Three O'Clock Prayer

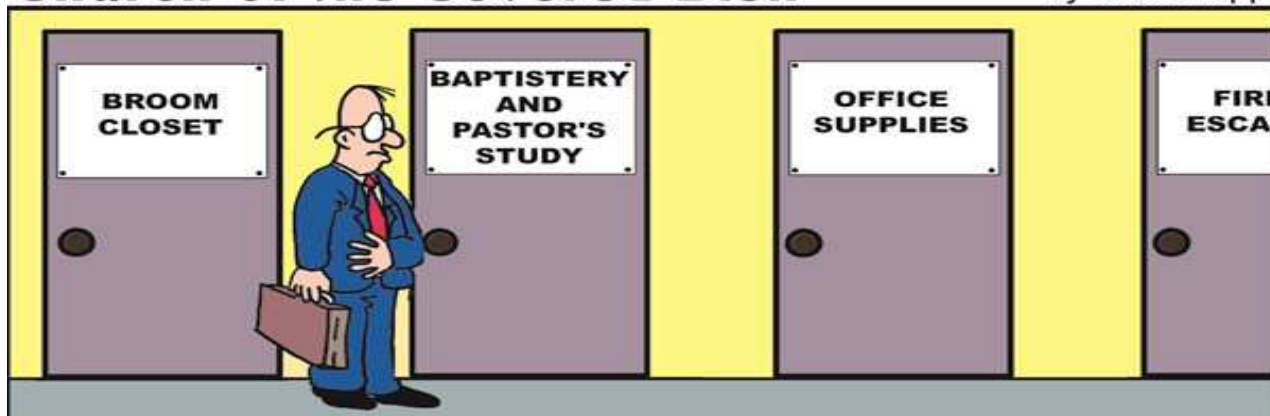
On a cold barren hillside, on a foreign campaign The troops were surrounded, and shells fell like rain

The young man had lost his job and didn't know which way to turn. So he went to see the old preacher. Pacing about the preacher's study, the young man ranted about his problem. Finally he clenched his fist and shouted, "I've begged God to say something to help me. Tell me, Preacher, why doesn't God answer?" The old preacher, who sat across the room, spoke something in reply -- something so hushed it was indistinguishable. The young man stepped across the room. "What did you say?" he asked. The preacher repeated himself, but again in a tone as soft as a whisper. So the young man moved closer until he was leaning on the old preacher's chair. He was close enough now he could hear the preacher breath...close enough he could almost hear the beating of his heart. "Sorry," he said. "I still didn't hear you." With their heads bent together, the old preacher spoke once more. "God sometimes whispers," he said, "so we will move closer to hear Him." This time the young man heard and he understood.

The author of the above story is "unknown" to me but what a powerful truth it brings out. So many times we cannot hear the voice of the LORD because of the "noise" that we are making. Sometimes maybe it is because our attention and focus is on the noise of the storm that is going on around us. Whatever the noise, we all want God's voice to thunder from the Heavens with the answer to our problem. But many times, more times than not...God's voice is the still, small voice...the gentle whisper. Perhaps as the story reveals there's a reason for that. Think about it...nothing draws our attention quite like a whisper. Everyone of us have been in a place where someone whispered something to someone else and our first thought was "I wonder what they are whispering about?" We have all been talking with someone and for whatever reason they whispered something to us...and maybe we had to move closer to hear what they were saying! When God whispers we must stop our ranting, we must focus on Him. We must move closer to Him. Until we are close enough to hear Him breath...until we are close enough to hear the very heartbeat of God. And then, as He whispers...as we listen, we will find our answer. Better still, we will find ourselves closer to God. In the world that we live in it is so very hard to find a quiet place. There is always something going on. People around us, televisions on, music playing...telephones ringing or making noise! It would be spiritual health to our bones if we would make it a habit to take our Bible and get alone with the LORD. Away from people, away from the hustle the bustle and the noise of everyday life. And just give HIM our complete and total attention. Like John the beloved oh what a revelation we could have of Him if we would spend some time with our head on his breast....listening to Him breath, listening to His heartbeat...hearing His whisper! As I close this month I want to leave you with the words of a beautiful old hymn that carries a timeless message....

Shut in with God in a secret place, there in the Spirit beholding His Face. Finding more power to run in this race, O how I long to be shut in with God! Shut in with God while kneeling in prayer, Finding His Beauty and Glory there. I bow in wonder at His awesome Grace, As He shuts me in His Holy place. **“Don't Let Distractions Cause You To Miss Your Blessing”**

And straightway Jesus constrained his disciples to get into a ship, and to go before him unto the other side, while he sent the multitudes away. 23 And when he had sent the multitudes away, he went up into a mountain apart to pray: and when the evening was come, he was there alone. 24 But the ship was now in the midst of the sea, tossed with waves: for the wind was contrary. 25 And in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went unto them, walking on the sea. 26 And when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, It is a spirit; and they cried out for fear. 27 But straightway Jesus spake unto them, saying, Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid. 28 And Peter answered him and said, Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water. 29 And he said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus. 30 But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me. 31 And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt? 32 And when they were come into the ship, the wind ceased. 33 Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God. Matthew 14:22-33

People often wonder...“Why didn't God help me?” “Why didn't God answer me?” “Where was God when I needed him?” Often the answer to these questions is that we allowed ourselves to become distracted. Some may say, “No not me...I prayed”, “I sought after God”, “I did what I was supposed to do” and nothing changed. Well then I would like to ask the questions...What made you stop praying? What made you stop seeking God? What made you stop doing what you were supposed to do? Could it be it was because you saw no results taking place, in other words you were distracted by what was not happening. Blessings, faith, and answers are often missed because of distractions. You start out strong and mighty. Your mind is made up that I'm going to wait on God until my change come. But then you realize time is moving on and it seems like nothing still is happening. In fact, it seems like things are getting worse and the small thought “maybe this is not God's will for me” or “maybe God is not with me” creeps in. Once the first distraction takes root, it causes you to take your eyes off of the Lord God Almighty that you are waiting on and instead place your eyes on the situation which seems all so wrong. The more you look at it the more it grows until it now seems bigger than God. Don't be fooled, a distraction does not always have to be a problem or a situation that seems to be getting worse. Sometimes it can be a situation that seems all so right...“I know he's not saved but I believe he really loves me” “I know this job is going to keep me from church but I'll now be able to pay all of my bills” “I know I shouldn't be hanging around those old friends but I'm tired of being by myself” These distractions are going to cause you to miss out on the things God has for you and leave you asking yourself why didn't God help me? God was helping you, but you became distracted before it became manifested. Let's look at the book of Matthew chapter 14. We find the disciples in a ship that was caught in a storm. They see Jesus walking on water towards them. Peter yells out Lord if this is you let me walk on the water and come to you. He receives the answer “come”. Now let's focus on the 30th verse - But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me. The 29th verse tells us that Peter actually walked on the water until he began to look at the boisterous winds and waves. His eyes were taken off of Jesus, he became afraid and then started to sink. Peter became distracted with what was going on around him instead of continuously focusing on Jesus. It's only when you truly come to trust God that you will be able to overcome distractions. However many of us never take the time to learn how to trust God. We see him as a genie in the bottle that's supposed to grant us our every desire. We must learn how to develop faith in the bible and come to know him as the God who is there. The question should not be how can I trust God but rather a strong acclamation-it's God I Trust! No matter what I see, hear or feel...I will trust God. What blessings are in stored for the person that comes to the place of fully trusting God. The storms of life will surely come but let me ask another question...Who is God to you? Is he a god who runs from problems or does he hide himself because he doubts himself? Is he a god that does not know how to help you or maybe your situation took him by surprise and he must now figure out what to do. Of course not, remind yourself from Luke 1:37 - For with God nothing shall be impossible Psalm 84:11 - For the Lord God is a sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. We can't afford to get distracted, but if we do remember this - God's mercy endureth forever. God gladly waits to put you back on the right path. God wants to bless you...He wants to help you...He wants to heal you...He longs to answer you...God has so much in stored for you. So don't let distractions cause you to miss out on the things God has just for you.



Keeping Steady Hands

"But Moses' hands were heavy; and they took a stone, and put it under him, and he sat thereon; and Aaron and Hur stayed up his hands, the one on the one side, and the other on the other side; and his hands were steady until the going down of the sun." Exodus 17:12

Too often the church is tempted to not lift its hands any higher than the society or people that surround it. As believers we are to have a higher standard and we are to maintain that standard even when others around us mock us, drop the standard, or tire. If ever there were a day that steady hands are needed "until the going down of the sun" (the end), today is that day! We must finish well; we must hold the standard of holiness high pointing to Jesus our Saviour who ran the race before us. With His arms and hands raised high as He crossed that heavenly finish line, let us follow such an example. Though your hands grow heavy, you must not allow them to waver. Others are depending upon you—raise them high and keep them steady to the end. The Need for Steady Hands is Great! Even as Joshua depended upon Moses' steady hands, that he and Israel win the day, so people are depending upon you; your nation is depending upon you to keep steady hands, to the very end. You have no idea the number of people who are watching you to see if your hands will remain steady or if they will waver. Some are watching so that they can use it as an opportunity to mock God if your hands falter. Others are watching with amazement and hope. They recognize that if God will help you to remain faithful, He can and will help them to stay faithful "until the going down of the sun." There are battles to be won; but it may depend upon your hands remaining steady. God puts His soldiers in the fray and He raises them for such a time as this. There are those who fight on the front lines and there are those who fight behind the scenes as it were—in the throne room of Grace, before the Father, pleading a steady supply of victory for those in the physical battle or other spiritual battles. And in this sense, God is depending upon your steady hands. He has given us a race to run. "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us (Hebrews 12:1). The Attack on Steady Hands is Great! As numerous as the ways in which we are human, so are the ways in which we are attacked and tempted to not remain steady "until the going down of the sun." Our bodies have limitations and there are times when we get tired or sick or just plain sick and tired. When those times come, the temptation is often great to let our hands down—just for a little while—"I need some rest." As men we can suffer mental attacks that would have us to drop our hands either through discouragement or distraction. Emotionally we might suffer from depression or flights of fancy, we might need to take great care when joking or taking part in frivolity that we don't give way to unsteadiness. We can even suffer from spiritual attacks thinking, "Why bother? God is Sovereign; He will do as He will." Or be overcome with pride—"look what I've done! See the battles I've won!" The attack might come in the form of busyness, worldliness, fleshly lusts, and the list goes on. Yet with all these attacks we must take great care to keep steady hands "until the going down of the sun." Hands may falter—lift them up in praise. At times we are taken by surprise and our hands may drop momentarily and, by the grace of God, friends may come along to gently reprove or exhort you, or the Holy Spirit may bring conviction—quickly repent, lift them again, and keep your eyes on the Son. You never know whose battle you may be affecting; but you know that at the very least you are affecting your own. Keep steady; don't throw them down and give up. Don't give up; lift up! The Help to Steady Hands is Great! In this account with Moses we see at least three helps. Let's look at them and use them in our own battles. First, there are physical means of help. They sat a stone under him so that he could sit down. Make sure that you get the rest you need and do what you can to maintain good physical health. Spiritual battles are often fought on the physical realm; be prepared physically. Secondly, Moses had two faithful companions—Aaron and Hur. They came alongside him and helped to steady him. Make sure you have godly companions, holy friends who will come alongside you to help you with your burden, are willing to reprove you when necessary, and bring exhortations your way. In Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 we're told that two are better than one and then we're given reasons for that. We are also told that a threefold cord is not quickly broken. Godly companionship is vitally important in keeping steady hands "until the going down of the sun." The third help mentioned in Scripture is God. In Exodus 17:9 we read that Moses had in his hand "the rod of God." Without God Moses would have just been another man on a hilltop. We cannot do anything apart from Jesus and we need to live daily in the power of the Holy Spirit. Without Him we are "just another man on a hilltop," regardless of what good we think we are doing. The Result of Steady Hands is Great! What are those results? VICTORY!!! Victory for us and our faithfulness may play a role in the victory of those who come behind us. Another result is that it yields within us greater strength, greater faith, and builds up within us a greater and steady staying power. Keep steady hands "until the going down of the sun." Finish well, crossing the finish line with arms held up, breaking through in victory! Say with Paul, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing." Reesie's Recipes



Loaded Green Bean Casserole

- 2 lb. green beans, trimmed
- 1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 4 tbsp. slices bacon, cut into 1/2" pieces
- 1/4 c. all-purpose flour
- 3 c. whole milk
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 3 c. shredded cheddar, divided
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 c. French's fried onions
- 2 tbsp. freshly chopped chives

Preheat oven to 350°. Prepare an ice bath. In a large pot of boiling water, add green beans and cook until bright green, about 6 minutes. With a slotted spoon or tongs, quickly transfer green beans to ice bath to cool, then drain and transfer to a large bowl. In a large, high-sided skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Cook bacon until crisp, 8 minutes. Remove bacon from skillet and drain on a paper towel lined plate. Over medium heat, whisk in flour and cook until lightly golden and no longer raw, about 2 minutes. Add milk, Worcestershire, and garlic powder and bring up to a simmer, stirring occasionally. Let mixture thicken slightly, about 2 minutes, then whisk in 2 1/2 cups cheddar until completely melted. Season with salt and pepper and remove from heat. Combine green beans and cheese sauce in a medium baking dish. Top with remaining cheddar and bake until warmed through and bubbling around the edges, about 20 minutes. Top with bacon and fried onions and bake 5 minutes more. Garnish with chives before serving.

Taco Corn Bread Casserole

- 1 package (8 1/2 oz) corn bread / muffin mix
- 1 egg
- 1/3 cup milk
- 3 cups cooked taco seasoned meat
- 1 can black beans
- 1 cup (8 oz) sour cream, light
- 1 cup colby jack, cheddar or mexican cheese, shredded and divided
- 1/2 cup onion, chopped
- 1 medium tomato, chopped
- 1 cup shredded lettuce
- 1 can sliced olives (optional)

In a large bowl, combine the corn bread, egg and milk until blended. Spread into an 8 x 8 pan sprayed with cooking spray. Bake at 350 for 15 minutes. Combine taco meat and beans, spread over corn bread. Combine sour cream, 3/4 cup cheese and onion. Spread over meat mixture. Bake for 20 – 25 minutes longer or until heated through and cheese is melted. Sprinkle with tomato, lettuce and remaining 1/4 cup of cheese.

Dreamsicle Cake

- 1 box of orange cake mix
- 4 eggs
- 3/4 cup of vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon orange zest
- 1- 4 ounce box of instant vanilla pudding
- 3/4 cup of carbonated orange soda of your choice/any brand

Glaze

- 2- 2 1/2 cups powdered sugar
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon orange juice
- 1 teaspoon of milk

Preheat your oven to 325F Grease a LARGE bundt pan. In a separate large bowl combine all the cake ingredients, plus pudding and the soda - mix well pour the mixed batter into the greased bundt pan (do not fill more than 2/3 full...you may have extra batter left) Bake for about 45 to 55 minutes or until set allow to cool completely before removing from the pan top with Glaze. **Glaze Instructions** Combine all the glaze ingredients in a small bowl and whisk until the glaze is pretty thick, adding more or less liquid/powdered sugar so you can get the correct consistency Drizzle glaze all over the cake

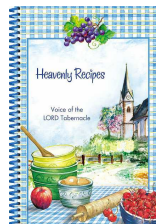
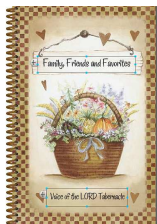
A Spring In The Desert

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: Ephesians 2:1 And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins;

Additional passage for Today: John 5:21; Romans 4:17; I Cor. 15:36

Thought for Today: If you want joy, real joy, wonderful joy, let Jesus come into your heart.

Story for Today: "Have you ever met someone that seemed to have it all together? Someone that made friends easily and seemed to be laughing all the time?" Shanda asked the group of girls sitting in her living room. Some of the girls nodded their heads while others just looked down at their notebooks or hands. "Did you know that many of those girls suffer with depression and anger?" she continued. At this all eyes were focused on her. "Why?" questioned Mika one of the more outspoken in the group. "Why? Because even though they put up a good front, without God, their life lacks purpose and fulfillment that they pretend they have." Shanda continued as she tried to help the girls see that everything they see doesn't make life real. The group meeting here today was a grief group that Shanda had started after one of the 8th graders at the local school had committed suicide. Cyndi Morgan was a popular girl with everything life had to offer. She came from a wealthy home, was a cheerleader and even had a boyfriend that was the envy of all of her friends. Shanda was trying to help these girls through the pain of not only losing a dear friend, but, overcoming the depression and suicidal thoughts that often seemed to linger after an event such as this. "Without God and the standards that He gives, we often do what we feel is best and will bring us the most pleasure. When things don't turn out like planned, we can begin to feel rejection, hopelessness and anger. And sometimes as a cry for help, or out of desperation, they act out, and without the standard God has set; understanding that He places the value on life, their anger at losing or not getting what they wanted will lead to thoughts such as life would be better for everyone without them." Shanda wanted these girls to realize they needed to follow God's plan, His standard not that of peers in their school, or community. "You see, when we turn over our life to Christ, and let Him oversee every aspect, then, we take the pressure off ourselves. Without mentioning any names, how many of you can think of someone that has expressed the feeling of being unable to control something that they thought was devastating?" Shanda paused as she gave the girls time to think. She could see in their eyes that many of them were remembering, either others or times when they themselves had felt this way. "Christ offers forgiveness, peace and to guide. He doesn't want to weigh you down with a bunch of do's and don'ts. He does give rules or commandments in His Word that help us to know the way, but they are guidelines for our good. Once Jesus Christ is in charge, the pressure is gone. It isn't our responsibility to make things happen. We only have to live for Christ and follow what He gives us to do. He will give us new life. He will make us feel alive and He will give contentment and purpose that will take you through the difficult days. Am I trying to say that nothing bad will ever happen if you let Jesus into your life? No! Sometimes things we think of as bad will happen. But, we don't have to be discouraged because we can KNOW that God is in control and that all things will work out for the good like it says in Romans 8:28," Shanda finished.

Questions for Today: Are you alive in Christ or do you try to fool others around you into thinking everything is good? Do you think your happiness is up to you, or do you find happiness in pleasing the Lord?
