The ONLY Way of Escape

Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God. Psalms 20:7

An old Indian chief constantly spoke of the Lord Jesus and what He meant to him. "Why do you talk so much about Jesus?" asked a friend. The old chief did not reply, but slowly, deliberately gathered some sticks and bits of grass. He made a circle of them. In the circle he placed a caterpillar. Still silent, he struck a match and lit the sticks and grass. They watched the caterpillar. As the fire caught around the circle, the trapped caterpillar began to crawl around rapidly, seeking a way to escape. As the fire advanced, the helpless caterpillar raised its head as high as it could. If the creature could have spoken, it would have said, "My help can only come from above." Then the old chief stooped down. He extended his finger to the caterpillar which crawled up his finger to safety. "That," said the chief glowing, "was what the Lord Jesus did for me! I was lost in sin. My condition was hopeless. I was trapped. Then the Lord Jesus stooped down in love and mercy and He drew me out of the horrible pit of sin and shame. How can I help but love Him and talk of His wondrous love and care?"

We see in the above passage from the book of Psalms the great singer of Israel speak of those who trust in things other than the LORD. And then he testifies of his trust and states his faith when he writes "BUT WE will remember the name of the LORD!" David being the king of Israel knew all too well of men and leaders who trusted in their numbers or their power...he also knew the folly of that. We see over and over in the history of God's people that their victories came by only one means and that was not the arm of the flesh or the power or might of their men BUT in the God that they served! What are you trusting in today? The statement that David made could just as easily read like this..."Some trust in works, some in their own righteousness, BUT we will remember the name of the LORD our God!" There is only one place in which true victory can be found today and that is in looking to Jesus Christ and His victory...His finished work on the cross of Calvary. The flesh can never bring true victory...the world can never bring true victory. The prophet Isaiah put it like this in Isaiah 31:1 "Woe to them that go down to Egypt for help; and stay on horses, and trust in chariots, because they are many; and in horsemen, because they are very strong: but they look not unto the Holy One of Israel, neither seek the LORD!" That same "woe" is pronounced upon anyone and everyone who would seek victory or salvation by any other means than faith in what Jesus has done. The only way that we will ever know true VICTORY is when we realize that it is not found in our might, power or ability...BUT only in HIM! As long as we continue to try and be "good enough" on our own we will continue to fail! Thank God today that through faith in what Jesus did on the Cross we can enter into HIS victory and be partakers of the Glorious work that was done there. Like the caterpillar in the story that we started with we will die trying to save ourselves, we will go around in circles looking for a way out in vain UNTIL we look up...until we look to THE WAY! Until we look to Him! For there is no life, no salvation, no justification or sanctification outside of Jesus and His finished work. Right standing before God cannot be found in our own works or faith in self. It is found only when we turn away from that and turn our faith toward Him...God who became flesh to accomplish what we never could or never can! Stop leaning to the arm of the flesh today...the only escape from the hopeless situation that you are in is to LOOK TO HIM!!

There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make **a way to escape**, that ye may be able to bear it. 1 Corinthians 10:13

The way of escape is ALWAYS through faith in Jesus and His finished work! What HE has done and not what we can do...Until next time may the LORD bless and keep you is my prayer, Pastor Billy R Douglas

REESIE'S RECIPES

Chocolate Covered Strawberry Cobbler

1 cup butter, cubed
1-1/2 cups self-rising flour
2-1/4 cups sugar, divided
3/4 cup 2% milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/3 cup baking cocoa
4 cups fresh strawberries, quartered
2 cups boiling water

Whipped cream and additional strawberries

Preheat oven to 350°. Place butter in a 13x9-in. baking pan; heat pan in oven 3-5 minutes or until butter is melted. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, combine flour, 1-1/4 cups sugar, milk and vanilla until well blended. In a small bowl, mix cocoa and remaining sugar. Remove baking pan from oven; add batter. Sprinkle with strawberries and cocoa mixture; pour boiling water evenly over top (do not stir). Bake 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into cake portion comes out clean. Let stand 10 minutes. Serve warm with whipped cream and additional strawberries.

Sausage & Cornbread Stuffed Mushrooms

20 large fresh mushrooms (1 lb.), cleaned, stems and gills removed

1/4 lb. breakfast pork sausage

1 cup STOVE TOP Cornbread Stuffing Mix (about 1/2 of 6-oz. pkg.)

1 cup water

2 Tbsp. chopped fresh parsley Heat oven to 450°F.

Place wire rack on foil-covered rimmed baking sheet. Place mushrooms, cap sides up, on rack. Bake 15 min. Meanwhile, brown sausage in medium nonstick skillet. Add stuffing mix, water and parsley; mix well. Remove mushrooms from wire rack; drain on paper towel-covered plate. Remove and discard foil (with mushroom liquid) from baking sheet. Spoon sausage mixture into mushrooms. Return to baking sheet (without rack). Bake 10 min. or until heated through.

Sweet Tart Cucumber Salad

10 pickling cucumbers (or 3 medium cucumbers, thinly sliced)

1 tbsp salt (divided)

2 cups white vinegar

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup lemon juice

3 tsps celery seed

1 tsp pepper

2 onions (medium, halved and thinly sliced)

Place cucumbers in a colander over a plate; sprinkle with 1 tablespoon salt and toss. Let stand 30 minutes. Drain. In a small bowl, whisk vinegar, sugar, lemon juice, celery seed, pepper and remaining salt until blended. In a large bowl, combine cucumbers and onions. Pour dressing over cucumber mixture; toss to coat. Refrigerate, covered, at least 2 hours before serving.

Taco Meatballs with dipping sauce

1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chilies2 tablespoons taco seasoning1 pound lean ground beef (90% lean)

3 ounces Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, cut into 16 cubes

1 large egg white

1 tablespoon water

1-2/3 cups crushed nacho-flavored tortilla chips

SAUCE:

1/3 cup taco sauce

3 tablespoons honey

Preheat oven to 400. In a large bowl combine chilies and taco seasoning. Add beef and mix thoroughly. Divide into 16 portions. Shape each one around a cheese cube covering it completely. In a shallow bowl whisk egg white and water. Place crushed chips in a separate bowl. Dip meatballs in egg mixture then in crushed chips, coating each ball. Place meatballs on a greased rack in a 15x10x1inch baking pan. Bake 15-20 minutes or until done. Meanwhile in a small microwave safe bowl mix taco sauce and honey. Microwave covered on high 30-45 seconds or until hot. Serve sauce with meatballs.



Stop Trifling With God and Sin

And Elijah came unto all the people, and said, How long halt ye between two opinions? if the LORD be God, follow him: but if Baal, then follow him. And the people answered him not a word. 1 Kings 18:21

If there is ANY area of your life that you think should be outside the touch or thought of the Church (Jesus, our Lord and Saviour)...think again. We—the Church, the body of Christ—should be speaking into every area of life. If the Bible talks about it...we should obey Him and speak to it. Friends, we will either act on truth or acclimate to sin! Whenever we compromise with truth, it's a compromise with sin. Whenever we compromise with sin, we become acclimated to it. Oh church! How long will you waver between two opinions? If the Lord is God, if Jesus is LORD, follow Him; but if the world is God, then follow him. Stop playing and start praying! Stop pretending and start contending! Stop clinging to carnality and starting clinging to the cross! What holds your affection? If it's not Jesus, you're faltering, you're wavering between two opinions. "Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." (James 4:4) God desires to be number one on a list of one! He calls us to faithful and holy living! How long will you waver between your evil glorifying television shows, the pornography on your computer, and a pure mind? How long will you waver between those temporal attractions that want to rob you of eternal blessings? You can't have it both ways; they are in direct opposition to each other! How long will you waver between the world and Jesus? The Jesus of the Bible demands the denying of self while the "church" of today allows the gratifying of self; both cannot be right. CHOOSE! The Biblical Jesus insists on separation from the world while the "church" of today permits you to enjoy its friendship; both cannot be right. CHOOSE! The real Jesus requires the uncompromising mortification of sin while the "church" allows you to trifle with it, wink at it, and walk with it. Both cannot be right; CHOOSE! Jesus—the TRUTH—He calls for full surrender while the "church" is content with half-hearted commitment; both cannot be right. CHOOSE! The devil's not afraid of half-hearted surrender; but he knows that a man or woman that is fully surrendered to the Holy One, the Holy child, the Holy Spirit is a danger to his work. It's time to reclaim surrendered ground! It's time to stop wavering and start reclaiming! It's time to stop wavering between who is in control of your life. It's time to choose. It's time to stop playing with the world and Jesus; it's time to rise up and be the church victorious that we are called to be! We are told about perilous times...they are here! We are told to redeem the time because the days are evil...they're here! We are told to be a light...the darkness is all around us so shine BRIGHT! pointing to the Father! It's past time for the church to ARISE! But just because we're late doesn't mean we shouldn't bother. Stand! BE BOLD!!! Preach the truth in season and outta season. Speak the truth with all longsuffering and doctrine. Preach Jesus! He's ENOUGH! He'll fill that void you're trying to fill with entertainment...with friends...with food, drugs, alcohol, romance...whatever you're shoving in that Christ-less, ever-hungry void will NOT fill it or you. Only Jesus is enough to make you feel complete. ONLY Jesus is enough to fulfill you! ONLY JESUS is the way to heaven regardless of what others may say within or without the church. Come to Calvary! The LORD hear thee in the day of trouble; the name of the God of Jacob defend thee; 2 Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Zion 3 Remember all thy offerings, and accept thy burnt sacrifice; Selah 4 Grant thee according to thine own heart, and fulfil all thy counsel. 5 We will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the LORD fulfil all thy petitions. 6 Now know I that the LORD saveth his anointed; he will hear him from his holy heaven with the saving strength of his right hand. 7 Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God. 8 They are brought down and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright. 9 Save, LORD: let the king hear us when we call.

When trouble comes your way, to whom do you run to bail you out? When you have overwhelming needs, who do seek out to meet those needs? When you just can't do it your self and you need someone to give you a helping hand to make it through, who do you reach out to for help? You may feel like there is no one you can run to but I've got good news there is One you can run to for refuge from the storm. One who will hear when you call for help. One who will hold your hand and see you through the darkest night. I. There is help for those weighed down with trouble. Job 5:7 - Yet man is born unto trouble, as the sparks fly upward. Job 14:1 - Man that is born of a woman is of few days and full of trouble. Trouble as used in the Bible means distress or adversity. Sometimes life throws you a curve ball and you find yourself face to face with problems or crises. One behemoth of nothing but trouble. At one time or another we all will face giants in our lives. Giants that come as unconquerable and insurmountable problems and concerns. Goliaths! Even if we did try to surmount these obstacles we're quickly slam dunked only to face other giants. Someone has said "Inside every large problem is a series of small problems struggling to get out." Failing one giant often only unleashes a boatload of other adversity. When these giants come the first place we often run to is our family, friends, the government - everywhere but where we should seek refuge. The help of man is at best limited. Psalms 60:11 - Give us help from trouble: for vain is the help of man. From a human standpoint, there is no solution for the problems in the world today. Isaiah 31:1 - Woe to them that go down to Egypt for help; and stay on horses, and trust in chariots, because they are many; and in horsemen, because they are very strong; but they look not unto the Holy One of Israel, neither seek the LORD! Psalm 46:1 - God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Often we wonder why God allows the storms to enter our life but as Erwin Lutzer has said. "God often puts us in situations that are too much for us so that we will learn that no situation is too much for him." Psalms 107:28 - Then they cry unto the LORD in their trouble, and he bringeth them out of their distresses. "In order to realize the worth of the anchor, we need to feel the stress of the storm." Psalms 9:9 - The LORD also will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in times of trouble. 1st Corinthians 10:13 - There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it. II. There is help for those who have great need. Hebrews 4:16 - Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need. Need refers to lacking the necessities of life, to be in want. Luke 15:14-16 - And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want.15And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine.16And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him. Psalms 72:12 - For he shall deliver the needy when he crieth; the poor also, and him that hath no helper. Few of us know the severe poverty that is a desperate problem throughout the world. Among the 4.4 billion people who live in developing countries, Three-fifths have no access to basic sanitation; Almost one-third is without safe drinking water; One-quarter lack adequate housing: One-fifth lives beyond reach of modern health services; One-fifth of the children do not get as far as grade five in school and one-fifth are undernourished. While most of us may not be impoverished, many of us still have needs. While we may not be financially destitute, many are going through extreme financial difficulties; some are faced with emotional or marital difficulties. Many children are in need of compassion and understanding.

Story for Today: *Marci was so tired of always having to clean up after Stephanie! Here she was once again, cleaning their bedroom. She knew that some of the things that were out of place were her fault, but, if Stephanie would just take care of her stuff it wouldn't look so bad and they wouldn't have to be cleaning again! It seemed like an endless chore. Marci knew that many times in the past she had been the one leaving the dirty clothes and toys out, but, it seemed lately it was more of Stephanie's things that she was picking up and putting away. She knew that she had a basket of folded laundry that still needed to be put away, but why bother when the room would still be a mess. And many times it was easy to leave her pajamas on the floor and the bed unmade because the room was a mess anyway. So, here she was once again cleaning up her mess and Stephanie's too! Before you begin to think that Stephanie was off playing, let me tell you that she was cleaning too. She was on the floor next to Marci. She was busy picking up all the dirty clothes. Yes, both hers and Marci's. She had finished putting the puzzle away that they had been working on last week that was left on the floor and was almost done picking up the clothes. Stephanie was Marci's little sister and she knew that sometimes she left things a mess. She was still learning how to be responsible. She knew that Marci really didn't like sharing a room with her and often felt hurt by her sister's actions and words. She knew a lot of what Marci said was true. She thought about how she had not been doing a good job of keeping her stuff cleaned up and how she kept blaming Stephanie when she should have been being a better example. Marci decided that she would make some changes. She knew how to take care of her stuff and she would do it no matter how messy the room looked. Maybe Stephanie would see her and decide to keep her stuff cleaned up too!

Questions for Today: *How about you? Do you overlook the wrong in your life and focus on the same things that others are doing wrong? Do you, like Marci, try to blame others when really you need to be the good example that may help others change their life? God encourages us to do good to others. He wants us to live for Him and do all of our work like it is for Him. If you have trouble because you are looking at what others are doing, remember that God's Word is our standard, not those around us!
