


My Bedside Table

Send His Word

Isaiah 55:8-13

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord. 9 For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. 10 For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: 11 So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it. 12 For ye shall go out with joy, and be led forth with peace: the mountains and the hills shall break forth before you into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. 13 Instead of the thorn shall come up the fir tree, and instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree: and it shall be to the Lord for a name, for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off.

God's Word alone can expose the depth of the need of mankind. It can go beyond the soul right into the heart of even the hardest hearted person. The importance of God's Word is no new principle. It cannot be denied. There is no literature in the whole world that can verify itself like God's Word. It is infallible. It is unshakeable. It is unchangeable. The Word does not come to us so that we can possess it. The Word must possess us. It must be applied to all the aspects of our lives. To fail in one part is to fail in all. God promises success through His Word. God's Word has purpose. It is powerful. It is fruitful. The Word can be reproduced in the life of others. It is never stagnant. It pushes forward in prosperity. It is like an unsinkable ship. It survives even on the roughest sea. Nothing can stop it. God's Word will accomplish its purpose. Here's a powerful example of Jesus sending his word in Luke 7:2-10 - And a certain centurion's servant, who was dear unto him, was sick, and ready to die. 3 And when he heard of Jesus, he sent unto him the elders of the Jews, beseeching him that he would come and heal his servant. 4 And when they came to Jesus, they besought him instantly, saying, That he was worthy for whom he should do this: 5 For he loveth our nation, and he hath built us a synagogue. 6 Then Jesus went with them. And when he was now not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to him, saying unto him, Lord, trouble not thyself: for I am not worthy that thou shouldest enter under my roof: 7 Wherefore neither thought I myself worthy to come unto thee: but say in a word, and my servant shall be healed. 8 For I also am a man set under authority, having under me soldiers, and I say unto one, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. 9 When Jesus heard these things, he marvelled at him, and turned him about, and said unto the people that followed him, I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. 10 And they that were sent, returning to the house, found the servant whole that had been sick. He had faith enough for the spoken word to be sent out by Jesus. The Word is powerful! They said that the Titanic could not sink but it did. God's Word can sail the roughest seas. Hitler burned Bibles by the thousands yet it still stands as the World's best seller. The sea is humanity with all their problems and difficulty. Do not be like Noah's generation that perished when the floods came. Get on board the Gospel ship. You'll be glad tomorrow you did it today. The story is told of an unbeliever who wanted to see 18th century Evangelist George Whitefield preach but did not want to listen to his message. Deliberately putting fingers in both ears, he watched the great preacher without listening to a word he said. But a stubborn fly landed on his nose, no matter what he did, he could not shake him off. He unplugged his ears long enough to shoo the fly away, and in those brief seconds, Whitefield proclaimed loudly, "Him who has ears to hear, let him hear!" The amazing timing of it so intrigued the man that he listened to the rest of Whitefield's sermon and was saved. The Word shall prosper in its purpose. It is based upon truth. It is based upon the integrity of the Speaker. If the Word does not prosper then God is the biggest liar that there ever was. The Creator of the universe, the Almighty God, stands behind His Word. He is unshakeable therefore so is His word. Let's look at what The Word produces: The product of God's Word is joy. Nehemiah 8:10 - Then he said unto them, Go your way, eat the fat, and drink the sweet, and send portions unto them for whom nothing is prepared: for this day is holy unto our Lord: neither be ye sorry; for the joy of the Lord is your strength. Weeping may endure for the night but joy cometh in the morning. When you sow God's Word joy will fill your heart. If you plant joy you will reap joy. It's the law of God's Word. Another product of God's Word is peace. Peace like a river. Peace is like a flood when it comes it will sweep over the soul. John 14:27 - Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. If you sow peace you will reap peace. It's the law of God's Word. Remember the Word of God has more power than you think so just send his word over any problem or situation you have and it won't return void.

Mushroom Swiss Mac & Cheese

1 package (16 ounces) mini penne pasta 1/2 pound baby portobello mushrooms, chopped

- 1 small onion, finely chopped
 - 2 tablespoons butter
 - 1 tablespoon olive oil
 - 1 garlic clove, minced

SAUCE:

5 tablespoons butter

1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, cubed

1-1/4 cups whole milk

1-1/4 cups half-and-half cream

2-1/2 cups (10 ounces) shredded Swiss cheese

1-1/4 cups grated Parmesan and Romano cheese blend

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

6 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

TOPPING:

1/3 cup panko (Japanese) bread crumbs

2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley

2 tablespoons butter, melted

Cook pasta according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a large skillet, saute mushrooms and onion in butter and oil until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Set aside. For sauce, in a large saucepan, melt butter. Stir in cream

cheese until smooth. Gradually add milk and cream; heat through. Stir in the cheeses, salt and pepper until blended. Stir in bacon. Drain pasta; toss with mushroom mixture and sauce. Transfer to a greased 13-in. x 9-in. baking dish. Combine the bread crumbs, parsley and melted butter; sprinkle over mixture. Bake, uncovered, at 375° for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown.

Eggnog French Toast

24 slices French bread (3/4 inch thick)

9 eggs

3 cups half-and-half cream

1/3 cup sugar

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1-1/2 teaspoons rum extract

1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Confectioners' sugar

Arrange the bread slices in two well-greased 15-in. x 10-in. x 1-in. baking pans. In a large bowl, beat the eggs, cream, sugar, extracts and nutmeg until blended; pour over bread. Turn bread to coat. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Remove from the refrigerator 30 minutes before baking. Bake, uncovered, at 500° for 12-15 minutes or until lightly browned, turning bread once. Dust with confectioners' sugar.

Peanut Butter Pie

1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened

1 cup plus 2 tablespoons creamy peanut butter, divided

1/2 cup sugar

1 carton (12 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed, divided

1 chocolate crumb crust (8 inches)

2/3 cup plus 2 tablespoons hot fudge ice cream topping, divided

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese until smooth. Beat in 1 cup peanut butter and sugar. Fold in 3 cups whipped topping; spoon into crust. In a microwave-safe bowl, heat 2/3 cup hot fudge topping for 30 seconds. Pour over peanut butter layer and spread to edges of crust. Refrigerate for 2 hours. Spread remaining whipped topping over pie. Cut into slices. Place the remaining hot fudge topping and peanut butter in two separate plastic bags. Cut a small hole in the corner of each bag; pipe topping and peanut butter over each slice of pie.

Pastry for single-crust pie (9 inches) -1 cup sugar - 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour - 1/8 teaspoon salt 3 eggs, lightly beaten - 1/4 cup butter, melted - 1 cup prepared mincemeat 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Walnut Mincemeat Pie

Line a 9-in. pie plate with pastry; flute edges. Line pastry shell with a double thickness of heavy-duty foil. Bake at 450° for 5 minutes. Remove foil; bake 5 minutes longer. Cool on a wire rack. Reduce heat to 350°. In a large bowl, combine the sugar, flour and salt. Stir in the eggs, butter, mincemeat and walnuts until blended. Pour into crust. Bake for 40-45 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Cover edges with foil during the last 15 minutes to prevent overbrowning if necessary. Cool on a wire rack.

Apple Butter Pumpkin Pie

1 cup apple butter 1 cup canned pumpkin

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

3/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ground ginger

3 eggs, lightly beaten

3/4 cup evaporated milk

1 unbaked pastry shell (9 inches)

Additional pie pastry, optional

Whipped cream, optional

In a large bowl, combine the apple butter, pumpkin, brown sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt and ginger. Add eggs. Gradually beat in milk until smooth. Pour into pastry shell. Bake at 425° for 35-40 minutes or until set (cover edges loosely with foil if necessary to prevent overbrowning). Cool on a wire rack. If decorative cutouts are desired, roll additional pastry to 1/8-in. thickness; cut out with 1-in. to 1-1/2-in. leaf-shaped cookie cutters. With a sharp knife, score leaf veins on cutouts if desired. Place on an ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 400° for 6-8 minutes or until golden brown. Remove to a wire rack to cool. Arrange around edge of pie. Garnish with whipped cream if desired.

Cheesy Potato Casserole

1 bag Ore-Ida® Country Style Hash Browns

1 can cream of chicken soup

2 cup Sour cream

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cup cheddar cheese shredded

1/3 cup green onions sliced

1/4 teaspoon black pepper, ground

2 cup corn flakes crushed

1/4 cup butter, melted

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat 13x9 baking dish with nonstick cooking spray. In a large bowl, whisk together soup, sour cream, salt and pepper. Stir in cheese, onion and Hash Browns until well mixed. Spoon evenly into baking dish. In a medium bowl, mix together cereal and butter. Sprinkle evenly on top of Hash Brown mixture. Bake uncovered for about 45 minutes, or until hot and bubbly. Allow to rest for 5 minutes before serving. Garnish with additional sliced green onion if desired.

Caramel Pecan Cheesecake Pie

1 sheet refrigerated pie pastry

1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened

1/2 cup sugar

4 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1-1/4 cups chopped pecans

1 jar (12-1/4 ounces) fat-free caramel ice cream topping

Additional fat-free caramel ice cream topping, optional

Whipped cream, optional

Line a 9-in. deep-dish pie plate with pastry. Trim and flute edges. In a small bowl, beat the cream cheese, sugar, 1 egg and vanilla until smooth. Spread into pastry shell; sprinkle with pecans. In a small bowl, whisk remaining eggs; gradually whisk in caramel topping until blended. Pour slowly over

pecans. Bake at 375° for 35-40 minutes or until lightly browned (loosely cover edges with foil after 20 minutes if pie browns too quickly). Cool on a wire rack for 1 hour. Refrigerate for 4 hours or overnight before slicing. If desired, garnish with additional account in a core to be a second to be a se

with additional caramel ice cream topping.

Savory Herb Roasted Turkey

2 tablespoons McCormick® Sage, Rubbed or McCormick® Poultry Seasoning

1 tablespoon McCormick® Paprika

1 tablespoon seasoned salt

2 teaspoons McCormick® Garlic Powder

1 teaspoon McCormick® Black Pepper, Ground

3/4 teaspoon McCormick® Nutmeg, Ground

1 whole turkey (12 to 14 pounds), fresh or frozen, thawed

1 large onion, cut into wedges

Spread remaining seasoning mixture over entire surface and under skin of turkey. Add 1/2 cup water to pan. Cover turkey loosely with heavy duty foil. Roast 1 hour. Remove foil. Roast 2 to 2 1/2 hours longer or until internal temperature reaches 165°F (175°F in thigh), basting occasionally with pan juices. Remove turkey from oven. Let stand 20 minutes. Transfer to platter or carving board to slice. Reserve pan juices to make gravy or to serve with turkey. The fact that through all of this he had seen their unwavering faith lead him to the conclusion that the God that they served MUST BE REAL! It's easy for anyone to stand and sing a song of joy while on the mountain top but the real test of faith...the real test of thankfulness is whether we can give thanks to the God that we serve, despite the wounds and pains of yesterday's struggles. Giving Thanks

But seek first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Matthew 6:33

Roger Babson, a famous statistician was having lunch with the President of Argentina, "Mr. Babson," the President said, "I have been wondering why it is that South America, with all its natural advantages, mines of iron, copper, coal and silver, rivers and great waterfalls is so far behind North America?" Babson replied, "Well, Mr. President, what do you think is the reason?" He answered, "...South America was founded by the Spanish who came in search of gold. North America was founded by the Pilgrims who went there in search of God." If we live a life of seeking gold — the blessings of God but not God Himself — we end up losing both.
