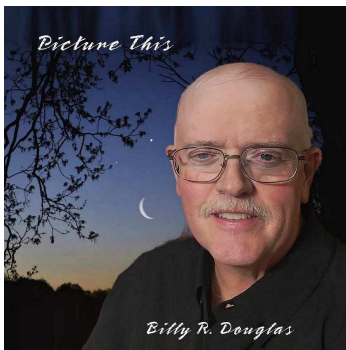

**A Word to the Wise – True or False? The Lord must balance it out.**

“A false balance is abomination to the Lord: but a just weight is his delight. When pride cometh, then cometh shame: but with the lowly is wisdom.” Proverbs 11:1-2

Joey marked the spot on his scales that represented the goal weight he must make in order to wrestle in the division he was signed up for. He was diligent in watching what he ate, stuck only to water, and was fastidious in his exercise regime. He watched the pounds shed off and the needle on his scales go down. Finally, the big day arrived and he had even managed to drop one-and-a-half pounds below his goal weight. He stepped on the scales at the wrestling match with a big grin of anticipation. What? No way! His grin turned into a grimace and his anticipation sunk like a rock into the pit of his stomach – four pounds over? IMPOSSIBLE!

Disqualified and dejected, Joey went home bewildered, put a hundred-pound weight on his scale and immediately saw the trouble. His scale was a “false balance” when he had trust it to be a “just weight.” His delight turned to dismay; how could he have been so careless, putting his trust into an inanimate object without testing it first. Disgusted and disgruntled, he picked up his “abomination” of a scale and pitched it into the garbage pail.

Though the Lord hates a false balance, it’s not from the emotional disappointment that Joey felt. God is holy and just and He demands that His children be holy as He is holy. He requires them to “do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with [our] God” (Micah 6:8). Today’s proverb on commerce extends beyond the seller, including the buyer as well. In other words, “all unjust dealing is ‘an abomination to the Lord;’ while all righteous dealing is ‘his delight.’” (Ralph Wardlaw)

If we love our neighbor as ourself, which is the second great commandment, then we will not want to defraud anyone. Some of the more common ways would be stealing office supplies, keeping that extra change (or more) that the cashier accidentally gave you, charging more than you know something is worth, or cheating on your taxes. Obviously, this list is not all inclusive, but if the Holy Spirit is pricking your conscience in any way, go make it right, RIGHT NOW! Let no rationalization or justification take place in your mind; don’t let your friends or the culture around you tempt you to keep that which is not rightly yours.

Don’t let pride ask you, “What will men think?” but rather ask, “What will God think?” It is pride that makes one think he deserves that which he has not earned. Wardlaw admonishes, “Shun every approach to what you know, from His word, to be ‘an abomination’ to Him; and practice³ unvaryingly, in defiance of human opinions and of all apprehended consequences, that in which He delights; --for of all evils the³ worst is God’s displeasure, and of all blessings the richest is God’s favour.”

The whole of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation, speaks sharply against pride. “It is the pervading maxim of the Divine word—‘Every one that exalteth himself shall be abased.’ In the end, pride must bring ‘shame.’” (Wardlaw) Eventually, pride cannot help but be discovered, either by bragging words or actions; it always leads to shame – if not through a pricked conscience or by the long arm of the law, at the least in the last day of judgment. “For whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap” (Gal. 6:7) and “For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad” (2 Cor. 5:10).

Let us remember that to humble ourselves is to walk according to the dictates and decrees of God almighty; it is wisdom – as this verse tells us – and in so doing, the Lord will lift you up (James 4:10).



Rock of Israel, Cleft for ME!

“The God of Israel said, the Rock of Israel spake to me,
He that ruleth over men must be just, ruling in the fear of God.” 2 Sam. 23:3

On page 8 is the Story Behind the Song; in that article we make reference to both Toplady's hymn Rock of Ages and Wesley's Hymn 27. Below is Wesley's hymn in its entirety. Please read it thoroughly, meditate on its meaning, and praise God for what He has done.

1. Rock of Israel, cleft for me, For us, for all mankind,
See, thy feeblest followers see Who call thy death to mind:
Sion is the weary land; Us beneath thy shade receive,
Grant us in the cleft to stand, And by thy dying live.

2. In this howling wilderness On Calvary's steep top,
Made a curse our souls to bless Thou once was lifted up;
Stricken there by Moses' rod, Wounded with a deadly blow;
Gushing streams of life o'erflowed The thirsty world below.

3. Rivers of salvation still Along the desert roll,
Rivers to refresh and heal The fainting sin-sick soul;
Still the fountain of thy blood Stands for sinners opened wide,
Now, e'en now, my Lord, and God, I wash me in thy side.

4. Now, e'en now we all plunge in And drink the purple wave,
This the antidote of sin, 'Tis this our souls shall save:
With the life of Jesus fed, Lo! From strength to strength we rise,
Followed by our Rock, and led To meet him in the skies.

O Friend, do you know the cleansing of “the purple wave, this antidote for sin”? Have you been washed in the blood of Jesus – the “Rock of Israel, cleft for me, for us, for all mankind”? If not, I urge you to trust in the atoning work of Jesus which was done upon the cross. That is where He was cleft – torn asunder and broken – for you. When we find salvation in the cleft of the Rock, we find that we are transformed by the Lord.

John Wesley shows what this transformation looks like with his four spiritual laws: 1. God loves you; therefore, love and obey Him. 2. Christ died for you; therefore, die to sin. 3. Christ is risen' therefore, rise in the image of God. 4. Christ liveth evermore; therefore, live to God until you live with Him, in glory.



Reesie's Recipes



Hawaiian Bundt Cake

- 1 (15.25-ounce) package yellow cake mix
- 1 (3-ounce) package instant lemon pudding mix
- 3/4 cup plus 1/3 cup orange juice, divided
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 1 teaspoon lemon extract
- 2/3 cup white sugar
- 1/2 stick butter

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F. Grease a 10-inch Bundt pan. In a large bowl, combine the cake mix and the pudding mix and stir to combine. Make a well in the center of the cake mix mixture and pour 3/4 cup of the orange juice, the oil, the eggs, and the lemon extract into the well and beat on low speed until blended. Scrape down the sides of the bowl and beat the batter for 4 minutes on medium speed. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake, about 35 to 40 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Allow the cake to cool in the pan for 10 minutes, then turn the cake out onto a plate and allow to cool completely. In a saucepan over medium heat, combine the remaining orange juice, the sugar, and the butter and cook for 2 minutes. Drizzle the glaze over the cake.

Dessert Pizza

- 1 can (8 oz) crescent roll dough
- 2 tbsps unsalted butter, melted
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tbsps milk (for icing)
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract (for icing)

Preheat your oven to 375°F and lightly grease a baking sheet or pizza pan. Unroll the crescent roll dough and press it onto the prepared baking sheet to form a large rectangle or circle, pinching the seams together to create a smooth crust. Brush the melted butter evenly over the crescent roll dough. In a small bowl, mix together the granulated sugar and cinnamon, then sprinkle the mixture generously over the buttered dough. Bake the cinnamon-sugar pizza for 10-12 minutes, or until the crust is golden brown and crispy. While the pizza is baking, whisk together the powdered sugar, milk, and vanilla extract in a small bowl until smooth and creamy. Once the pizza is out of the oven, drizzle the icing over the top in zigzag patterns or swirl designs. Let it cool slightly before slicing and serving.

Pineapple Cheese Ball

- 2 (8oz) pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 2 T. chopped green pepper
- 2 T. chopped onion
- 3/4 cup crushed pineapple in syrup, drained
- 1 1/2 cup chopped pecans

In a large bowl combine first 4 ingredients and 1/2 cup of pecans, mix well. Divide into 2 balls and roll in remaining pecans. Chill.

THE STORY BEHIND THE SONG

Rock Of Ages

Perhaps there's no greater division in the Body of Christ than that by which we call "Arminianism" and "Calvinism," though, perhaps, most would be more familiar with the "fathers" of these two opposing theologies – John Wesley and John Calvin respectively. And yet, God's arms of grace are wide enough to envelop any who will humble themselves as believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. For example, John Wesley and Augustus M. Toplady (a staunch Calvinist), though violently opposed to the other, would both find grace and safety for their souls – salvation – in the cleft of the Rock, Jesus the Christ. It was through their bitter rivalry that the sweet, immortal hymn Rock of Ages would find its birth.

Wesley and Toplady read the same Bible and believed in the same atoning work of Christ; they both had found themselves saved in "the cleft of the Rock. What could have these brothers in Christ at such odds? Why would each of them hurl stones (words) at the other by means of tracts and sermons?

Each of these men held sincerely to their theological biases; they both argued with Scriptural authority and believed they were fighting for the cause of Christ. John Wesley preached that by God's grace it was possible for men to live above sin and that God's grace was free for all men – ALL COULD be saved. Augustus just as strongly contended that God elects only some to salvation while the rest of humanity is damned – Christ's atonement is only for the select few and Toplady was one of God's chosen.

Toplady accused: "Wesley is guilty of Satanic shamelessness" and that he "acts the part of a lurking, sly assassin." Wesley responded to "the vain boaster," stating, "I do not fight with chimney-sweeps." In March of 1776, as editor of The Gospel Magazine, Toplady compared "the debt of sin" to "England's national debt," pointing out that no one could pay off such a debt and we must rely solely on Christ for redemption/salvation. He concluded his article with a three-stanza poem which began:

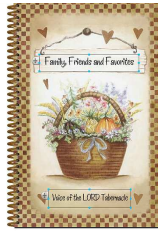
Rock of ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in thee;
 Let the water and the blood, From thy *riven side which flowed,
 Be of sin the double cure, Cleanse from wrath and make me pure.
 (* "Riven" is an old word which means "torn apart," "split asunder.")

Two years later (at 38), Toplady would die of consumption with these words on his lips: "My heart beats every day stronger and stronger for glory. Sickness is no affliction, pain no cause, death itself no dissolution...My prayers are now all converted into praise."

Thirty years before Toplady wrote Rock of Ages, John and Charles Wesley wrote Hymns on the Lord's Supper (1745) which contained a prayer in its preface voicing many of the themes and words that are also found in Toplady's hymn. There's a real possibility that Augustus may have read it in his younger years. Of particular interest is Hymn 27; it begins with the line "Rock of Israel, cleft for me." Here is the whole of that first stanza which also addresses one of the differences between Wesley's and Toplady's theologies:

Rock of Israel, cleft for me, For us, for all mankind,
 See, thy feeblest followers see Who call thy death to mind:
 Sion is the weary land; Us beneath thy shade receive,
 Grant us in the cleft to stand, And by thy dying live.

Although Rock of Ages is a true blessing, there is no greater blessing that the truth of which it speaks: There is salvation only in Jesus. I'm sure the animosity Wesley and Toplady had for each other has also been washed away in the blood of the Lamb as they sing His praises together through all eternity!

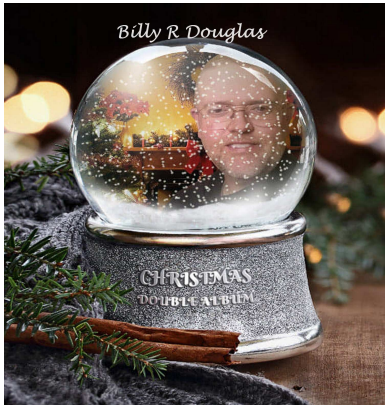

Verse for Today: Romans 12:9 Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. **Additional Passages for today:** 1 John 3:18; 1 Peter 1:22; Matt. 5:37 & 39; Psalm 34:14; 97:10

Thought for Today: Love as God loves. Pretending to love is hypocrisy and isn't love at all.

Story for Today: Natalie waited outside the youth room door for Sarah as the class was being dismissed. The girls agreed to meet together today to finish making the banner designs for the new signs that needed to be ordered soon. It wasn't long before Sarah came through the door with her boyfriend, Matt. The trio headed for the local coffee shop and soon the girls were working on the project.
