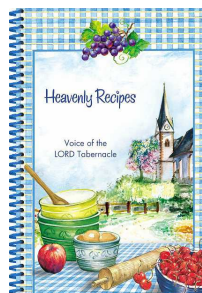

**REESIE'S RECIPES****Banana Pudding**

2 bags Vanilla Wafers
 6 to 8 bananas, sliced
 2 cups whole milk
 1 (5 oz.) box instant French Vanilla pudding
 1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese
 1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk
 1 (12 oz.) container frozen whipped topping thawed:

Line the bottom of a 13x9 inch dish with 1 bag of cookies and layer bananas on top. Bowl 1- Combine the milk and pudding mix and blend well using a hand-held electric mixer. Bowl 2- Combine the cream cheese and condensed milk together and mix until smooth. Fold the whipped topping into the cream cheese mixture. Add the cream cheese mixture to the pudding mixture and stir until well blended. Pour the mixture over the cookies and bananas and cover with the remaining cookies. Refrigerate until ready to serve!

Cowboy Beans

1 pound ground beef
 1 onion, diced
 Salt & pepper
 2 28-oz. cans pork n' beans
 1/4 teaspoon chili powder
 1/2 teaspoon granulated garlic
 1/2 cup barbeque sauce
 1/2 cup ketchup
 1/2 cup brown sugar

Brown ground beef and onions with salt and pepper to taste until meat is cooked through. Drain fat then add meat mixture to a crock pot or large saucepan.

Open cans of beans and pour off any liquid that's settled at the top. Add beans and remaining ingredients to the meat mixture and stir to incorporate. For crock pot cooking, cook on low for 4-6 hours. For stove-top cooking, heat over medium-high heat until simmering then reduce heat to low and cook, covered, for 1 hour.

Reesie's Homemade Lemonade

2 capfuls Country Time Sweetened lemonade mix
 2 pkg. Kool-aid lemonade mix
 2 1/2 cups sugar
 1 gallon water
 1 lemon sliced

Mix all ingredients together and chill.

Grilled Cola Chicken

2 pounds chicken breast
 1 Tablespoon olive oil
 1 1/2 Tablespoons freshly grated onion
 1 garlic clove, grated
 1 cup coca-cola
 1/2 cup ketchup
 1 Tablespoon apple cider vinegar
 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
 1 1/2 teaspoons chili powder
 1 1/2 tablespoons brown sugar
 1 Tablespoon paprika
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/2 teaspoon cumin

Heat a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Add oil to pan. Add grated onion and garlic to pan and saute for 1 minutes, stirring constantly. Stir in cola and next four ingredients (through chili powder); bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer 15 minutes or until sauce thickens. While sauce is cooking, preheat the grill to medium-high heat. Once sauce is done, remove 1/3 cup of sauce to take out to the grill. Combine sugar, paprika, salt and cumin. Rub spice mixture into both sides of chicken. Place chicken on grill coated with cooking spray; using the 1/3 cup of reserved sauce, baste chicken with ~3 Tablespoons of sauce and grill 5 minutes. Flip over, baste with 3 more Tablespoons of sauce and cook additional 5-7 minutes depending on thickness of chicken. Serve with reserved sauce

Obedience

Recently I have been hearing people talk about grace as though it should be expected to replace obedience to God's commands and doing the right things. They say that reading the Bible and praying is legalistic. I admit that there are those who do the right things with the wrong motives which may be legalism but God calls for a change of heart not a presumption of grace. When Israel was doing the right things with the wrong heart God didn't say to stop doing the right things and leave it at that. God called for a change of heart. When Jesus got after the Pharisees for having the wrong motive He desired them to have a change of heart, not to turn their back on the things which were right. If our heart is not in it, let us continue to walk in obedience and ask God to change our hearts and renew our minds instead of walking in disobedience. Please don't misunderstand; grace is vital. I love grace; I probably need grace more than the next fellow but we must not be presumptuous of God's grace; we ought not to abuse it. Time and again we are called to obedience. Our obedience won't be perfect; this is one reason we need grace; but, we ought not to stop walking in obedience just because we don't feel like it and just rename it legalism. Our obedience doesn't gain us entrance into heaven but our obedience, especially when we don't feel like it, does show that we love God. It shows an appreciation for His grace. We all know that salvation is by grace ALONE; however, we also know that grace is neither a license to sin nor a free pass to neglect the commandments of God. The apostle John specifically wrote the letter of 1 John so that people could be assured of their salvation. Let us never hang our helmet of salvation solely on the hook of "cheap grace" or "sinning grace" (neither sins of commission nor sins of omission) lest we find that it was not the solid hook of grace but rather a "rubber hook" of false religion, false belief, or false doctrine which allows that helmet to come clattering to the floor. God's word gives us assurances to go by, we need not make up our own. Even the apostle Paul tells us to examine ourselves to see if we are in the faith. Dear reader, may this outline bring courage and/or conviction to you, whichever the Holy Ghost deems necessary in your life. These are the assurances which John gives us so that we may know we are saved. (Please read 1 John 2) 1. We Keep His Commandments: (v.3) —Notice the dangerous indictments in verse 4 and the encouragement in verse 5. Time and again we are called to obedience. 2. We Walk AS He Walked (v 6) —Your walk is your lifestyle, your actions, words, and thoughts. 3. We Love the Brethren (v 10) —Again, notice the indictments in v 9 and 11. 4. We Hate the World (v 15-17) —In each of these verses there is a word of warning to those who love the world and the things of this world. BEWARE! and BE AWARE! 5. We Do Righteousness (v. 29) —This is NOT legalism. This is the supernatural response of the Christian. It is no longer we who live but Christ living IN us and THROUGH us. To do these things is NOT a salvation by works but rather it is a salvation THAT works. To deny these things by renaming them "legalism" or saying that it is "denying grace" is to deny the word of God and is foolishly dangerous. Let us not be bewitched by vain philosophies and false doctrines. Instead, let God be true and every man a liar. If you are a Christian the above assurances should be evident in your life. What the Rich Man Saw From Hell

19. There was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day: 20 And there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores, 21 And desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. 22 And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; 23 And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. 24 And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame. 25 But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented. 26 And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence. 27 Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house: 28 For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. 29 Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them. 30 And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent. 31 And he said unto him, If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead. Luke 16:19-31

I want to challenge the Believer to catch a glimpse of Hell. Do we weep anymore for the lost? Here is a text that most Believers has heard, read and told many times in their lives, yet it is a story that is not preached much anymore. In preparing for this message I began to think when is the last time I have heard an entire sermon preached on this subject, and to be honest I could not remember. Ladies and Gentlemen the Church is in desperate need of catching a glimpse of hell. The everyday Christian has forgotten the reality of hell. It is mean and harsh to preach on the subject of eternal damnation. It is more important to make people feel good than to share with them the truth of eternal separation from God. I pray by looking at our text we will not be stirred but broken, that we will not be touched but changed. It is my prayer that through this message we will once again weep for those who are lost and are on their way to hell. So what did the Rich Man See from Hell? 1. He Saw Paradise Prepared (vs.22-23) 22 And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; 23 And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. John 14:1-3 - Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. 2 In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. 2. He Saw His Present Pain (vs.23-24) 23 And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. 24 And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame. Matthew 8:12 - But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Mark 9:43-48 - And if thy hand offend thee, cut it off: it is better for thee to enter into life maimed, than having two hands to go into hell, into the fire that never shall be quenched: 44 Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched. 45 And if thy foot offend thee, cut it off: it is better for thee to enter halt into life, than having two feet to be cast into hell, into the fire that never shall be quenched: 46 Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched. 47 And if thine eye offend thee, pluck it out: it is better for thee to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire: 48 Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched. 3. He Saw Passing Into Heaven Impossible (vs. 25-26) But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented. 26 And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence. Matthew 25:41 - Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels: 4. He Saw The Need Of Other People (vs. 27-29) 27 Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house: 28 For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. 29 Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them. Matthew 7:13-14 - Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: 14 Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it. Revelation 20:11-15 - And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them. 12 And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works. 13 And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works. 14 And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. 15 And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire. 5. He Saw The Importance Of Preaching (vs. 29-31) In horrible anguish and pain he realized what it would take to keep his family from coming to hell. 29 Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them. 30 And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent. 31 And he said unto him, If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead. 1st Corinthians 1:21 - For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe. Mark 1:15 - And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel. 2nd Peter 3:9-10 - The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. 10 But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. 1st Corinthians 2:2 - For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified. I pray as you have read over this message that it will stir you to pray for the lost as well as share the gospel with everyone you meet.

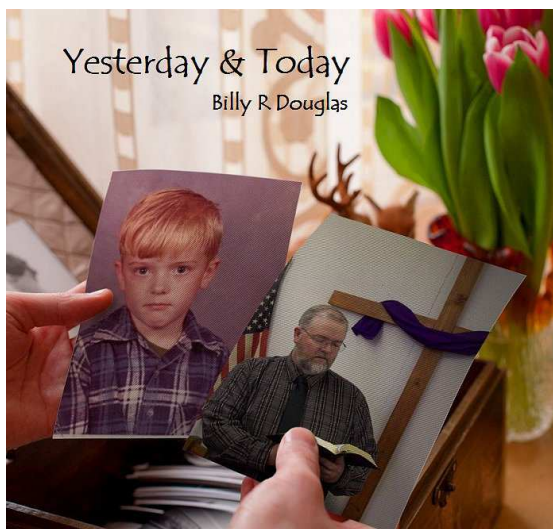

I Don't Think God is Listening

"I will greatly praise the LORD with my mouth; yea, I will praise him among the multitude." Psalm 109:30 (KJV)

Here in Psalm 109 David takes God's comforts to himself, but in a very humble manner, and without boasting. O God, whom I praise, do not remain silent. He talks about the wicked and deceitful men who have opened their mouths against him; they have spoken against him with lying tongues. With words of hatred they surrounded him; they attack him without cause. They repaid him with evil for good, and hatred for his friendship. They falsely accused him, but David was a man of prayer. During this time period, David sees no evidence that God cares. Everything David does is met with stubborn opposition and expressions of hatred. Here he describes his experience with betrayal. Few experiences are more painful than betrayal. Yet David keeps crying out to God and telling Him all he is going through. He tells God that he is poor and needed and that his heart is wounded. David says his knees are weak because he has been fasting. He ask God to help him. It seems like God is not there. Have you ever felt that way? Have you ever felt that God was not there, that He is not hearing your prayers. I can assure you that God is there. Sometimes He is quiet so He can strengthen us. To help us, even though it does not seem like it. He wants us to become stronger Christians. David was feeling betrayed. Forgiveness can be given freely, but trust must be earned. Matthew 6:14-15 "For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (KJV) God wants for each of us to learn the power of forgiveness. Do not speak against those who betray you. We all need to learn to stop condemning each other. Some of us are betrayed but some of us use gossip to betray others. We need to live in such a way that we do not cause another believer to stumble and fall. We also need to live in such a way that the non believer will see Christ in us. God wants us to pray for those who have hurt us. Ask the Lord to give you a gentle spirit. While on the cross, Jesus cried out to the Father for man-kinds forgiveness. He asked God to forgive those who were crucifying Him for those who had turned their back on Him. These are reasons God sometimes allows us to go through the hurt and betrayals that we have to face from others. By going through these trials we become stonger Christians. Determine in your heart to be a person of loyalty and integrity. Determine to be Christlike at all times and in situations. Let's God's Holy Spirit guide you. Remember even when it seems as if God does not hear you. He does and he is watching out for you. God did hear David's prayers He loved David. During this time God was strengthening David and helping him to grow spiritually. Through it all David says in Psalm 109:30 "I will greatly praise the LORD with my mouth; yea, I will praise him among the multitude." Can you say that in the midst of your troubles? Lord keep us strong. No matter what we go through Lord help us to remain faithful. We love you Lord and we know that you are always there and that you do watch over us and hear our prayer.
