Story Behind The Song

Throw Out The Lifelinr

Reverend Edward Smith Ufford, after having witnessed the thrilling sight of the lifeline being flung far out over treacherous water and the quick action of the life-saving crew during a drill at the life-saving station on Point Allerton near Boston, went home and penned the words to this famous evangelistic hymn. So impressed and inspired by this one event, it took him only 15 minutes to write the words and compose the music at his organ. Published first in 1888, he travelled far and wide, using a collection of life-saving apparatus to emphasize the spiritual truth of his song.

As with many hymns, the results from its singing are also impressive. Rev. Ufford relayed many such accounts like the following: "Once in Pennsylvania a set of men were laying cards and drinking in a club room. Another room in the same building had been rented for religious meetings, and suddenly the words of 'Throw Out the Life-Line,' sung by a young woman, with a strong chorus taking up the refrain, broke in upon their merriment. The revelry was hushed. At last one player threw down his cards. 'If what they are singing is right,' he said, 'then we are wrong.' He went home, and before long the others followed his manly example. The club was broken up by that one song."

This hymn not only convicts sinners of sin, but it has often been used to prompt believers to take up evangelistic work. As Amos R. Wells so aptly stated, "Thousands of Christians have been moved by its tender pleading to leave their selfish endeavors, go down to the tempest-torn beach, and do their best to rescue those that are battling with the waves of sin."

That's my goal in presenting this wonderful hymn this month. Won't you PLEASE throw out the life-line of Jesus Christ into a world that is being swallowed up by the dark waves of sin?

- 1. Throw out the lifeline across the dark wave; There is a brother whom someone should save; Somebody's brother, O who then will dare To throw out the lifeline, his peril to share? Refrain: Throw out the lifeline! Throw out the lifeline! Someone is drifting away; Throw out the lifeline! Throw out the lifeline! Someone is sinking today.
 - 2. Throw out the lifeline with hand quick and strong; Why do you tarry, why linger so long? See, he is sinking, O hasten today; And out with the lifeboat, away, then, away! [Refrain]
- 3. Throw out the lifeline to danger-fraught men, Sinking in anguish where you've never been; Winds of temptation and billows of woe Will soon hurl them out where the dark waters flow. [Refrain]
- 4. Soon will the season of rescue be o'er; Soon will they drift to eternity's shore; Haste then, my brother, no time for delay! But throw out the lifeline and save them today. [Refrain]

Philippians 1:21 KJV For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.



A Word to the Wise – God Calls ALL the Shots – Proverbs 16:1-6 part 02

"By mercy and truth iniquity is purged: and by the fear of the LORD men depart from evil."

Proverbs 16:6

Last month, we looked at these verses and saw that God calls ALL the shots; from this passage we recognize our total dependence upon God for everything. It's important to note that everything is not just an abstract agreement, but it entails our thoughts, words, actions, attitudes, responses...truly EVERYTHING!

At the same time, we looked at the fact that God has given man free will to do as he wants, but he cannot escape the consequences of his choices. Our free will must run within the boundary of God's sovereignty – He calls all the shots. We have room to roam, but we are always held accountable to a holy God who has declared what is righteous and what is unrighteous. No court of man can undo how the court of heaven has already judged.

"God declares the pure ways of holiness and draws men to Christ, but He neither forces men into the way of holiness nor into the way of sin. In giving men the desire of their hearts, God will move them along the route they have chosen, while still drawing and calling them to the way of the cross – the way of Christ – giving them opportunity to repent and follow "holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." Yet, should they refuse, remaining willful and impenitent sinners, they, not God, have made themselves wicked and will find themselves facing a sinner's hell for all eternity. And yet, God, in His great mercy, provides an atonement from sin through Jesus, His only begotten Son. Through fearing God – having a filial reverence for Him, thereby desiring to neither anger nor displease Him – men will depart from that which is evil."

With this in mind, we move on to the gracious warning given by God in verse 5. "Every one that is proud in heart is an abomination to the LORD: though hand join in hand, he shall not be unpunished."

Every one – that means all people, from the lowest ranks to kings and all those in authority. So, this warning includes you, dear reader, as well. Since no one is exempt, we had better understand what it is to be "proud in heart;" it is to exalt oneself above God's word and above his fellow creatures. God doesn't look to the words or actions of men, He isn't fooled by them. God looks at your heart. Why does he look upon pride with such abomination? Because there is NO pride within the Holy One of Israel; it's completely contrary to His nature and we are to be holy as He is holy. I urge you to stop now and read Philippians 3:7-8. Jesus, who is God, humbled Himself in obedience and didn't exalt Himself above others; we must do likewise. "Though hand join in hand..." Regardless the consensus of opinion or how man's high courts may rule, God calls the shots and all those who go against Him "shall not be unpunished." Even when whole nations join together to come against Jesus (Ps. 2), God wins; He rules, they "shall not go unpunished."

Since every one of us were born with pride – pushing our own ways – what hope is there? Must we be punished? God calls ALL the shots, but His mercy is from everlasting to everlasting. God has chosen a way for all men to be saved; verse 6 holds this hope out to every man. Joseph Benson well-explains: "By the covenant of grace, in which mercy and truth shine so bright, even the mercy and truth of God, which meet together, and kiss each other, in Jesus Christ the Mediator; by mercy in promising, and truth in performing, is the guilt of sin taken away from us, when we are truly penitent, and cast our sinful souls by faith on that mercy and truth. Hereby also a principle of mercy and truth is implanted in us, by which the power of sin is broken, and our corrupt inclinations are mortified and destroyed. In this way...is iniquity purged, and the sinner both pardoned and renewed. And by the fear of the Lord — By a filial reverence toward God, and by a holy fear of offending him; men depart from evil — They are kept from abusing pardoning mercy, and from returning to folly or wickedness. So he shows that forgiveness and holiness, or justification, and at least a measure of sanctification, are constant and inseparable companions."



Be Careful When Pointing Fingers

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law." Galatians 5:22-23

I know a man who is a very angry man; his temper seems to always be just below the boiling point and it takes very little to move him to impatience, road rage, unkind words, and very harsh tones. His anger, pride, and lack of self-control lead to constant double-standards, unreasonable demands, and self-promotion. He speaks badly of others in an attempt to make himself look better or to shift blame away from himself. At the same time, he also has many good qualities that ingratiate him to others. Regardless, it's vital to recognize that such carnality of heart destroys. On the short list, it ruins relationships, fractures friendships, harms homes, and often makes your witness worthless (people are always watching).

If one dares to do their Christian duty given by the Apostle Paul to reprove, rebuke, and exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine – even when done gently and lovingly – they have "poked the bear" and receive either a flat denial and/or find themselves to be the recipient of a personal attack, thereby hoping to take the focus off himself.

I recently read a story that made me think about my friend and made me wish he could learn the lesson found therein. The story is about a man who was having severe conflicts with his neighbor. His heart was filled with feelings of hatred, wrath, contentions, emulations, strife, envying, and even murder. This man blamed his neighbor for the feelings within himself. And because he thought these feelings were his neighbor's fault, he decided that the remedy would be to shun his neighbor and live as a hermit. So, he did.

One day, the man filled his glass water jug at the stream. He set it down, but the jug tipped over and poured out its contents. This made him so angry that he picked up that glass jug and smashed it against a rock. Suddenly, he was struck with the shocking realization that the reason for his anger lay entirely within himself. It was not his neighbor's fault at all.

As I read that little illustration and thought how applicable it would be for my friend, the Holy Spirit prodded my heart as if to say, "Be careful when you point a finger at someone, there's always three fingers pointing back at yourself." Or, as Jesus said, "And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?" (Matt. 7:3)

That's not to say that we aren't to examine the actions of others, compare them to Scripture, and even deal with them Biblically and lovingly (with truth and grace) – we are. But first, we are to use those actions as a call to prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to examine our own hearts to see "if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting." (Ps. 139:24)

The believer's life is to be characterized by the nine virtues listed in our key verse; the fruit of the Spirit is to be so abundant in our life that when the world presses upon us, sweet juice and the oil of gladness spill out. In other words, our heart needs to be so full of the Holy Spirit that there's no room for the works of the flesh and its fruit which are listed in that same chapter of Galatians. Yet, if those carnal or fleshly traits fill one's life, when the press comes, bitter and distasteful juice is what spills out, leaving a bad taste for others to swallow and deal with.

O Lord, when I am in the press of life, may succulent, sweet juice pour forth. May others be encouraged and sweetened by my life because of Your Spirit filling me with His fruit and leading me to obedience. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Mexican Casserole

1 lb lean ground beef
1 small onion, chopped
1 (10 oz) can Ro-Tel tomatoes
1 (15 oz) can Ranch Style beans
1 packet taco seasoning
1 (10.5 oz) can cream of chicken soup
½ cup water

1 (10–12 oz) bag tortilla chips, crushed (use enough to layer, not the whole bag)2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided

Sour cream

Salsa

Preheat your oven to 325° In a large skillet over medium heat, cook the ground beef and chopped onion until browned and fully cooked. Drain any excess fat. Stir in the Ro-Tel tomatoes, Ranch Style beans, taco seasoning, cream of chicken soup, and water. Let the mixture simmer for 5–7 minutes until heated through and well combined.

Lightly grease a 9x13-inch casserole dish. Spread a layer of crushed tortilla chips on the bottom of the dish. Add half of the meat and bean mixture on top of the chips. Sprinkle with 1 cup of shredded cheddar cheese. Repeat the layers with more crushed chips, the remaining meat mixture, and finish with the remaining cheese.

Cover the casserole with foil and bake for 20–30 minutes, or until bubbly and the cheese is melted. Remove from oven and let it rest for 5–10 minutes before slicing. Serve warm, topped with a sour cream and salsa.

Creamy Cocnut Cake

1 (16 oz) box Betty Crocker white cake mix
1 cupcream of coconut
1 cup sweetened condensed milk
1 (16 oz) container thawed whipped topping
1 (10 oz) package flaked coconut
1 jar Maraschino cheeries

Preheat oven to 350. Prepare cake mix as directed on box (add 1/4 cup flaked coconut to batter). Bake in a 9x13 inch pan and let it cool completely. Mix cream of coconut and sweetened condensed milk. Poke holes in the cooled cake and pour the mixture over it. Spread whipped topping on top. Sprinkle with flaked coconut, arrange cheeries on top and chill for a few hours.

BBQ Pork Loaded Potatoes

6-8 boneless pork chops
5-6 potatoes
Bbq sauce
Shredded cheese
Sour cream
Diced onion

Lay chops in crock pot. Cover with bbq sauce. Lay a sheet of aluminum foil on top of them. Wash potatoes and wrap in foil. Lay potatoes on top of chops. Cook in crock pot on low 5 hours. Remove potatoes. Remove foil from on top of the chops. Shred chops. Load potatoes with meat, cheese, sour cream and onion. Top with bbg sauce.





I will meditate in thy precepts, and have respect unto thy ways. I will delight myself in thy statutes: I will not forget thy word. Additional Passages for today: Matthew 6:21

Thought for Today: Hiding God's Word in your heart is only part of the process needed for holy living. Obeying what you know, studying to learn more, and meditating so you can apply it are all necessary to help us to live a victorious life in Christ.

Story for Today: Gathering the treasured package close to his chest, Steve ran through the rain to his uncle's cabin where he was staying with his best friend, Stu. The cabin was a great hang-out for the young guys as they were close to home, but on their own for a few days. Steve had hoped that he would have time to spend with God. Stu wanted sleep and a relaxing time away before starting his summer job. Studying the Bible each morning before breakfast, Steve had enjoyed the peace and quiet. He also enjoyed the times throughout the day when he could reflect on the morning's reading. He even practiced memorizing the verses and writing down the lessons he thought of in a journal for further reflection after his return to normal living. With the rain still coming down outside, Stu was content to sleep the day away only rising to get a bite to eat when the hunger pangs reminded him that he hadn't eaten. Steve was grateful that he could still study the Bible. He liked to listen to it when he was chopping wood, but his favorite time was opening the Bible, being able to see the words and read for himself, and recognizing the words of Christ that were marked in red. Today, his lesson was from the Sermon on the Mount. been studying the Beatitudes that started in verse 3 of Matthew chapter 5 the last few weeks and had even studied the rest of that chapter, realizing that Jesus took the law from the Old Testament and raised it to an even higher level. But, today, he had been reading from Matthew 6:19-21, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." He recalled part of his study in Psalm 119 and how it appeared that the more David studied the law of the Lord the more he treasured it. He loved God and the laws and testimonies of the Lord. He wanted to be able to take them everywhere he went and that is why he spent so much effort memorizing the words, and trying to apply the truths to his life.

When Stu awoke next, he heard Steve praying. He was praying that he would learn more and more and that he would never forget God's laws or ways. He then began to pray earnestly for his friend Stu. He prayed that God would use him and that Stu would not only be healed from the cancer that was spreading rapidly through his body, but more importantly that he would be healed from the curse of sin that he was in bondage to before it was too late. Stu knew that this would probably be his last summer if all went as the doctors anticipated. Working this summer was a dream and all he felt he had left. He wished he knew the God that Steve was always talking about. But, Stu knew that he had lived a wicked life and didn't deserve the life that his friend desired for him. If he had been good like Steve, then, maybe, God would want to heal him. He shook his head and made his way back to the bed. Sleep evaded him as his mind played over and over the words of Steve's prayer. Could he be healed from the curse of sin? He had attended church for most of his childhood and had heard all the stories. Until lately, he hadn't thought much about them. As his body had weakened, he had begun to think more about God but had decided he was too bad. He didn't want to look weak by seeking forgiveness just because his life was almost over. He wouldn't have time to memorize all the verses that Steve had, but Steve had once told him that all he had to do was to believe in Jesus, confess, repent of his sins and receive Him as his Lord.

Questions for Today: Do you treasure God and His Word? Do others know that you do by your actions?
