**BUT GOD was with Joseph**

“But the LORD was with Joseph, and shewed him mercy, and gave him favour in the sight of the keeper of the prison.” Genesis 39:21

In the life of Joseph we see at least four “But God” life lessons. 1) “But the LORD was with Joseph, and shewed him mercy and gave him favour” (Gen. 39:21). 2) “So now it was not you that sent me hither, but God: and he hath made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house, and a ruler throughout all the land of Egypt” (Gen. 45:8). 3) “And Israel said unto Joseph, Behold, I die: but God shall be with you, and bring you again unto the land of your fathers” Genesis 48:21. 4) But as for you, ye thought evil against me; but God meant it unto good, to bring to pass, as it is this day, to save much people alive” (Genesis 50:20). Time and again, bad event became better only to have it go bad again; yet, Joseph held on to his faith in God, believing that God is faithful. Joseph was hated by his brothers and, instead of just killing him outright, they sold him as a slave (a kind of living death). Bought by Potiphar, he was falsely accused and put into prison. There, the chief butler agreed to make mention of Joseph to the Pharaoh after Joseph had interpreted his dream of being reinstated to his rightful place; but he forgot. No matter how bad things got, God was with Joseph. God had a plan and God had a man in Joseph. You’ll remember from last month that the conjunction “but” undoes all that came before. The situations and circumstances put upon us by the hand of man (at times this includes ourselves) are undone by the providential, all-sovereign Hand of God! Hallelujah!

In the first instance, Joseph had done all that was righteous and good, yet his master threw him into prison – BUT GOD – showed mercy where man did not. In our second account, Joseph was speaking to his brothers and said, “Your hand sold me into slavery; but God raised me up for the purpose of saving you and others. In our third example, Joseph’s father, Israel/Jacob, told his son, “I’m going to die.” This would leave Joseph without a father or a home, BUT God would be his Father and bring Joseph home. Finally, Joseph speaks with his brothers again. “Yes, you had evil plans in selling me, but God undid the evil and had a plan for good.” Although a New Testament verse, Joseph, among many others, shows us that Romans 8:28 is an Old Testament concept: “And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.” No matter the evil of our circumstances or how persistently that evil seems to pop its ugly head into the happenstance of our lives, if we truly love God, faithfully walking in obedience to Him, we can trust the “BUT GOD meant it unto good” to be revealed in due season.

Those who love God will grow, not grumble, through hard circumstances. They won’t see themselves as victims; but rather through faithfulness, they recognize themselves, by God’s strength, in God’s time, as victors. Instead of becoming bitter, they become better. And instead of looking for a home and reward here, they seek that “city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God.” Such a person recognizes that although the individual events of their life may not “taste” good and some circumstances may even be downright bitter, once God stirs in His loving plan with His “BUT God” hand, all the events put together become good!

Dr. H.A. Ironside would frequently share the observation of an elderly cook at a Bible conference he was at. A group of preachers were discussing Romans 8:28 when she addressed them saying, “You all have expressed appreciation for the hot biscuits I make for you each morning. But consider – the flour itself does not taste good, nor does the baking powder, nor the shortening, nor the other ingredients; however, when I mix them all together and put them into the oven, they come out just right for biscuits. That is how I understand that God makes everything work together for good.” Even Romans 8:28 is a “BUT God” passage if you’ll read it in context. “Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.” (Romans 8:26-28)

Brothers and sisters, we don’t know how to pray in some of our hard circumstances; and honestly, left to our own passions we’d likely pray, “LORD, get me outta here!” BUT God (the Spirit) prays for us and intercedes for us. Let us trust God, patiently and faithfully running the race which God has set before each of us.



Victory Declared TOO SOON!

To be on truth's side then meant only recognition and reward, not danger and death." If we will not stand with truth in the hard and evil day, we will find ourselves standing against the Defender of Truth, He who IS TRUTH, Jesus Christ. Be faithful and fruitful!



Reesie's Recipes



Amy's Pecan Pie

- 3 eggs
- 1 c. sugar
- 3/4 c. Karo syrup
- 1/4 c. melted butter
- 1 c. pecan halves
- 1 unbaked deep dish pie shell

In a medium bowl combine eggs, sugar, butter, and syrup, mix thoroughly. Add pecans, stir until well coated. Pour into pie shell. Place pie pan on a cookie sheet and bake at 375 degrees for approx 45 mins. Let cool at room temp for at least 2 hrs before serving. (Filling will not be set if cut before 2 hours of cooling)

Amish Broccoli Salad

- 1 head broccoli, chopped
- 1 head cauliflower, chopped
- 1/2 medium sweet onion, chopped
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 cup sunflower kernels
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 (8oz) shredded Cheddar cheese

Combine mayonnaise and sugar, set aside. Mix all other ingredients together in a large bowl. Pour mayo mixture over vegetables.

Reesie's Dressing

- 1 skillet cornbread, cooked and crumbled
- 10-12 biscuits (not canned) cooked and crumbled
- 1 box herb flavor stove top stuffing
- 1 (10oz) cream of mushroom soup
- 1 (10oz) cream of chicken soup
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 to 5 stalks of celery, chopped
- Sage, salt and pepper to taste
- A little cooked chopped turkey
- Broth from cooked turkey

Crumble breads and stuffing mix together. Add all ingredients, saving broth for last. Add enough broth to make it good and moist. Bake on 350 for 35 to 45 minutes or until golden brown on top.

Country Style Baked Beans

- 1/2 lb. ground beef
- 1/2 pound sausage
- 10 slices crisp bacon, crumbled
- 4 (16oz.) pork and beans
- 1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 3/4 cup honey
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 3/4 cup barbecue sauce
- 1 T. Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
- 1 tsp. liquid smoke

Cook ground beef and sausage until well done. Make it into a fine texture with a fork while cooking. Drain off the fat. Cook bacon crisp and crush over the other meats. Open beans and drain off what juice you can. Mix meats, beans and all other ingredients together. Bake in an oven proof dish at 350 for 45 minutes.

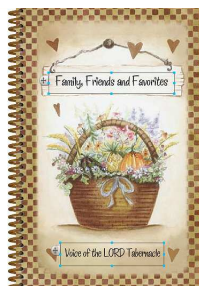
Love Your Enemies

He Giveth More Grace



Throughout all the stages of our life we suffer from various forms of affliction—physical, mental, emotional, financial, relational, or even political. Some are natural, coming with age; others come by our choices; some are forced on us by others, like persecution. Two truths regarding affliction: 1) we desire them to pass quickly and 2) God's sovereign hand brings them to us, sees us through, and takes them away in His perfect timing.

I love God's response when Paul asked three times to have his affliction removed: "My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness." We see it time and again in the lives of those who have trusted their condition and circumstance to their Heavenly Father. God's wondrous grace is not only sufficient, it's abundant as well. James promises, "But he giveth more grace..."

When your body no longer co-operates with your brain's desire; when pain rather than comfort is your constant companion – KNOW that God's grace IS SUFFICIENT and He gives MORE grace! When emotions play havoc with your peace, causing your mind to wander from its Biblical moorings; when permanent and ungodly solutions push in on temporary situations; when fear desires to overtake you – KNOW that God's grace IS SUFFICIENT and He gives MORE grace! When financial, medical, nourishment, or other needs are looming over us; when we've obediently trusted in God to the best of our ability and Satan is now laying siege on our stronghold of obedience, seemingly ready to prevail; when we've come to the end of our proverbial rope – KNOW that God's grace IS SUFFICIENT and He gives MORE grace! When persecution comes in its varied forms so that you are wrongly imprisoned, friends and family forsake you, the threat of being parted from life or limb is real – KNOW that God's grace IS SUFFICIENT and He gives MORE grace!

Let me tell you about deeply afflicted Annie. At three-years-old her mother died while giving birth to her sister. Her father and the two girls went to live with a widowed friend but they were not really welcome there. Annie's father allowed the girls to be adopted by a family who loved them very much; shortly thereafter, he passed away from a serious illness. At the age of eight, she came to saving faith in the Lord Jesus and before her teen-age years developed a love for reading and writing - particularly poetry. Shortly after high-school she was diagnosed with crippling arthritis; eventually she couldn't walk and it even severely limited the use of her hands. In the midst of this both of her adopted parents died within a few months of each other. This left the twice-orphaned girls on their own again.

She would painfully shove a pen through her bent and crippled fingers. Held by swollen joints she wrote first without any thought that it might be a means of ministry or that it would bring income for support. Her verses provided a solace for her in the long hours of suffering. Her painful story continues with God's provision and times of pain and loss.

Annie Johnson Flint's poem, He Giveth More Grace, became a precious hymn of the faith that has blessed countless souls, reminding us that God's grace IS SUFFICIENT!

1) He giveth more grace when the burdens grow greater, He sendeth more strength when the labours increase; To added afflictions He addeth His mercy, To multiplied trials, His multiplied peace. 2) When we have exhausted our store of endurance, When our strength has failed ere the day is half done, When we reach the end of our hoarded resources Our Father's full giving is only begun. 3) Fear not that your need shall exceed His provision, Our God ever yearns His resources to share; Lean hard on the arm everlasting, availing; The Father, both you and your load will upbear. Chorus: His love has no limits, His grace has no measure, His power no boundary known unto men; For out of His infinite riches in Jesus He giveth, and giveth, and giveth again.

Beloved, regardless of your present or future affliction, trust in the sufficiency of God's grace and humble yourself for more.



He Has Taken Your Place

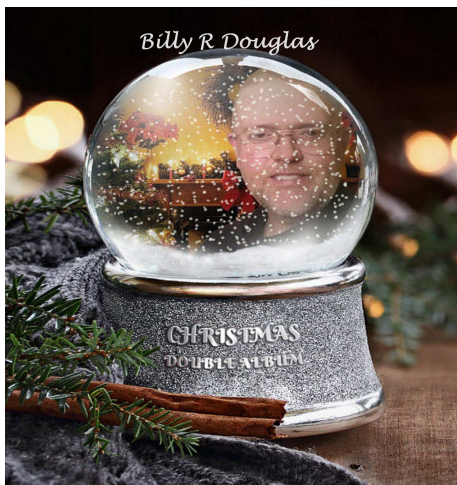

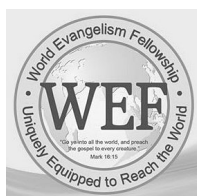

Thought for Today: Binding one's self with truth is the way to true freedom.

Story for Today: Madge stood not knowing what to say. Karlie and Mr. Evans, one of the members of the board for their company, had just been talking and without meaning to, Madge had overheard the details of some not-so-pleasant things that were being planned. Things were not great at work and today they seemed to be headed in a bad direction.

Madge was a member of the local church and was faithful in reading her Bible daily. Speaking to God and telling others about Him had become second nature to this precious saint. She also practiced other spiritual disciplines including fasting, Bible memorization, and spending time meditating on God's Word, to name a few. Quickly exiting the filing room where she had been working, Madge headed to the break room and the quiet corner where she knelt on her aged knees and began to speak to her heavenly Father. She needed His guidance as she traversed the rough times that were sure to come. You see, Madge had overheard plans to pay people to turn in co-workers that hadn't complied with the new religious regulations. At the beginning of the year, new religious protocols were offered and people were given a reward for complying; then, a more threatening letter was sent out strongly encouraging employees to get on board. Now, it appeared co-workers would be paid to expose their peers and fines would be put in place for the non-compliant workers. Standing for truth in the workplace had always been a struggle, but today it seemed even worse. Madge knew that she would stand out like a sore thumb if she tried to help Karlie understand that these practices were not in line with the guidelines that had been in place long before either of them had started working. And they were not in line with the truth found in God's Word. The truth was that these new regulations had a darker side than either of them knew about.
