

"How Shall We Sing The Lord's Song In A Strange Land?"part 03

Do you know why so many of these so-called Christians live in sin and never shed a tear? It is because they have no memory of Zion. They have never been to Zion. They have never been saved. They cannot remember what it was like when they walked with God because they have never had a walk with God. Do you know why many people drop out of church? It is because they were never a part of the church to begin with. 1st John 2:19 - They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us. The church is more than a building. The church is a body. It is the Body of Christ. There is a tremendous difference between belonging to a building and being a party of body. A leech can attach itself to my body and yet never be a part of my body. In my ministry I have seen in the church spiritual leeches. People who attach themselves to the building, sucking all of the benefits and blessings from it they can, but when the blood is gone - they go find another building. But they never become a part of the body. Do you know why a true believer can never be happy in Babylon? Because once you have tasted Jesus, you will never be satisfied with the food the world has to offer. These dear people, who once had tasted the sweetness of Zion's glory, now was having to taste the bitterness of Babylon's guilt. And I can well imagine they were thinking to themselves: Where is the blessedness I knew When I first saw the Lord? Where is the soul refreshing view Of Jesus and His Word? What peaceful hours I once enjoyed! How sweet their memory still! But they have left an aching void The world can never fill. II. V. 3 THERE IS A SARCASM THEY CANNOT ENDURE Psalm 137:3 - For there they that carried us away captive required of us a song; and they that wasted us required of us mirth, saying, Sing us one of the songs of Zion. (Ill. Sin always brings more than just slavery. It brings shame. This world is not interested in a Christian as long as he stands on his feet. But he will put him on the front page of the newspaper when he falls flat on his face. The world loves to see Christians fall. Their motto is "The bigger they are the harder they fall and the better we like it." Now that should not surprise you. Jesus said in John 15:19 - If ye were of the world, the world would love his own: but because ye are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world hateth you. The world loves to load its cannon with the fodder of fallen Christians. Did you notice that when Jim Baker and Jimmy Swaggart fell they became the biggest targets of comedians like Johnny Carson and others? They became the butt of so many jokes. Chuck Swindoll said: "The scoffers and critics of Christianity never stand any taller or shout any louder than when God's people publicly fall into sin and are force to suffer the inevitable consequence. All Satan's host dance with glee when believers compromise, play with fire, then get burned." One of the first spiritual superstars ever to fall was the strongest man who ever lived by the name of Samson. You remember his story well. He was the fair-haired boy of the Jewish race. He was God's choice and the people's champion. But he fell. He tripped over his own sin. When he did, his enemies put out his eyes, they bound him, put him to doing a woman's work and the last thing they demanded of him before he took his revenge is recounted in: Judges 16:25 - And it came to pass, when their hearts were merry, that they said, Call for Samson, that he may make us sport. And they called for Samson out of the prison house; and he made them sport: and they set him between the pillars. But while he performed for them you can just imagine how they mocked him and how they scorned him. And more particularly how they made fun of the great God that he once served. The greatest tragedy of a backslidden believer in Babylon is the shame and disgrace he brings to his God. If God knows my heart, I would rather die today than ever to bring shame to the name of Jesus. (III. There was a teenage girl who was out on a date one night. In fact, she and her boyfriend were double dating and one of them suggested that they go to a party where there was going to be alcohol and drugs and all kinds of illicit activity. Well, this particular young lady was a radiant Christian who loved the Lord and she said, "No, I'm not going to do that. And if you're going to do that you can take me home." Well one of the kids said, "What's the matter? Are you afraid you're Daddy will hurt you?" She said, "No, I'm afraid that I will hurt my Daddy.") If you know and love the Lord Jesus Christ, you have been branded with the name Christian. And when a Christian falls into sin he drags the name of Jesus through the mud and the slime and the filth of that sin and holds his precious Saviour up to the ridicule of an unbelieving world. We ought to see sin as a spiritual AIDS that we avoid at any cost.



Pity or Praise?

"I will bless the Lord at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth." Psalm 34:1

When hard times come we can either pity ourselves or praise God. I understand that there are other reactions we have and emotions we feel; but often our responses will stem from and will more closely align to pity or to praise. Think back with me over the last year or so. When COVID-19 struck with all its tyrannical restrictions, were your responses closer to pity or praise? When you recognize that the economic struggles and emptying store shelves are due to a government's agenda of mishandling this "crisis" does your mind move more quickly to pity or praise? When illness strikes you or a loved one, what does the God of heaven see as He looks down upon your frail humanity? Is it trusting in Him with worship and praise or do you more closely resemble the Israelites who were murmuring over a lack of water only three days after praising God for bringing them through the Red Sea?

Admittedly, I, myself, am a slow learner; but I'm grateful for the example of those around me who choose praise. When my parents came down with cancer all I saw was praise and reliance on their Creator. My co-worker, in desperate need of a kidney transplant shows no self-pity but plenty of praise to the One in control of all things. Please understand, one can have questions and sadness about the situations they find themselves in without plummeting to self-pity. How often did David praise God in the midst of such internal struggles?

Dr. Frank Crane, Presbyterian minister and columnist who wrote a set of ten volumes of "Four Minute Essays," observed, "Pity is a glorious and creditable attribute—when it flows out toward another. Then it is like the mountain brook, carrying health and joy to all who drink of its cool flow or even gaze upon its happy play. But pity, when it turns upon self, is like a stagnant pool, covered with hateful scum, and concealing ugly, slimy things in its foul ooze. One who is sorry for himself is already half-beaten. ... Self-pity is the collapse of all the faculties, it is cowardly surrender in the face of the enemy."

In another of Dr. Crane's "Four Minute Essays" he shares this example. "I know a young man, twisted, crippled, paralyzed, unable to feed or dress himself, yet who sits daily by his window with a shining face. He is cheerful, helpful, a fountain of joy to all who know him. The boys love to gather in his room at night and play cards and tell stories. One would think he would be a gloom and a burden; his is an uplift. You soon forget his limitations. You soon cease to pity him, for he does not pity himself. He does not drain you; he inspires you."

What about you? In the midst of adversity or disappointment, do you drain or inspire others? Those who are believers in Christ have every help available to us and every reason to inspire those around us, regardless our circumstance. I suppose the question is: Where do you turn to during these trying times we all face? We can either turn to the One who is in control of all things, Who can truly make a difference both in us and in our circumstances or we can turn inward becoming "like a stagnant pool, covered with hateful scum." Job's friends were of no help; he would need to focus inward or upward. Job chose wisely, "Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him."

The Word of God promises that we will face trying times; and as we see the world around us, it is proof again that God knows the end from the beginning. What kind of counsel, or self-talk, do you give yourself? Paul exhorts us to "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." David rejected the temptation to wallow in self-pity, instead, encouraging himself in the Lord: "Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him for the help of his countenance." (Psalm 42:5)

That's the kind of hope we need. Think of your life as a music box. Hope in God winds it perfectly, allowing us to be beautiful music in the ears of God and those around us. When we put our own hand to the turnkey during trying times we often over wind it, breaking the spring and stopping the music meant to come from our lives. It takes discipline for such self-talk and trust; but it is the difference between joy and a downcast spirit.

Breakfast Casserole

1 lb sausage, browned and drained
1 lb bacon, cooked, drained and crumbled
12 oz frozen hashbrowns
1 medium green bell pepper, diced
4 Tbsp onion, chopped
2 cups shredded montery jack cheese, divided
1 cup Bisquick pancake mix
3 cups milk
1/2 tsp salt
4 eggs

Preheat oven to 375. Grease a 9x13" pan. In a large bowl combine sausage, bacon, hashbrowns, bell pepper, onion and 1 cup of the cheese. Pour into baking pan. In a medium bowl whisk together Bisquick, milk, salt and eggs untol well blended. Pour over potato mixture. Sprinkle top with remaining cheese. Cover and refrigerate for up to 24 hours. Remove dish from fridge. Bake uncovered 30-35 minutes or until light golden brown on edges. Let stand 10 minutes before cutting.

All-American Meatloaf

2 eggs

3/3 cup milk

2 teaspoons salt

1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

1 Tablespoon A1 steak sauce

1 Tablespoon BBQ Sauce

3 slices bread, crumbled in processor

1 1/2 pounds ground beef

1 small onion, finely chopped

1/2 green bell pepper, finely chopped

1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup ketchup

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Whisk eggs, milk, salt, ground black pepper, steak sauce and bbq sauce in a large bowl. Add crumbled bread and stir until thoroughly combined. Mix ground beef, onion, green pepper and Cheddar cheese into bread mixture; transfer mixture to a pan. Combine brown sugar, ketchup in a small bowl; spread about half over meat mixture. Bake in the preheated oven until no longer pink in the center, 1 hour and 15 minutes. Drain grease off of meat loaf at the one hour mark. Top with remaining sauce and cook 15 minutes longer or until An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 160 degrees

Sun Drop Cake

1 lemon cake mix
1 box lemon instant pudding
1/4 cup oil
3 eggs
12 ounces Sun Drop
Squeeze of lemon

Glaze

1 tsp vanilla
1 cup powdered sugar
3 ounces Sun Drop

Directions

Preheat oven to 350. Grease and flour bundt pan. In mixing bowl combine cake mix, pudding, oil, eggs, Sun Drop and squeeze of lemon. Mix well and pour into prepared pan. Bake for 30-35 minutes. Drizzle glaze over cake. **GLAZE**: In small mixing bowl combine vanilla, powdered sugar and Sun Drop. Mix until smooth.



John Geddie



"The love of Christ banished the terrors of the law." Those were the words of John Geddie concerning his salvation at age nineteen in 1834. He tirelessly preached this same message of Christ's love as a missionary in the New Hebrides islands for twenty-four years.

John was an avid reader; his favorite subject being stories of mission efforts and the desperate need of the Gospel in unevangelized areas. After completing secondary school at Pictou Academy in Nova Scotia, he studied theology. Small and slightly built, he was often referred to as "little Johnnie." While at seminary, his health became so poor that he was told to give up his studies. He promised the Lord that if his health were restored, he would go as a missionary to a heathen land. On March 13, 1838, he was ordained and began pastoring a church on Prince Edward Island.

During his time as pastor, he promoted foreign missions which was a new idea to the colonial churches. Up to this point, they had sought financial aid for their own work, but had not considered sending out missionaries. It took several years and many pleas, but a mission society was finally formed. John and his wife were the first missionary volunteers. Their destination was Aneiteum, an island in the New Hebrides where people practiced cannibalism.

The Geddies arrived in New Hebrides in 1848 and soon felt the reality of their situation. They were on an island, surrounded by people from whom they had much to fear and whose language and customs they did not know. Geddie wrote, "We have His promise, at whose command we have come hither, 'Lo, I am with you alway."

Their first task was to learn the unwritten Aneiteumese language. Then they began to print materials and teach the people to read. After three years and much labor, John had won a total of ten people to the Lord. Several times, while walking the trails, spears and clubs were thrown at him. He once faced an angry crowd of men who threatened to kill him for interfering as they strangled a young widow to death that she might "join her husband in the afterlife." He unwittingly violated some cultural taboos and made the chieftain angry. But eventually the message of Christ's love penetrated the hearts of the people and hundreds turned to the Lord.

As people were saved and their lives changed, John began to teach them and send them out to other islands with the message of the Gospel. People came from all over the region to see what had happened in Aneiteum. One group even brought a pig in the hopes they might use it to purchase a teacher to take back to their village. When John Geddie died on December 14, I872, a tablet was placed behind the pulpit of the church in Anelcauhat which reads: In memory of John Geddie, D.D. When he landed in 1848, there were no Christians here, and when he left in 1872, there were no heathen."

They huddled inside the storm door-two children in ragged, outgrown coats. "Any old papers, Lady?" they asked a passerby. She was very busy; she wanted to say no, until she looked down at their feet wrapped only in thin little sandals, sopped with sleet. "Come on in and I will make you a cup of cocoa," she said. There was no conversation. Their soggy sandals left marks on the clean hearthstone. Cocoa and cake would fortify against the chill outside. After serving them, she went back to the kitchen and started on her household budget as they sat enjoying the warmth. After a few minutes, the silence in the front room struck through to her. She looked in. The girl held her empty cup in her hands, looking at it. The boy asked in a flat voice, "Lady, are you rich?" "Am I rich? Mercy no!" She looked at her shabby slipcovers. The girl put her cup back in its saucer carefully. "Your cups match your saucers." Her voice was old with a hunger that was not of the stomach. They left then, holding their bundles of papers against the wind. They had not said thank you. They did not need to. They had done more than that. Plain blue pottery cups and saucers-but they matched. She tested the potatoes and stirred the gravy. "Potatoes and brown gravy, a roof over our heads, my husband with a good, steady job-these things matched, too," she mused. She moved the chairs back from the fire and tidied the living room. The muddy prints of small sandals were still set upon the hearth, and she let them be. "I want them there in case I ever forget how very rich I am," she told herself.

How is that possible one may ask? I'll tell you how; By bringing it to God and leaving it there. "Let your requests be made known unto God"; then you can offer thanksgiving and rest in the fact that He is in control. Worry is the opposite of Faith. Hebrews 11:6 says, "But without faith it is impossible to please God: for He that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." When we meditate on the problem it simply grows bigger. But when we meditate on God and His word, Faith increases. So if you are worried about something today, stop meditating on the problem. Give it to God and thank him for the solution. Then the peace of God will guard your heart and mind.

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: James 3:11-12 Doth a fountain send forth at the same place sweet water and bitter? Can the fig tree, my brethren, bear olive berries? either a vine, figs? so can no fountain both yield salt water and fresh.

Additional passages for Today: John 15:4-9; Matthew 7:15-23

Thought for Today: If we are a fountain, we can only pour out what we have inside. If we are a tree, the fruit we grow announces what kind of tree we are. If we are believers, how we live shows who we believe in. Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved.

Story for Today: Jackie glanced at her friend's parents expecting to see angry eyes and expressions of hate. She was amazed to see a calmness between the pair. The voices didn't escalate like she was used to hearing. They didn't bring up past hurts and say mean things as she had heard from her parents countless times over the years. Mr. and Mrs. Princeton were different than most of the couples she knew. That is one reason she loved going to their house. Her friend, Clarissa, was the nicest girl she knew. They had been friends for the last three years, and it always amazed her how kind and thoughtful Clarissa was to everyone. It was only a couple of minutes before Mr. and Mrs. Princeton had quietly talked out their differences and had come to a resolution and were back to engaging with Clarissa and her friends. When Jackie got home that night, it wasn't long before she realized that her mom and dad were fighting again. Jackie wondered how long before they would be divorced. She figured they were only staying together because of her and her brothers. Being Christians, they tried to look the part when others were watching. Sometimes Jackie wondered if there was any difference in how they treated each other and how they would if they weren't "Christians." She had been to her friend Alexis' house and knew her mom didn't put up with anything. She was a wild woman when she was upset. The language she used would curl your toenails. She wasn't opposed to throwing things and kicking her latest man out the door. But as Jackie thought about it, she realized that her parents often used unkind words and had hateful looks that were passed back and forth along with the accusations of "you always..." and "you never...." She wondered why Clarissa's parents were so much different. They attended the same church and even had some of the same friends.
