### The Great Price of Freedom

And the chief captain answered, With a great sum obtained I this freedom...

Acts 22:28

In the above passage of scripture we read a statement by the chief captain to the Apostle Paul that really isn't meant in the exact line of thought that brought this article about. But while reading this chapter a few days ago the words found in this

verse jumped off the page at me and left me in tears. "With great sum obtained I this freedom"... when I read that I begin to think about the "great sum", the price, THE RANSOM that was paid for us. The price given that we might have eternal life through Christ Jesus and His death on the cross. I want to share with you something that you may or may not have heard before but I pray that in some way it drives home the point that I am trying to make. There was once a big turntable bridge which spanned a large river. During most of the day, the bridge sat with the length running up and down the river parallel with the banks allowing ships to pass freely on both sides of the bridge. But, at certain times of the day, a certain train would come along and the bridge would be turned sideways across the river allowing the train to cross. A switchman sat in a small shack on one side of the river where he operated the controls to turn the bridge and lock it into place when the train crossed. One evening when the switchman was waiting for the last train of the day to come, he looked off into the distance through the dimming twilight and caught sight of the train's light. He stepped to the controls and waited until the train was at a prescribed distance when he was to turn the bridge. He turned the bridge into position, but to his horror, he found that the locking control didn't work. If the bridge was not locked securely into position, it would wobble back and forth and the ends when the train came to it, causing the train to jump the track and go crashing into the river. This would be a passenger train with many people aboard. He left the shack with the bridge turned across the river and hurried to the other side of the river where there was a lever which he could use to operate the lock manually. He could hear the rumble of the train now and leaned back-ward to apply his weight to it, locking the bridge. Many lives depended upon this man's strength. Then, coming across the bridge from the other direction, he heard a sound that made his blood run cold. "Daddy, where are you?" His four-year-old son was crossing the bridge to look for him. His first instinct was to cry out to the child, "Run! Run!" But the train was too close. The tiny feet would never make it across the bridge in time. The man almost left the lever to run and snatch up his son and carry him to safety, but he realized he could not get back to the lever in time. Either the people on the train or his son must die. He took just a moment to make his decision. The train sped swiftly and safely on its way and no one on board was even aware of the tiny, broken body thrown mercilessly into the river by the rushing train. Nor were they aware of the pitiful figure of a sobbing man still clinging tightly to the locking lever long after the train had passed. They didn't see him walking home more slowly than he had ever walked before to tell his wife of the choice he had made and of the loss of their son. I realize that this may not be as clear of a picture of Calvary as one would hope. But if somehow we can begin to comprehend the emotions that went through this man's heart, maybe we can get a glimpse, if even a small one of the great love of our Heavenly Father when He sacrificed His Son to bridge the gap between us and eternal life. And of the GREAT PRICE that was paid..." With a great sum obtained I this freedom..." Such mercy, such unselfish love has never been known before or since than that of the love of the Father when he gave His only Son for a lost and dying world. And not just the Father BUT in the story the little boy didn't have a choice in what happened BUT in the great plan of redemption the SON...Jesus Christ did have a choice. He chose to lay down His life so that we can live. Can there be any wonder that the earth trembled and the skies grew dark as Jesus hung there on the cross when the great price for the plan of redemption was paid. Sadly most of mankind just like those on the train speed along through life without giving a thought to what was done or of the great sacrifice that was made. Those on the train didn't even know what the Father had done for them...much of the world doesn't know either and its up to us...not just to be thankful everyday, EVERY MOMENT of our lives for the price paid for our freedom BUT to also tell those who do not know of this wonderful act of love done on their behalf. LORD may we never lose sight of the great sacrifice made for us!

### **Easy Cheesy Potatoes**

1 lb. baking potatoes (about 3), cut into 1/2-inch chunks

1/2 lb. VELVEETA®, cut into 1/2-inch cubes 1/2 cup chopped onions

1/4 cup KRAFT Real Mayo Mayonnaise 4 slices OSCAR MAYER Bacon, cooked, crumbled

HEAT oven to 375°F. COMBINE all ingredients except bacon in 8-inch square baking dish sprayed with cooking spray; cover. BAKE 45 min. TOP with bacon; bake, uncovered, 5 to 10 min. or until potatoes are tender.

### **Coconut Cream Cheese Cake**

1 c margarine, softened (2 sticks) 6 oz cream cheese, softened

6 eggs Extra Large

2 c sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

2 1/4 c cake flour

1/4 c cream of coconut (optional)

#### **FROSTING**

1/2 c margarine, softened

8 oz cream cheese, softened

1 tsp vanilla

3 c confectioners' sugar

1 c coconut- for toasting and sprinkling on top of the frosting

Preheat oven to 350. Prepare a 9 x 13 pan with non stick cooking spray. Cream together butter, cream cheese and sugar. Beat in eggs one at a time, vanilla and then mix in flour. Add cream of coconut. Spread batter into prepared pan. Bake 35 to 40 minutes or until wooden pick comes out clean. As the cake cools it will fall, that's normal, it's not thick like a regular cake. Cool on cooling rack. **Frosting:** Beat together butter, cheese, vanilla and add sugar. Mix until well blended. Toast coconut in a lightly sprayed skillet and keep tossing until golden. Gently place cake on cake taker. Frost and sprinkle with toasted coconut.

### REESIE'S RECIPES

### **Cheesy Bacon Brunch Casserole**

8 slices OSCAR MAYER Bacon, chopped
2 cups frozen shredded hash browns, thawed
1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced
1 each green and red pepper, chopped
1 small onion, chopped
12 eggs

1/3 cup Sour Cream

3/4 lb. (12 oz.) VELVEETA, cut into 1/2-inch cubes

HEAT oven to 350°F. COOK bacon in large skillet on medium heat 10 min. or until crisp. Remove bacon from skillet with slotted spoon; drain on paper towels. Discard all but 2 Tbsp. drippings from skillet. ADD potatoes, mushrooms, peppers and onions to reserved drippings in skillet; cook 10 min. or until peppers and onions are crisp-tender, stirring occasionally. Stir in

VELVEETA. Spoon into 13x9-inch baking dish sprayed with cooking spray. WHISK eggs and sour cream in medium bowl until blended; stir in bacon. Pour over vegetable mixture. BAKE 40 min. or until center is set and casserole is heated through.

#### **Chicken and Rice Bake**

1 can (10 1/2 oz) Cream of Mushroom soup 1 1/3 cup water

3/4 cup uncooked long grain white rice
1/4 teaspoon paprika

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

Stir the soup, water, rice, paprika and black pepper in an 11x8x2-inch baking dish. Top with the chicken. Season with additional paprika and black pepper. Cover the baking dish. Bake at 375°F. for 45 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through and the rice is tender. Let stand for 10 minutes. Stir the rice before serving.



### **The Virtuous Woman**

Devotions from the book of Proverbs by Brother Steven Huston

Proverbs 31:1 "The words of king Lemuel, the prophecy that his mother taught him." The name Lemuel means "unto God" or "one dedicated unto God." The virtuous woman is a godly woman who dedicates her children and those in her sphere of influence to the Lord. She is a woman who, like Hannah of old, yearns for motherly influence and directs the steps of her "children" in the nurture, admonition, and fear of the Lord, dedicating and preparing them for the Lord's service. She weeps in prayer for them with a heart focused on God and their good. "The prophecy" is actually a burden. Her heart is burdened with divine wisdom from God and she feels that it is her divine duty to impart this godly wisdom to her children with an urgency for their own soul and a heart of love for her Creator. Her desire is for her divine Bridegroom and that her "children" may grow to love Him as she does and that they may become like their "Father," imitating His perfect love, His holiness, mercy, compassion and love of Truth. This burden is placed upon her by God and for God. "that his mother taught him." We are all teaching something; what is it that you are teaching? The virtuous woman teaches by example. She shows a love for God and leads by diligence. She walks in wisdom, integrity and purity. She teaches with her words, her heart, and her walk. (Read Titus 2:3-5) Heavenly Father, help me to impart Your wisdom to my "children." May Your princes and princesses learn to walk in Your righteousness by Your living example through me. Amen.

Proverbs 31:2 "What, my son? and what, the son of my womb? and what, the son of my vows?" What shall I say? What shall I teach? What is the mind of God that I should instruct my "child" in the Lord's fear and admonition? Remember, this is your "son," your sphere of influence. It's a special God-given relationship for which you are responsible and will some day give an account for. What shall you say for their safety and yours? This is of your womb; it's not just about your sphere but it's about you as well. Every child is a special part of his mother. You painfully bore him and you, sometimes painfully, bear a responsibility to point others to their Creator. With this in mind, what shall you say? Is there anything which can outweigh the influence of a godly mother? She vows to dedicate and lead her "children" to the Lord and His service. She prays with her heart and tears that her "child" would never be the prey of Satan. Dedicating herself and her sphere to the Lord is not enough; she prayerfully teaches, trains, and leads others to the Lord with the urgency felt from her vow to do so. If we would have more men of such godly influence as Samuel, we must first have more virtuous women as Hannah. O Creator and Giver of Life, give me the words to say, the patience to teach, and burden my heart with an urgency to do so IN YOUR STRENGTH. Remind me daily, it's ALL about You, not about me. I thank You for the sphere You have given me. May I be diligent in fulfilling Your will. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Proverbs 31:3 "Give not thy strength unto women, nor thy ways to that which destroyeth kings." Are you praying for discernment? This mother knew her son's tendencies well enough to give him warning. These warnings may have come from knowing their generational tendencies or he may have already shown these besetting enticements in his own life. Regardless, she loved her son enough to give godly counsel, warn against sin, and encourage him in a righteous walk befitting of kings and princes. The virtuous woman is strong enough to give godly counsel to those in her sphere; she loves enough to warn and to speak truth into their lives. Whether accepted or rejected she stands strong and speaks truth because she loves God and she loves her "children." It was godly counsel for the law warned against taking many wives (Deuteronomy 17:17). It ran contrary to God's perfect design for marriage—one man, one woman, in sacred covenant with God, for life. Had Solomon followed after this advice he would have continued to walk in wisdom, his heart would have kept in tune with God, and perhaps his kingdom would not have been divided (I Kings 11:3). Lemuel and Christians today are soundly warned against licentiousness. We would do well to use our liberty as the apostle Paul exhorts, "...only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another." (Galatians 5:13) Father, give me discernment by Your Spirit and by Your strength may I speak truth which is timely. I plead in Jesus' name, Amen.

### "Are You A Full Gospel Christian?" conclusion

Acts 19:1-2, 6 - And it came to pass, that, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper coasts came to Ephesus: and finding certain disciples, 2 He said unto them, Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost. 6 And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Ghost came on them; and they spake with tongues, and prophesied. Declare the "full gospel" message of the God-given power that comes with the baptism with the Holy Spirit, with the evidence of speaking in tongues. This Holy Spirit baptism is completely distinct from water baptism — Acts 1:5 - For John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence. Jesus made it unequivocally clear that water baptism and Holy Spirit baptism are two entirely distinct experiences. The reception of God's power when we are filled with the Spirit is "good news" that is too infrequently preached from pulpits today. Acts 3:2-7 - And a certain man lame from his mother's womb was carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask alms of them that entered into the temple; 3 Who seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple asked an alms. 4 And Peter, fastening his eyes upon him with John, said, Look on us. 5 And he gave heed unto them, expecting to receive something of them. 6 Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk. 7 And he took him by the right hand, and lifted him up: and immediately his feet and ankle bones received strength. Declare the "full gospel" message of divine healing. For the sick and infirm, the promise of divine healing is "good news" indeed! It is an integral part of the full gospel. Mark 16:17 - And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; Declare the "full gospel" message of deliverance from demons. Unbelievers can be greatly vexed by demons, even to the point of demon possession. The full-gospel message is that "those who believe ... will drive out demons". John 14:12 - Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father. Declare the "full gospel" message of the authority of the believer. If we believe, we can do mighty works like those that Jesus did — "the works that I do shall he [the believer] do also." The commission from Jesus Christ to us, His people, is to do His works and even greater! Mark 11:21-23 - And Peter calling to remembrance saith unto him, Master, behold, the fig tree which thou cursedst is withered away. 22 And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God. 23 For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith. Declare the "full gospel" message of mountain-moving faith. Great obstacles can be surmounted by faith in God. Mighty miracles are possible through faith in God. When Peter marveled at the miracle Jesus had performed, Jesus replied simply, "Have faith in God." 1st Corinthians 1:7-8 - So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ: 8 Who shall also confirm you unto the end, that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. There is not a shred of evidence in the New Testament that God intended the supernatural spiritual gifts to die out early in the Church Age. To the contrary, the Scriptures clearly teach that the gifts of the Holy Spirit are for today as well as for the early Church. Declare the "full gospel" message of the Hebrews 6 fundamentals of our Christian faith. Hebrews 6:1-2 - Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, 2 Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment. In sum, let's purpose to follow Paul's apostolic example, to "fully preach the gospel" and to "declare ... all the counsel of God." That will include (but not be limited to): 1. Repentance 2. Salvation; being born again 3. Water baptism 4. The baptism with the Holy Spirit 5. Speaking in tongues as the evidence of our Spirit baptism 6. Gifts of the Spirit 7. Power over demons 8. The authority of the believer 9. Mountain-moving faith 10. Doing the mighty works Jesus did 11. The Hebrews 6:1-2 foundational truths of our faith.
