“Asleep In The Light”

Amos 6:1-6

1 Woe to them that are at ease in Zion, and trust in the mountain of Samaria, which are named chief of the nations, to whom the house of Israel came! 2 Pass ye unto Calneh, and see; and from thence go ye to Hamath the great: then go down to Gath of the Philistines: be they better than these kingdoms? or their border greater than your border? 3 Ye that put far away the evil day, and cause the seat of violence to come near; 4 That lie upon beds of ivory, and stretch themselves upon their couches, and eat the lambs out of the flock, and the calves out of the midst of the stall; 5 That chant to the sound of the viol, and invent to themselves instruments of musick, like David; 6 That drink wine in bowls, and anoint themselves with the chief ointments: but they are not grieved for the affliction of Joseph.

The message from Amos the prophet here is one to the people of God and not to the heathen concerning the danger of growing apathetic in our walk with God. He says in verse 1 - Woe to them that are at ease in Zion, and trust in the mountain of Samaria, which are named chief of the nations, to whom the house of Israel came! The children of God during that time had gotten comfortable in Zion which is a type of the church. We see that in this day in which we live in. Christians today are “Asleep In The Light.” We have allowed sin in the church and we don’t even bat an eye at it. We have become at ease in the church just as the people of God were in the prophet Amos time. See the people of God felt secure in their own religion. They had the attitude if we attend church now and then we will be alright, won’t we? Listen to what the prophet Jeremiah says: Jeremiah 7:1-4 - The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD, saying, 2Stand in the gate of the LORD’s house, and proclaim there this word, and say, Hear the word of the LORD, all ye of Judah, that enter in at these gates to worship the LORD. 3Thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, Amend your ways and your doings, and I will cause you to dwell in this place. 4Trust ye not in lying words, saying, The temple of the LORD, The temple of the LORD, The temple of the LORD, are these. Don’t trust in the outward symbols of religion because that’s a false security. Just going to church doesn’t make you anymore of a Christian than standing in a garage will make you a vehicle. Beware if you are trusting in religion and you don’t have a relationship with Jesus Christ. It’s doom in your future! Christians today has no interests in the things of God. Happiness and pleasure are more important than souls getting saved. We’ve heard the word of God but fail to take it serious. The world is lost in darkness while the church is asleep in the light. Christian, let me ask you a question...Does what grieves the heart of Jesus grieve your heart? What grieves the heart of Jesus is lost souls that are headed to Hell. Please don’t be selfish, this is the call to every believer: to awake out of sleep, shake the slumber off and reach out your hand to those that are lost and dying. REESIE'S HOLIDAY RECIPES



Coca Cola Cherry Salad

- 1 can cherry pie filling
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 large package of cherry gelatin mix
- 1 (7 1/2-ounce) can of crushed pineapple
- 1 12-ounce can of Coca-Cola
- 1/2 cup of chopped nuts
- 1 tub of chilled whipped topping
- 3 ounces of cream cheese

Boil the pie filling and water. Remove from heat and add the gelatin mix. Stir until mixed. Add the pineapple with its juice from the can, and add the Coke. Stir in the nuts and cool until set. Meanwhile, mix together the whipped topping and cream cheese and spread on the cooled and set salad. Serve.

Fancy Bean Casserole

- 3 cups frozen French-style green beans, thawed
- 1 can (10-3/4 ounces) cream of chicken soup
- 1-1/2 cups frozen corn, thawed
- 1 can (8 ounces) sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/4 cup cubed Velveeta cheese
- 5 teaspoons butter
- 1/3 cup crushed Ritz Crackers
- 2 tablespoons slivered almonds

In a large bowl, combine the first seven ingredients. Transfer to an 11-in. x 7-in. baking dish coated with cooking spray. In a small skillet, melt butter. Add cracker crumbs and almonds; cook and stir until lightly browned. Sprinkle over the top. Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 35-40 minutes or until heated through and topping is golden brown.

Thanksgiving Pie

Ingredients

- 1 UNBAKED PIE CRUST ROLLED OUT TO A 12" SQUARE
- 3 EGGS
- 2 CUPS COOKED, MASHED PUMPKIN
- 3/4 CUP BROWN SUGAR, FIRMLY PACKED
- 1 TEASPOON GROUND CINNAMON
- 1/2 TEASPOON GROUND GINGER
- 1/2 TEASPOON GROUND CLOVES
- 1/4 TEASPOON GROUND NUTMEG
- 1/2 TEASPOON SALT
- 1 1/2 CUPS MILK

Preheat the oven to 425°. Lay the pie crust in a 9" square pan and fit it up around the sides. Flute the edges in a pretty design. Beat the eggs until thoroughly mixed. Add the pumpkin, sugar, and spices and salt, and mix well. Add the milk and mix thoroughly. Pour the pumpkin mixture into the pie crust. Bake the pie at 425° for 15 minutes; then turn the oven down to 350° and continue baking for about 30 minutes more or until a knife put in about an inch from the edge comes out clean. The pie will set a little more as it cools. Cool the pie on a rack before serving. Cut it into squares to serve. Refrigerate any leftover pieces.

Heavenly Cranberry Salad

Ingredients

- 1 pound cranberries
- 8 ounces miniature marshmallows
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 (20 ounce) can crushed pineapple with juice
- 1 banana, sliced
- 1 cup unsweetened whipped cream

In a food processor or blender, coarsely grind the cranberries. Place ground cranberries in a large bowl and stir in the marshmallows, sugar and pineapple. Let mixture stand overnight in the refrigerator. Just before serving, stir in the sliced banana and whipped cream.






