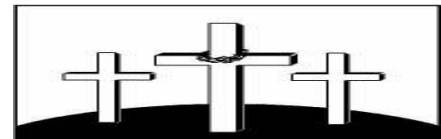

Saved at the Bottom of the Sea

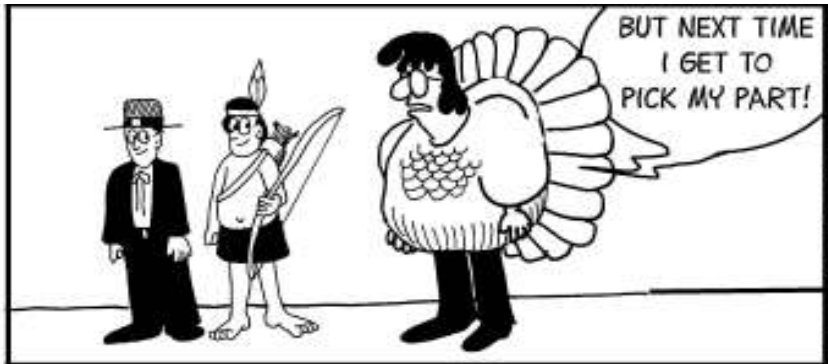

REESIE'S HOLIDAY RECIPES



Streusel-Topped Pumpkin Pie

Ingredients

- 1 refrigerated pie crust (from 15-oz box), softened as directed on box
- 1 can (15 oz) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)
- 1 can (12 oz) evaporated milk (1 1/2 cups)
 - 1/2 cup granulated sugar
 - 2 eggs, slightly beaten
 - 1 tsp. cinnamon
 - 1/2 tsp salt
 - 1/2 tsp ground ginger
 - 1/8 tsp ground cloves

Topping

- 1/2 cup quick cooking oats
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup margarine, softened

Heat oven to 375°F. Place pie crust in 9-inch glass pie pan as directed on box for One-Crust Filled Pie. In large bowl, mix filling ingredients until well blended. Pour into crust-lined pan. Bake 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350°F; bake 15 minutes. Meanwhile in small bowl mix topping ingredients with fork until crumbly, set aside. Sprinkle topping over pie. Bake 10 min. longer or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cool on rack for 30 min. Refrigerate until chilled before serving.

Cranberry Salad

Ingredients

- 1 lb bag Ocean Spray cranberries
- 2 oranges
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 sm. boxes raspberry jello
- 1 cup chopped nuts

Grind cranberries and oranges. Add sugar and sit aside. Prepare jello as directed. Chill until slightly thickened. Add mixture to jell, add nuts and chill until firm.

Maple-Pecan Pie

Ingredients

- 1/4 c margarine, melted
- 2/3 c sugar
- 1 c maple syrup
- 3 Eggs
- 1/2 tsp Salt
- 1 c Pecan halves
- 1/4 c semi sweet choc. Chips
- 1 tsp shortening
- 1 9" pie shell

Heat oven to 375°F. Place pie crust in 9-inch glass pie pan as directed on box for One-Crust Filled Pie. Cream margarine and sugar. Add syrup, eggs, salt. Mix together and add pecans. Pour into crust. Bake 15 min. Cover crust edge with strips of foil to prevent excessive browning. Bake 25 -35 min longer or until filling is set. Cool 15 min. In small bowl microwave choc chips and shortening and stir until smooth. Drizzle over pie.

Praline-Pumpkin Cake

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 1/4 cup whipping cream
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped pecans
- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 1 cup (from 15-oz can) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1 container (1 lb) cream cheese frosting

Heat oven to 325°F. In 1-quart heavy saucepan, stir together butter, whipping cream and brown sugar. Cook over low heat, stirring occasionally, just until butter is melted. Pour into 2 (9- or 8-inch) round cake pans; sprinkle evenly with 3/4 cup pecans. In large bowl, beat cake mix, pumpkin, milk, oil, eggs and 1 teaspoon of the pumpkin pie spice with electric mixer on low speed until moistened. Beat 2 minutes on medium speed. Carefully spoon batter over pecan mixture in each pan. Bake 43 to 45 minutes or until cake springs back when touched lightly in center. Cool 5 minutes; remove from pans to cooling rack. Cool completely, about 1 hour. Stir remaining 1/2 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice into frosting. To assemble cake, place 1 layer, praline side up, on serving plate. Spread with half of the frosting. Top with second layer, praline side up; spread remaining frosting to edge of layer. Drizzle with caramel topping and additional pecans.

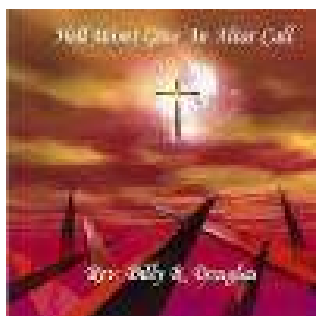

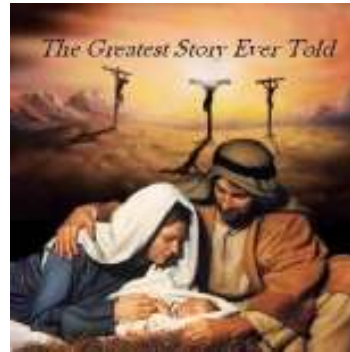

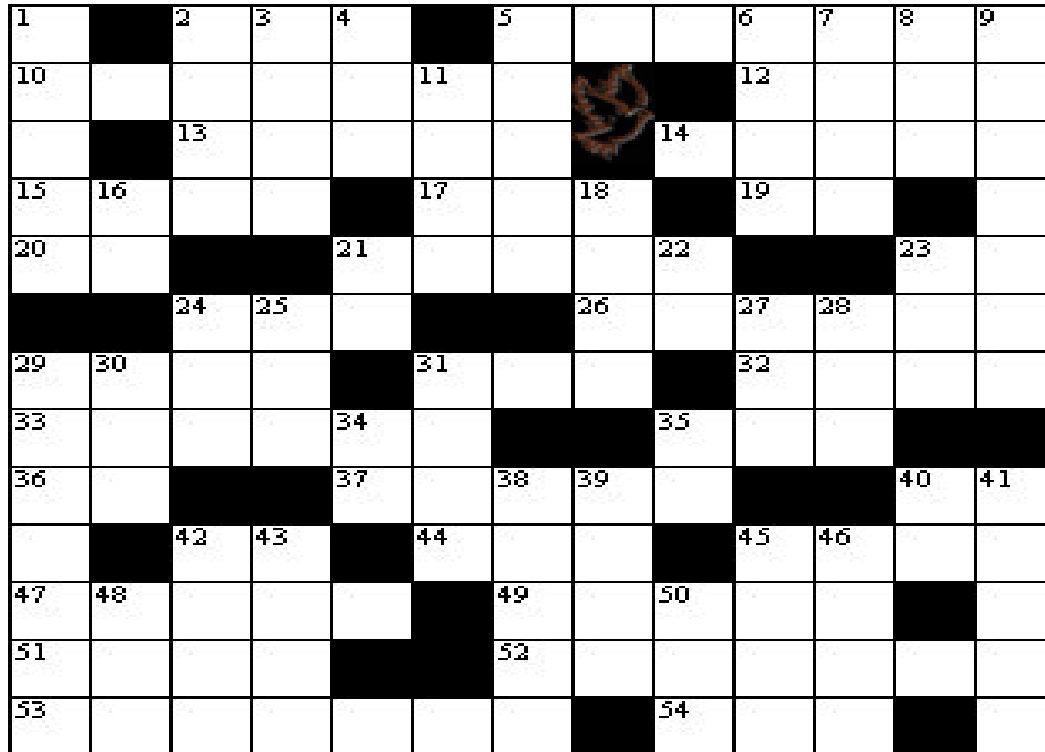
Where...Is IT Written??

More Great Holiday Recipes

Sweet Potato Pie

Ingredients

- 1 (9 inch) pie shell, unbaked
- 1 pound sweet potatoes, cooked and peeled
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 (14 ounce) can EAGLE BRAND® Sweetened Condensed Milk (NOT evaporated milk)
- 1 teaspoon grated orange rind
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In large mixing bowl, beat hot sweet potatoes with butter until smooth. Add remaining ingredients except pie shell; mix well. Pour into pie shell. Bake 40 minutes or until golden brown. Cool. Garnish as desired.

KIDS CORNER

Turkey Gobbler Biscuits

Ingredients

- 1 cn pillsbury grands, buttermilk biscuits
- 2 to 3 tsp. milk
- 16 dried currants or 4 raisins, quartered
- 8 shelled sunflower seeds
- 16 pieces pimiento or red bell pepper, cut into 1/8 x 1/2 pieces

Directions

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Separate dough into 8 biscuits. Cut 1/2 inch piece off each biscuit; set small piece aside to use for body. To form feathers, cut each large piece of dough at about 1/4 inch of straight edge. 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheets. Place each body piece of dough, cut side down, on center of each feather portion allowing 1/4 inch of body to drop below straight edge. Press lower half of each body piece firmly, allowing top half of each piece to remain puffy, forming head. Brush dough with milk. For eyes, press 2 currants into each head. For beak, press sunflower seed below eyes. Arrange pimiento piece just below beak to form "wattle". Bake for 10 to 15 minutes or until golden brown. Immediately remove from cookie sheets. Serve warm

Layered Pumpkin Cheesecake

Ingredients

Crust

- 2 cups gingersnap cookie crumbs (about 32)
- 1/4 cup margarine, melted

Filling

- 4 (8 oz) cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup canned pumpkin
- 1 1/2 tsp ground ginger
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. nutmeg

Heat oven to 300. Grease 9" spring form pan with shortening. Wrap foil around pan to catch drips. In small bowl mix cookie crumbs and butter. Press crumb mixture in bottom and 1" up side of pan. Bake 8-10 min or until set. Cool 5 min. In large bowl beat cream cheese with electric mixer on medium speed just until smooth and creamy: do not over beat. On low speed beat in sugar, then beat in eggs one at a time just until blended. Spoon 3 cups of the cream cheese mixture into pan, spread evenly. Stir pumpkin, ginger, cinnamon and nutmeg into remaining cream cheese mixture: mix with wire whisk until smooth, spoon over mixture in pan. Bake 1 hour 25 min or until edges are set but center still jiggles slightly when moved. Turn oven off and open over door at least 4". Leave cheesecake in oven 30 min longer. Remove from oven and place on cooling rack. Without releasing side of pan, run knife around edge of pan to loosen cheesecake. Cool in pan on cooling rack for 30 min. Cover loosely, refrigerate at least 6 hours but no longer than 24. Run knife around edge of pan to loosen cheesecake again. Carefully remove side of pan. Place on serving plate.

Dinner Rolls

Ingredients

- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup Crisco
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 pkg yeast, dissolved in 1/2 cup warm water
- 1 cup cold water
- 2 tsp. salt

Directions

Mix all ingredients together, sift in 8 or 9 cups of flour. Mix: knead mixture. Put in greased bowl and let rise, then put in roll pans and let rise another hour. Bake at 425 until brown.
