keep in mind is that **They were** under order of the King to make the translation as close to the original text as humanly possible. No group of scholars and translators in history has EVER even came close to the men and the work that King James commissioned. There is no way to honestly stand with ANY of the modern day versions in one hand and the King James version in the other and say they are equal or even close to being equal...to many changes...to many words and verses taken completely out! So I ask you...does it matter which Bible you use? The answer is a resounding YES and the choice is clear. The preserved King James Version...the closest one we have to the ORIGINAL text...the one translated by men who's knowledge and faith was beyond reproach. OR...any of the other versions available that are based on corrupt or at the very least questionable text translated by men who were not even men of faith. Considering the fact that God's Word says ... man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God. Why would anyone want anything less than the closest thing to the original that we can lay our hands on? REESIE'S RECIPES



Almond Joy Pudding Cups

1 can light unsweetened coconut milk 2 1/2 cups skim milk 1 tsp almond extract 2 pkgs. instant chocolate pudding Cool Whip (light or fat-free)

In bowl combine coconut milk with skim milk and almond extract; add pudding mix all at once. Beat with wire whisk until creamy and begins to thicken, about 2 minutes. Refrigerate; top with whipped topping

Sour Cream Coffee Cake

2/3 cup chopped pecans 2 tablespoons brown sugar 1-1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

BATTER:

1 cup butter, softened
 2 cups sugar
 2 eggs
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
 2 cups all-purpose flour
 1 teaspoon baking powder
 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream
 Confectioners' sugar

In a small bowl, combine the pecans, brown sugar and cinnamon; set aside. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in vanilla. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream. Pour half of the batter into a greased and floured 10-in. fluted tube pan; sprinkle with half of the pecan mixture. Gently top with remaining batter and pecan mixture. Bake at 350° for 45-50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack to cool completely. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar.

Sweet & Sour Meatballs

<u>Meatballs</u>

1/2 cup dried bread crumbs 1 pound ground beef 1 (12oz) package sausage 1 egg 1/2 tsp. dry mustard 1 Tbsp. soy sauce

Sauce

1 (20-ounce) can pineapple chunks in juice, drained, reserve juice
2 tablespoons Butter
2 tablespoons firmly packed brown sugar
1 tablespoon cornstarch
2 tablespoons cider vinegar
1 tablespoon soy sauce
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
2 medium green and/or red bell peppers, cut into 1-inch pieces

Heat oven to 350°. Stir together all meatball ingredients in a large bowl. Shape meatball mixture into 1 inch balls. Place meatballs onto ungreased 15x10x1 inch pan. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until meatballs are browned. Meanwhile combine reserved pineapple juice, butter, brown sugar, cornstarch, vinegar, soy sauce and ginger in 1quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture is thickened and bubbly (4 to 6 minutes). Boil, stirring constantly, 1 minute. Place meatballs, sauce, pineapple chunks, bell peppers and into ungreased 2-quart casserole; stir gently to coat. Cover; bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until meatballs are heated through..

Italian Meatloaf

2 pounds ground beef 1 cup dry bread crumbs 3/4 cup chunky spaghetti sauce 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped 1/2 cup green bell pepper, finely chopped 1 egg, slightly beaten 1 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon pepper 1/2 cup Mozzarella Cheese, shredded

Heat oven to 350œF. Combine all ingredients except mozzarella cheese in large bowl. Form mixture into 11x5-inch loaf. Place into ungreased 11x7-inch baking dish. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes until cooked through and browned. Sprinkle cheese over loaf. Continue baking for 5 to 10 minutes or until cheese is melted. Let stand 10 minutes before cutting.

<u>"BOUND BY A CROSS"</u>

"And now, behold, I go bound in the spirit unto Jerusalem, not knowing the things that shall befall me there:" Acts 20:22 KJV

Saul (later to be called Paul), was bound by the consequence of constraining love. He was bound by a hope placed deep within him that transcended reason or theology or any kind of human understanding. He was bound by a cross: something putrid and ugly; a loathsome and unthinkable ending for any man let alone a Jew; and while he was a free man for most of his life and could walk about the country and travel at will... a mere finger held him captive to the King of Kings and The Lord of Lords. Some have said that when Paul speaks of "not knowing the things that shall befall me (him) there :" (v.) 22b [speaking of his future once he gets to Jerusalem, and beyond] is a definite example of "weariness of soul" - and a life constantly facing the shadows of despair. Really? Look at verse 24 where we see Paul saying..."But none of these things move me, neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might finish my course with joy," That doesn't sound much like someone who is despondent to me. I'd say it illustrates a man who has enlisted both heart and soul into the service of the King. In fact when Agabus (in Chapter 21) comes down from Judea to visit with Paul with regards to his future, we read where he took Paul's belt and tied it around his own hands and feet, and said, "Thus saith the Holy Ghost. So shall the Jews at Jerusalem bind the man that owneth this girdle, and shall deliver him into the hands of the Gentiles." Acts 21:11b Because of this warning by Agabus, all those who loved Paul as their Spiritual father and their friend, plead with him not to go. Agabus(a prophet) had made predictions before that had come true such as a major famine throughout all the land (ref., Acts 11:28) which came to pass. Now he predicts this to happen to Paul if he goes to Jerusalem. Yet Paul's reply to this was simple; he said: "What mean ye to weep and to break mine heart? for I am ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus." Acts 21:13 Does this sound like someone who is despondent to you? It's guite the opposite! If you've ever had the pleasure to speak with such a "soldier of the cross", who has "having done all, stood" even in the midst of insurmountable odds, (ref., Eph 6:13), you will recall their sense of "completion"; of "wholeness"; of integrity" and a peace that seems to "blanket" their spirit. BONDAGE? I hardly think so! For while they have come through GREAT adversity and much peril; and while sacrifice definitely has made it's mark on their lives; they are the richest, happiest and most joyful people you will ever want to meet. Each of us are faced with that inevitable checklist of "life-choices". I'd have to say that in the light of all that is happening around the WORLD, we don't know what the future holds either - but we can know who holds the future! That kind of hope, that kind of knowledge captivates our hearts, our minds and our spirits; and binds us by a mere finger: the Finger of God! Going bound in the Spirit, having that kind of call on our lives, causes us to not just offer but to GIVE our very lives in sacrifice especially if it means the spiritual well-being of another. Oh brother and sister in Christ! Are you bound in the spirit? Are you one of those who sees your future in a vacuum, a mere vapor being sucked up into oblivion as we speak - and you have no idea how you will "rise above" your current circumstances? Or are you like Paul; captured in the bonds of what Christ has done for you at Calvary... and you've got to tell somebody? Jesus is looking for a few good men... and women!!!
