Oh Be Not Weary

William Wilberforce led a campaign against the British Parliament to abolish slavery in the late 1700's and early 1800's. During the course of his intense efforts, Wilberforce came to a desperate place of discouragement, feeling he had absolutely no more strength to continue. In this condition, he was about to give up, when his elderly friend, John Wesley, lying on his deathbed, was informed of his friend William's distress. Wesley requested pen and paper, and with a quivering hand, wrote these words, "Unless God has raised you up for this very thing, you will be worn out by the opposition of men and devils. But if God be for you, who can be against you? Are all of them stronger than God? Oh be not weary of well-doing! Go on, in the name of God and in the power of his might, till even American slavery shall vanish away before it." John Wesley died six days later, but William Wilberforce fought for forty-five more years, and in 1833, three days before his own death, witnessed the abolition of slavery in Britain.



Are You Warming Your Hands By The Wrong Fire?

John 18:15 -27 - And Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple: that disciple was known unto the high priest, and went in with Jesus into the palace of the high priest. 16 But Peter stood at the door without. Then went out that other disciple, which was known unto the high priest, and spake unto her that kept the door, and brought in Peter. 17 Then saith the damsel that kept the door unto Peter, Art not thou also one of this man's disciples? He saith, I am not. 18 And the servants and officers stood there, who had made a fire of coals; for it was cold: and they warmed themselves: and Peter stood with them, and warmed himself. 19 The high priest then asked Jesus of his disciples, and of his doctrine. 20 Jesus answered him, I spake openly to the world; I ever taught in the synagogue, and in the temple, whither the Jews always resort; and in secret have I said nothing. 21 Why askest thou me? ask them which heard me, what I have said unto them: behold, they know what I said. 22 And when he had thus spoken, one of the officers which stood by struck Jesus with the palm of his hand, saying, Answerest thou the high priest so? 23 Jesus answered him, If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil: but if well, why smitest thou me? 24 Now Annas had sent him bound unto Caiaphas the high priest. 25 And Simon Peter stood and warmed himself. They said therefore unto him, Art not thou also one of his disciples? He denied it, and said, I am not...26 One of the servants of the high priest, being his kinsman whose ear Peter cut off, saith, Did not I see thee in the garden with him? 27 Peter then denied again: and immediately the cock crew. Our text records the saddest hour in the life of one of our Lord's most interesting disciples. No other follower of Christ demonstrated 1-Such COURAGE At Times 2-Yet Such A COWARD At Other Times. A-The night before the crucifixion was a very cowardice night for Simon Peter. He said things and did things of which he would forever be ashamed! B-If there was one segment in Peter's life he would love to blot out of his record it would have been that night! Several events took place on that fateful night which led up to Peter's spiritual collapse. The events occurred as follows: 1. His DISPUTING about Foot Washing. John 13:6 - 10 -Then cometh he to Simon Peter: and Peter saith unto him, Lord, dost thou wash my feet? 7 Jesus answered and said unto him, What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter. 8 Peter saith unto him, Thou shalt never wash my feet. Jesus answered him, If I wash thee not, thou hast no part with me. 9 Simon Peter saith unto him, Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head. 10 Jesus saith to him, He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all. "Thou shalt never wash my feet" (v.8) Rebellion! 2. His DECLARATIONS of Loyalty. Matthew 26:33 - Peter answered and said unto him, Though all men shall be offended because of thee, yet will I never be offended. John 13:37 - Peter said unto him, Lord, why cannot I follow thee now? I will lay down my life for thy sake. The very thing that Peter proudly boasted that he would NOT do, he did! Christ's warnings were simply cast aside! 1st Corinthians 10:12 - Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall. 3. His DROWSINESS in Gethsemane. Matthew 26:36 - 45 - Then cometh Jesus with them unto a place called Gethsemane, and saith unto the disciples, Sit ye here, while I go and pray yonder. 37 And he took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be sorrowful and very heavy. 38 Then saith he unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: tarry ye here, and watch with me.39 And he went a little farther, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt. 40 And he cometh unto the disciples, and findeth them asleep, and saith unto Peter, What, could ye not watch with me one hour? 41 Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak. 42 He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy will be done. 43 And he came and found them asleep again: for their eyes were heavy. 44 And he left them, and went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words. 45 Then cometh he to his disciples, and saith unto them, Sleep on now, and take your rest: behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. "If Peter could not be faithful in the face of DROWSINESS, he certainly will not be faithful in the face of DEATH!" "If you sleep during PRAYER time, you will fail during PROVING time!" 4. His DEMONSTRATION of Swordplay. John 18:10-11 - Then Simon Peter having a sword drew it, and smote the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus. 11 Then said Jesus unto Peter, Put up thy sword into the sheath: the cup which my Father hath given me, shall I not drink it Christianity does NOT conquer with the Sword of STEEL, but rather with the Sword of the SPIRIT! Ephesians 6:17 - And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: 5. His DRIFTING from Fellowship. Matthew 26:58 - But Peter followed him afar off unto the high priest's palace, and went in, and sat with the servants, to see the end. The phrase "afar off" represents more than just Peter's physical distance from the Lord, but it also reflects his distance apart from his spiritual relationship with the Lord. Instead of being close to the Lord (the True Fire), Peter found himself by the worldly fires with the ungodly! Warming himself with this fire says that Peter was more concerned about his physical coldness than his spiritual coldness. I. He FELLOW SHIPPED with the WORLD! John 18:18 - "and Peter stood with them" 2nd Corinthians 6:17 - Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you. Any time your fellowship with the Lord and His people begins to wane, you will soon move into the camp of the ungodly! "Birds of a feather flock together!" "It is unwise to warm yourself beside the fire with people of whom you may get burned!" II. He FORGOT His WORDS! Luke 22:61 - And the Lord turned, and looked upon Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said unto him, Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice. III. He FORSOOK His WILL! Luke 22:56 - 60 - But a certain maid beheld him as he sat by the fire, and earnestly looked upon him, and said, This man was also with him. 57 And he denied him, saying, Woman, I know him not. 58 And after a little while another saw him, and said, Thou art also of them. And Peter said, Man, I am not. 59 And about the space of one hour after another confidently affirmed, saying, Of a truth this fellow also was with him: for he is a Galilaeen. 60 And Peter said, Man, I know not what thou sayest. And immediately, while he yet spake, the cock crew. A. His Wickedness (He Denied Christ!) The same Peter who once said of his Lord, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God."(Matt 16:16), now refers to Him as "this man of whom ye speak" (Mark 14:71) B. His Weeping Luke 22:61-62 - And the Lord turned, and looked upon Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said unto him, Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice. 62 And Peter went out, and wept bitterly. If you are warming your hands by the world's fire of PASSION and PLEASURES, instead of the PRAISE, PRAYER, and POWER of God, then you are warming yourself by the wrong fire!!!



What Do Christians Do?

“And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me.” (Luke 9:23)

Although its impact is much greater when hearing this godly man speak with his Mississippi accent, read the following words of Minister Don Wildmon (Founder of the American Family Association) from around 1999: “In 1973, the Supreme Court said it was okay to kill babies. Since then, we’ve killed more than the entire population of Canada. And it continues. A woman’s choice? Half of those who’ve died in the mother’s wombs have been women; they didn’t have a choice. It’s called abortion. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. First it was in dingy, dirty theaters, then convenience stores, then grocery stores, then on television, now it’s in the homes of millions who view the internet. It’s called pornography. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. They call it “no fault;” why should we blame anyone when something so tragic happens? Haven’t they already suffered enough? Half the marriages in America end this way. The children suffer, the family broke down. It’s called divorce. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. One time it was a perversion; we kept it secret. We secured help and hope for those who practiced it. Now it’s praised. We have parades celebrating it and elected officials give it their blessing. Now it’s endowed with special privileges and protected by special laws. Even some Christian leaders in denominations praise it. It’s called homosexuality. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. It used to be an embarrassment, a shame, now a third of all births to mothers, are to mothers who aren’t married. Two-thirds of all African American children are born into a home without a father. The state usually pays the tab. That’s why we pay our taxes, so the government can take the place of parents. After all, government bureaucrats know much better how to raise children than parents do. It’s called illegitimacy. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. At one time it was wrong but then the state decided to legalize it, promote it, and tax it. It has ripped apart families and destroyed lives. But just look at all the money the state’s raised. No longer do we have to teach our children to study and work hard; now we teach them they can get something for nothing. We spend millions encouraging the people to join the fun and excitement. Just look at the big sums people are winning; they’ll never have to work again. It’s called gambling. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. Not long ago Christians were the good guys; but now any positive image of Christians in movies or on the television is gone. We’re now depicted as the bad guys—greedy, marrow minded hypocrites. The teacher can’t have a Bible on her desk but can have playboy. We don’t have Christmas and Easter holidays just winter and spring breaks. We can’t pray in school but we can use foul language. It’s called being tolerant. Me? I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now. Yes, all of these things came to pass in 30 years. Where were the Christians? They were in church! All these things are for somebody else to deal with! Times have changed; involvement has been replaced with apathy. But don’t blame me! I didn’t do anything. I go to church; the minister preaches, and I go home. That’s what Christians do now.” Too often “Christianity” never leaves the church. Friends, deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Jesus! Follow Jesus where? He went everywhere. He took truth to the church and into society. He showed compassion but never at the expense of truth; rather, truth compelled Him to compassion and compassion compelled Him to speak truth. Silence is nothing more than a form of acceptance. Inactivity is a sign of death. Dead men don’t move unless someone picks them up and moves them...is that what happens in the church today? I’ve known several churches that can’t even get a majority of their people to move. Jesus said, “If any man will come after me...”—Action—purposely coming to Jesus. “Let him deny himself...”—Action—purposely choosing to submit your will to that of God’s (a form of dying). “and take up his cross daily...”—Action—purposely taking up your burden every day. “and follow me.”—ACTION—purposely following Jesus wherever He leads; step by step. Look at the hurts listed throughout Mr. Wildmon’s message. Each of those people needs the compassion of truth. They don’t need the inaction of mental judgment—Jesus will judge the living and the dead. They don’t need the inactivity of looks or attitudes of superiority or pity; they need an active introduction to Jesus and His truth. They don’t need the inactivity of Pharisaical prayers, “Thank you Lord that I am not like them.” They need our active prayers of brokenness, not only praying for them but with them, if possible. They don’t need the inactivity of not engaging with them, walking around them like the Levite in the “Good Samaritan.” They need our active engagement with them, showing compassion and paying the cost of truth and engagement. The church is not a building where we hear a sermon and retire to the comfort of our own homes, ignoring the hurting world around us. WE ARE THE CHURCH! We are to BE ACTIVE in showing the love, compassion, and truth of Christ. IF we are the body (of Christ), why aren’t we following the Head? Don Wildmon’s words describe a paralyzed body. Are we raised or are we dead? Are you dead to your will, alive to Christ’s burden placed before you, and following the lead of Jesus? Society is changed one soul at a time—which direction are we turning the tide?



REESIE'S RECIPES

Hummingbird Upside-Down Poke Bundt Cake

Cake

- 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1/3 cup packed brown sugar
- 6 pineapple slices (from 20-oz can), drained,
juice reserved
- 1 box Betty Crocker™ SuperMoist™ yellow cake mix
- 1/2 cup reserved pineapple juice
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup mashed very ripe bananas (2 medium)
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Filling

- 1 cup (from 14-oz can) canned sweetened condensed
milk (not evaporated)
- 1/4 cup reserved pineapple juice

Powdered Sugar Icing

- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 2 teaspoons reserved pineapple juice
- 2 tablespoons chopped pecans, toasted

Heat oven to 350°F. Generously spray 12-cup bundt cake pan with baking spray with flour. Pour 2 tablespoons melted butter evenly in bottom of pan. Sprinkle brown sugar over butter. Cut pineapple slices in half. Line bottom of pan with pineapple halves, fitting slices close together. Set aside. In large bowl, beat cake mix, 1/2 cup melted butter, 1/2 cup reserved pineapple juice, eggs, bananas, cinnamon and nutmeg with electric mixer on medium speed 2 minutes. Pour into pan over pineapple. Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove from oven; cool 15 minutes. In small bowl, mix Filling ingredients. With handle of wooden spoon (1/4 to 1/2-inch in diameter), poke holes halfway down in cake every inch, wiping spoon handle occasionally to prevent sticking. Carefully pour filling mixture over holes in cake, using spoon to direct mixture into holes. Refrigerate in pan, uncovered, 2 hours. Remove from refrigerator, and run metal spatula around outer and inside edges of pan to loosen cake; turn upside down onto serving platter. In small bowl, mix powdered sugar and 2 teaspoons reserved pineapple juice. Drizzle on top of cake; sprinkle with pecans.

Amish Dinner Rolls

- 3/4 cup warm milk (about 120-130°F)
- 1/2 cup warm water (about 120-130°F)
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 3/4 cup mashed potato flakes
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 3 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp Kosher salt
- 1 package (2 1/4 tsp, 1/4oz, 7g) RED STAR Platinum Superior Baking Yeast

In a mixing bowl combine milk, water, butter, mashed potato flakes, egg, sugar, flour, salt, and yeast. Using a stand mixer fitted with dough hook, knead for 6-8 minutes or until smooth and soft without being too sticky. The dough should clear sides of the bowl but slightly stick to the bottom. Add additional flour one tablespoon at a time if too wet. Add additional milk 1 tablespoon at a time if too dry. Remove from bowl and set on clean surface. Using the heel of your hand knead briefly until it forms a nice round ball. (Alternately you can knead by hand on a floured surface until you have a smooth soft dough.) Place dough in a greased bowl, cover and let rise until doubled, about 60-90 minutes. Punch down dough and turn out onto a clean surface. Cut dough into 16-20 equal pieces. Using the heel of your hand, quickly and firmly roll each piece around in circles until it forms a tight little ball. Arrange rolls in a greased 9 x 13-inch pan. Cover with greased plastic wrap. Let rise for about 1-1 1/2 hours. They will have doubled in size and be puffy. Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350°F. After the rolls have risen, uncover and place in oven and bake for 20-25 minutes, until golden brown.

Cranberry Fluff Salad

- 12 ounces fresh cranberries, frozen, then thawed
cranberries (fresh or frozen also work)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 8 ounces crushed pineapple, drained
- 2 cups mini-marshmallows
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans, optional

Chop cranberries in a food processor. Remove to a bowl. Mix in sugar, cover, and refrigerate overnight. Add well drained pineapple and marshmallows. Mix to combine. Whip heavy cream to stiff peaks. With a rubber spatula, gently fold the cream into the cranberry mixture. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Creamy & Cheesy Green Bean Casserole


- 3 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup sour cream
- 2 cans (28 oz each) French style green beans, drained well
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar or Colby Jack cheese
- 1 cup French's fried onions

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9x13 baking dish, or similar casserole dish, with cooking spray. Set aside. Melt the butter in a large pot over medium heat. Once melted, add the flour, salt, sugar, and pepper. Stir with a whisk for 1 minute. Stir constantly so it does not burn. Take off the heat and add sour cream. Stir together until combined. Add green beans, half the cheese, and half the fried onions. Stir together and pour into prepared baking dish. Top with the remaining cheese and sprinkle with the remaining fried onions. Bake for 30 minutes.

Waldorf Salad

- 2 Red Apples, chopped
- 2 Green Apples, chopped
- 1 cup Red Seedless Grapes, halved
- 1/4 cup Raisins
- 3/4 cup Celery, chopped
- 1/2 cup chopped Walnuts
- 2/3 cup Mayonnaise
- 1 Tbsp Sugar
- 1 tsp White Vinegar

In large bowl toss the apples in lemon juice. Add celery, grapes, raisins and walnuts. In a separate bowl stir together mayonnaise, sugar and vinegar. Coat apple mixture. Refrigerate until ready to serve.



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Confess Or Don't Confess: What Does The Bible Say?

THERE'S AN INCREASE OF preachers proclaiming that Christians need not ask God for forgiveness of sins. They say, "The confession of sin is for unbelievers. Confessing in order to be forgiven is a work of the flesh. Whether you confess to a priest or directly to God makes no difference." This seems to contradict traditional doctrine. Confess or don't confess? What does the Bible say? ONE SACRIFICE One of their go-to verses is Hebrews 10:12: "But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down on the right hand of God." They say that the "one sacrifice ... forever" means we no longer have to confess our sins. Does it really? The book of Hebrews boldly proclaims the superiority of Jesus Christ over angels, the Levitical priesthood, and the sacrificial system. Verses 1 through 4 proclaim that the blood of bulls and goats could not permanently remove sin. Verse 12 completes the thought by showing that the sacrifice of Jesus Christ fulfilled the sacrificial requirements once and for all. This is self-evident. Jesus said, "It is finished" meaning paid in full. It is in the perfect tense meaning that Jesus paid the price with the ongoing result that no further payments are required. The issue, therefore, is not the need for further payments. PAYMENT MADE BUT NOT APPLIED Universalism believes that since Jesus Christ died as payment for all sin every person is automatically saved. That's not much different than those in the Do Not Confess camp who say, "After all, the Christian's sins have already been paid for." That's true, but payment was not applied to my account until I came by faith to the old rugged Cross, confessed my sins, and asked Jesus Christ to be my Lord and Saviour. Then I received forgiveness from God's treasury of grace. IF WE CONFESS OUR SINS HE IS FAITHFUL "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 Jn. 1:9). This verse should end the argument, but no. They say the lost need to confess their sins and saints need to confess that they are already forgiven. That's not what this verse says. It doesn't say to confess our forgiveness, but to "confess our sins." This is a third class present active subjunctive. If the first part of the conditional clause is met (the confessing of sins) the second part will always come true ("He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness"). IS CONFESSION A WORK OF THE FLESH? The Greek word for confession (homologeō) is a compound Greek word. Homo means "of the same" and logeo means "to speak." Confession is therefore "saying the same thing" about your action that God's Word says. Kenneth Weust had this great observation about homologeo. He said, "Confession of sin on the part of the saint means therefore to say the same thing that God does about that sin, to agree with God as to all the implication of that sin as it relates to the Christian who commits it and to a holy God against whom it is committed." WE DARE NOT TRIVIALIZE SIN Brother Swaggart's commentary on 1 John 1:9 sums it up best: "While we dare not minimize the cleansing of the precious blood of Christ and all its effect, at the same time we must not trivialize or minimize sin as well ... Let not the Christian take sin lightly ... God is faithful to forgive us our confessed sins, because of what Jesus did for us at the Cross." Amen.

I Heard The Voice of His Words

'A thing was revealed unto Daniel.... and the thing was true... but the time appointed was long. Daniel 10:1

Yet heard I the voice of his words: and when I heard the voice of his words, then was I in a deep sleep on my face,
and my face toward the ground. Daniel 10:9
