I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me. For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin." Romans 7:19-25 (KJV)* Do you see why it is notable? It sounds like ol' Brother Clabaugh trying to explain something doesn't it? But there is some meat to this passage and it goes right along with what we've been speaking of here lately. Simply put if I may, it says, I just can't live a life of righteousness before my God. “Who You Gonna Call?”

The LORD hear thee in the day of trouble; the name of the God of Jacob defend thee; 2Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Zion ; 3Remember all thy offerings, and accept thy burnt sacrifice; Selah. 4Grant thee according to thine own heart, and fulfil all thy counsel. 5We will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the LORD fulfil all thy petitions. 6Now know I that the LORD saveth his anointed; he will hear him from his holy heaven with the saving strength of his right hand. 7Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God. 8They are brought down and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright. 9Save, LORD: let the king hear us when we call. When trouble comes your way, to whom do you run to bail you out? When you have overwhelming needs, who do seek out to meet those needs? When you just can't do it your self and you need someone to give you a helping hand to make it through, who do you reach out to for help? You may feel like there is no one you can run to but I've got good news there is One you can run to for refuge from the storm, One who will hear when you call for help, One who will hold your hand and see you through the darkest night and his name is JESUS! I. There is help for those weighed down with trouble. Job 5:7 - Yet man is born unto trouble, as the sparks fly upward. Job 14:1 - Man that is born of a woman is of few days and full of trouble. (Trouble as used in the Bible means distress or adversity.) Sometimes life throws you a curve ball and you find yourself face to face with problems or crises. At one time or another we all will face giants in our lives. (David faced Goliath) Someone has said "Inside every large problem is a series of small problems struggling to get out." Failing one giant often only unleashes a boatload of other adversity. When these giants come the first place we often run to is our family, friends, the government – everywhere but where we should seek refuge. The help of man is at best limited. Psalms 60:11 - Give us help from trouble: for vain is the help of man. From a human standpoint, there is no solution for the problems in the world today. Isaiah 31:1 - Woe to them that go down to Egypt for help; and stay on horses, and trust in chariots, because they are many; and in horsemen, because they are very strong; but they look not unto the Holy One of Israel, neither seek the LORD! Psalm 46:1 - God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Often we wonder why God allows the storms to enter our life but as Erwin Lutzer has said. "God often puts us in situations that are too much for us so that we will learn that no situation is too much for him." Psalms 107:28 - Then they cry unto the LORD in their trouble, and he bringeth them out of their distresses. "In order to realize the worth of the anchor, we need to feel the stress of the storm." Psalms 9:9 - The LORD also will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in times of trouble. 1st Corinthians 10:13 - There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it. II. There is help for those who have great need. Hebrews 4:16 - Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need. (Need refers to lacking the necessities of life, to be in want.) Luke 15:14-16 - And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want. 15And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. 16And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him. Psalms 72:12 - For he shall deliver the needy when he crieth; the poor also, and him that hath no helper. Few of us know the severe poverty that is a desperate problem throughout the world. Among the 4.4 billion people who live in developing countries, Three-fifths have no access to basic sanitation; Almost one-third is without safe drinking water; One-quarter lack adequate housing; One-fifth lives beyond reach of modern health services and One-fifth of the children do not get as far as grade five in school and one-fifth are undernourished. While most of us may not be impoverished, many of us still have needs. While we may not be financially destitute, many are going through extreme financial difficulties; some are faced with emotional or marital difficulties. Many children are in need of compassion and understanding. Some families are in want of stability and cohesiveness. We can never use the language of the Laodicean church and say, 'We have need of nothing.' Our needs are great but the Lord's resources are inexhaustible. The New Testament points out some types of man's needs: Material — Matthew 6:31-32 - Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? 32(For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. Physical — Luke 9:11 - And the people, when they knew it, followed him: and he received them, and spake unto them of the kingdom of God , and healed them that had need of healing. Personal — Luke 10:42 - But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. Moral — John 13:10 - Jesus saith to him, He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all. Social — 1st Corinthians 12:21 - And the eye cannot say unto the hand, I have no need of thee: nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you. Spiritual— Hebrews 10:36 - For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise. Mental— James 1:5 - If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. Philipians 4:19 - But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus. III. There is help for those without strength to go on. Proverbs 24:10 - If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small. There are times in life when life can seem overwhelming. You may even feel like your life is a journey on a restless and troubled sea. You need help to make it through another day but feel like you're all helpless and all alone. I have good news for you there is help for everything you're going through. Even though you feel like you can't take another step, you may still have to walk the valley but you don't have to walk it alone on your own strength because Jesus is with you. (Read 2nd Chronicles 14) - When Asa was king of Judah , an Ethiopian named Zerah attacked Judah with an army of 1,000,000 warriors and 300 charioteers. Outnumbered and without the military strength needed to defend themselves rather than frantically looking to others for deliverance, Asa leaned on the Lord. 2nd Chronicles 14:11 – And Asa cried unto the LORD his God, and said, LORD, it is nothing with thee to help, whether with many, or with them that have no power: help us, O LORD our God; for we rest on thee, and in thy name we go against this multitude. O LORD, thou art our God; let no man prevail against thee. Psalms 28:7 - The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped: therefore my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise him. God delights in giving strength to those who are weak who will run to Him. Isaiah 40:29 - He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength. All of God's Giants have been weak men. Hudson Taylor, founder of the China Inland Mission, knew the secret of strength through weakness. Complimented once by a friend on the impact of the mission, Hudson answered, "It seemed to me that God looked over the whole world to find a man who was weak enough to do His work, and when He at last found me, He said, 'He is weak enough—he'll do.' Smith Wigglesworth, he was an uneducated plumber who God used mightily to do some great works for the glory of God. All God's giants have been weak men who did great things for God because they counted on His being with them." Isaiah 40:31 -But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint. Man's greatest weakness is spiritual. We read in Romans 5:6 - For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. As sinners the Bible declare that we are "without strength." This carries the idea of being "powerless". It speaks of people who are "utterly helpless with no means of escape." The idea is that the lost sinner stands before God with absolutely no ability to change what he is. We are powerless to escape sin, to escape death, to resist the devil, to please God in any way. The whole essence of this statement is that man is unable to change his sinful nature by his own effort. He is totally without strength and weakened by his sins. John 1:12 - But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: So when trouble comes your way, WHO YOU GONNA CALL? McKenney, It is my prayer that it will be enlightening to you...

Today there is a fresh outpouring of evil upon the Earth. There is a revival of witchcraft and all forms of satanism of greater proportions than that of the Middle Ages; it is probably the beginning of Satan's final assault, his last great offensive to damn the lost and weaken the Church. There are growing numbers of Satan worshippers, meeting freely in increasing numbers of satanic "churches". Practicing witches, numbering in the tens of thousands, advertise in newspapers, on television and radio, and keep regular office hours. More and more the police are required to deal with strange, new problems of law enforcement such as the opening of graves and mutilation of bodies for occult purposes, and the stealing of pets for sacrificing and divination. Children, teenagers and derelicts are increasingly being abducted, tortured and ritually murdered as sacrifices to Satan. And in the midst of all this outpouring of evil, Samhain, the Festival of Death, is still the ultimate high holy day of the satanic year. Now generally called Halloween, October 31st is definitely the focal point of this flood of filth, and at midnight of that date these hellish activities reach their yearly climax. Sacrifices are offered to the God of Death and Darkness all over the world. Sacrifices are offered in many forms, from food and drink offerings to chickens, goats, dogs and cats; and, in some places, there are human sacrifices. This may well be the worst part of all, for the very little children, the innocent lambs whom the Lord has entrusted to the churches for safe-keeping and protection, are deliberately subjected to fears and terrifying sights and sounds that may inflict permanent emotional injuries and open them up to invasion by demonic forces which seek to destroy them. Although some churches denounce and forbid such pagan practices, most enter in; and those voices raised in protest in such churches are themselves denounced as radical and dangerous. It is sad, but true, that the most significant days in the Christian year have all been invaded by the enemy, bringing in pagan practices and appealing substitutes to take our eyes and affections from the Lord. But Halloween is the exception; there was nothing Christian to invade! This one was the devil's holiday all along, and he has somehow duped the Christians into embracing it and accepting it as our own! REESIE'S RECIPES



Swirled Pumpkin Cheesecake Bars

Crust

- 1 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 2 Tbsp butter, melted

Filling

- 11 oz. cream cheese
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 tsp all purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1/2 cup canned pumpkin
- 1 Tbsp brown sugar

In a small bowl, combine cracker crumbs and sugar, stir in butter. Press onto bottom of a 9" square baking dish coated with cooking spray. Bake at 325 for 7-10 minutes or until set. Cool on a wire rack. Filling: In a large bowl beat the first 5 filling ingredients until smooth. Add egg, beat on low just until combined. Remove 3/4 cup of batter to a small bowl: stir in pumpkin and brown sugar until well blended. Pour plain batter over crust. Drop pumpkin batter by tablespoons over plain batter. Cut through batter with a knife to swirl. Bake at 325 for 20-25 minutes or until center is almost set. Cool on a wire rack for 1 hour. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours.

Creamy Chicken Casserole

- 1 sleeve Ritz crackers, crushed
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 4 cups water
- 1 (32 ounce) container chicken broth
- 3 skinless, boneless chicken breast, cubed
- 1 (16 ounce) container sour cream,
- 1 (26 ounce) can condensed cream of chicken soup

Preheat an oven to 350 degrees. Mix the crackers and melted butter together in a bowl; set aside. Bring water and chicken broth to a boil in a pot over high heat. Season with salt and black pepper. Add the chicken. Reduce heat to a simmer, and cook, stirring occasionally, until chicken is no longer pink in the center, 5 to 7 minutes. Drain the chicken; set aside. Whisk together the sour cream and cream of chicken soup in a large bowl. Stir in the chicken, then transfer the mixture to a 9x13-inch baking dish. Sprinkle the cracker mixture on top. Bake in the preheated oven until bubbly, 25 to 30 minutes.

Flourless Chocolate Cake by Rita Caylor

- 7 oz. (45-50%) cocoa semisweet chocolate, Baker's brand
- 3/4 cup butter [must be butter]
- 1 cup sugar, divided
- 4 eggs, separated
- Powdered sugar, just a small amount
- Preheat oven to 300 degrees.

Melt chocolate and butter in a double boiler. [I used 2 different sizes of pans and put the water in the bottom of the bigger pan] Stir together half of the sugar and 4 egg yolks and add to the melted chocolate and butter and set aside off of the stove. Using an electric mixer, beat the 4 egg whites, and then slowly add the rest of the sugar [1/2 cup] until the peaks are real stiff. Slowly 'fold' the egg whites in to the chocolate mixture until completely mixed good, but don't stir, just turn the spoon over and over to mix. Pour into a round 9" - vegetable sprayed pan, spraying good. Bake for 40 minutes or until a toothpick is tested in the center and comes out with just a few crumbs on it. Cool for 30 minutes and then turn upside down on a plate or cake dish. Sprinkle with a little powdered sugar to dress the cake up.

Note: This cake looks kind of 'ugly' when it comes out of the oven, but looks are not what this cake is about, it's that Good taste of Chocolate that counts, so when it is turned upside down it looks so much better and the powdered sugar helps dress it up

Milky Way Fudge

- 1 tsp butter
- 1 can (14 oz) sweetened condensed milk
- 2 cups (12 oz) semi sweet chocolate chips
- 3 milky way candy bars (2.05 oz each), chopped
- 1 tsp vanilla

Line a 9" square pan with foil and grease the foil with butter, set aside. In a large microwave safe bowl combine the milk, chocolate chips and candy bars. Microwave uncovered on high for one minute, stir. Microwave at additional 15 second intervals, stirring until smooth. Stir in vanilla. Spread into prepared pan. Refrigerate for one hour or until firm. Using foil, lift fudge out of pan and cut fudge into one inch squares. Store in airtight container in refrigerator.



A LITTLE GIRL'S MEMORIES

I was born in what is known as the Daniel Boone mountains in Eastern Kentucky. As a very young little girl, I remember when my Daddy crossed the fields to Mrs. Gilbert's farm. They had a battery radio and the news had gotten deep into the mountains that President Roosevelt was going to speak to America. Daddy walked home and told all of us, "We are in a war. Pearl Harbor has been bombed and many of our soldier boys have been killed." Every young man of age was drafted, and many volunteered to go to war and fight for our freedom. I share my memories, for it was a different time - World War II. It seemed like everyone wanted to help in every way. The government gave us sugar stamps and shoe stamps. No one complained. Whatever was required, we did. The mothers would exchange shoe stamps for sugar stamps. If one family had not worn out their shoes, and another needed shoes, they exchanged for sugar. There was no selfishness. When a son or father had to enlist, there were tears and sorrow as they kissed their loved ones goodbye. Christians from every church called out to the Lord - O Lord, bring him back home safely. There was crying and praying everywhere. We knew America's hope for victory was in the Lord Jesus Christ. So many gave their lives - I lost an uncle in a battlefield in Germany, and a cousin shot down over Tokyo. We were so proud of our American soldiers. I remember Victory Day for America - the war was over! Church bells were ringing everywhere. It is different now. There have been many wars since then. So many blessed American servicemen and women have given their lives. Many of this nation's citizens have forgotten the Lord Jesus Christ. I remember in my childhood, the newspaper told of our loss on the battlefield every day. I find now, maybe on the back page of the daily newspaper, that there might be words printed, "Three American soldiers were killed in battle this week." My beautiful America - her heart is so sick. Dear Lord, you must be sad, you love her so much. Lord Jesus, you told us in your word that "If my people, who are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land" (2 Chronicles 7:14). My friend, Brother Dillon Sullivan, wrote this song that I have recorded - it is about his Mother and Dad when their oldest son went to war: *When Mama's Oldest Son Went To War On a cold, snowy morning, January '42 Mama loaned her oldest son to Uncle Sam To go and fight a battle the enemy had waged, To bring freedom's adversary to the ground. With her feet wrapped in grass sacks she waded through the snow, Holding to my Daddy's hand, across the fields they would go. Heading for the Depot to catch the waiting train, Not knowing if she'd ever see her darling son again. (Chorus) There were heartaches and sorrows, tears for each tomorrow, When Mama's oldest son was over there. There were prayers sent up to heaven and tears by the gallon, When Mama's oldest son went to war. That old rock chimney corner was Mama's hiding place, For she talked to Jesus and asked Him for His grace. Oh dear Lord in heaven, watch over my boy I pray, Protect him with your guiding hand and bring him home some day.*

Witchcraft

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Halloween & the Occult

Where did Halloween and its customs originate? What does it mean in the world of the occult? Is this celebration just *harmless* fun and games? How did the occult become so accepted in America AND in the church? What does the Bible say about the occult?

The Occult in America

Through the mid-1990's the popularity of witchcraft in America grew by leaps and bounds. Many people would be surprised to find how commonly the occult is practiced in our society, and they may find it is closer to home than they realize. In 1958, the Chicago Tribune reported that, though difficult to quantify due to the lack of a formal organization, neo-paganism is the fastest growing religion in North America. It is now estimated that it will double in size every eighteen months. Estimates in the U.S. of practicing witches were as follows (and it is possible that these figures could be as much as 50% higher than these): In 1972, there were 20,000 witches in the United States, in 1986, there were 25,000, in 1992, there were 200,000, in 1998, there were 360,000, and in 1999 there were 768,400 (that they knew of).

Books — Nearly every bookstore has a major section on the occult. You do not have to look any further than the Harry Potter series to see just how popular these books have become. Some bookstores and book clubs are devoted entirely to the occult. Magazines and tabloids, such as the National Enquirer, sold at every grocery store check-out lane, promote psychics and all kinds of occult practices.

Games — Toy or game sections in stores often sell occult games such as Ouija boards or Dungeons and Dragons and similar "fantasy games." Still more popular are computer games involving witches, sorcerers, demons, and occult powers of all kinds. Often players role-play or pretend they are these occult characters.

Stores — Some stores specialize in selling paraphernalia used in various occult activities. We have such a store called "Sacred Earth" in Ansover, IL. Their web site says: "Sacred Earth brings you a diverse selection of spiritual and magical supplies, including an extensive collection of herbs, stones, jewelry, ritual books, books, herbal woadge sticks, tarot cards and more."

Television and movies — Many programs and movies have major occult themes, beginning years ago with "Hocusvany's Babby," "The Exorcist," "Hairy Potter" etc. MANY children's cartoons and programs feature occult powers, with witches, sorcerers, demons, etc. The trend started in the sixties with shows like Bewitched, I Dream of Jeannie, The Munsters and continue today with shows like Wizards of Waverly Place, Ghost Whisperer and more. This can even be seen in "educational programs" such as Barney, Sesame Street and more.

Music — Many popular recording artists are personally involved in necromancy, witchcraft, and Satanism. Popular songs often involve the occult, and many of their album covers portray occult and Satanic symbols.

Education — Many colleges and universities teach courses discussing the occult, and even high school and grade school texts may contain references to witchcraft and the occult. Although Christmas has been banned from the public school system each October the hallways and windows of most schools across America can be found adorned in decorations featuring witches, ghosts and goblins.

The New Age movement — consists largely of people involved in the occult and pagan religions. Many of the teachings from the New Age movement have also made their way into the pulpits of Evangelical churches across America in the form of "The Word of Faith Movement", using mind power as its focus instead of faith in the God of the Bible, going as far to teach that "we" are little gods.

Satanic rituals — News often mentions crimes which police suspect are the result of Satanic worship rituals.

Halloween — is a holy day in witchcraft. Moon spells and incantations are cast on this night than any other time of the year. Satanist and Wiccan alike consider this their most "holy" day of the year. All of the customs and traditions associated with this celebration are rooted in the occult. The popularity of this celebration in America has almost become surreal...it is close to being the biggest money maker of any of the holidays celebrated in America.

But these two things shall come to thee in a moment in one day, the loss of children, and widowhood: they shall come upon thee in their perfection for the multitude of thy sorceries, and for the great abundance of thine enchantments. For thou hast trusted in thy wickedness... Isaiah 47: 9-10

He looked at me and the first words he said was, "He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him", Hebrews 11:6b. He recognized me as well and a big smile came on his face. I was blessed so much to hear those words from the Lord that day, coming from someone that most in our town would not even give the time of day. God had taken a child-like man and filled him with His glory. May we never be guilty of trying to find God in organized religion or institutionalized Christianity, He lives in His people! We are commanded not to become involved with the unfruitful works of darkness (Eph. 5:11). Both from my experience as a witch, and since getting saved, as a minister of the gospel of Jesus Christ, I have seen far too many examples of how breaking this command works out in lives. Remember, while we have God's promise of protection for ourselves and our children, that promise may not hold if we allow our children to celebrate this dark holiday. Case after case has come to us of children in rebellion. In many of these families, the problem can be traced back to the children being exposed to Halloween and the occult at a young age.
