

## A Word to the Wise: The Wise Fool

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction. Proverbs 1:7

Knowing what to do and doing it are two very different things. To do or not to do, that's the question. James warns that to ask for wisdom and then to not walk in the instruction given makes a man unstable in all his ways. Solomon's appetite for wisdom was whetted by his father's instruction:

Proverbs 4:3-13 "For I was my father's son, tender and only beloved in the sight of my mother. He taught me also, and said unto me, Let thine heart retain my words: keep my commandments, and live. Get wisdom, get understanding: forget it not; neither decline from the words of my mouth. Forsake her not, and she shall preserve thee: love her, and she shall keep thee. Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding. Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her. She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace: a crown of glory shall she deliver to thee. Hear, O my son, and receive my sayings; and the years of thy life shall be many. I have taught thee in the way of wisdom; I have led thee in right paths. When thou goest, thy steps shall not be straitened; and when thou runnest, thou shalt not stumble. Take fast hold of instruction; let her not go: keep her; for she is thy life."

Solomon was the recipient of wisdom from King David, a man after God's own heart, and, also, fitted for wisdom from heaven above, as promised by God; yet, Solomon became a fool. The obtaining of wisdom, applying wisdom to the lives of others, and its personal application for benefit and to God's glory are very different things. Like David, parents often try to bestow wisdom to their children. Yet, depending on the disposition of the child (or adult), some accept it while others reject it. What will you do with the wisdom that the Holy Spirit desires to share with you through God's Word, in general, and the Proverbs, specifically? Much of that depends on how we choose to relate to wisdom. Let's briefly look at just a few of the relational words regarding wisdom in Proverbs 1:2-5.

1. "To KNOW wisdom and instruction" calls for a personal encounter, a deep commitment to and intimate interaction with wisdom. Instead of possessing wisdom, wisdom possesses you and, as one writer put it, you're committed to the wisest action regardless the cost. Do you know wisdom like this? 2. Are you willing to RECEIVE instruction? This takes a humility of heart and mind, crucifying the pride of self-desire or self-instruction. It requires submission to discipline and correction; such discipline may be painful and yet not be punishment. 3. "A wise man will HEAR, and increase learning." Such hearing doesn't pass through the ears only; it moves the heart, hands, and feet to discerning obedience.

How can I call the writer of Proverbs a wise fool? He started on the path of wisdom, walking with her, cherishing her, and obediently submitting to her call. BUT, 1 Kings 11 tells us that his wives turned his heart after other gods and that Solomon did evil in the sight of the Lord. In other words, he stopped the intimate communion with wisdom, he rejected godly instruction – chasing after physical fulfillment, and, while he may have had a head full of wise words, his heart was not hearing the voice of her call (obedient discernment). This is largely the account of vanity shared by Solomon in his book of Ecclesiastes. It's my hope that this "wise fool," when he was old, repented of his foolishness and returned to wisdom, thereby fulfilling his own saying that if a child is trained up in the way he should go, "when he is old he will not depart from it." This is likely, for he closes out the book describing his folly thusly: "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil."

Are you wise, foolish, or a wise-fool?

#### Jesus IS the Answer – BUT - Are we asking the right question?

Indeed, we live in perilous times! One quick read through the beginning of Second Timothy chapter three and one would think the Apostle Paul was looking through a time portal, straight into the heart of the United States of America 2023. Mid-west values have shrunk, the Bible belt has loosened, and our spiritual pants, nationally, have slipped down, exposing our nakedness and shame. Yet, like Daniel's spiritual description of Israel in chapter nine of his book, we have such "confusion of face" many, perhaps most, don't feel the shame that is rightfully ours. (Jeremiah 6:15 gives a fuller description.)

To catalog our national atrocities would take more room and more energy than I have. Suffice it to say that we were a nation which was founded upon godly principles; we were a "light shining on a hill." However, because of our sin, what once was is no longer and that light is now so very dim, if not snuffed out altogether. Make no mistake, there are individuals and some churches whose light continues to shine, but, nationally, we are divided, in chaos, "truth is fallen in the street" and righteousness has been run down next to it.

We must look to the future Biblically, recognizing what will be the lot (notice: I did not say the end) of those who will walk in the way of God, instructing others in godliness, making Christ alone their hope and refuge. Isaiah warns: "he that departeth from evil maketh himself a prey." (59:15) And Paul, after sharing his experiences, states plainly, "Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." (2 Tim. 3:12)

That's plain enough; what, then, can we do? The only thing we can do – give those around us the answer they need regardless the cost. Light is the answer to darkness; salt is the answer to corruption; bread is the answer to hunger. Jesus is the answer for our dark, corrupted, hungry, nation and world – not just for today; Christ and His way have ALWAYS been the answer! But, what's the real question?

The question isn't, "How can I have a better life" or "How can I improve my family, nation, or world situation?" The question is, "How has my Creator commanded me to live?" and "How can I best glorify, honor, and praise Christ?" In other words, is Christ (Christianity) a means to an end or is He the end? J. Gresham Machen hauntingly lays out this poignant truth which begs the question, moving us to penetrating self-examination: "Are we using Christ or are we allowing Christ to use us?" for what is Christianity but Jesus living in us and through us.

"Christianity will indeed accomplish many useful things in this world, but if it is accepted in order to accomplish those useful things it is not Christianity. Christianity will combat Bolshevism; but if it is accepted in order to combat Communism, it is not Christianity: Christianity will produce a unified nation, in a slow but satisfactory way; but if it is accepted in order to produce a unified nation, it is not Christianity: Christianity will produce a healthy community; but if it is accepted in order to produce a healthy community, it is not Christianity: Christianity will promote international peace; but if it is accepted in order to promote international peace, it is not Christianity. Our Lord said: 'But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you' (Matt. 6:33). But if you seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness in order that all those things may be added unto you, you will miss both those other things and the Kingdom of God as well." (Christianity and Liberalism; p. 162)

What are our motives in presenting truth to the culture? Are we loving God and others or are we loving ourselves, hoping for self-preservation and longing to simply conserve what once was? Are we promoting Jesus or is it self-promotion by using Him?

#### **Cheesy Rotini Bake**

2 cups uncooked rotini pasta

1 (10.75 ounce) can cream of mushroom soup

1/4 cup melted butter

2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1/2 cup sour cream

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add the rotini pasta and cook for 8 to 10 minutes, or until al dente. Drain and set aside. In a medium bowl, combine the cream of mushroom soup, melted butter, 1 cup cheddar cheese, garlic powder, and black pepper. Mix until well combined. Grease a 2-quart baking dish. Spread the cooked pasta in the bottom of the dish. Pour the cream of mushroom mixture over the pasta. Bake in the preheated oven for 25 minutes. Remove from the oven and top with the sour cream. Sprinkle remaining cheese on top. Return to the oven and bake for an additional 5 minutes or until cheese is melted. Let cool for 5 minutes before serving.

#### **Breakfast Pigs In A Blanket**

8 fully cooked breakfast sausage links thawed

8 Pillsbury Cinnamon Rolls with Original Icing 8 count (use the regular size cinnamon rolls, not Grands)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Open the cinnamon rolls and set the frosting aside. Slightly flatten each cinnamon roll, then place one sausage in the center of each roll. Wrap the dough up around the sausage and pinch shut. The sausage should be visible at each end of the roll. Place the rolls seam side down on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake at 350F for 15-17 minutes until the rolls are golden brown and cooked through. Drizzle the frosting over top of the hot rolls. Cool slightly before serving.

#### **BLT Dip**

1 lb bacon (cooked until crisp and chopped

8 oz cream cheese 1/4 cup mayo

1/4 cup sour cream

1/4 cup shredded cheddar

1 tsp onion powder

1 tsp dried minced garlic

1/2 tsp smoked paprika

pinch salt

1 cup chopped lettuce

1 cup chopped tomato (squeeze out the juice after chopping)

fresh veggies to dip

Combine ¼ of the bacon with the cream cheese, sour cream, mayo, cheddar, and seasonings. Mix in a deep dish pie plate. Sprinkle on the lettuce, tomato, and the rest of the bacon. Serve with fresh veggies to dip.

#### **Chocolate Chip Pie**

1 stick butter, softened 1/2 cup brown sugar 1/2 cup granulated sugar 2 eggs 1 tsp vanilla 3/4 cup all purpose flour 6 oz. chocolate chips pie shell

Preheat oven to 350. Cream together first 3 ingredients. In a separate bowl whisk 2 eggs. Add eggs to batter. Bland it some more. Add vanilla and flour. Mix well. Fold in chocolate chips. Add mixture to pie shell, spead evenly. Bake at 350 until done

For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works. 2 Corinthians 11:13-15



**Verse for Today:** Jonah 1:2 Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me.

Additional Passages for Today: Exodus 14:10-16; Numbers 22:1-35; Jeremiah 1:7; Ezekiel 3:1; Acts 5:20

**Thought for Today:** God sent many people to warn and share truth throughout the ages. When they obeyed God and the people listened, good things happened.

**Story for Today:** "Please go tell your brother to come inside." requested Mom of 10-year-old Ethnie. Liam was outside playing basketball and there were chores that needed to be done. Ethnie went outside and headed in the direction that would take her to the court where many of the neighborhood boys would be found most afternoons and evenings during the school year. As she went, Ethnie remembered that Liam had gotten her in trouble before school for not putting the cap on the toothpaste. He had also talked to her about her attitude when she was feeling rushed and she had spoken sharply to her mom. She was still upset about that. A quick decision, as she came to the court, made her stop and turn around without saying a word. She headed home and went to work doing her chores as if she had completed the task. An hour and a half later Liam still hadn't shown up. Mother was very upset that not only were the chores not done but Liam hadn't obeyed her request to come home. The guest speaker for the special service at church would arrive any minute and she was not ready. As Dad walked in with Mr. Jones, Mom pasted on a smile and mentioned that Liam was still at the courts. Dad excused himself and was quickly on his way to collect his wayward son. Liam saw his dad approaching and waved goodbye to his friends. Apologizing as they walked, Liam didn't make any excuse for not getting his chores done and graciously accepted his punishment.

That night as Mr. Jones spoke to the congregation, Ethnie couldn't stop squirming in her seat. It was as if Mr. Jones was speaking right to her. He spoke about Jonah and how God had called him to go and preach to the land of Nineveh, warning them of the judgment to come. He shared how Jonah rebelled against God and tried to go in the opposite direction. The great fish was a gift of mercy, sent by God to protect the wayward Jonah. Ethnie realized that her heart was wicked. She had wanted Liam to be punished. She had not wanted him to receive mercy. Sure, Liam knew he had chores to do and it wasn't her responsibility to remind him. But, Mom had wanted to show grace and because she was disobedient, Mom and Dad had suffered also. Ethnie regretted her choices today. Mr. Jones told how dangerous it would have been for Jonah to speak to the people of Nineveh. Telling Liam to come home was not dangerous at all and yet she had been just as disobedient as Jonah. Repentance was the answer. She knew she needed to have her mind transformed. Recognizing that her choice to try to get vengeance was wrong, Ethnie went to the altar to seek forgiveness and rid her soul of the rebellion that had dwelt within her.

**Questions for Today:** What has God given for you to do this day? Who can you offer an escape from the wrath to come? If you don't share the truth, who will? Will you be obedient to God or will you follow your own will?
